These are the reasons for the exemption of the factory from the list of reparation factories. The factory was damaged by the bombing of the city of Osaka during the war and the equipment was destroyed. The factory was reconstructed and the production of tools was resumed. The factory is now producing tools for the reconstruction of the country and the welfare of the people. The factory is not producing weapons or military equipment and therefore it should be exempted from the list of reparation factories.

9. Number of employees: NONE at present
10. Reasons why we ask for the exemption:
  - a. Owing to the frequent air-raids during the war a Tool-factory in the premises of the Temma Plant of the Nakanishi Jikuke K.K., 68, 5-chome, Temmabashi-suji, Kitaku, Osaka City, was instructed to evacuate to avoid damages by the bombardment. The settlement was begun in April 1945 and completed in June same year.



We were busy with the preparation to operate the plant, then the termination of war was declared. Although the plant was closed soon after the war-end waiting for further instruction from the authority concerned, we are going to start now its operation, as soon as we get permit, with the production of bicycle parts.

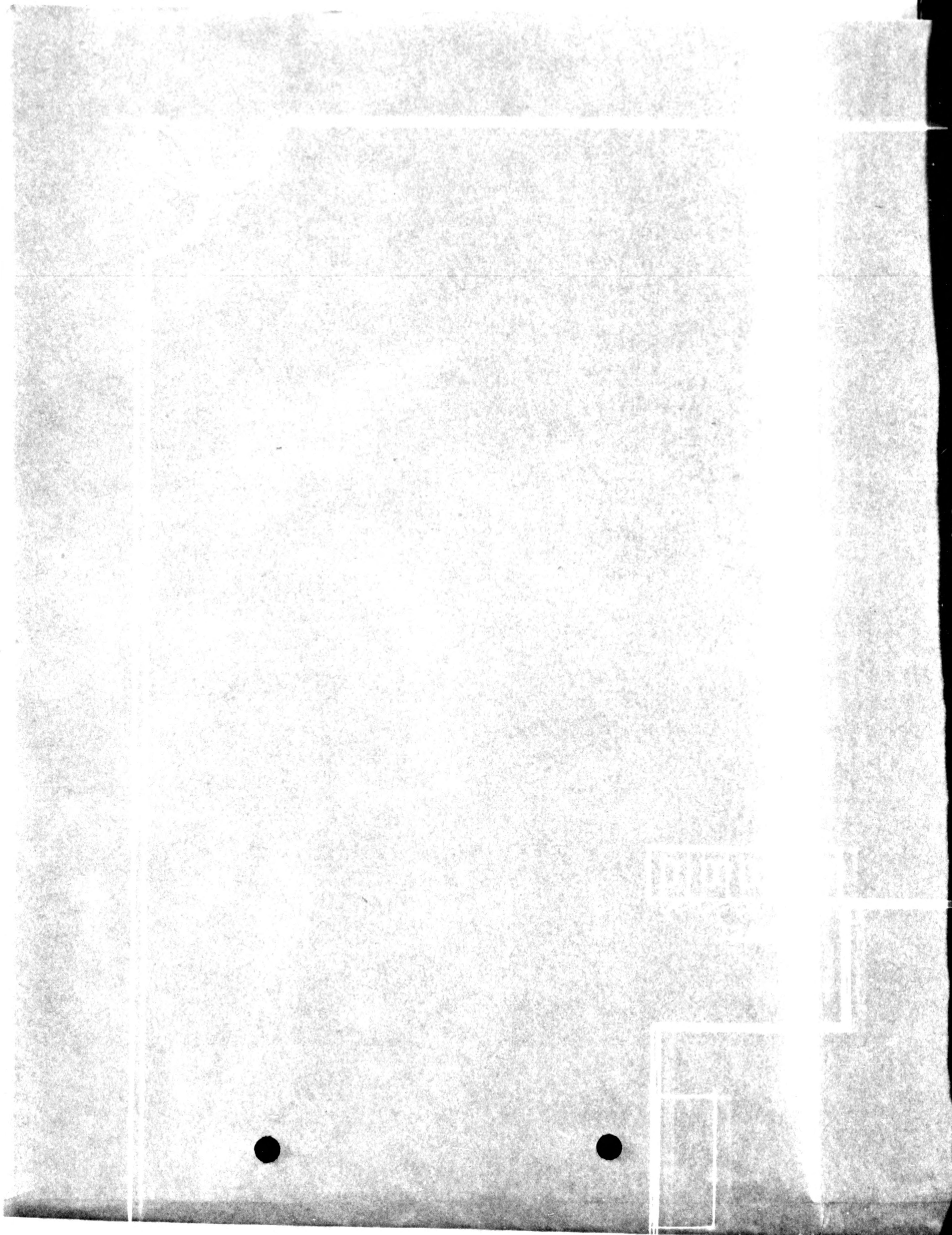
- b. We are tool-makers and neither ball-bearing nor its part was made by us.
- c. For the reasons given above, we beg to place a petition before you for the exclusion of our plant from the List of Reparation Factories.

d. Reason why we ask for the exemption

Though our factory was pointed out as the Ball bearing factory in the indication of the fourth reparation factory, at this time, our factory makes neither ball-bearing nor its part, and that we are busy with the preparation for the production of broach(toll) as the special occupation, when the war ended on the way of completion of these arrangements.



