1. A labor school has been established by the Osaka Branch of the Osaka District Labor Union Liaison Council. The school is being conducted from 5 November 1947 to 13 December 1947. There are classes three times a week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday; the hours are from 1300 to 1600. The school has approximately 300 members and represent all of the major unions in Osaka. Tuition fees to attend this school are ¥60 per person. The subjects being taught in the school are:

## 1. References:

a. Annex D-3 to I Corps Military Government Plan for 15 November 1947 - 15 February 1948, paragraphs 3 and 4.

b. "Principals for Japanese Trade Unions" - a policy statement issued by the Far Eastern Commission Dec 1946.

2. Recommendations for constructive action on the problem of labor schools have been made by this and higher headquarters in writing and at conferences over the past year. One such policy statement issued by GHQ a year ago is reference 1b above. A recent restatement of these objectives issued by this headquarters is reference 1a above. Other material has been issued in pamphlets by ESS/La - GHQ and by labor conferences at GHQ and at I Corps Headquarters. The problem is admittedly not an easy one. The ensuing discussion is offered as further assistance for the local labor officer.

3. Defects of autonomous educational programs by Japanese trade unions have for some time been clearly recognized. The principal failings of these schools to date have been that their courses are not particularly suited to workers' present needs and the schools themselves are not very democratic. This may be attributed in part to the lack of a heritage of democratic organizations in Japan, and to workers' past experiences under a system of education by feudalistic superiors. In recent years, workers education was handled by employers, and tended to stress obedience, diligence, paternalism, and ultra-nationalism. It was expected that many mistakes would be made in the initial attempts of workers to establish their own schools. Present schools are particularly susceptible to minority control because the average worker is not only handicapped by a limited education, but is today principally occupied with problems of food, clothing, housing, and transportation in a war-destroyed and inflated economy.

4. Guided by a sympathetic understanding of the problem, and using the reference material above with other SCAP material on the subject, the military government labor officer can materially assist such schools to become better institutions.

## 5. The following is a suggested course of action:

a. Advice from the labor officer to existing labor schools should be constructive and sympathetic. It would be wise to give some cognizance to achievements made thus far.

b. The general aims toward improvement should concentrate on (1) more democratic structures (2) better selection of subject material.

c. All unions in the prefecture should be encouraged to and should have opportunity to elect a policy committee for such a school.

d. A charter for the school should be drafted by this committee and approved by all member unions.

e. The charter should stipulate that broad policy and methods of budget should be formulated and controlled by member unions, or by their democratically elected representatives, whichever seems most practical.

f. Standing committees and special committees should be provided for, in order to broaden the base of member participation, to lessen the dangers of minority control, and increase the effectiveness and scope of the school's activities.

g. Subjects more directly related to the needs of the average Japanese worker today should be included in the program. A suggested list of such subjects is:

- (1) Democratic Trade Union Structure and Functioning.
- (2) Trade Union Law - What It is and How It Works.
- (3) Purposes and Activities of Local Monthly Meetings. (with a brief summary of parliamentary procedures and methods of secret ballot elections).
- (4) Collective bargaining (including types of contracts, how to draft a contract, direct negotiation methods, use of government grievance machinery, and labor-management relations during the life of the contract.)
- (5) The Labor Relations Adjustment Law - What It Is, and How It Works.
- (6) Political Activities of Trade Unions (see SCAP pamphlet, same subject, issued by ESS/La-GHQ).
- (7) Educational Activities of Trade Unions. (See SCAP pamphlets, same subject, issued by ESS/La-GHQ).
- (8) Other Activities of Trade Unions (such as social activities, anti-blackmarket activities, etc.).
- (9) The Labor Standards Law - What It Is, and How It Works.
- (10) The New Japanese Constitution.

h. Schools should be assisted by providing them with SCAP material on such subjects. Prefectural officials familiar with and responsible for the enforcement of recent Japanese labor legislation should give further assistance.

i. Encourage individual unions to establish education program on local levels.

