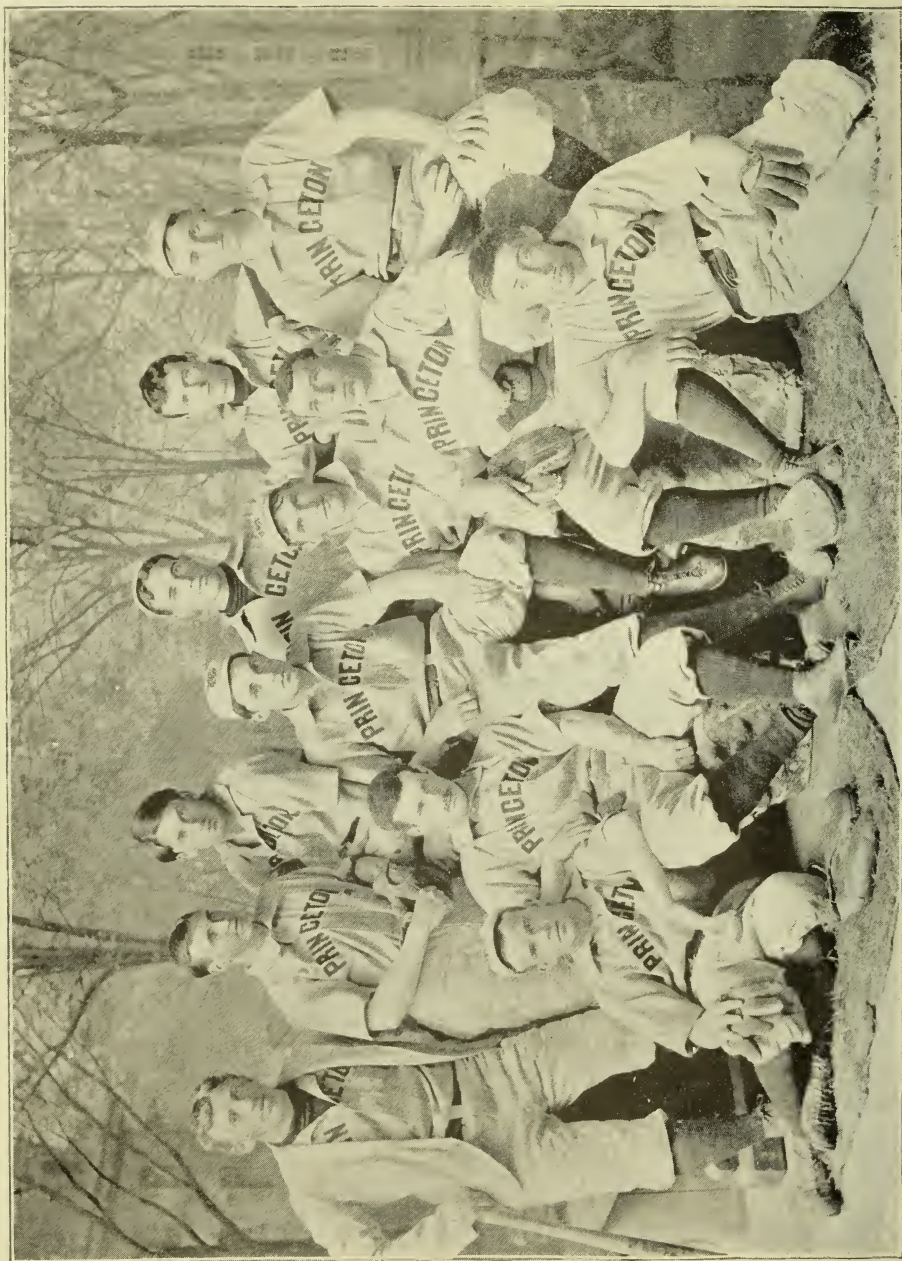

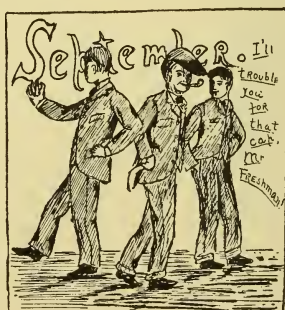
PRINCETON College entered upon its 145th Academic year, on the afternoon of the twenty-third of September, 1891, at half past three, with the usual greetings and handshakings; we all hied ourselves to Marquand Chapel, there to attend the opening exercises, and to view, with amazement, the largest Freshmen Class ever seen.

On the following day these same Freshmen swarmed into the old Chapel, and proceeded to the election of their officers and to the framing of resolutions, apropos of the warm reception to which they had been treated by the Sophomores.

After much noise and excitement, J. P. Poe was chosen President, and A. Wheeler and H. Anderson, Vice-President and Treasurer respectively.

That same evening saw one of Princeton's glorious old customs duly enacted. Notwithstanding the threats and prophesies of Mat. Goldie, the rush did come off. The entire Sophomore and Freshmen classes, after amassing in the most compact forms possible, with great fortitude, proceeded to walk into each other for four consecutive times. Amid the dash and shouts and uproar, the Sophomores were finally declared victorious, and the weary participants departed homeward for bed.