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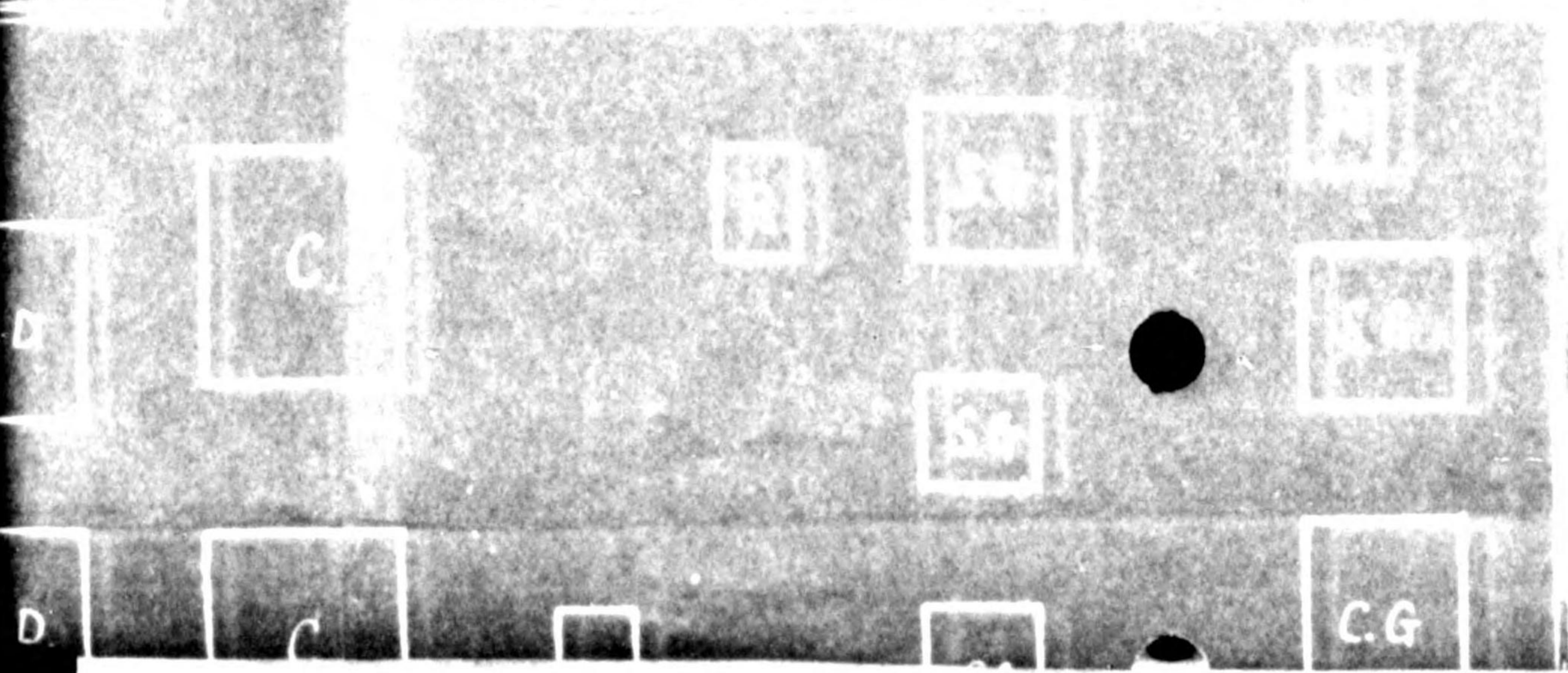
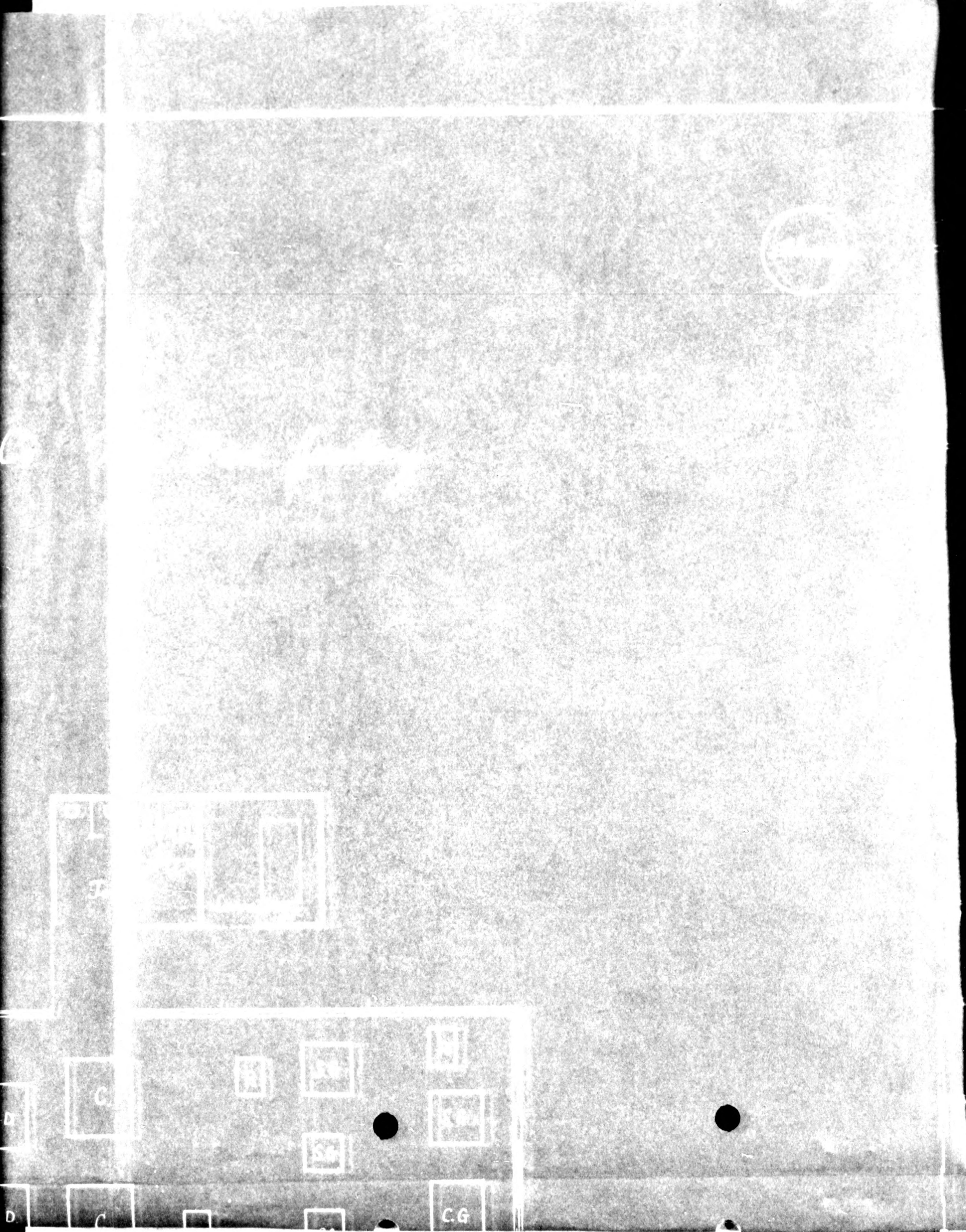
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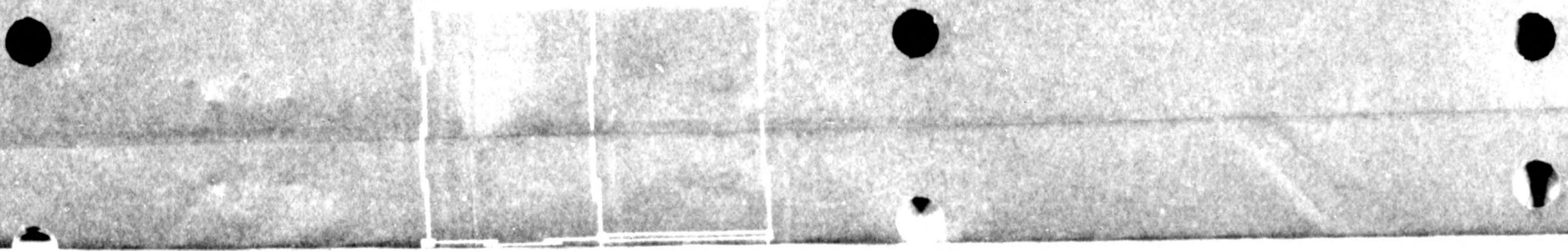