6. In general, the military government labor officer should be primarily concerned with encouraging the establishment of useful, democratic organizations of workers in conformity with the general principles set forth by the FEC principles and by SCAP policies. If emphasis is placed on these principles, dangers of individual manipulation will be materially decreased.

1. Mr. J. Hashimoto, director of the National Property Department, Osaka, called at this headquarters today and stated that he had just returned from the main office of the National Property Bureau in Tokyo.

2. Mr. Hashimoto informs this office that Mr. Funayama, director of the National Property Bureau in Tokyo had received a recommendation from Mr. Harding of Reparations Section, SCAP, that Mr. K. Kobayashi, head of the local reparations section of Osaka Arsenal, be relieved from his assignment. Mr. Funayama further stated that Mr. Harding said this recommendation was made by Lt Col Anderson just before leaving for his new assignment in Korea.

3. At the present time, Mr. Kobayashi is the only qualified person in this area to handle the tremendous volume of business involved in the control, custody and maintenance of arsenal machinery located in Osaka Prefecture, and his knowledge of past and present activities at the arsenal makes him invaluable; therefore this office feels in the best interest of the occupation, his services be retained.

4. It is pointed out that although Mr. Harding did not order his dismissal, but merely recommended it, this constitutes to the Japanese officials, a command.

1. Reference is memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, File AG 091.1(4 Jan 46)GS, (SCAPIN 550), dated 4 January 1946, subject: Removal and Exclusion of Undesirable Personnel from Public Office.

2. Investigation reveals that Mr. K. Kobayashi, head of the local Reparations Section, Osaka Military Arsenal, is a former relatively high ranking officer in the Japanese Navy and as such is subject to purge under the provisions of reference 1 above. In the face of these facts, it is not possible to approve the permanent retention of Mr. K. Kobayashi in government service.

3. In order to enable the Military Government Section, Headquarters Eighth Army, to orient a replacement for Mr. K. Kobayashi, Government Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has postponed his removal until 31 December 1947.

1. Reference is made to Mrs. May Hasuike who is presently in the employ of the American Red Cross. Personal history statements of Mrs. Hasuike show that she was redeployed subsequently to her 18th birthday and is therefore unemployable as a foreign national. Mrs. Hasuike is, however, employable as a Japanese national in accordance with the provisions of letter, AG 230.145-8A, Hq. I Corps, subject: same as above, dated 16 October 1947, which is quoted in part for your information and guidance:

"The employment as Japanese Nationals of repatriated Nisei, who were over 16 years of age at the time of their repatriation, and who have been cleared by the Provost Marshal and the Counter Intelligence Corps, is authorized. In such cases and in other cases where renunciation of citizenship, service in Japanese Armed Forces, etc., are involved, Provost Marshal and Counter Intelligence Corps clearance is deemed sufficient to enable these persons to be employed as Japanese Nationals."

2. It is requested that Mrs. Hasuike be informed of the above and that appropriate steps be taken to delete her name from the foreign national payroll.

SUBJECT: Special Report Concerning Labor Recruitment

TO : Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, APO 500  
(Through Command Channels)

1. This headquarters has recently completed an investigation of labor recruiting practices in two branch factories of the Dai Nippon Spinning Co. In conducting the investigation primary consideration was given to the following:

- a. To what extent has the feudalistic labor recruiting practices synonymous with the spinning industry been "democratized"?
- b. Is local labor being utilized in the spinning factories?  
If not, why?

2. The two factories selected for study were:

- a. The Takada Branch factory (approximately 2,000 employees).
- b. The Koriyama Branch factory (approximately 2,500 employees).

In each factory over 80% of the employees are young girls.

3. a. Generally it was found that the feudalistic labor recruiting practices have not ceased, parental contracts continue to exist, forced labor continues to operate the spinning machines. It was found that certain modifications have been adopted in the recruiting process in an effort to glaze the surface. Outstanding among these was the system found to exist in the Takada branch factory where a "union" representative accompanied the company labor recruiting agent on labor procurement missions. It was found that this union agent participated in negotiations at least to the extent of promising to send girls in Kanazawa expense money in order to enable them to travel from their homes to the factory (this advance payment is prohibited by the Labor Standards Law, which became effective in Nara, 1 September 1947).

b. Specifically the investigation uncovered the following

facts:

- (1) The spinning factories continue to send recruiting agents into areas of overpopulation and low living standards to obtain the bulk of their labor (95% of women employees).
- (2) That contracts between factory management and parents for the services of young girls continue to be consummated although both parents and management are "covering up."
- (3) The girl victims are:
  - (a) In many cases uninformed of their right to oppose the system.
  - (b) Cognizant of their legal rights but unwilling to stand against or oppose the family dictatorial system.