On the twenty-fifth the old chapel was again thronged. A college mass meeting was held in which the election of Prof. Woodrow Wilson to the Graduate Advisory Committee was ratified.



September 28th, the class Base-ball Championship began by 'Ninety-two beating the Freshmen, in their first appearance, by nine runs to five.

Rain prevented the Junior Sophomore game on the twenty-ninth. On the thirtieth, 'Ninety-three beat 'Ninety-five, ten to nothing.

OCTOBER.

The month of October opened very auspiciously for our grave old Seniors, for by winning from 'Ninety-four by a score of four to nothing, they also won the championship for the third successive year.

Saturday, the day of horse and revel, at last arrived. The 'Varsity Grounds were crowded by throngs of people to witness the Sophomore-Freshman game. Amid the noise and tumult, and brilliant repartees of the spectators, the Sophomores succeeded in getting the less rattled, and, after a close and very exciting contest, finally vanquished the Freshmen by the score of six to four.



After the din of the game had subsided, we watched the quieter struggle of the eleven with Rutgers. The visitors were beaten twelve to nothing, and the professional prophets secured their first definite data. On the eighth we scored eighteen points against

Lehigh, at Bethlehem, and on the tenth the prophets were given further material by a score of twenty-eight to nothing against the Crescents.

On the ninth the Sophomore class elected their Reception Committee.

On the fourteenth of the month, the second game with Lehigh showed the improvement in the team's work in the score of thirty to nothing, and on the following Saturday the eleven met Franklin and Marshall. All sorts of rumors came back about the game until the score was definitely announced on the Princetonian bulletin board as forty-four to nothing. The game with Lafayette on the twentieth resulted in a score of twenty to nothing.

It was about this time that the hearts of those who revel in atomic affinities were gladdened by the completion of the new Chemical Laboratory. Those who knew said it was the most convenient and complete in the country, and we, who did not know, proudly communicated that information to our friends.

A not very exciting game was played with the New York Athletic Club on the twenty-fourth and twenty-eight points more were added to our record. The Fall Handicap Games were held the same afternoon.

On the twenty-ninth we defeated the Manhattan Athletic Club by the score of seventy-eight to nothing, but it is impossible to arouse much enthusiasm over the "Dutch taking Holland." A Hare



and Hounds Club was organized under the name of the University Harriers. The month ended with the game with Wesleyan, won by a score of seventy-three to nothing. This was the first champion-

ship game, and the eyes of the college now became resolutely fixed on Thanksgiving Day; and so, leaving us struggling betwixt hope and fear, the glorious, golden days of such an October as had not been known for years, came to an end.

NOVEMBER.

The first of November has come, and the greatest day of the year to the undergraduate is but some three weeks off. Every day the 'Varsity grounds are crowded to their utmost, and the least improvement in the practise of the team is eagerly noted. The scores of Wednesday's and Saturday's games are read and compared. Everybody is busy conjecturing the relative strength of our eleven with Yale's, and so great is the excitement that the month is nearly gone before we know it.



On Election Day while the Foot-ball team was defeating Orange, to the tune of twenty-eight to nothing, the Tennis friends were busily watching the final struggles in the Freshman tournament.

On the following Saturday, all who could possibly find the funds boarded a Special Train, and were rolled towards Manheim, where we had the satisfaction of beating the University of Pennsylvania twenty-four to nothing.

On the night of the twelfth the Cane Spree took place, in which the Freshmen were successful, winning two out of the three events from the Sophomores. The fourteenth dampened the hopes of the College, Cornell was beaten by the meagre score of six to nothing. But it was only for a time. The practise of the team grew better and better. The spirit of the College ran high, even the Freshmen caught some of it, and proceeded to wallup Lawrenceville by twenty points to nothing.

Everybody was now emigrating to New York. At last Thanksgiving had arrived, and—nineteen to nothing, Well, in the words of the prophet:—"We saw what we saw."



December is a peculiar month. The great game is over, Baseball is so far off as to be practically *nil*, and the midyear examinations still lie in that border land of doubt which we would fain leave unexplored. On the third of the month the Glee, Banjo and Mandolin Clubs gave their first concert at Trenton.

On the eighth Philip King, '93, was elected captain of the Foot-ball team.

JANUARY.

Fully eleven inches of cold, white snow was complacently awaiting the happy Freshmen as they returned from their homes at the end of Christmas vacation.

For the next few days human forms were to be seen flying helter-skelter throughout the town. The very air was invested with snow-balls. At last, to the high glee of the upper classmen, this great fight took place. 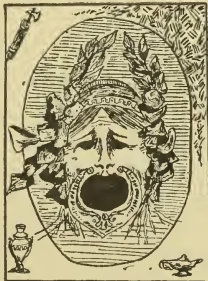

On the evening of the twentieth the last concert of the year was given at the Assembly Rooms of the Madison Square Garden in New York.