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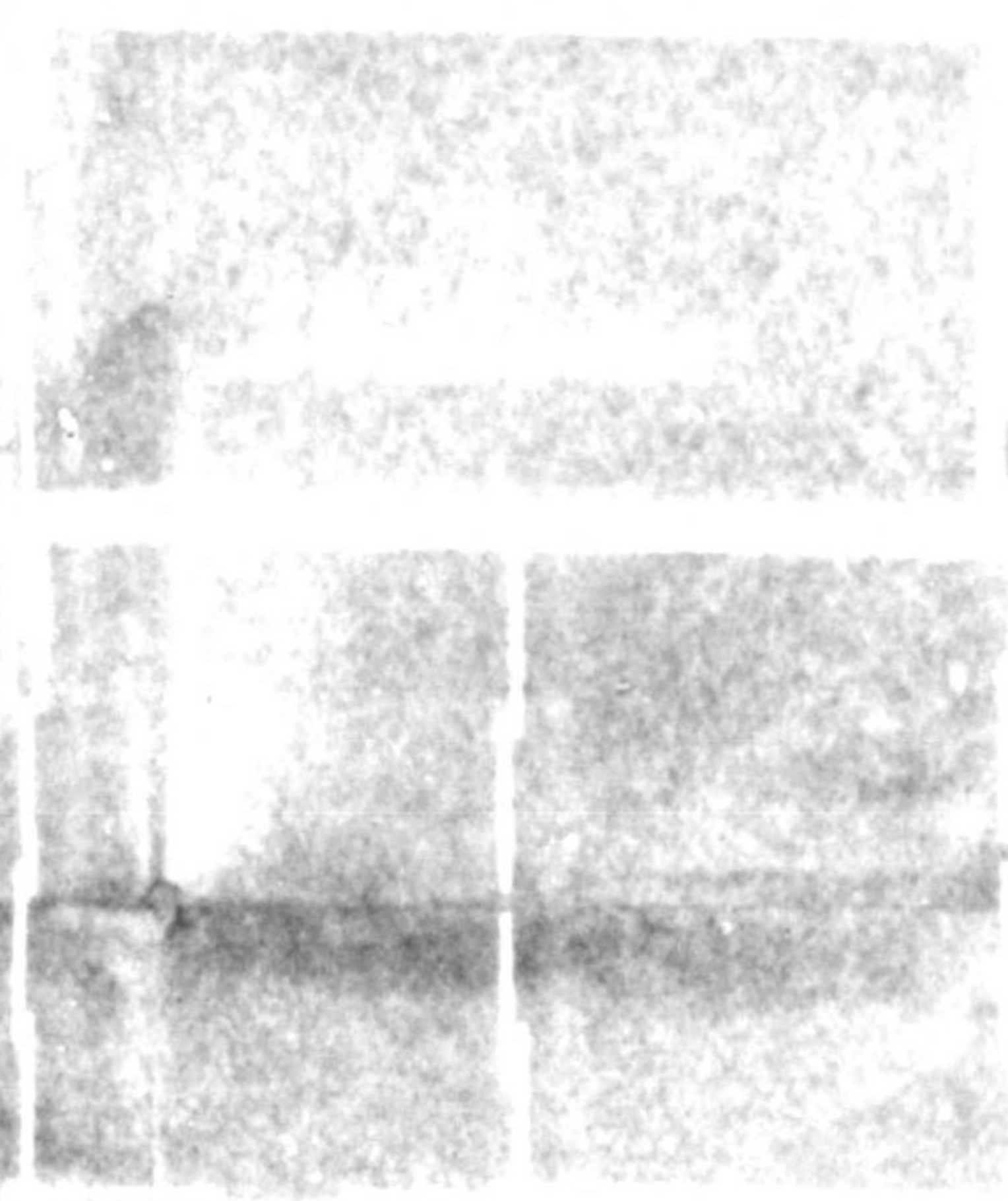
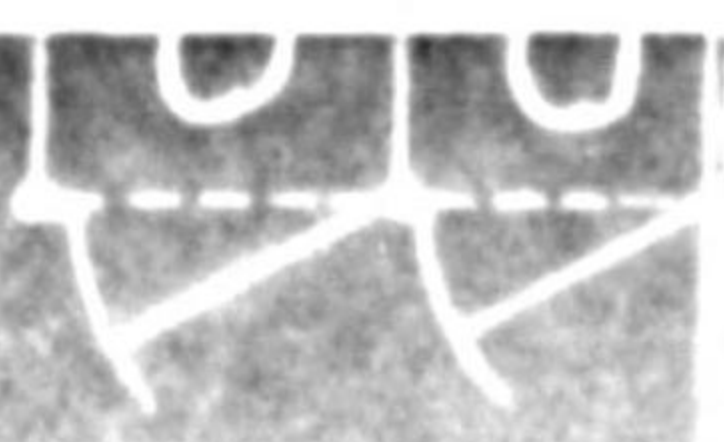

