

A Selected Bibliography on The Subject of BIGHORN SHEEP

This collection is the result of a two-year effort of review and research on literature pertaining to bighorn sheep of North America. Until recent years, very little scientific information was available, and the majority of references were found in memoirs and personal notes of several early explorers and trappers. Although such references are colorful and of historical distribution significance, they add very little to the store of scientific data needed for management of the species.

During the past several years more interest, both on a professional and nonprofessional level has been initiated towards the various species and subspecies of bighorns. Numerous publications are available on behavioral, physiological, and managerial aspects of bighorn, especially on the desert sub-species.

The organization of the Desert Bighorn Council in 1957 spurred the development of a tremendous reservoir of information on numerous facets of bighorn sheep. It is such groups with such sincere feelings toward their interests that motivate the necessary enthusiasm which gives us the flow of information vital to adequate protection and management of a species. Without such interest groups our fact finding effort would proceed at a much slower pace.

Several of the references listed are of a general nature and refer to bighorns only through their discussion of other subjects. Often these observations and comments are vital in recognizing possible associations and aspects of a species to be further identified and researched. Other references are purely scientific in nature, and cover a specific aspect of a species or sub-species of bighorn; such as skull development, or dental anomalies. The subject index is an attempt to generalize the list of references by what appeared to be the most pertinent of subject matter. Those papers which I was unable to review were categorized to the subject expressed by the title. Therefore, some of the papers might actually be better listed in a different subject heading.

Though this is by no means a complete bibliography on the subject, it is an attempt to gather together a selection of both colorful and historical records, and as much scientific information as could be identified. My apologies are given to those authors and persons whose papers I was unable to review or obtain a reference to. It is my expressed purpose to maintain such a bibliography current and complete as possible, and submissions from enthusiasts, both professional and non-professional, are encouraged.
