SUBJECT : Recommendation for action on pending case,  
(KIHARA, Shichiro)

1. The questionnaire of KIHARA, Shichiro was submitted to SCAP without action for the Central Screening Committee. The apparent reason for their not taking action on this case was that although KIHARA was a "recommended candidate" in the 1942 election his questionnaire was accompanied by an elaborate explanation of this "recommendation" in which he stated he was recommended after the initial list of candidates was published, and further that he refused a 5,000 yen election which the Imperial Rule Assistance Association offered to him at the time of his "recommendation".

2. Inasmuch as KIHARA was a "recommended" candidate for the 1942 election he falls under the mandatory provision of sub-paragraph 8, paragraph G of SCAPIN 550. His case should therefore be of the type which should be presented to the Appeals Board.

3. It is believed that a variation in this case from normal procedure would serve no good purpose, and would further establish an undesirable precedent.

4. By way of additional information, which has no direct bearing on this case, is the fact that KIHARA was the President of the Teikoku Tsushin Sha K.K. (Imperial News Service Company) during the period 1934 to 1940. Although this paper is not one which has been submitted by the Japanese Government as one coming within the scope of the interpretation of Category G, there is a distinct possibility that it would.

SUBJECT: Designation of Recommended Candidates


1. There were 466 seats in the House of Representatives of the Japanese Government in 1942. An equal number of persons were recommended for these positions by the IRAA. However, these candidates were not allocated one to a prefecture. Chiba, Tokyo, Gifu, Kyoto, Wakayama, Shimane, Okayama and Yamaguchi recommended one more candidate than their respective number of Diet seats. Conversely, eight prefectures, namely: Aomori, Miyagi, Ibaragi, Aichi, Mie, Osaka, Kagawa and Kochi recommended one less candidate than their respective seats.

2. All of the living recommended candidates are designated under SCAPIN 550 with the exception of Shinkiyo Moriyuki who has not been repatriated from Okinawa, and Royama Masamichi, candidate in the bi-election who was reinstated by the Appeal Board.

3. Summary of the status quo of this group of individuals:

Memo of "Recommended Candidates"

The number of "Recommended Candidates" totals 466, of those 321 ones became successful and 85 non-successful. By the way eight prefectures such as Chiba, Tokyo, Gifu, Kyoto, Wakayama, Shimane, Okayama and Yamaguchi recommended one more candidate than their respective number of the Diet seats, while eight prefectures such as Aomori, Miyagi, Ibaragi, Aichi, Mie, Osaka, Kagawa and Kochi recommended one less candidate than their respective seats.

Para VII, 9, appendix I, Cabinet & Home <sup>affairs</sup> Ministry Ordinance #1, 1947

9. Any person who held between 7 July 1937 and 2 September 1945 any one of the following positions.

Chief of metropolitan, city, ward, town or village federation of branches or chief of city, ward, town or village branch of the Imperial Ex-Servicemen's Association (Zaigo Gunjin Kai).



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....."11. All military and organizations in Japan, including ex-officers' organizations, together with their affiliates and the clubs which were used for making propaganda for militarism and ultra-nationalism should be dissolved and their revival or establishment in any form, including a disguised form, should be prohibited. The application of this para should extend also to various associations created under the guise of production associations, such as cooperative societies for joint cultivation of land, for fishing, and others, which are composed wholly or substantially of ex-officers of the Army and Navy and gendarmerie and headed by their former military commanders. This para should apply also to any other associations composed wholly or substantially of ex-officers of the Japanese Army and Navy and gendarmerie, ostensibly created for legitimate purposes, but which are, in reality disguised forms of military or military organizations, or which have some other disguised subversive purpose."

....."13. For the purpose of prevention of the revival of Japanese militarism, persons who have at one time fallen within any of the following categories should not be nominated or employed in the government service, public office, or educational institutions except as they may be necessary in performing duties essential to the demobilization of repatriated military and Naval personnel.

- a. Generals, admirals, and all other senior officers and all career officers of the Army, Navy, and gendarmerie;
- b. Other officers of the Army, Navy and gendarmerie, including members of the reserve, if their employment would harm the cause of peace and security;
- c. Officials of ex-officers; and other military associations and of bodies closely associated with the Armed Forces.

"The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers may authorize the nomination or employment of a person coming within categories a and c if his record shows that he has been an opponent of Japanese expansionism and totalitarianism.

"14. All measures necessary should be undertaken to prevent any revival of the Japanese Army, Navy, gendarmerie, secret police and their administrative organs."