In either case most of the girls are not too happy in the factory and wish to return home "as soon as my contract expires".

4. That the practice of recruiting workers from areas of low living standards which are great distances from the factory has an adverse effect upon the living standard in the community immediately adjacent to the factory. The average wage of women workers in the Takada branch factory is ¥800 per month while in other industries in the area the average wage is ¥1,300.

5. The feudalistic recruiting practice stimulates local unemployment and leads to an upset economy. For example: Recently the Takada branch factory sent a labor recruiting team composed of one company agent and one union representative to Kanazawa where a labor procurement effort of one months duration was carried out. At this very time there were 2,000 unemployed workers living within a 10 mile radius of the factory itself. Sixty per cent of these were women. It was also noted that the Takada factory had made no recent appeal to the Takada labor exchange for local labor.

6. The labor unions have no definite program for opposing the system either on a legal or moral basis. As a matter of interest it was learned that "So Domei" to which all spinning factory unions are allied had given advice, if not instructions, to keep "hands off" the entire labor recruiting situation in the spinning industry and for unions to concentrate on improving dormitory conditions and promote

"cultural activities".

7. It seems that both labor and management justify the continued presence of the illegal recruiting system by the explanation that the entire Japanese economic structure is based around the spinning and weaving industry and any attempt to restrict labor recruiting, or to raise wage levels, is apt to upset the balance and result in serious complications. In addition, factory management points out that despite legislation prohibiting it, many parents and middle aged Japanese continue to condone the contract recruiting system and use it as a means to make ends meet financially. Regarding reform legislation, it has been noted that Japanese agencies responsible for the uncovering of, and prosecution of, persons violating recently passed Japanese legislation are reluctant to really crack down on violators of these laws. It is felt, therefore, that until a sufficient number of Japanese people become aware of their rights under, and of the benefits of, reform legislation that no real progress will be made towards eliminating forced labor practices especially in the spinning factories. As long as factory owners and parents continue to cover up their labor contract relationship, and as long as girls continue to submit to the dictates of the family system even when their welfare is adversely affected, then reform legislation is of relatively no value, in fact tending only to force parties involved to be a little more shrewd in their dealings. Actually it can be said that the elimination of forced labor contracts exists on paper only. The system itself continues.

8. Recommendations:

a. Considerable CI & EE concentration to be given to an educational program regarding the breakdown of subservience to the evils of the family dictatorial system.

b. That industrial agencies as well as labor attempt to accomplish a revolution in the manner of thinking of factory management concerning the relative high production output of permanent well paid employees, as compared to the low production output of short time low paid employees. Japanese employers apparently are hesitant to recognize this at the present time even though 90% of the girls working in spinning factories remain less than 3 years during which they reach a comparatively high state of production only after 18 months apprenticeship period.

c. That peculiar evil of the dormitory system should be abolished by legislation in the near future. This would literally push the factory employees out of the vacuum in which they now live, into the community. Faced with community problems, community prices, community social responsibility, and community civic responsibility, the factory employees would be forced to seek higher wages (at least up to the level of those paid in the community) better living conditions, and would in fact find themselves actually becoming citizens of the community.

d. That labor unions be prodded into making a concrete and direct attack of the forced labor system as carried on by employers. This attack should dovetail with the recommended program for education concerning the evils of the family dictatorial system, and therefore should be based not upon the legal wrong, but the moral wrong of the entire system. 



