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Commons in wiki universe

Commons is different than other projects

- Different focus: On Wikipedia everything revolves around articles, on Wikisource around books and on Wikimedia Commons everything revolves around files, most of which are images
- Different rules:
 - No Neutral Point of View
 - We keep files with extreme opposite points of view and let the other project decide which one to use
 - No No Original Research
 - We do "original research" all the time: identifying and categorizing animal species, locations, people, etc.
 - Ok to have usernames named after institutions
 - User:BrooklynMuseum

Commons

- Successful image has to have multiple attributes:
 - Graphics: good quality, high resolution, in scope (educational)
 - License: free, verifiable, complete, clear, concise
 - Categories: covering many aspects (orthogonal), detailed
 - Metadata: as full as possible, clear, concise, internationalized (i18n), organized in infoboxes



Graphics

• Scope:

- 3.1 Must be a media file
- 3.2 Must be an allowable free file format
- 3.3 Must be freely licensed or public domain
- 3.4 Must be realistically useful for an educational purpose
 - 3.4.1 File in use in another Wikimedia project

Quality:

- Resolution as high as possible (even if image will be displayed as an icon in the article)
- Better to have fewer high quality images than a lot of low quality ones

Licensing

Free

- Usually Creative Commons or Public Domain
 - Public domain due to: age, publication, official government materials, created by US government employee, etc.
- No Fair use materials
- Verifiable
 - Provide: date of author's death, publication date or sources if license relies on it
- Complete
 - Image must be free in country of origin and in the US
 - · Many authors in PD in their own country are still copyrighted in the US due to ULRA
 - All creators must be covered
 - We might have a scan of a famous photograph of a sculpture, which is a copy of earlier sculpture, so we might need to have license or 2 sculptors, one photographer and explain why person digitizing does not need a license
- Clear and concise

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Categorization

- Categories allow groupings of similar images
- An image could be categorized by multiple criteria:
 - Creator(s)
 - Subject: non-obvious features of the context (identification of animals, vehicles, weapons, geographical features)
 - Time: depicted time, time of creation
 - Location: depicted location, origin
 - Medium used: etching / painting / rare photographic process / rare type, etc.
 - Institution
 - Source: images from ... manuscript
- Many categories combine or intersects one or more basic criteria
 - Islamic manuscripts in the Walters Art Museum

Category intersections

<u>Category:Painted portraits of men of France</u> which seems like intersection of 4 basic categories:

- 1. <u>Category:Paintings</u> (1)
- 2. <u>Category:Portraits</u> (2)
- 3. <u>Category:Men</u> (3)
- 4. <u>Category:France</u> (4)

Logically it should be a subcategory of 4 intersections of 3 of above categories and 4 intersections of 2 of above categories:

- 1. <u>Category:Painted portraits of men</u> and <u>Category:Portrait</u> <u>paintings of males</u> (1-2-3) sub of
 - 1. Category: Portrait paintings (1-2)
 - 2. Category:Portraits of men (2-3)
 - 3. Category: Paintings of men (1-3)
- 2. <u>Category:Paintings of men of France</u> (1-3-4) sub of
 - 1. Category: Men of France (3-4)
 - 2. Category: Paintings of people from France (1-4)
 - 3. Category:Paintings of men (1-3)
- 3. Category: Portraits of men of France (2-3-4) sub of
 - 1. Category: Portraits of people from France (2-4)
 - 2. Category: Men of France (3-4)
 - 3. Category:Portraits of men (2-3)
- 4. <u>Category:Painted portraits of people from France</u> (1-2-4) sub of
 - 1. <u>Category:Portraits of people from France</u> (2-4)
 - 2. Category:Portrait paintings (1-2)
 - 3. Category: Paintings of people from France (1-4)

Serious issues with current system:

- All categories in English while many
 Wikipedia users do not speak English
- Intersecting categories produces a lot of extra categories and extremely specialized ones like <u>Category:Painted portraits of</u> <u>women from Spain in national costume</u>
- Wikidata properties might be the solution

Metadata: Roles of File Infobox Templates

- File description
 - In case of large collections of images from GLAM institutions, already compiled metadata should not be lost
- Information allowing verification of the license, like source, author, etc.
- Internationalization
 - Wikimedia Commons is shared among many projects using languages. Users might not know English.
 - metadata should ideally be presented in the language of the user
 - links should point into most relevant Wikipedia
- Repeated metadata should be stored in as few places as possible to ease maintenance
- Machine readability

Three tiers of infobox templates

- 1. Most general: Information template (used by 88% of files 11.6M)
 - Fields: author, description, date, source, permission and other-versions
 - often (2.8M) accompanied by Location template for geo-location
- 2. Specialized infobox templates for specific types of images:
 - Artwork: for 2D and 3D museum artworks (360k)
 - Photograph: for museum photograph collections (82k)
 - Book: for images of scanned books (500k)
 - Other templates for: images of airplanes, busses, stamps, etc.
- 3. Customized templates for mass-uploads of images from a single source, are created based on one of above templates
 - Created for images from Bunsesarchiv, Deutsche Fotothek, Walters Art Museum, National Archives and Records Administration, many other
 - Used in case none of the four standard templates is a good match to the provided metadata

I18n of {{Artwork}} fields

Artwork template field name	Recommended i18n template
author	{{Creator}}
institution	{{Institution}}
date	Dates should be in YYYY-MM-DD format or {{Other_date}} template should be used for phrases like around, before, between, etc.
medium	{{Technique}} can be used for i18n of phrases like "adjective noun and adjective noun on adjective noun". We have a vocabulary of 500 nouns and 60 adjectives translated into about 30 languages
dimensions	{{Size}} template is used for i18n of artwork dimension. It can translate width, height, depth, diameter, etc. and display numbers in metric or SI units depending on language
object history	{{ProvenanceEvent}} template can i18n phrases like "date: acquired by name, from name"

Creator and Institution templates

- Metadata about creators (painters, sculptors, writers, etc.) is stored in Creator templates (15.6k)
- Metadata about GLAM (Gallery, Library, Archive & Museum) institutions is stored inside Institution templates (1.8k)
- Both sets of templates occupy their own specialized namespaces
- Both sets produce in file namespace an collapsed template with mostly a name visible, which when clicked expands into informative infobox
- Most templates from both sets introduce links to Wikidata, Wikipedia and/or Wikisource pages, and links to Authority control databases.

Batch uploads of artwork images

- Preparation
 - Create needed templates and categories
- Metadata preparation
 - Match artwork artists with Commons creator templates and categories. Create new ones if needed
 - Match institutions with Commons Institution templates and categories. Create new ones if needed
 - I18n of other {{Artwork}} fields
- Possible approaches:
 - i18n before upload using spreadsheet (DB)
 - I18n after upload using multiple passes with a bot
- Both approaches take a lot of time with ~10% of odd cases taking 90% of time

Customization of existing infobox templates

- Information, Artwork and Photograph templates were designed to allow modifications by child templates
 - new fields can be added by using other_fields field and Information field template
 - unneeded fields can be left intentionally blank
- Modifications should be kept to minimum for consistency and common experience
- New fields should be internationalized
