## REPORT

## Superintendent of Schools

T'o the School Committee:
Gentlemen:-
I respectfully submit the regular annual report of the Superintendent of Schools for the past school year

In September all the schools except one opened with new teachers, although two of them, Miss Chapman and Miss Judd, had taught in other schools in town. The teachers that have not before taught in town are:

The following statistics are taken from the reports of the teachers at the close of the school year 1906.1907. ending last Jume:
Whole number enrolled ..... 85
Average membership ..... 75.61
Average attendance ..... 69.64
Per cent. of attendance ..... 9.2

This report covers the five schools under the control of the town of Westhampton. In addition to these pupils the town sends a number of pupils to the union school in Loudville, which is controlled by Northampton.

The work done in the schools is practically the same as that done in the Easthampton schools. Of course it is impossible for a teacher, who has six or eight classes in her room, to give as much time to one class as a teacker can give who has only one or two classes in her room. On the other band, there are certain distinct advantages in a district schonl. As the pupils are all in one room, they can advance as rapidly as they are able to do the work. Also, the younger pupils learn much from hearing the more advanced classes recite. It seems that pupils who go from district schools are likely to do quite as goorl work in high schools as the average of the pupils that come from graded city or village schools.
