



The list of 10.000 articles every Wikipedia should have: a short history

- A list of 1.000 to "invigorate [smaller Wikipedias], and ensure that they each contain a minimum of information that will be of use to users" (Danny, 2004)
- 140 biographies, including 32 in "Women in history" section.
- Wikid77 created the list of 10.000 articles in 2008, to handle more voices and more diversity: https://meta.wikimedia.org/wiki/List_of_articles_ever_y-wikipedia_should_have/Expanded
- We will center on biographies: they should be 2.000, currently has 1.913 individual humans.







Universalism

the belief that some items are equally valuable for everyone



Diversity

the idea that local knowledge may be relevant for everyone

Wikidata

Extract all the biographies Wikidata items.

2

Pagepile

Build a pagepile with all the items.

3

Quickstatements

Add P5008 (on focus list of Wikimedia project) with timestamp to items.



Defining location: three approaches



P19

Birthplace, they may migrate after birth.



P27

Problematic, because of political change.



P551

Residence, only filled when this is different from birthplace. Not consistent.








Location by gender






Location by current sovereign country

- 20th century: 751 biographies
- 19th century: 533 biographies
 - o (1/5: 1890s)
- 18th century: 154 biographies
- 1900s: 132 biographies (most represented decade)

And I think they represent well our current status: white caucasic, with males in front and piggy-back women.



Most links: Barack Obama (320, 1st) Jesus (310, 2nd)

- 1 More than 60 films.
- Best box-office actress in India of all times.
- 34 US actors, only 2 indians (both classical)



Oksana Chusovitina

- Only person with 8
 Olympic participations.
- No women from Centra Asia in the list.
- There are 8 boxers from the US.



Ramon Llull

- Medieval catalan philosopher, theologian and encyclopedist
- Precursor of combinatory.
- A fifth of europeans are from the British Isles.



Making a list is taking sides.
