

CARLISLE FITTING SCHOOL.

Musical and Literary Entertainment.
An Excellent Institution.

BAMBERG, April 22.—Special.—The entertainment given last night at the Carlisle Fitting School was a perfect success, and the musical part of the programme was a reartreat. The entertainment was gotten up to raise money to purchase book cases to hold the handsome library recently presented to the school by Gen. F. M. Bamberg, and which has just arrived. The large chapel of the beautiful new school building was crowded and a sum sufficient for the purpose required was realized.

Quattlebaum and Izlar.

The singing of Misses Gussie Adams and Clara Riley and the instrumental work by Misses Effie Bamberg and Annie Adams won the highest praises, the audience insisted on encores after each number.

That such a programme should have been so successfully rendered shows the rapid progress made by the pupils in the music department, which is presided over by Miss Sams, an accomplished young lady of wonderful talent from Gaffney City, who has recently been added to the faculty.

The Carlisle school has never been in a more flourishing condition than it is now. The faculty is composed of three male and three lady teachers including a music instructor. It has over one hundred students, about forty per cent. of whom are non-residents. The school is but seven months old, and is running along as nicely and disciplined as well as a school ten years old. The handsome new building, which cost \$10,000, has been completed, and presents an attractive appearance.

Prof. Hugo G. Sheridan, as head master of the school, probably has no superior in South Carolina in his line, as is evidenced by the fact that nearly all of his old students have followed him here.

As an adjunct of Wofford College for young men and the Columbia Female College for young ladies, the Carlisle Fitting School will do much towards prospering those institutions, and Bamberg will always be proud of her fitting school.