**A Petition**

My factory was designated as one of the No 4 Reparation Plant from the GHQ, which had a connection with the bearing on Aug. 23rd 1946. Since we started operating from Aug. 1943, according to the demand of the Bearing Factory, we were ordered to produce a maintenance machine, which is a part of the bearing. Our factory was producing mostly metal plates, such as cutting and pressing. So we haven't any capacity of producing inner and outer bearing, bolt etc.

It is quite different regarding to the production of bearing, We would like to make request to remove our factory from the Reparation Plant.

On Sept. 13th. Mr. Kuhe, in charge of the Commercial Industrial Sec. of GHQ. came to our Main Factory of in Kawachi and Tenme(Same as our Factory) for an inspection and we think that he recognized that its only for metal plate Works.

**Is not Precision Bearing Industry.**

The factory was established in 1911 as a maker of hand tools, architectural hardware and die-cast parts at the following places: Yamashiroji, Itoya, Gama Gita, under the name of Kikuchi Kikuchiro. Being the big success for his products, faced with the excellent quality and low prices, he was compelled to

Financially we have no connection with the Zaibatsu-financial clique of Japan.

9. Brief History of the Factory:

The factory was first established by Tatsujiro NAKANISHI, father of the present president, in 1917 as a maker of Metal Toys, Architectural Hardwares and Bicycle parts at the following place: Temmabshisuji, Kitaku, Osaka City, under the name of Nakanishi Seisakusho. Owing to the big demand for his products, famed with the excellent workmanship and cheap prices, he was compelled to



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build up several branch factories to meet the over-whelming orders both at home and from abroad. Since the occurrence of the Chino-Japanese affairs, the demand for the ball-bearing increased remarkably and in compliance with the request of the Japanese Army, the organization of the firm was changed from a private enterprise to an incorporated company in 1941 and began to work as subcontractors of various bearing makers in the manufacturing of the bearing-retainers, most of which were done by our pressing & punching machines. In parallel to the increase of the demand in this line, we had to extend our facility and in 1943 we acquired the former factory of the Ise Orimono K.K. at the above-said place and built a new plant, which is called now our Mie Plant. We were ordered by the Japanese Army to do our business as the supplier of the bearing retainers to the bearing makers. On the termination of the war, we started manufacture of Kitchen utensils and Farming tools and in December 1945 parts of Bicycles.

COMPARISON

Other makers

NAKANISHI

- 1. Majority of other makers depend part-supply on subcontractors. It is generally recognized that the bicycle makers purchase parts more than 50%.
- 2. Being depending on lath-work, a great deal of material loss and lack of interchangeability.
- 3. Existing difficulties in obtaining proper material in proper size.
- 4. By these reasons; higher cost of production.

- 1. We can set up bicycles by making every part needed to assemble a complete set. Here rolling-mill acts an essential role in supplying & utilizing every & single pcs. which otherwise would turn to scrap.
- 2. Press work is, in every course, most efficiently employed, basing on years experience. In fact, majority of our machinery is of various types of stamping & punching press.
- 3. By our rolling mills we find no difficulties in getting proper materials of any size required.
- 4. Thus; very low cost of production.

These facts carry its explanation that we can make bicycles at a very low costs in a mass production system. The location of this plant is very favorable for procuring food, which is one of the important factors for smooth running of factory from the view point of its workers.

We can send out complete bicycles, making here the above-given parts and getting others from other plants of this company.

