



## Cambridge Fire Department.

The Fire Department of Cambridge is composed of a Chief Engineer, four Assistants, six Engine Companies, and one Hook and Ladder Company. There is, in addition to these, in the first Ward, a company who confine their labors to that Ward—the Engine being owned by private citizens in that Ward.

The regular companies consist, in all, of thirty-five able-bodied men: viz. a Foreman, first Assistant Foreman, second Assistant Foreman, Clerk, Steward, and thirty men, of not less than twenty-one years of age, subject to the approval of the Mayor and Aldermen. The Hook and Ladder Company consists of twenty able-bodied men, including the officers.

The pay and allowance to each Engine Company is \$955. To the Hook and Ladder Company, \$545. No allowance is made for refreshments except in cases of assistance rendered by fire companies from adjoining cities or towns, and then not to exceed six dollars for each company refreshed, and then only by order of the Chief Engineer or his Assistants. ## RATES OF POSTAGE,

*Compiled from the Post Office Laws and Regulations.*

FOR Letters not exceeding 1-2 ounce in weight, for any distance within the United States not more than 3,000 miles, 3 cents *prepaid*, and 5 cents when *not prepaid*. And for any distance exceeding 3,000 miles, double these rates.

If conveyed wholly or in part by sea, and to or from a foreign country, for any distance over 2,500 miles, 20 cents, and for any distance *under* 2,500 miles, 10 cents (unless otherwise fixed by treaty.) And every additional half ounce or additional weight of less than half an ounce, shall be charged with an additional postage. Letters to California and Oregon, 6 cents *prepaid*, 10 cents when *not prepaid*.

All drop-letters or letters placed in any post office *not* for transmission but for delivery only, shall be charged one cent each. All letters advertised as uncalled for, shall be charged one cent additional to the regular postage.

### *Letter Postage between the United States and Canada and other British North American Provinces.*

Letters weighing not more than 1-2 an ounce to and from British North American Provinces, for any distance not over 3,000 miles, 10 cents; for any distance over 3,000 miles, 15 cents, and for every additional half ounce an additional postage is charged.

### *Postage on Books, Periodicals, Newspapers, Circulars and other Printed Matter.*

Each newspaper, periodical, unsealed circular, and other printed matter, not exceeding *three ounces* in weight, shall be sent to any part of the United States for 1 cent. And for every additional ounce or fraction of an ounce 1 cent additional shall be charged.

When the postage of any newspaper or periodical is paid yearly or quarterly in advance, at the office where the same is mailed, and evidence of such payment is furnished to the office of delivery — one-half of said rates only shall be charged.

**BOOKS**—Bound or unbound, not weighing over 4 pounds, shall be deemed mailable matter, and shall be charged one cent an ounce for all distances under 3,000 miles, and 2 cents an ounce for all distances over 3,000—to which 50 per cent. shall be added when not prepaid.




