Cabinet Order concerning the Restoration of Property to J. & P. Coats, Ltd.

In accordance with the Ordinance concerning the Orders to be issued in consequence of the Acceptance of Potsdam Declaration (Imperial Ordinance No. 542 of 1945), the Cabinet establishes this Cabinet Order.

(Purport of the present Cabinet Order)

Article 1. Matters necessary for the restoration, upon the requirement of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the property which is now in the hands of Fuji Boseki Kabushiki Kaisha (seat of the principal office; Chuoku, Tokyo-to; hereinafter referred to as "Fuji Boseki") to J. & P. Coats, Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "Coats"), shall be provided for by the present Cabinet Order.

The restoration of the property as provided in the preceding paragraph shall, unless otherwise provided in the present Cabinet Order, be effected in accordance with the provisions

of the Ordinance on Returning, etc. of Allied Nationals' Property (Imperial Ordinance No. 294 of 1946).

(Reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi)

Article 2. Teikoku Seishi Kabushiki Kaisha (seat of the principal office: Ryuge-cho, Nakakawa-chi-gun, Osaka-fu; hereinafter referred to as "pre-war Teikoku Seishi") which ceased to exist due to the amalgamation as of July 1, 1943 shall be reestablished on the date of the approval of the plan as provided in Article 6.

- 2 The Kabushiki Kaisha which is reestablished under the provisions of the preceding paragraph (hereinafter referred to as "Teikoku Seishi") shall be by the tradename of Teikoku Seishi Kabushiki Kaisha and with a capitalization of ₹2,000,000 and other items of the articles of incorporation shall be the same as that of pre-war Teikoku Seishi.
- 3 Upon approval as provided in Paragraph 1, the Minister of Finance shall forthwith commission the Registry which has jurisdiction over the seat of the principal office of Teikoku Seishi to register the following particulars:
- (1) The object;
- (2) The trade name;
- (3) The total amount of capital;
- (4) The amount of each share;
- (5) The seat of the principal office;
- (6) The manner in which the company is to give its public notices;
- (7) The period of duration;
- (8) The provisions as to restriction on the transfer of share and prohibition of indorsement of share certificate;
- (9) The full name and address of each director and auditor.
- 4 Upon commission of registration as mentioned in the preceding paragraph, the Registry shall effect the registration.
- 5 Procedures for the registration as mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall be set by the Attorney-General.

(Director and Auditor of Teikoku Seishi)

Article 3. The directors and auditors of Teikoku Seishi shall be those of pre-war Teikoku Seishi as of December 7, 1941.

- 2 The term of office of the directors and auditors as mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall be until the termination of the first general meeting of shareholders after the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi.
- 3 The director and auditor of Teikoku Seishi as provided in Paragraph 1 shall be exempted from the application of the following provisions; in so far as they may hold concurrently the position of an officer of Teikoku Seishi and an officer or employee of Fuji Boseki;

provided that, such exemption shall be effective only for the period between the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi and termination of the first general meeting of shareholders as provided in the preceding paragraph:

(1) Article 11 of the Imperial Ordinance concerning the Restriction on Securities Holdings, etc. by Companies (Imperial Ordinance No. 567 of 1946);

(2) Article 13 of the Law relating to the Prohibition of Private Monopoly and Method Preserving of Fair Trade (Law No. 54 of 1947).

(Transfer of the Property)

Article 4. Fuji Boseki shall transfer to Teikoku Seishi the following properties in accordance with the approved plan as mentioned in the provisions of Article 6. In this case Fuji Boseki shall not require the decision made at a general meeting of shareholders.

(1) Fuji Boseki's Yao Mills (Location; Ryugecho, Nakakawachi-gun, Osaka-fu) its site, and machineries, equipments as well as other properties located in the said Mills as they exist at the present time;

(2) Ten thousand shares of stock of Teikoku Katan-Ito Kabushiki Kaisha (seat of the principal office; Kita-ku, Osaka-shi);

(3) Trademarks formerly registered in the name of pre-war Teikoku Seishi.

