Frank A. Kimball's diary for 1899.

Sunday January 1<sup>st</sup> -

At home (?) - 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue & 20<sup>th</sup> St - all day except while going to the R.O. and taking Hazel and Chasse Reed up to Mr. Whicker's -

Hattie Johnson came home and staid till most dark, when I whaled part way home (Chula Vista) with her.

Maryat Currie here with us. "Sister" went to church with her and afterward called to see Mrs. Willets -

My headache is better tonight -

Monday Jany. 2<sup>d</sup> 1899 -

Hauled a load of old wharf piles to the house this A.M.

J.C. Ball Cr. Hauling wood  
Rain began about 3 P.M. but is not raining now. 8<sup>30</sup> P.M.

Monday Jan. 2<sup>d</sup> Continued -

Margaret Currier returned home  
(Portuguese) on the stage this morning -  
Am too tired for any use tonight -

Tuesday January 3<sup>d</sup> 99.

At the old wharf early but  
found the tide too high to work  
Sent to W<sup>m</sup> Manning Hardy \$5.<sup>00</sup>  
by W. F & Co<sup>s</sup> E. money order -  
and charge to his ac/c -

Made "saw horse", on which to  
saw the old spiles into wood and  
began to saw them -

"Sister" with me and called on  
J.C. Baird - found him still  
in bed -

At Whalers and got Chassie's boots  
and left some of "sister's"

At George's - got 2 kgs of water  
Fir gal's Coal oil (Burke's) .80

Wednesday Jan<sup>y</sup> 4, 1899

Up early and out bid the old wharf  
but the wind was blowing off  
shore and Capt. Zorrill would  
not go out to work. So I split up all  
the piles lying along the mole and  
wheeled them out where they can  
be loaded on a wagon.

With "Sister" drove to 26<sup>th</sup> St.  
San Diego to see if the stolen timbers  
were there - found them all right

Thursday Jan<sup>y</sup> 5, 1899.

At the wharf at 16<sup>30</sup> but  
Capt Zorrill did not come till an  
hour later. Then went in his boat  
to 26<sup>th</sup> St San Diego to get the stolen

it. I made two trips to 26<sup>th</sup> St to help  
him but he said he could do it alone  
Lunch for Capt Zorrill 15-

Friday January 6. 1899.

Clothes froze on the line last night  
and were not thawed out till long after  
7 o'clock this morning-

Am too tired to hold up my  
head - and my hip is very  
lame and my right side is  
very sore -

 Dr. Remondino in relation to getting  
 Miss A. Wilcox into some hospital

He said Mr Capron wanted him to give  
him & Capron 2,400 shares and he & Ha-

On Tuesday Feb. 7. as Mrs. Kimball, Hattie A. Johnson and myself were returning from the Post Office at 7<sup>30</sup> P.M. my horse got entangled in a bunch of wire lying in the street and ran away. The horse fell and tumbled thrown to the ground and was kicked once on top of my head and three times on the left side and terribly bruised beside being much bruised in my fall. Miss. Johnson jumped from the buggy the moment the horse fell and was not in the least injured. Mrs. Kimball could not get out before the horse got up and ran again and while going at a fearful rate she jumped out and was severely injured on the left hip. She ligament