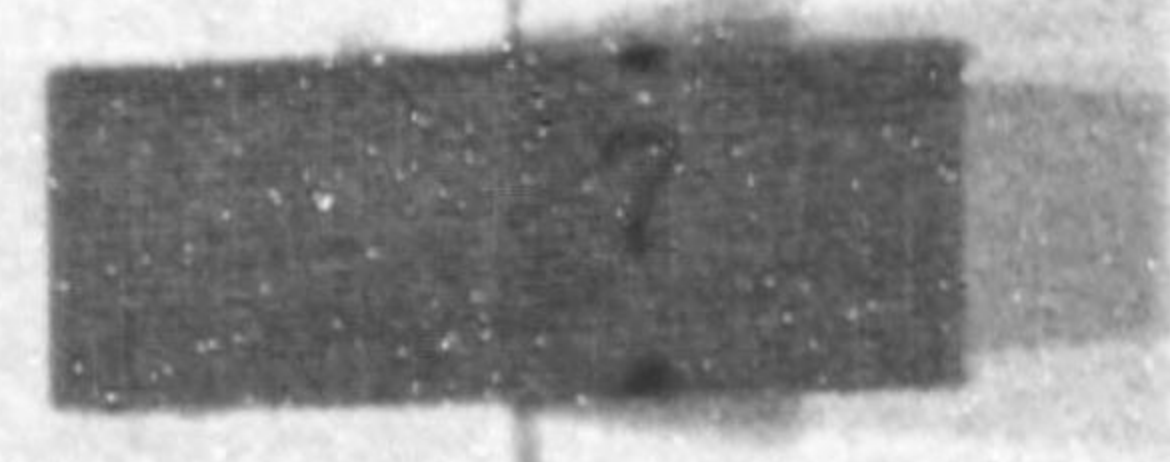

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10. Persons who held the following offices in the Great Japan Military virtue Association (Dai Nippon Butoku Kai) <sup>-52-</sup> (to be called Association hereafter) between 22 March 1942 and 2 September 1945, with the exception of those who can give satisfactory proof to the contrary.

- (1) Central office-president, Vice-president, Chief of the Board of Directors, Directors and Chiefs of Section.
- (2) Prefectural branch-chief, Vice-Chief, Chief of the Board of Directors, Directors and Chiefs of Sections.
- (3) Local sub-branch (including sub-office (Bun Kai) and others substantially corresponding with sub-branch), Chief (including chief of sub-office and others substantially corresponding with chief of sub-branch; ditto hereafter.)

Note: "Persons who can give satisfactory proof to the contrary shall be as follows:

- I. Proof to the contrary to be recognized in respect of all officers.

Any person or persons who can give proof that he made positive attempts to obstruct the militarization of the association.

- II. Other proof to the contrary to be recognized in respect to the following officers.

1. In respect to directors of central office, any person who can give proof to the contrary under the following paragraphs.

- (a) That he did not hold the concurrent post of a Section Chief or any other active position, and

- (b) The number of attendance at the directors conference being such as not to exceed 1/4 of the number of conferences held during the period in which he was a director and, proof of non-participation in other activities of the association, and,

- (c) That his personal record was such as to show that he did not identify himself with any quasi-militaristic or quasi-ultranationalistic activities.

2. Officers of Prefectural Branches

(a) In respect to person who was an officer only before September 22, 1942, any of the above persons who can give proof to the contrary under the following paragraphs.

(1) That the actual activities including the various performances of the said branches were similar to those of the said branches prior to the reorganization of the central office and,

(11) That (consequent on the reorganization of the central office) the preparatory measures for the purpose of the reorganization of the said branches did not become active.

(111) That his personal record was such as to show that he did not identify himself with any quasi-militaristic or quasi-ultranationalistic activities.

(b) In respect to officers subsequent to the period as in 2(a) above, (to include officers even prior to the same date, in cases where the activities of the said branches were in actual fact strengthened or preparatory measures for the purpose of reorganization thereof became active), any person who can give proof to the contrary under the following paragraphs.

(i) That he was not authorized any responsible part in the final coordination or general execution of the functions of the branch, such as Chief of Branch or Chief of the Board of Directors; and,

(11) That he did not take an active part in strengthening the actual activities of the said branches such as various performances, etc.; and,

(111) That his personal record was such as to show that he did not identify himself with any quasi-militaristic or quasi-ultranationalistic activities.



3. Chief of Local Sub-Branch.

(a) In respect to any person or persons who was Chief of a local sub-branch only before September 22, 1942, any person or persons who can give proof to the contrary under the following paragraphs.

- (i) That the actual activities of the said local sub-branch including its various performances were similar to those of the said branches prior to reorganization of the central office; and,
- (ii) That consequent on the reorganization of the central office no preparatory measures for the purpose of strengthening the actual activities of the said local sub-branch were taken; and,
- (iii) That his personal record was such as to show that he did not identify himself with any quasi-militaristic or quasi-ultranationalistic activities.