If this plant be chosen to remain as it is, the following figures can be given as our future products:

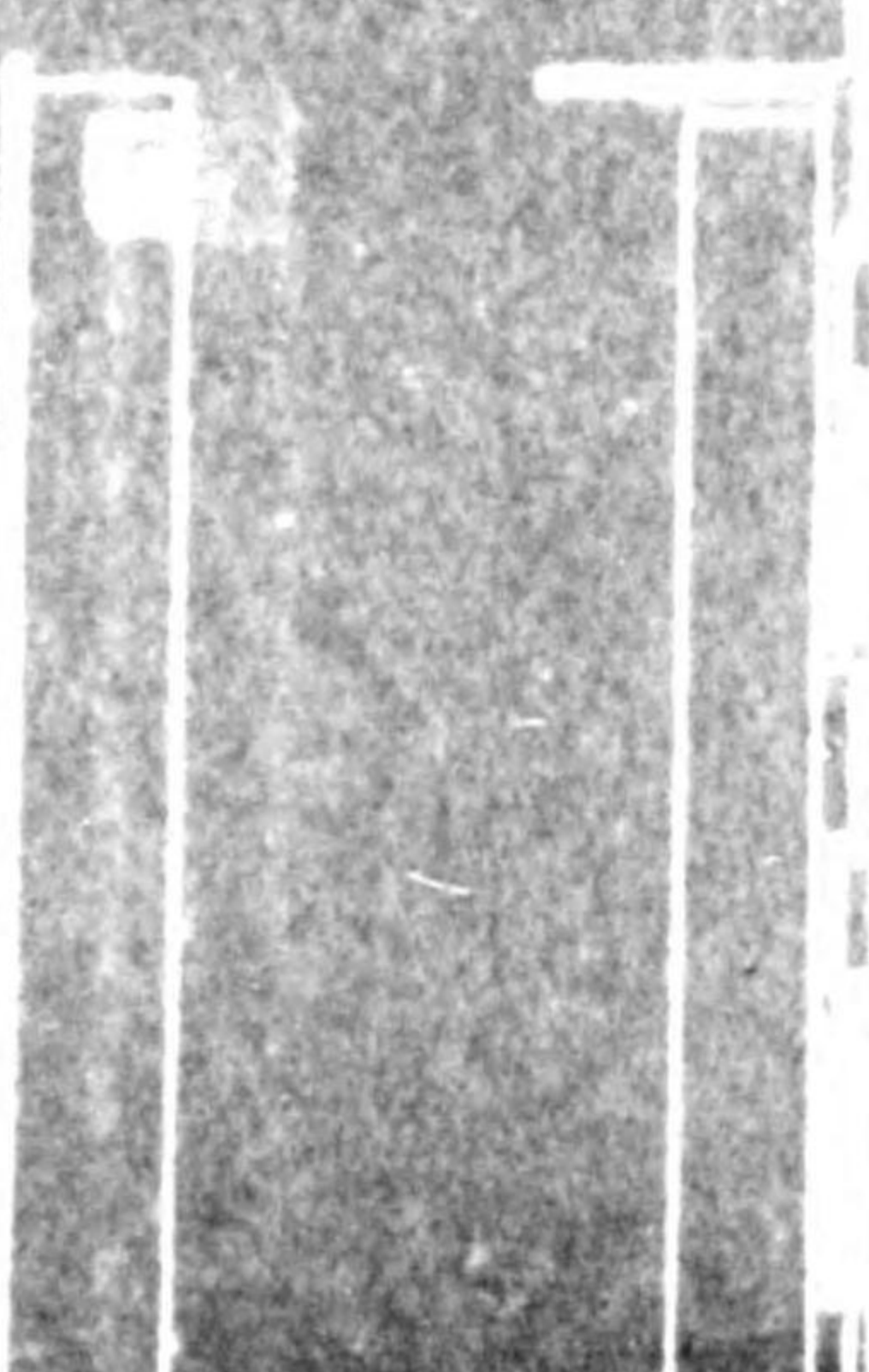
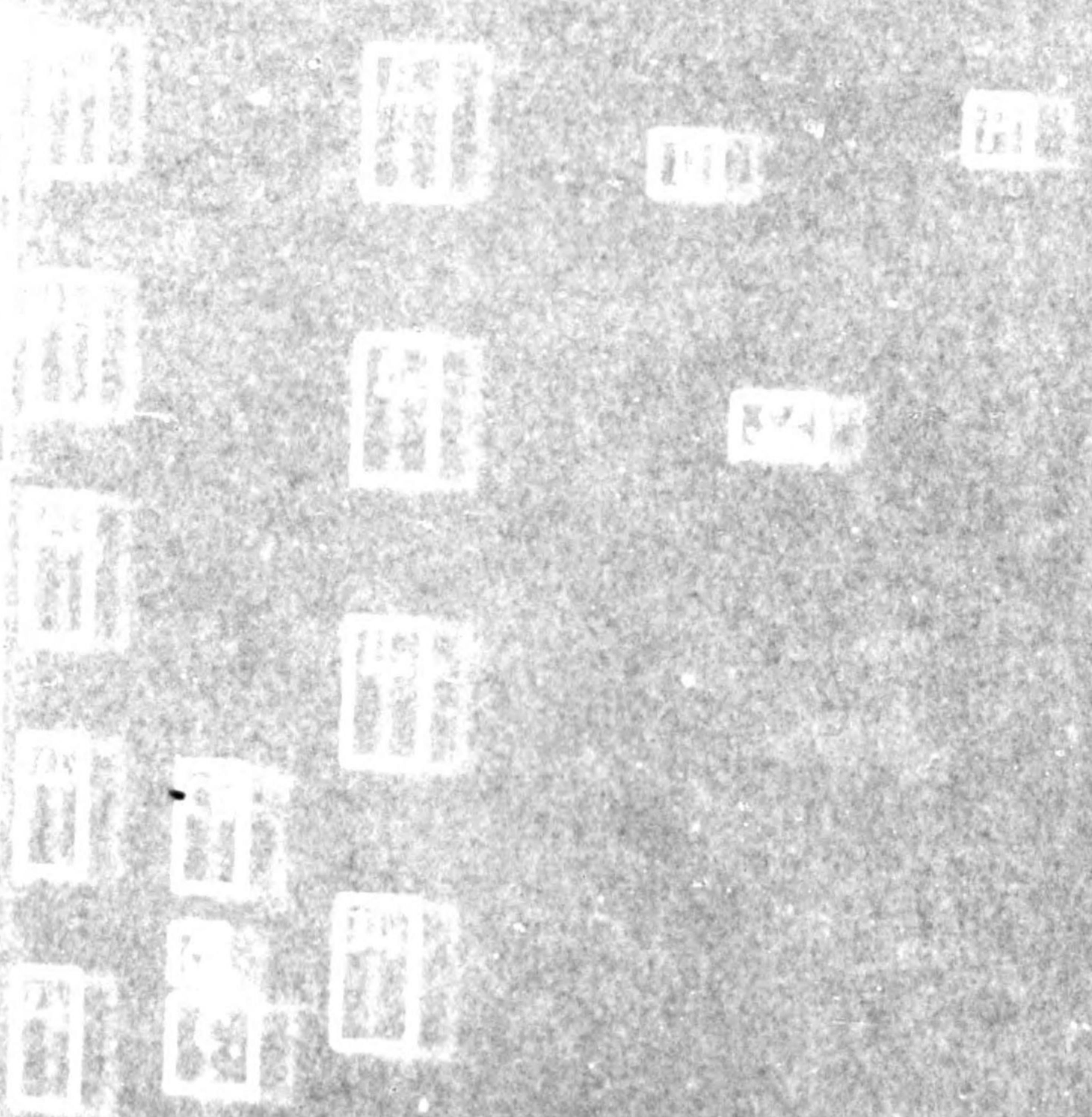
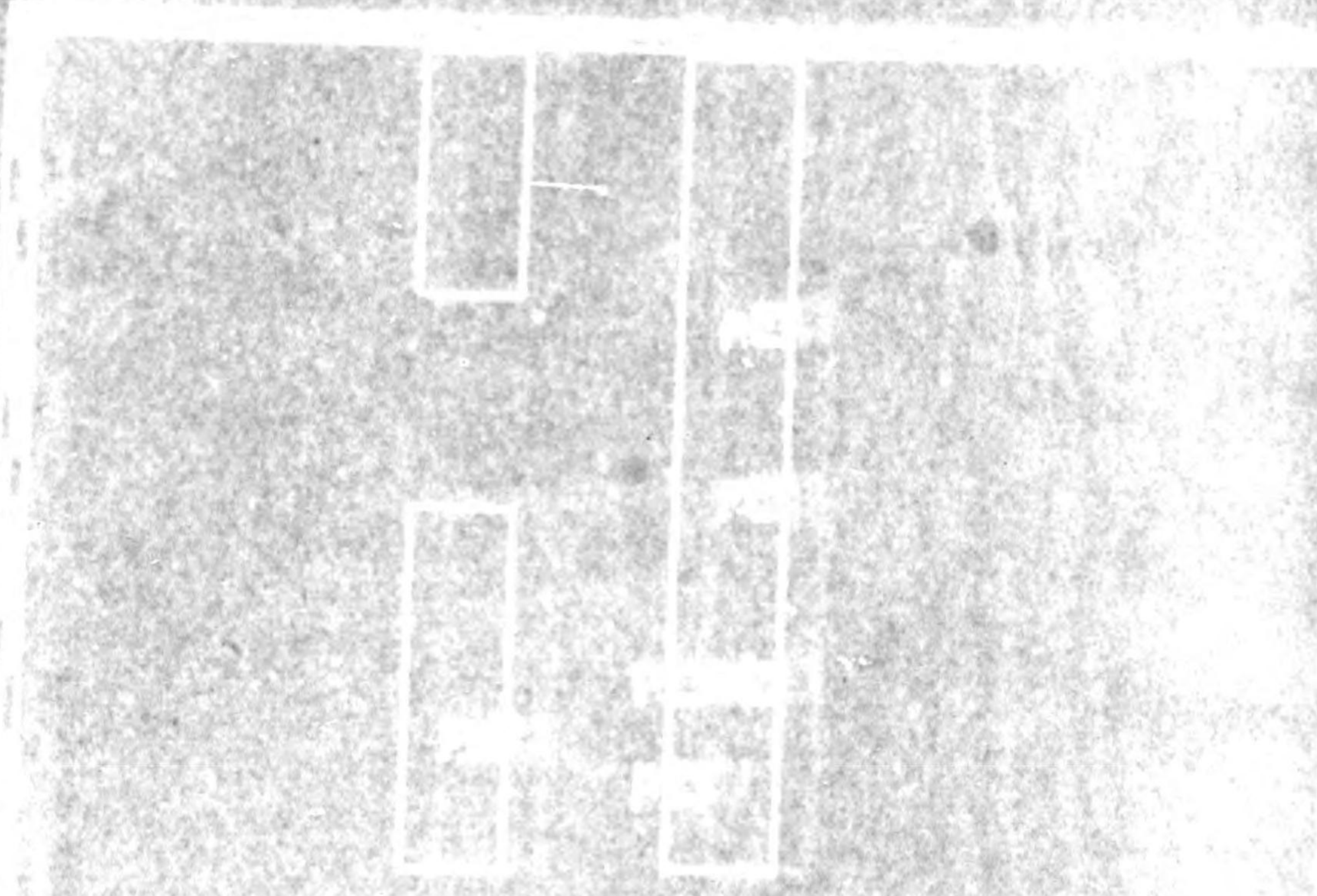


