“Bonaventure Barron was born in Clonmell, Co. Tipperary, and was nephew to Luke Wadding. His uncle took great care of his education, had him admitted into the Franciscan order, and sent for him to Rome. After a time he grew into great reputation, and was much taken notice of for the purity of his Latin style. He lived about sixty years at Rome, and died there, very old and blind, on the 18th March, 1696.”—*Ware's Writers*.
