

## C.A.R. - Displacements

Following the escalation of the inter-communal violence in the beginning of December 2013, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) in the Central African Republic has increased to more than 838 000. Over 400 000 are reported in the capital Bangui. Sixty percent of them are children. Over half of the 4.6 million population of the country is in immediate need of aid. (ECHO)

## Democratic Republic of Congo - Humanitarian Crisis

- Katanga: Renewed ethnic clashes and fights between armed groups and FARDC. Situation deteriorating, especially in the triangle Manono Pweto Mitwaba. 400 000 IDPs in the province.
- Orientale: Return of Congolese refugees from South Sudan. 6 254 in 2014 in Duru, Bangadi, Doruma.
- North Kivu: 80 000 IDPs, 30 000 refugees in Uganda following clashes between ADF-NALU and FARDC. ECHO evaluation mission in Nobili-Kamango confirmed food needs and water access critical. (ECHO)
