

# REPORT

# Board of Directors.

# PHILADELPHIA, April 24th, 1902.

The Board of Directors of the Zoological Society of Philadelphia submits to the members and loanholders its thirtieth annual report for the year ending February 28th, 1902.

# GENERAL AFFAIRS AND FINANCES.

The slight decrease in the admissions is much more than accounted for by a singular prevalence of bad weather on days when the Gardens should have been largely visited. Between April 1st and November 1st there was rain upon fourteen Saturdays and Sundays, while upon seven more the weather was such as to materially affect the receipts.

It has been observed with satisfaction, that in the use of the tickets issued to the Public Schools, there has been a marked increase in the practice of sending children in parties of considerable size, accompanied by one or more teachers. The educational advantage to the scholar, of the intelligent instruction received under this system, is so great, that its growth is to be regarded as a distinct gain.

During the year the Board has lost two members by death, Dr. Francis W. Lewis and Mr. David W. Sellers,

who were elected respectively in 1888 and 1892. To each of these gentlemen, many years of previous interest had brought complete familiarity with the objects for which the Society exists, and the loss is indeed severe which deprives the Society of their counsel and their efforts.

An unusual number of species were new to the collection; these were as follows:—

### MAMMALIA.

#### PRIMATES.

1. Hylobates lar (L.) White-handed gibbon.

Hab., Malay Peninsula.

One male, purchased June 20th. It is well known that these delicate apes do not long survive captivity, and this specimen died on August 22d.

2. Ateles paniscus (L.) Red-faced spider monkey.

Hab., Guiana.

One specimen. Purchased.

3. Cebus azaræ Reng. Azara's cebus.

Hab., Paraguay.

One specimen of this rare monkey, brought from Asuncion, Paraguay, by Dr. Flagg of Philadelphia, was received on July 3d.

# CARNIVORA.

4. Felis nebulosa Griffith. Clouded leopard.

Hab., southeastern Asia, Borneo.

A male of this beautiful species was purchased June 20th. Few of the large cats are less often seen in captivity than this.

5. Putorius nigripes Aud. & Bach. Black-footed ferret. Hab., western United States.

This species, although ranging from Texas to Montana, has been very little known until recent years.

A female was received on April 27th from Seymour,
Baylor County, Texas.

### Insectivora.

6. Erinaceus algirus Duv. & Lereb. Algerian hedgehog. Hab., northwest Africa.

A hedgehog purchased January 8th, which reached New York on a transport returning from the Philippines, appears to belong to this species.

### RODENTIA.

7. Tamias pricei Allen. Price's chipmunk.

Hab., California.

Three specimens from Santa Cruz County. Purchased.

8. Spermophilus spilosoma Benn. Spotted spermophile.

Hab., Texas to Arizona.

An adult female and three young; received from Pecos, Texas, July 12th.

9. Peromyscus texensis (Woodh.) Texas white-footed mouse. Hab., western Texas.

One specimen from Pecos. Purchased.

10. Lepus arizonæ Allen. Sage hare.

Hab., southwestern United States.

Seven specimens received from Pecos in January and March appear to belong to the form described as *L. a. minor* (Mearns).

# Ungulata.

11. Oreamnus montanus (Ord) Rocky Mountain goat.

Hab., Idaho to Alaska.

On October 1st the Society was fortunate enough to secure a young male of this interesting species, which has never previously been exhibited in a living state in this country. This specimen was born about the middle of May last, and was several

weeks old at the time of its capture, near Field, British Columbia. It was secured for the Society through the interest of Mr. George Vaux, of Philadelphia, and his sons, and reached the Gardens on October 1st in perfect condition. In December an agreement was entered into by which some animals were loaned by the Zoological Society to the International Forest, Fish and Game Association, for the purpose of their annual exposition, in return for which certain animals were received by the Society as a gift. Among these was a female goat from Idaho. The presence of a pair of these rare animals in the Gardens is an event of unusual interest.

36. Archibuteo ferrugineus (Licht.) Tawny rough-legged buzzard.

Hab., western United States.

