

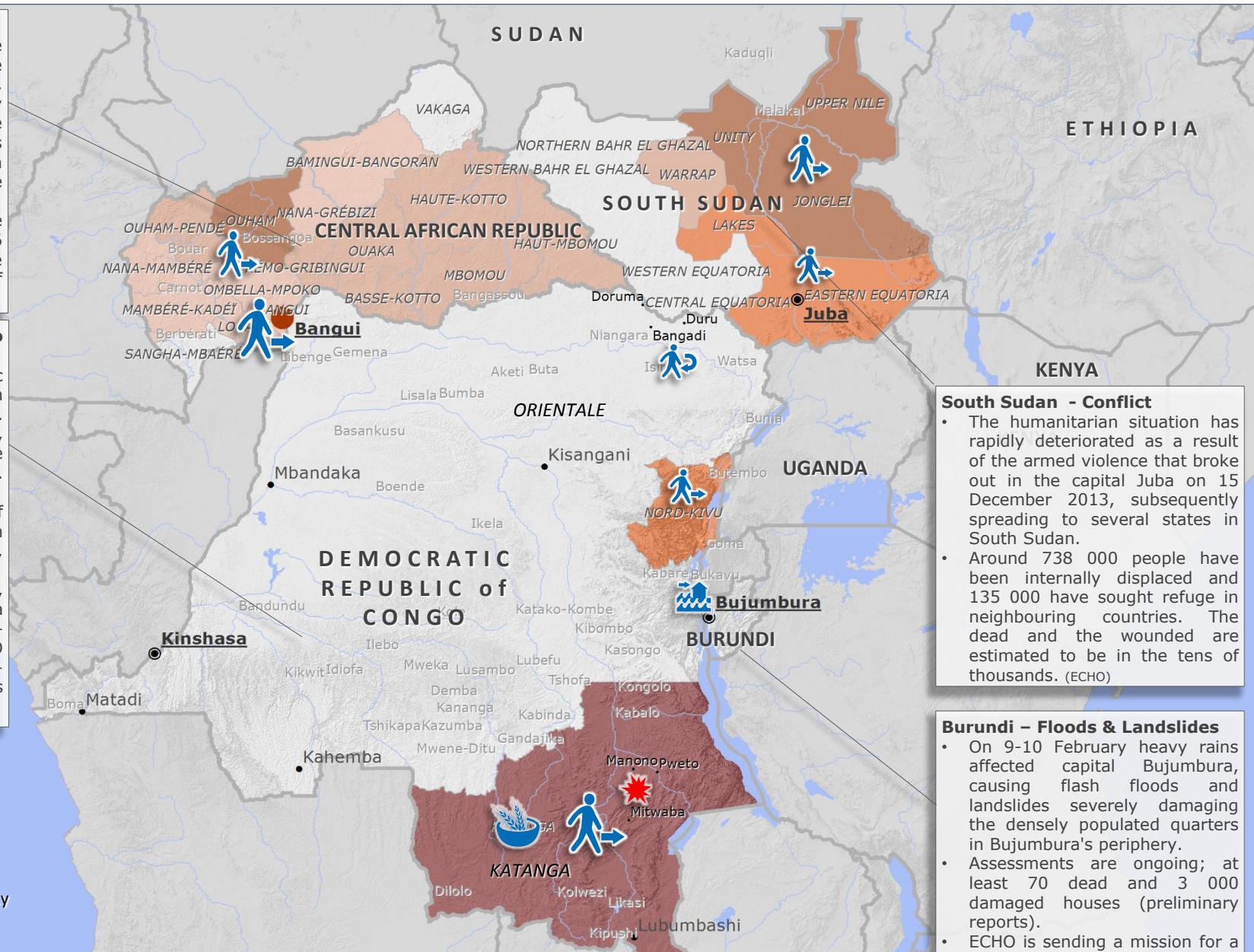
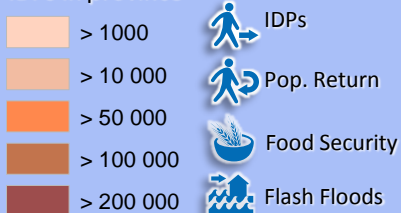
C.A.R. - Displacements

Following the escalation of the inter-communal violence in the beginning of December 2013, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) in the Central African Republic has increased to more than **838 000**. Over 400 000 are reported in the capital Bangui. Sixty percent of them are children. Over half of the 4.6 million population of the country is in immediate need of aid. (ECHO)

Democratic Republic of Congo – Humanitarian Crisis

- **Katanga:** Renewed ethnic clashes and fights between armed groups and FARDC. Situation deteriorating, especially in the triangle Manono – Pweto – Mitwaba. 400 000 IDPs in the province.
- **Orientale:** Return of Congolese refugees from South Sudan. 6 254 in 2014 in Duru, Bangadi, Doruma.
- **North Kivu:** 80 000 IDPs, 30 000 refugees in Uganda following clashes between ADF-NALU and FARDC. ECHO evaluation mission in Nobile-Kamango confirmed food needs and water access critical. (ECHO)

South Sudan - Conflict

- The humanitarian situation has rapidly deteriorated as a result of the armed violence that broke out in the capital Juba on 15 December 2013, subsequently spreading to several states in South Sudan.
- Around 738 000 people have been internally displaced and 135 000 have sought refuge in neighbouring countries. The dead and the wounded are estimated to be in the tens of thousands. (ECHO)

Burundi – Floods & Landslides

- On 9-10 February heavy rains affected capital Bujumbura, causing flash floods and landslides severely damaging the densely populated quarters in Bujumbura's periphery.
- Assessments are ongoing; at least 70 dead and 3 000 damaged houses (preliminary reports).