- 2 The Holding Company Liquidation Commission shall, immediately after the effective date of the present Cabinet Order, deliver without compensation to Fuji Boseki the ten thousand shares of stock of Teikoku Katan-Ito Kabushiki Kaisha, as mentioned in item 2 of the preceding paragraph and shall get back from the said company the receipt which the Holding Company Liquidation Commission has issued under the provisions of Article 11 of the Holding Company Liquidation Commission Ordinance (Imperial Odrinance No. 233 of 1946).
- In the case of the preceding paragraph, the instructions of transfer issued by the Holding Company Liquidation Commission on March 6, 1947 to Fuji Boseki in connection with the shares of stock concerned under the provisions of Article 10, Paragraph 1 of the said Ordinance shall be invalidated and the transfer contract under the said instructions shall be regarded to be rescinded.

(Shares of Stock of Teikoku Seishi)

Article 5. When Teikoku Seishi is reestablished under the provisions of Paragraph 1 of Article 2, Coats shall be given 12,000 shares of stock of Teikoku Seishi (6,000 fully paid shares and 6,000 partially paid shares to the extent of \(\frac{4}{75}\)) and Fuji Boseki shall be given 8,000

shares of stock of Teikoku Seishi (4,000 fully paid shares and 4,000 partially paid shares to the extent of \(\frac{1}{2}\)75) which will be regulated under the provisions of the Article 10, Paragraph 1 of the Holding Company Liquidation Commission Ordinance.

2 Out of the shares of stock mentioned above, the partially paid shares shall be regarded as shares on which the payment has not been completed on the effective date of the Law for Partial Amendments to the Commercial Code (Law No. 148 of 1948) upon application of Articles 3 and 4, of the Supplementary Provisions of the said Law.

(Plan for Reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi)
Article 6. Fuji Boseki shall, not later than the date designated by the Minister of Finance, submit a plan for the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi and transfer of properties incidental thereto, to the Minister of Finance, and obtain his approval. In this case, the Minister of Finance may, if he deems it to be necessary, approve it with modification.

2 The plan mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall be annexed with the following statements:

(1) The inventories and balance sheets of the pre-war Teikoku Seishi as of December 20, 1941;

(2) A statement showing the values according to their official records of the fixed assets to be transferred and restored to Teikoku Seish in accordance with the provisions of Articles 4 and 9;

(3) A statement of the values of manufactured goods, raw materials and other stocks at Fuji Boseki's Yao Mills, as of November 25, 1948.

Minister of Finance after the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi, Fuji Boseki shall make a statement showing the values of manufactured goods, raw materials and other stocks at Fuji Boseki's Yao Mills as of the date of the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi, and shall submit it to the Minister of Finance for his authorization. In this case, the Minister of Finance may order to Fuji Boseki to modify the said statements, if he deems it to be incorrect.

4 Out of the properties to be transferred to Teikoku Seishi from Fuji Boseki in accordance with the provisions of Article 4, the manufactured goods, raw materials and other stocks listed in the statement authorized in accordance with provisions of the preceding paragraph, shall be transferred at the values stated in the said statement, and the obligation of

payment of the said values shall be the sole indebtedness of Teikoku Seishi to Fuji Boseki, arising from the enforcement of return as provided by the present Cabinet Order.

(Alteration of the Tradename of Teikoku Katan-Ito Kabushiki Kaisha)

Article 7. Tradename of Teikoku Katan-Ito Kabushiki Kaisha shall be altered to Teikoku Katan-Ito Hambai Kabushiki Kaisha on the effective date of the present Cabinet Order.

In the case of the preceding paragraph, the Minister of Finance shall forthwith commission to the Registry the registration of alteration.

3 The provisions of Paragraphs 4 and 5 of Article 2 shall apply mutatis mutandis in case of the preceding paragraph.

(Exceptional Treatment for Indebtedness)

Article 8. Coats shall be released from any and all claims whatsoever which Fuji may have arising from the enforcement of return as provided by the present Cabinet Order.

(Relation with other Laws and Ordinances)

Article 9. Teikoku Seishi shall be regarded as the successor of the pre-war Teikoku Seishi and shall be regulated under the provisions of the Ordinance on Returning, etc. of Allied Nationals' Property, in respect to the restitution of properties of the pre-war Teikoku Seishi listed in the inventory and balance sheet of the said company as of December 7, 1941, with exception of those enumerated in Article 4, Paragraph 1.