The first example of this fine hawk which the Society has ever received, was presented on May 21st by Mr. E. Meyenberg, of Pecos, Texas. A second specimen from the same locality was purchased in January, 1902.

37. Falco fusco-cærulescens Vieill. Aplomado falcon.

Hab., Texas to South America.

This beautiful species is represented by a pair received June 4th from Pecos.

#### COLUMBÆ.

38. Ena capensis (L.) Cape dove.

Hab., Africa.

Two specimens. Purchased.

#### HEMIPODII.

39. Turnix nigricollis (Gm.) Black-necked hemipode. Hab., Madagascar.

Two specimens. Purchased.

40. Totanus solitarius (Wilson.) Solitary sandpiper.
 Hab., North America.
 One specimen, presented by Master James Mullin.

### Anseres.

41. Spatula clypeata (L.) Shoveler duck. Hab., Northern Hemisphere.

#### STRUTHIONES.

42. Casuarius australis Wall. Australian cassowary. Hab., Australia.

One specimen. Purchased June 20th.

# REPTILIA.

# CHELONIA.

43. Chrysemys rugosa (Shaw.) West Indian terrapin. Hab., West Indies.

One specimen from Cuba. Purchased.

44. Damonia reevesi Gray. Reeves' terrapin.

Hab., China.

Four specimens. Purchased.

45. Testudo elegans Schoep. Elegant tortoise.

Hab., India and Ceylon.

Three specimens. Purchased.

46. Emyda granosa (Schoep.) Bungoma turtle.

Hab., India.

Four examples of this curious soft-shelled turtle were presented November 26th by Mr. Carl Hagenbeck.

47. Sternothærus nigricans (Donnd.) Blackish terrapin.

Hab., Madagascar.

Two specimens. Purchased February 27th. They were accompanied by two examples of *S. derbianus*, a closely allied species from western Africa.

### LACERTILIA.

48. Cyclura carinata Harl. Harlan's iguana.

Hab., Bahamas.

Two specimens of this little-known iguana were found in a box floating in the Delaware River and were presented by Mrs. Josephine O'Drain on July 4th.

49. Holbrookia texana (Trosch.) Texas spotted lizard.

Hab., Texas and Mexico.

One specimen from Pecos, purchased June 18th, and a second from Seymour, Texas, also purchased.

50. Uta stansburiana B. & G. Stansbury's uta lizard.

Hab., western United States.

Several specimens. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg, Pecos, Texas.

51. Uta ornata B. & G. Ornate uta lizard.

Hab., southwestern United States.

Four specimens from Pecos. Purchased.

52. Sceloporus consobrinus B. & G. Marcy's wave-lined lizard.

Hab., southwestern United States.

Four specimens from Pecos. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg.

53. Sceloporus occidentalis B. & G. Occidental wave-lined lizard.

Hab., California.

Nine specimens of this lizard were received from Oakland, Cal., on October 5th. Alcoholic specimens are hardly distinguishable from the common species of the eastern States (S. undulatus), but in life the color characters are enough to mark them at a glance.

54. Sceloporus torquatus poinsetti B. & G. Poinsett's scaly lizard.

Hab., southwestern United States.

Four specimens from Pecos. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg, and a number of others purchased.

55. Phrynosoma douglassi (Bell.) Douglass' horned lizard. Hab., western United States.

A specimen of the form of this lizard known as P. d. hernandezi (Girard) was collected by Dr. Henry Skinner, of the Academy of Natural Sciences, at Tapello, New Mexico, at an altitude of ten thousand feet. At the same locality Dr. Skinner procured a smooth green snake (Liopeltis vernalis).

Another horned lizard, received from an unknown locality in the West, presents the characters assigned to the subspecies *P. d. ornatissimum* (Girard).

56. *Phrynosoma blainvillei* Gray. Blainville's horned lizard. Hab., southern California.

Six specimens. Purchased June 1st.