SUBJECT: Violation of Labor Standards Law

TO : Commanding Officer, Kinki Military Government Team,  
APO 301

1. On 7 March the Chief of the Otsu Tax Office, Mr. Kishimoto, violated Article 61 of the Labor Standard Law as printed in Official Gazette No. 303, 7 April 1947, by employing 18 women for a period of six hours on a rest day. The National Tax Workers Union at Osaka is now desirous of removing Mr. Kishimoto from the Otsu tax office for this violation. As Mr. Kishimoto has done an exemplary job in his collection of taxes, reaching 100% of his goal on 16 March 1948, and also acting as liaison for all tax offices in Shiga Prefecture, this Headquarters is desirous of seeing that Mr. Kishimoto is not removed from his position. The following narrative report of the situation is submitted so that a better evaluation of the case may be made and so that due consideration may be given to the source of the information.

2. Narrative Report

a. Source of information - Mr. Kishimoto, Chief Otsu Tax Office. There are 39 women over 18 years of age employed at the Otsu Tax Office. During the period of heavy work load 13-26 February, Mr. Kishimoto worked eight women overtime each night in hours varying from midnight to 3 A.M. This work was rotated among the thirty-nine women. These women and also the men who performed overtime work during this period will be paid for this overtime work as soon as the Osaka Tax Office approves the budget for this work. The request for this payment has been submitted to the Osaka Tax Office by Mr. Kishimoto.

b. Due to the fact that this work was performed in February, Mr. Kishimoto cannot be prosecuted under the provisions of the Labor Standard Law since prosecutions cannot be made under that law until 1 March 1948.

c. On 7 March, 18 women worked in the tax office for a period of six hours each as stated in par. 1. Mr. Kishimoto said this work was on a voluntary basis. However, in asking them to perform the work he stated that the reports they were preparing must reach the Osaka Tax Bureau on time.

d. The Otsu Tax Office Labor Union afterwards pointed out to Mr. Kishimoto that this was in violation of Article 61 of the Labor Standard Law. Mr. Kishimoto states that he was not aware of all the provisions of this law. He, therefore, contacted the Labor Standards Bureau in the prefecture on 11 March and they informed him that they did not intend to prosecute. The members of the union in the Otsu Tax Office told Mr. Kishimoto they did not desire prosecution, but merely pointed it out to prevent such occurrence in the future. However, one member of the communist party who is employed in the tax office reported the matter to the Shiga Shimbun and on 13 March, an article was published in the paper concerning Mr. Kishimoto's action in working employees overtime during the month of February (see par. 2(a)).

e. The Labor Standards Bureau then stated that they would submit a report to the Labor Ministry and await a ruling of the Labor Ministry before carrying out any action against Mr. Kishimoto. However, they did state that the newspaper article bringing the matter before the public attention nullified their previous statement that they would not prosecute.


f. The Osaka Labor Union has placed posters in the Osaka Tax Bureau stating that Mr. Kishimoto should be relieved from his position as chief of the Otsu Tax Office. (All of the above information was received from Mr. Kishimoto).

g. The procurators office in Otsu has not as yet received an official complaint concerning this matter and has not performed any investigation. Their present attitude on the matter is that until such a report is received officially, they will not investigate. 4

3. The tax collection program in Shiga Prefecture has been very successful. A great deal of this success may be attributed to Mr. Kishimoto. He has acted as liaison man to coordinate the work of the six tax offices in the prefecture and has obtained for Military Government all reports desired and in many other ways has given valuable assistance. He has achieved 100% collection in his own office which has the highest goal of the six tax offices in Shiga Prefecture.

The attached letter covers, I think, the situation in the tax office in Otsu that we discussed on the phone yesterday. I have checked in haste and may not have covered all sources of information - but just talked to Labor Standard Bureau representatives + their story checks with that given by Mr. Kishimoto.

One item not included in the report because it has no direct bearing but which was written in the paper and has influenced public opinion - one girl in the tax office lost the sight of one eye due to over work in a cold office (or so Mr. Kishimoto says) and this fact is widely known in this area and naturally places the tax officials in the position of being slave drivers. Tax office has filed for a compensation for this girl and it is being properly handled legally.

I think there is more heat than fire here but it isn't helping the tax program.