REASONS FOR THE PETITION

- A. The Mie Plant of the NAKANISHI KINZOKU K.K. is now manufacturing the complete parts of the bicycles, which we think, are the foremost articles necessary for the daily life as well as for the foreign trade to be exchanged with other goods required by Japan. The activity of the factory has been an influential one for this town's industry. If this factory is to be closed down due to the present designation, the life of the townsfolk will also be affected financially.
- B. It has 275 employees in the factory. They are living with their dependants in this town or in the adjoining villages. The non-employment thus aroused will form one of the grave problem in this town.
- C. The factory being the only one in this town, the finance dept of this town-office will be put in a very unfavorable situation by its disappearance from this area. Not only from the financial point of view but also from that of future development of this town, it presents a serious theme, as they have really added much to the administration of this district, both mentally and financially.



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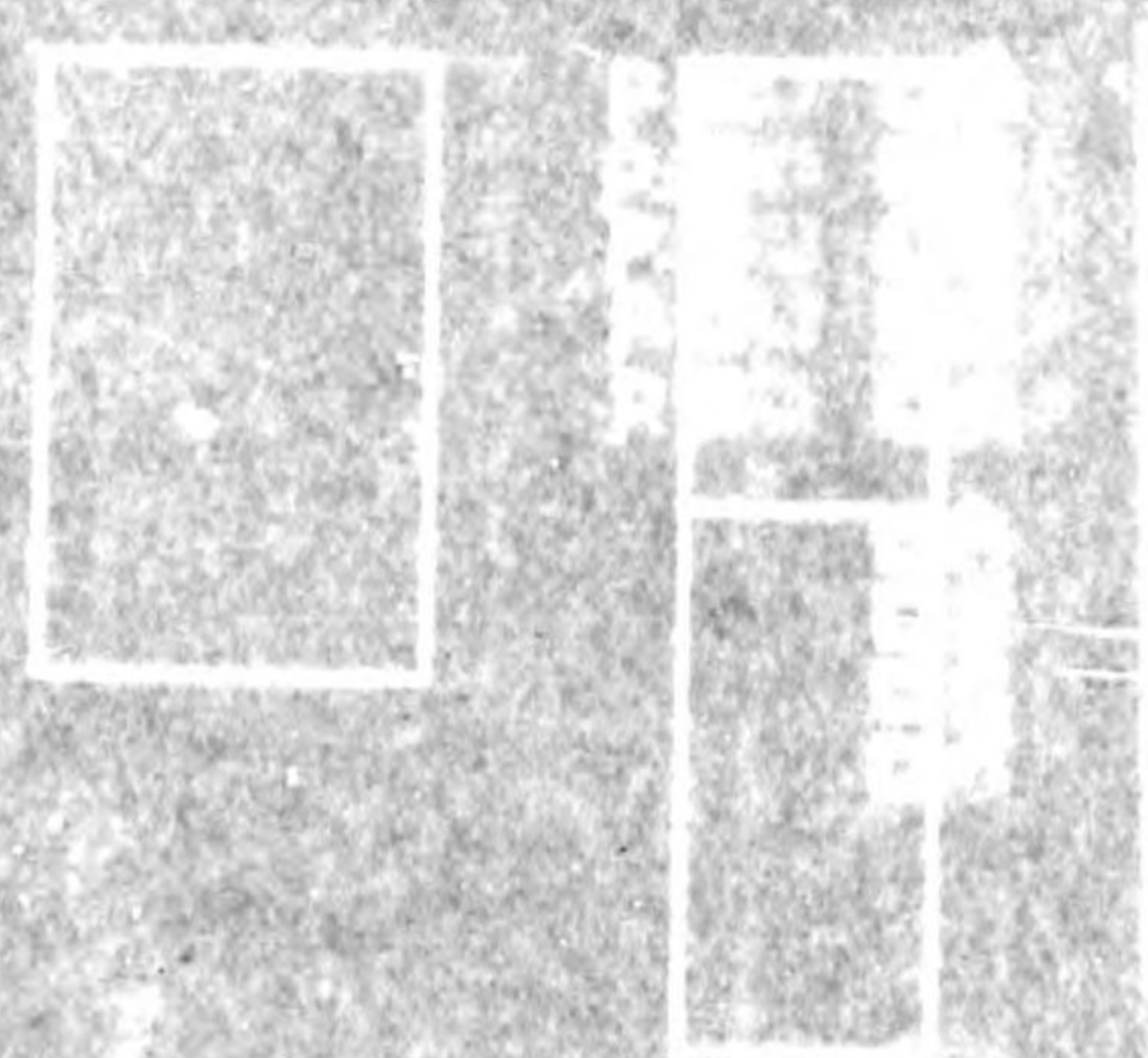
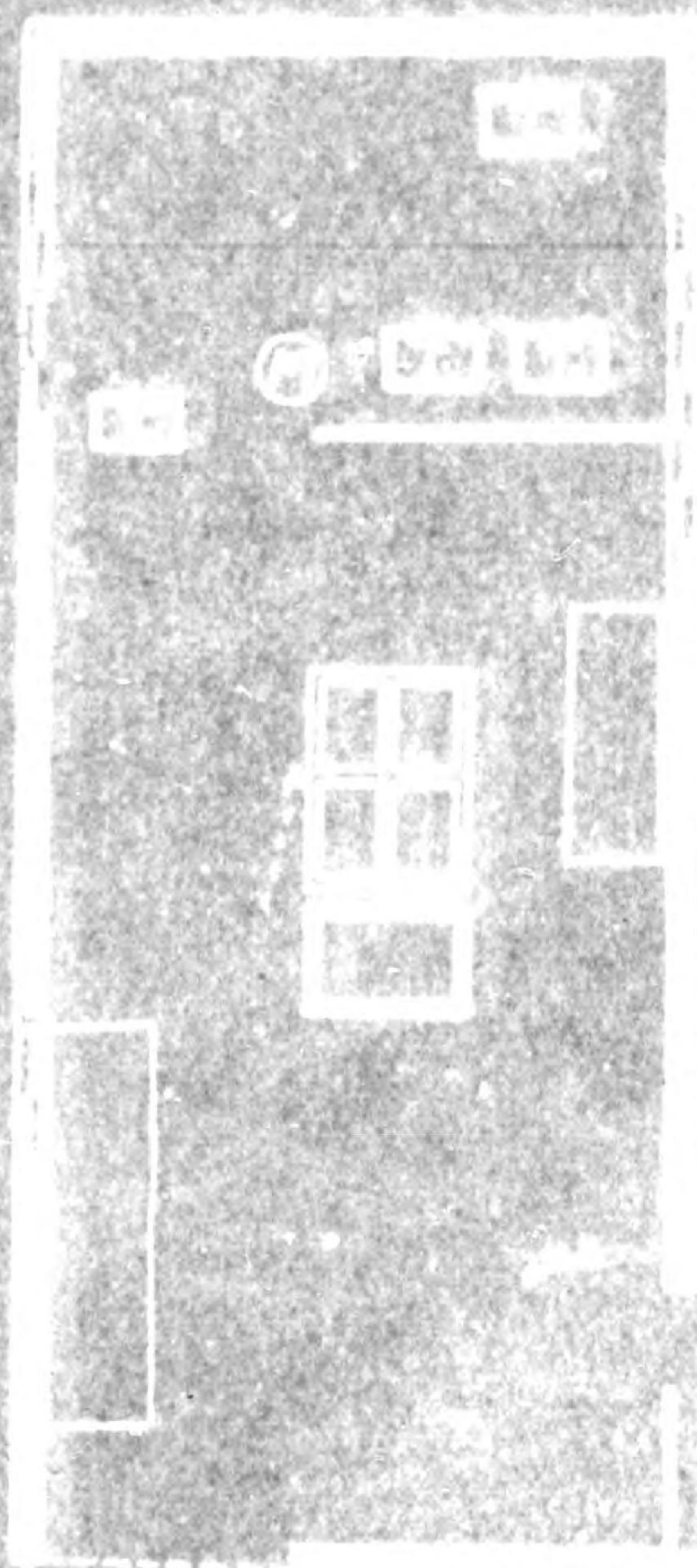
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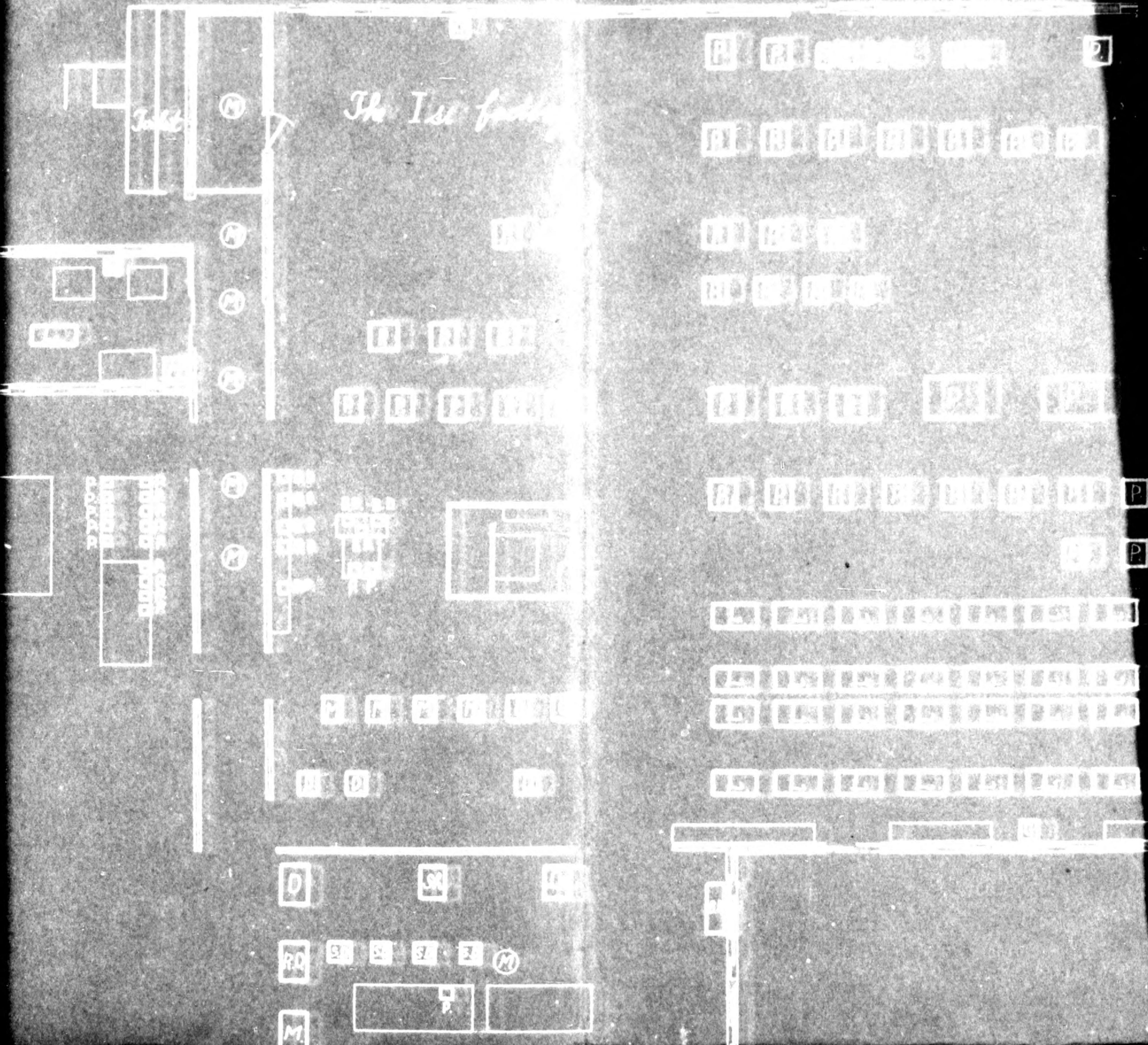