(b) In respect to chief of local sub-branch subsequent to date as in 3 (a) above any person who can give proof to the contrary under following paragraphs.

- (i) That the actual activities of the said local sub-branch including the various performances were similar to that of the said sub-branch prior to the reorganization of the central office; and,
- (ii) That the period of service as chief of local sub-branch was one year or less; and,
- (iii) That during the period of service as chief of local sub-branch the activities of the said branch were in no way militaristic or ultra-nationalistic; and
- (iv) That his personal record was such as to show that he did not identify himself with any quasi-militaristic or quasi-ultranationalistic activities.

The Supreme Commander has referred to me your letter of July 9th, 1947, concerning the removal from public office of influential members of the Great Japan Martial Virtues Society.

Careful consideration has been given to the points made by you with reference to the number and type of personnel involved and the possible consequences upon certain aspects of your economic program. As I am sure you know, the Supreme Commander is watching with deepest interest your efforts to develop effective measures designed to alleviate existing economic distress.

In order that the elimination from public service of those officials of the Great Japan Martial Virtues Society who are adjudged to be undesirable may not hinder the execution of your program, there is no objection to phasing the removal of such personnel by reasonable increments beginning with those at the highest levels in the national government on down.

Inasmuch as the settlement of this long-pending problem will enable the government to devote its primary attention to positive measures of governmental reorganization, decentralization, and rehabilitation of the economy, the Supreme Commander is pleased to note from your letter that you intend to bring this matter to an expeditious conclusion.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD.

SUBJECT: Martial Virtues Society.

1. The Minister of Justice, Yoshio Suzuki, telephoned to me this morning on the newly installed private telephone and, speaking in English, asked if he could call upon me alone. This was the first time he had ever spoken in English and he obviously did not want anyone else to know that he was coming. When he arrived he said he desired to discuss a Judicial Process and Police Powers Plan which he is drafting for the reorganization of the Ministry of Justice and law enforcement agencies in accordance with the mandate from the Cabinet. In the course of our discussion the Justice Minister stated that the Prime Minister had written a letter to the Supreme Commander asking that the effects of the purge of influential members of the Great Japan Martial Virtues Society be minimized as far as practicable but that the Prime Minister did not expect nor hope that his letter would be favorably considered.

2. I asked Mr. Suzuki to enlarge upon this point and he said that the letter had been written after discussion at the Cabinet, merely as a gesture for the record. He said that the Prime Minister had been put under considerable pressure to indicate that he was as loyal to the bureaucracy as his predecessor, Mr. Yoshida, had been and that whenever Mr. Yoshida was faced with a purge problem he had always been prevailed upon to appeal to the Supreme Commander, even though without success in most instances. Accordingly, the Prime Minister had asked Mr. Sone, the Director-General of the Cabinet Secretariat, who speaks fluent English, to prepare a letter which while making the appeal, at the same time emphasized that the Prime Minister intended to carry out the purge of the influential members of the Society in question.

3. The Justice Minister continued the conversation by saying that of the 1,000 to 1,300 officials affected, about one-third in all levels of government would be able to show that they were not militarists and ultra-nationalists, but that two-thirds of them would probably be held to be militarists. He said that this two-thirds would in the main consist of career police officials, especially those who had been prefectural police chiefs during the war, and those who had been officials of the dreaded Special Higher Police which had oppressed the people severely through a reign of police terror. Mr. Suzuki said that he and the fellow members of his Cabinet were determined to reform the police system of Japan with a view to eliminating the corruption, tyranny and inefficiency of the police. He said that the vaunted success of the police in

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Japan had been due, not to effective or efficient crime detection methods, but to violence intimidation and torture.

4. I asked the Justice Minister pointblank, if the influential persons of the Great Japan Martial Virtues Society were removed, whether there was any danger that the economic emergency measures would be imperiled, rice collections retarded, or law and order affected in any way. He answered with a categorical "no", stating that if he were allowed to phase the removals, beginning with the national government and gradually combing through the prefectural and local governments, the removal of these officials would not jeopardize any of the objectives which I had mentioned. He said many police officials were allied with ring-leaders in black-marketing operations and with the underworld in general. Moreover, he said that within one year, with a police training school which would instruct fresh minds with scientific crime detection methods, instead of the brutal and inhuman methods previously used by the police, law enforcement in Japan would be far better off than today.