Article 10. The following provisions shall not apply to the transfer of property or the acquisition of shares of stock as provided in Article 4 or Article 5:

(1) Articles 22 and 23 of the Law concerning the Emergency Measures for the Account of Companies (Law No. 7 of 1946)

(2) Article 2 of the Imperial Ordinance concerning the Restriction on Securities Holdings, etc. by Companies (Imperial Ordinance No. 567 of 1946)

(3) Article 3 of the Law concerning Adjustment and Coordination of Disposal of Securities and Others (Law No. 8 of 1947)

(4) Article 7 of the Elimination of Excessive Concentration of Economic Power Law (Law No. 207 of 1947).

Article 11. Imperial Ordinance concerning the Restriction on Securities Holdings, etc. by Companies shall not apply to Teikoku Seishi.

Article 12. The shares of stock acquired by Teikoku Seishi under the provisions of Articles 4 and 9 shall be regarded to be actually owned by Teikoku Seishi in violation of the provisions of Article 10 of the Law relating to the Prohibition of Private Monopoly and Method of preserving Fair Trade at the time for enforcement of the said provisions, and shall be subjected mutatis mutandis to the application of the provisions of Article 107 of the said Law and provisions of Article 1, 2 and 6 of the Cabinet Order on Disposition of Stocks and Debentures as provided for by Article 107, Article 108 and Article 110 of the Law No. 54 of 1947, relating to Prohibition of Private Monopoly and Method of Preserving of Fair Trade (Cabinet Order No. 43 of 1947; hereinafter referred to as "Cabinet Order No. 43"). In this case, "enforcement date thereof" as stated in the provisions of Article 1 Paragraph 6 of Cabinet Order No. 43 shall read "the date of the reestablishment of Teikoku Seishi."

(Non-taxation)

Article 13. The Registration Tax or the Security Transfer-tax shall not be levied on registration under the provisions of Article 2, 4 or 7, or transfer of shares of stock under the provisions of Article 4.

2 The local public bodies shall not levy local taxes on the acquisition of the properties under the provisions of Article 4.

(Exceptional Treatment for Taxation)

Article 14. The assets accrued to Teikoku Seishi resulting from the transfer of the properties from Fuji Boseki without compensation in accordance with the provisions of Articles 4 and 9, shall not be regarded as "the profit" in the computation of normal income accrued during an accounting period as provided in the Corporation Tax Law (Law No. 28 of 1947) and of income accrued during an accounting period upon imposing Business Tax in the Local Tax Law (Law No. 110 of 1948).

2 The loss accrued to Fuji Boseki from 'the transfer of the properties to Teikoku Seishi without compensation in accordance with the provisions of Articles 4 and 9 during the accounting period shall not be regarded as "the loss" in computation of normal income accrued during an accounting period as provided in the Corporation Tax Law and of income accured during an accounting period upon imposing Business Tax in the Local Tax Law.

(Penal Provisions)

Article 15. Any person who violates the provisions of Article 4, Paragraph 1 shall be liable to penal servitude for a period not exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding \(\frac{1}{2}\)10,000.

- (1) A person who failed to submit a plan, annexed statement or inventory in contravention of the provisions of Article 6 or who submitted false documents;
- (2) A person who failed to submit the plan for disposal of shares of stock in contravention of provisions of Article 2, Paragraph 1 of Cabinet Order No. 43 which applies mutatis mutandis in Article 12;
- (3) A person who failed to take step, who disposed of shares, who failed to report, who submitted false report or who failed to follow the instruction in contravention of the provisions of Article 6, Paragraph 4, 5, 6 or 7 of Cabinet Order No. 43 which is applied mutatis mutandis in Article 12.
- Article 17. In case a representative agent, employee or other hired man of a juridical person commits the offences as mentioned in the provisions of the preceding two Articles in regard to the business or property of the said juridical person, the juridical person concerned shall be liable to a fine prescribed in the preceding two Articles in addition to the punishment of the actual offender.

