1. Composing standard scholastic ability test problems.

After finishing several pre-test, examined the contents of problems, and reached decision, and accordingly made the following tests in order to make standard scale.

Upper secondary school mathematics (Analytical Geometry 1, Geometry)

This test was carried on picking up 900 students at random from Jonan and other 10 upper secondary schools on March 14.

National language, Mathematics. This was carried out in like manner on March 15 and 16 picking up 2700 pupils from Tokushima L.S.S. and 8 other lower secondary schools.

Attentions are focused on how to increase scholastic ability of students among people in the prefecture. Especially people engaged in education are making great efforts to improve students ability. Students' ability tests were made recently. These tests are valuable not only to know the present ability of students but also to give them adequate guidance, and are focusing general attention.

1. Aims of education confronted and efforts made toward these aims, and the degree of progress:

A. Completion of draft of educational budget for 1951.

Educational budget has been composed according to the principles reported last month, and after the negotiation with the governor, has been delivered to the governor.

B. Publishing of the lottery for the reconstruction of the Constitution Memorial Hall.

The lottery has been published, and is now being sold in various parts of the prefecture. The Constitution Memorial Hall construction expense, 20,000,000yen was decided to be put in the budget for 1951.

C. Educational Public Hearing.

Educational Public Hearing has been held in 7 places to listen to the opinions of the public as to the policies of the public as to the policies of the Board of Education. This has been very helpful, because through this the present policies of education were well understood by the people in general, and their opinions and wishes were also useful as good materials for making educational policies for 1951. On Feb. 27 last meeting of this program is to be held in Naruto City.

D. Establishment of principles for teacher transfer at the end of the school year:

To put the right person in the right place; to enrich the teaching staff suitable for the kind of the school; to make necessary transfer due to the appointment of the new graduates of various schools and colleges. According to these principles, detail plan for transfer is being made.

E. 5 day week system conference.

This conference was held on Jan. 23 at the office of the Board of Education. Attendants were representatives of the prefectural assembly, of various organizations, of press company, of schools, etc. The situation of the 5 day-week system in this prefecture was explained, and discussed. Different opinions were raised on the administration of Saturday, the decrease of students ability etc. But most opinions were in favor of this system and supported to continue the experiment.

Report of the monthly activities during January.

Remarkable tendencies during the month:

1. Meeting of Elementary and Secondary school principals in the prefecture:

In each gun and city, principals meeting was held for the purpose of effectuating school administration and the directions concerning transaction of school affairs during the end of school year and educational programs for the new school year were given to them.

2. Examination on the practice of 5-day week system:

It's already one year since this system was adopted throughout this prefecture. So we made a spot-check survey to see the effect of this system. The result shows that this system is being carried on satisfactorily as a whole, although there are some detail points which need to be corrected. On 23 of this month popular meeting is planned to be held to listen to the public opinions on this system. Representatives of various circle of the prefecture are going to be invited to this meeting. Further rationalization of the administration of this system and its sound development are expected.

3. Increase of the number of schools having school lunch program. 41 schools in the prefecture are added and designated for school lunch program. Through this, 12,000 pupils are to be added to this program.

1. Purpose:

To grasp the actual effect of the present education:
 its merits and defects, by examining abilities of upper secondary
 and elementary pupils in this prefecture, and obtain concrete
 data for pupil guidance and education, and thus to increase
 efficiency of education.

2. Characteristics of this test.

(1) As clear by the purpose of this test, its characteristics and principles exist in obtaining materials for pupil guidance.

(2) Although this test is not compulsory but voluntary, almost 100 per cent of the schools of this prefecture are applying for it, as it is considered necessary requisite for effective education.

(3) Questions are so composed as to enable the measurement of the extent of achievement through the analysis of the objectives in the new course of study.

(4) Besides achievement test, aptitude test is to be made at the same time.

(5) It is so devised as to enable the evaluation of educational contents the without waluating principals and teachers.

(6) Especially, by the use of the "Handbook for utilizing the results of test" it is intended to be utilized for the education of pupils. This is, we believe, an unusual example.

4. Problems of test.

From among teachers of upper secondary and elementary schools in the prefecture, pupil ability test problem composing and advisory committees were chosen, and they presented problems for test. Teacher consultants composed test problems using them as references.

(2) Characteristics of the problems of this test.

a. Analyzed aims of education according to the new course of study and enabled to measure the degree of attainment.

b. Enabled to measure understanding, skills, and attitude. But skills and attitude could not but be considerably limited. This was true especially in case of upper secondary.

c. Studied pattern of question and tried to create new pattern.

(3) Content and scope.

In case of elementary test, contents of each subject: "National language and Arithmetic" "Physical education" "Physical education," "Social Study and Science", "Music, Art and craft, Home-making" were allotted according to the time allotment presented in the new course of study Part I (General).

In case of upper secondary, for general Social Study was adopted for Social study, General Mathematics or analytical Geometry I for Mathematics, Chemistry or Biology for Science, National language excluding Chinese classics, Comprehensive Agriculture I for Agriculture, and A or B course of General Home-making for Home-making.

1. Aims of education confronted, and efforts made by superintendent and the extent of progress toward the goal.
 - A. Budget making for 1950-52 and negotiation with the prefectural government.

Emphasis of budget making for 51-52 is put on

 - a. supplementing teachers
 - b. enrichment of contents and equipment of schools and
 - c. Establishment of citizens' public halls according to this policy the budget is composed to negotiate with the pref. govt.

Difficulties are expected in getting this budget approved, as the financial condition of the prefecture is very bad. But we are resolved to make our best effort to get a satisfactory result.
 - B. On reconstruction of Constitution Memorial Hall.

We are endeavoring to reconstruct Constitution Memorial Hall. For the funds of reconstruction the draft of the plan of publishing 15,000,000 yen lottery is decided to be presented in the regular meeting of the prefectural assembly during December. Its profit, insurance money, and expense from pref. govt. will be main funds. With these funds, plan is being made to realize to start work as soon as possible.
 - C. Evaluation of the experiment of 5 day week system.

As the result of examination from various angles as to how the three main principles of 5 day week system

 - a. complete 5 day school activities
 - b. cultivation of independent attitude for study on the part of the students
 - c. strengthening of teachers in-service education, the conclusion is that present situation is showing satisfactory result as a whole.
 - D. On improvement of teachers' salaries.
 - a. Based on the cabinet order concerning first salary, promotion etc. article 12, section 3, paragraph 1 which mentions about special officials, re-counting of salary was done and announcement of promotion etc. was finished by the end of November.



D. Completion of the survey on finance.

Ministry of education has been making investigation on finance since the end of August this year to clarify nation-wide condition of educational expence and its standard especially under the equalization fund system, and in this prefecture too this survey has been made and completed and reported to the Ministry. These materials will be distributed to each town or village to be made reference materials for budget making.