5. By way of example the Justice Minister cited a case involving a large black-market ring in Kawasaki, a suburban community near Yokohama. On the information that such a ring was operating and using rice badly needed by the people for the making of sake which was then distributed through irregular channels, a Ministry of Finance official last week was sent to investigate and was promptly murdered. The murderers were known and there were at least two witnesses to the crime but, notwithstanding the fact that the Home Minister himself ordered the arrest of the murderers, they had not yet been taken into custody because of the close affiliation of the ring with the police. In fact, Mr. Suzuki said it was frequently necessary for the procurators under the Justice Ministry to offer larger bribes to the police to apprehend known criminals than the underworld paid the police, in order to attain any degree of justice whatsoever. By way of an aside, Mr. Suzuki pointed out that he and other members of his Cabinet were constantly being shadowed by the police and note made of anyone they saw or who came to see them, and, although the police had been ordered not to continue their surveillance they arrogantly declined to obey on the ground that it was necessary for protection of the Cabinet members.

6. In conclusion the Justice Minister declared that many people in Japan were commenting both publicly and privately on the fact that the police had been relatively immune to the purge. Although many persons who held comparatively nominal positions in totalitarian organizations had been removed from public office, the police, who had coerced them into accepting those offices and performing the duties thereof had evaded the purge, except those who happened to be in office on 4 October 1945, when the Supreme Commander had issued his great Civil Liberties Directive. And yet, Mr. Suzuki pointed out, it was the police more than any other single element in Japanese life which made militarism possible through the seizing of opponents of the militaristic regime and holding



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them in "protective arrest", without arraignment, without trial, without benefit of counsel, frequently without food, and in almost all cases because they harbored "dangerous thoughts" which was synonymous with "democratic thoughts". For these reasons the Justice Minister said he and his colleagues in the Cabinet hoped that they would have the full support of GHQ in their efforts to reorganize their governmental structure and remove from public service the influential officers in ultra-nationalistic and so-called "patriotic societies."

1. On 13 March 1947 I informed the Minister of Home Affairs that all influential members of the above Association or any branch thereof during the period when it was an instrument of militarism should be treated as falling within the provisions of Category "G", Appendix "A", SCAPIN 550, in the absence of satisfactory proof to the contrary.

2. I am now advising Minister of Justice Suzuki that in the administration of Imperial Ordinance No. 1, dated 4 January 1947, persons who held the following offices in the Association between 22 March 1942 and 2 September 1945 will be deemed to be influential members thereof:

(a) At the national level:

President,  
Vice-President,  
Chief of the Board of Directors,

Chiefs of Sections.

(b) At the prefectural level and in the six principal cities:

3. Persons who hold positions commensurate with the above enumerated positions also will be deemed to be influential, regardless of their particular titles.



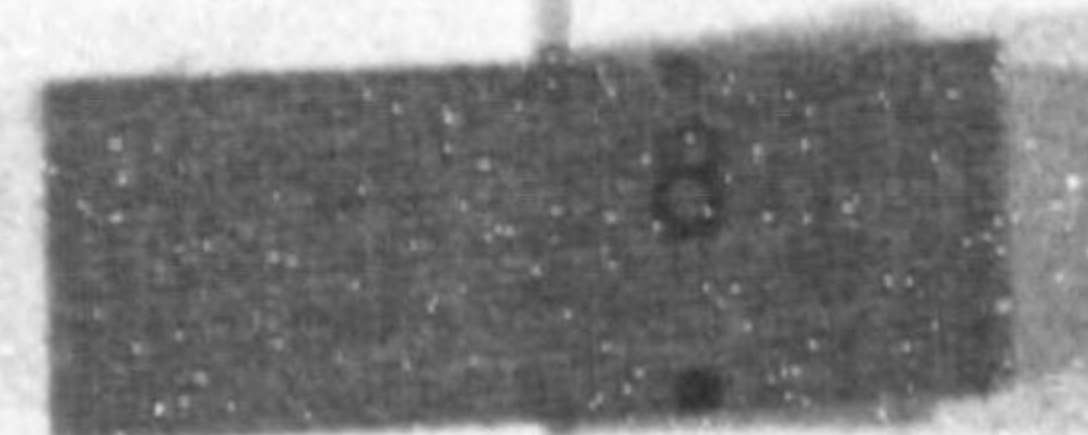

**IMPERIAL ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF 1947**

**Article II.** The term "public service" as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include positions of members of National Diet, personnel of the national government entity, assembly members and personnel of the local public organizations (including To, Do, Fu, Ken, Shi, Ku, Hoshi, Kura and Cho-fan Bunkai), and positions of specific personnel of specific companies, associations, mass communication media and other organization, and shall be classified into the principal public office and the ordinary public office.

The "principal public office" and the "ordinary public office" shall be defined by the Prime Minister.

**Article III.** Any person who falls under the provisions of Appendix "A" to the Memorandum, in case he holds any principal public office, shall and, in case he holds any ordinary public office, may be removed therefrom...
