April 2d.—Eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Quebec, but visible and central on the South Sea, in lat. $32^{\circ}.15'$ and long. $149^{\circ}.6'$ west of Greenwich.

Sept. 13.—Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec:

Beginning of the Eclipse, 0h. 40m. morning,

Middle of ditto 1h. 52m. ditto

End of ditto 3h. 4m. ditto

Duration of ditto 2h. 24m.

Digits eclipsed, $6^{\circ}.5'$ on the moon's southern limb.

Sept. 27.—The Sun eclipsed, invisible at Quebec, but will be centrally eclipsed on the eastern Ocean, near the Isles of Japan, in lat. $39^{\circ}23'$ north, and long. $157^{\circ}5'$ east of Greenwich.

MOON'S RISING AND SETTING.

At four days old it sets at, and shines till, about 10 at night. 5 - about - 11 6 - about - 12 7 at near, 1 in the morn- ing.		15, at full, it rises about 6 in the evening. 16 - at $\frac{1}{2}$ after - 7 17 - at $\frac{3}{4}$ after - 8 18 - about - 10 19 - about - 11 20 - about - 12
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N. B. This Table is sufficiently accurate for the purpose it is wanted—that of ascertaining moon-light evenings.

Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

Reduce this Fraction to its *least terms*, and it will serve as a constant Multiplier, by which any sum of the *given* Currency being Multiplied, it will be converted into the Currency required.

N. B. When the Fraction is not an improper one the *Multiplier* will become a Divisor.

EXAMP. To form a rule for changing Sterling at 4/6. pr. Dollar into New-York at 8/ pr. Dollar.

Here *Sterling* is *given*, and *York* required: The Dollar in $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{York is } 8/ \text{ or } 96 \text{ Pence Numerator,} \\ \text{Sterling } 4/6. \text{ or } 54 \text{ Pence Denominator.} \end{array} \right.$

Therefore $\frac{96}{54}$ is the Multiplier sought, which reduced to its least terms becomes $\frac{16}{9}$ or $1\frac{7}{9}$, therefore if Sterling be multiplied by 16 and divided by 9 the result will be York, thus. $\frac{16}{9}$ is the same as 2 into $\frac{8}{9}$, but $\frac{8}{9}$ is the same as 1 less $\frac{1}{9}$, therefore 2 into $\frac{8}{9}$ is equal to 2 into 1 less $\frac{1}{9}$, which is that Rule, expressed shorter thus, $\frac{16}{9} = 2 \times \frac{8}{9} = 2 \times 1\frac{1}{9}$.

These several duties are payable under the acts of the Imperial Parliament of 4, Geo 3, c. 15, sec. 1, 6 Geo. 3. c. 52, sec. 4, 14 Geo. 3d, cap 88, sec. 1; 3d Geo. 4, cap 119, sec. 8; 6 Geo. 4, cap. 114, sec. 9; 7 Geo. 4, cap. 48, sec. 44, and 7 & 8 Geo. 4. cap. 56, sec. 29. and under the acts of the Provincial Legislature of 33 Geo. 3, cap. 8, 35 Geo. 3d, cap. 9, 41 Geo. 3d, cap. 14, 53 Geo. 3, cap. 11, amended by 53 Geo. 3, cap. 2, and 55 Geo. 3, cap. 3, rendered permanent by 3 Geo. 4, cap. 119.

(1) This further duty is only charged with its amount, if any shall exceed the amount of the previous duties, in which case the excess is payable, 16 Geo, 4, cap. 114, sec. 11, but this is not likely to occur except with every high priced articles, it may therefore be considered as merely nominal.

(2) This further duty will in every case exceed the previous duty, the excess will therefore be charged; the amount payable cannot however shew by Table, as it will vary in every case according to the value of the article.

(3) Molasses if imported in a vessel not belonging to the U. Kingdom or to Quebec, the duty will be 7d stg, instead of 4d.

(4) This duty is drawn back if the half be shipped for the use of the fisheries in the lower parts of the Province.

(6) Upon such of these goods as are liable to the Provincial duty of 2½ per cent, that duty is payable under the Provincial law, but its amount is deducted from the payment made under the 6 Geo. 4, cap. 114.

(7) A tonnage duty of 4s sterling, per tun from the ships, and 10 per cent upon the amount of duties on the goods imported is chargeable by order in Council, under certain conditions, which present only apply to the ships of the United States.