It is interesting to remark that it is this species which has been credited with the habit of voluntarily ejecting blood from the vessels of the eye. While this curious performance has not been actually witnessed among those exhibited in the collection, a small jet of blood has on several occasions been observed on the wire back of their cage and on the tiled wall behind it, which had evidently proceeded in some manner from the lizards.

57. Phrynosoma modestum Girard. Least horned lizard.

Hab., southwestern United States and Mexico.

Three specimens from Pecos. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg. The large number of these lizards which were received later in the season is sufficient evidence of the abundance of this species in western Texas.

58. Gerrhonotus multicarinatus Blain. Many-keeled lizard. Hab., Pacific coast of United States. One specimen from Oakland, Cal. Purchased.

59. Cnemidophorus tessellatus (Say.) Tesselated lizard. Hab., Texas and Mexico.

Ten specimens from Pecos. Purchased.

60. Cnemidophorus gularis B. & G. Rio Grande six-lined lizard.

Hab., southwestern Texas.

One from Pecos. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg. The relation of this and the preceding species to others of their genus is not yet fully known, and the present identification is only provisional.

61. Eumeces obsoletus B. & G. Sonoran skink.

Hab., southwestern United States and Mexico.

Two specimens from Pecos. Presented by Mr. E. Meyenberg.

# - OPHIDIA.

62. Charina bottæ (Blain.) Botta's snake.

Hab., Oregon to Lower California.

One example of this curious little snake, allied to the boas, was received on October 5th from Oakland, Cal. It is doubtful if the species has ever before been exhibited in a zoological garden.

63. Eutænia eques (Reuss.) Spotted-necked garter snake.

Hab., southwestern United States and Mexico.

Seven specimens of this snake, which has commonly been known as *Eutænia cyrtopsis* (Kenn.) and which is rare in collections, were received during

the Summer, all having been collected south of Pecos, Texas.

64. Eutænia elegans elegans B. & G. Elegant garter snake. Hab., Oregon to California.

Six small specimens from Oakland. Purchased.

65. Salvadora grahami (B. & G.) Graham's leaf-nosed snake. Hab., southwestern United States.

One specimen from an unknown locality. Purchased April 16th from a dealer, and a second received from Pecos September 6th.

66. Zamenis lateralis (Hallow.) Side-striped whip snake.

Hab., Arizona and California.

Two young specimens, received from Oakland.

67. Coluber obsoletus confinis (B. & G.) Spotted mountain black snake.

Hab., southern United States.

Two specimens of this somewhat rare snake were received July 22d from Georgia.

68. Coluber subocularis\* A. E. Brown. H-spotted snake.

Hab., the Davis Mountains, Texas.

The discovery of an undescribed snake of some size within the limits of the United States was hardly to be expected at this day. Four specimens, however, the largest measuring rather more than five feet, were received during the Summer from Mr. Meyenberg, a collector of the Society at Pecos, Texas, which had been procured in the Davis Mountains, about fifty miles south of Pecos, and differed in important characters from any species previously known. They were described by the Secretary under the above name.

69. Pityophis catenifer catenifer (Blain.) California pine snake.

Hab., California to Oregon.

One small specimen from Oakland. Purchased.

70. Ophibolus alternus\* (A. E. Brown.) Alternating king snake.

Hab., the Davis Mountains, Texas.

From the same locality and collector which yielded the specimens of *Coluber subocularis* referred to above, a new king snake was received on October 22d. The specific name *alternus* which is applied to it has reference to the peculiarity of its color pattern, the gray ground color of the body being crossed on the back by bands of black two or three scales wide, and transversely marked on their centres with red, which alternate with other bands half their width and entirely black.

71. Diadophis amabilis B. & G. Pacific ring-necked snake. Hab., southwestern United States and Sonora. One specimen from California. Purchased.