Supplementary Provision:

Article 18. The present Cabinet Order shall come into force as from the day of its plomulgation.

For the purpose of enforcing the Fisheries Cooperative Association Law (Law No. 242 of 1948) and the Law concerning the Consolidation of the Fisheries Organization and Others in conformity to the Enactment of the Fisheries Cooperative Association Law (Law No. 243 of 1948), the Cabinet establishes this Cabinet Order.

(Date of Enforcement)

Article 1. The Fisheries Cooperative Association
Law (hereinafter called "Cooperative Law")
and the Law concerning the Consolidation of
the Fisheries Organization and Others in conformity to the Enactment of the Fisheries
Cooperative Association Law (hereinafter called
"Consolidation Law") with the exception of
the stipulation in Art. 2, shall come into force
as from February 15, 1949 respectively.

(Jurisdictional Administrative Authorities)
Article 2. The Minister of Agriculture and Forestry shall be the competent Minister in the case of Art. 32, Par. 3 and Art. 127 of the Cooperative Law. However, in the case where the fisheries cooperative association conducts the businesses mentioned in Art. 11, Par. 1, Item 1 or 2; Art. 87, Par. 1, Item 1 or 2; Art. 93, Par. 1, Item 1 or 2 or Art. 97, Par. 1, Item 1 or 2 of the Cooperative Law, the competent Ministers shall be the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry and the Minister of Finance.

The administrative authority concerning the stipulations in Arts. 122 and 123 of the Cooperative Law, despite the stipulation in the proviso to the preceding paragraph, may be executed independently by the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry and the Minister of Finance.

Article 3. The competent Minister in the case of Art. 1, Par. 7 of the Consolidation Law; and the administrative authories mentioned in Art. 10, Par. 2, which applies with necessary modifications in Art. 11, Pars. 1 and 2 of the same Law shall be the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry.

- of Art. 1, Par. 6; Art. 2, Par. 1 and Art. 12, Par. 4 (including the case where it applies with necessary modifications in Art. 12, Par. 5) of the Consolidation Law shall be, in the event of fisheries associations, the governor of the Metropolis, Hokkaido or prefecture or the mayor of a special city within whose jurisdiction the main office thereof is located, and the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry in the event of other fisheries organizations.
- of Art. 5, Par. 1 and Par. 3 (including the case where it applies with necessary modifications in Art. 7, Par. 2 and Art. 9, Par. 2); Art. 7, Par. 1; Art. 9, Par. 1 and Art. 10, Pars. 1 and 2 of the Consolidation Law shall be the governor of the Metropolis, Hokkaido or prefecture or the mayor of a special city within whose jurisdiction the main offices of the said fisheries association is located.

(Consolidation of Relevant Orders)
Article 4. The Enforcement Ordinance for the

Fisheries Organization Law (Imperial Ordinance No. 704 of 1943) and the Fisheries Organization Registration Ordinance (Imperial Ordinance No. 706 of 1943) shall be abolished.

2 The aforementioned Imperial Ordinances shall be effective even after the enforcement of this Cabinet Order in the cases of those fisheries organizations which are functioning at the time of enforcement of this Cabinet Order.

Article 5. A part of the Enforcement Regulations of the Revenue Stamp Law (Imperial Ordinance No. 183 of 1944) shall be amended as follows:

Art. 1, Items 9 and 10 shall be amended as follows:

(9) Fishermen's Cooperative Association, Fishermen's Production Association, Federation of Fishermen's Cooperative Associations, Fisheries Processing Cooperative Association and Federation of Fisheries Processing Cooperative Associations (excluding those Fishermen's Cooperative Association or Federation of Fishermen's Cooperative Associations which do not require its affiliated member associations or members to make investments).

(10) Deleted.

In Art. 2, "Fisheries Associations, Manufacturers' Associations and" shall be deleted.

Article 6. A part of the Enforcement Regulations of the Income Tax Law (Imperial Ordinance No. 110 of 1947) shall be amended as follows:

In Art. 4, Par 1, Item 1 of the Supplementary Provisions, "Fisheries Associations and Manufacturers' Association" shall read "Fishermen's Cooperative Association and Fisheries Processing Cooperative Association."