Among other accessions, a few of special interest may be noted: Three scarlet king snakes, dug out of an Indian mound in Florida and presented by Mr. Clarence B. Moore on March 3d. Several examples of one of the burrowing ground boas (Eryx johni) from India; a fine female serval, and a specimen of the black-footed raccoon (Procyon hernandezi) from western Texas. A second example of the western raccoon was presented on November 7th by Mrs. Julia Stockton Robins. In May a regal-horned lizard was presented by Miss Mary K. Baker, of Philadelphia, and a pair of Zebu cattle, of a large breed, presented by Mrs. John Wanamaker.

On May 18th a number of burrowing owls were received from Seymour, Texas, and have remained in much better condition than any previously in the collection.

A fine male binturong was purchased on June 20th to complete a pair. On June 11th a male deer of the Sambur type, but of unknown species, was received from the New

York Zoological Society in exchange. This animal was formerly in the collection of the Duke of Bedford, but the locality from which it originally came is unknown.

The Hon. Henry Burk, of Philadelphia, presented to the Society on July 30th a fine young female leopard, which he had procured direct from India.

Four mud turtles received from Pecos, Texas, in September, are referred to *Cinosternum henrici* with some hesitation, as the relations of the western mud turtles to each other and to the eastern species are not yet fully made out.

A fine pair of young griffon vultures were purchased in November to replace those which had lived more than twenty years in the Gardens. A male red deer, five pronghorned antelopes and other animals were received from the International Forest, Fish and Game Association in exchange for certain specimens loaned to them.

- 33 common garter snakes (*Eutænia sirtalis*), July 6th, August 7th and 15th.
- 14 common water snakes (*Tropidonotus sipidon*), September 17th.
  - 8 Woodhouse's water snakes (T. s. transversus), September 16th.
- 10 Cyclops water snakes (T. cyclopeum), August 1st.
  - 1 coach whip snake (Zamenis flagellum), April 12th.
  - 2 copperheads (Ancistrodon contortrix), September 20th.
- 13 Poinsett's scaly lizards (Sceloporus poinsetti), June 25th.

The variability of the breeding period induced by captivity in many animals, is shown in this list by the European brown bear, which normally breeds early in the spring or late in the winter. The pair in the Gardens produced this year as late as July 25th; last year the same female bred on January 16th, and in 1899 on January 19th.

The axis deer of India also breeds indiscriminately in April and February.

The birth of a six-banded armadillo in captivity is unusual, and important observations upon the placenta of this species were made by Dr. H. C. Chapman.\*

The deaths were not numerous, but included the last of a pair of griffon vultures, purchased September 12th, 1878; the grizzly bear "Rose," which was received from Utah January 7th, 1874; a male American bison, and a male lion.

Numerous efforts have been made by the Board in past years to secure systematic and competent study of the pathological material furnished by animals dying in the Gardens; a field of observation strangely neglected in this age of investigation. For various reasons these attempts have been heretofore futile in results. During the autumn of 1901, Dr. Charles B. Penrose, with the assistance of Dr. C. Y. White, became interested in the work, and the studies which are now being made by these investigators seem to promise results of great value, not only in promoting the knowledge of disease, but also in the practical application of the morbid conditions noted, to the care of animals kept in captivity.

The old wolf and fox pens having become insecure, were torn down early in the summer and were rebuilt on the same site, but were extended eighteen feet at the southern end. The new structure of handsome design, and constructed of stone and iron, is one hundred and fifteen feet long and twenty-four and one-half feet deep, and contains fourteen pens, suited to hardy members of the dog tribe. The cost of this improvement was \$2763, of which \$2500 was provided by the city appropriation for work of permanent character.

With the object of providing the best facilities possible for keeping up the Society's herd of American buffalo, a space of ground some two and a half acres in extent, lying between the lake and the eastern boundary line, has been inclosed with Page wire fencing, and a pair of young buffalo, both bred in the Gardens, but not at all related, have been placed there. The produce of this pair, bred hereafter, with blood from some foreign source, will introduce a new and distinct strain into the Gardens, thereby assisting to the

best of our capacity the efforts to postpone for a few more years the inevitable end of this noble species.

The thanks of the Board are due to those who have made gifts to the Society during the year.