On the evening of the twenty-ninth the long looked for event in the Dramatic World took place. *Katherine* made her first appearance at the Gymnasium. The poor old chest weights and rowing machines were unfeelingly banished to the cellar, and the walls of our stately Sanctuary of Muscle, beheld a sight such as they never dreamed of before.



APRIL.

Benjamin Brandeth McAlpin, Charles B. Newton and Bertram Vandyke Post; from Whig Hall, A. P. Andrew, Jr., H. L. B. Henderson, John W. Nicely and A. M. Thompson. On the ninth we defeated Lehigh by a score of ten to one.

The next day the organizations of the Republican and Democratic Clubs for the campaign were completed. This day was also marked by the culmination of a deal between the *Princetonian* and the German department, and the consequent appearance of that journal with the most wildly delirious title at the top of the first page that ever marked the progress of college journalism; it was what the French call *ravissant*. It is to be regretted that this inspiring emblem was subsequently withdrawn.

On the thirteenth the team defeated the Staten Island Athletic Club by a score of seven to one, and on the following Friday, the fifteenth, started on their Easter trip in the south.

April twenty-third, we defeated Lehigh ten to six. On the twenty-seventh the giants of debate in the respective halls tried conclusions in the preliminary Lynde contest. Clio Hall choose as her representatives, Hanson, Prentice and Street; alternate, Duffield. Whig's candidates were, Brennan, Phinizy and Wood; alternate, Truby. On the same day there had been a different kind of contest going on at the 'Varsity grounds, occasioned by the visit of the University of Pennsylvania Ball team, who were victorious by six runs to nothing, and so the showery, uncertain, delightful month of April faded away, leaving nothing but a memory of another bit of our little journey through the world now lost in the shadowy past, this, and the promise of May.

MAY.

May with all its balmy days, and perfect Spring weather, was destined to be a very dark month in the history of Princeton. Not contented with bringing reverse after reverse to our busy Ball team, it also cast its shadow on Track Athletics, and the team, which authorities said, was good for first place at Mott Haven, was destined to finish an uncomfortable third.

As early as the seventh our ball of ill-luck was set a rolling. Harvand defeated the nine by eleven runs to five.

On the tenth however, we took a brace, and in the second game with the University of Pennsylvania, beat them eight to one.

This spirit lasted for some days, for on the fourteenth the Track team started off with a glorious rush, and won in the Dual Games with Columbia by seventy points to forty-two.

The twentieth was a gala day for Princeton town. The anniversary of the founding of the Fire Department. A grand parade took place. Every patriotic citizen was arrayed in red flannel, and the whole effect was greatly heightened by four brass bands, playing as many different tunes simultaneously. That evening there was a College mass meeting for the election of Athletic officers. The fortunate candidates were University Treasurer, R. T. Shelton, President of the Base-ball association, W. Ferguson, and T. F. Humphrey, Treasurer. On the twenty-third

Yale beat us at New Haven, one to nothing. On the twenty-eighth the Mott Haven games took place. Harvard won, Yale second, and Princeton third.

There were only three more days of May left, but in that time Princeton was again defeated at Cambridge, May thirtieth: Harvard nine, Princeton four.



JUNE.

June will go down in history as a fit beginning of the hottest summer known for years, but, as the Exams. were upon us, heat was a very small item in the list of our discomforts.

On the eleventh, the Yale team came to Princeton for their second game. The Alumni had already begun to arrive, and the Campus was fast putting on its festive commencement attire.

Even the "Pollers," now that examinations were over, flocked out in full force, and the meek Freshmen, of a few hours before appeared in all the glory of a Sophomore's lavish display of colors.

Though the championship was not for us, we did hope, and not unreasonably, for second place. The game was far too close for any comfort, the score remaining one to one until the eighth inning.

Then Murphy, Yale's Captain, stepped to the bat, and, with two men on bases, drove the ball high up towards the heavens, and our hopes,—well, at any rate the celebration was postponed for another year.



But June is the month of roses, and with all the fair strangers in town, there were pleasanter things to be done than bewail ill-luck. On Sunday morning the Seniors solemnly filed into Marquand chapel to hear their Baccalaureate sermon.

Monday was class-day, the day dear to the heart of every Princetonian, when the Senior class assembles round the cannon, tells its history, and smokes a parting pipe.

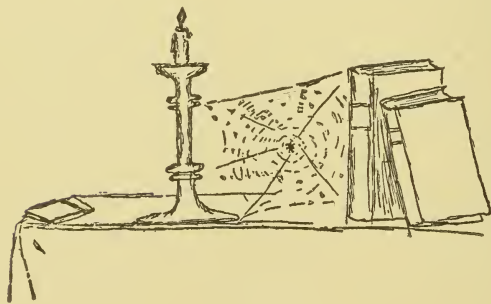
Though the afternoon was excessively hot, the hours slipped quickly by, and before we knew it the last pipe had been broken, and another class had left its number on the old cannon.

The Sophomore Reception delightfully bridged over the interval between Tuesday and Wednesday, and with the morning came the one hundred and forty-fifth annual commencement.

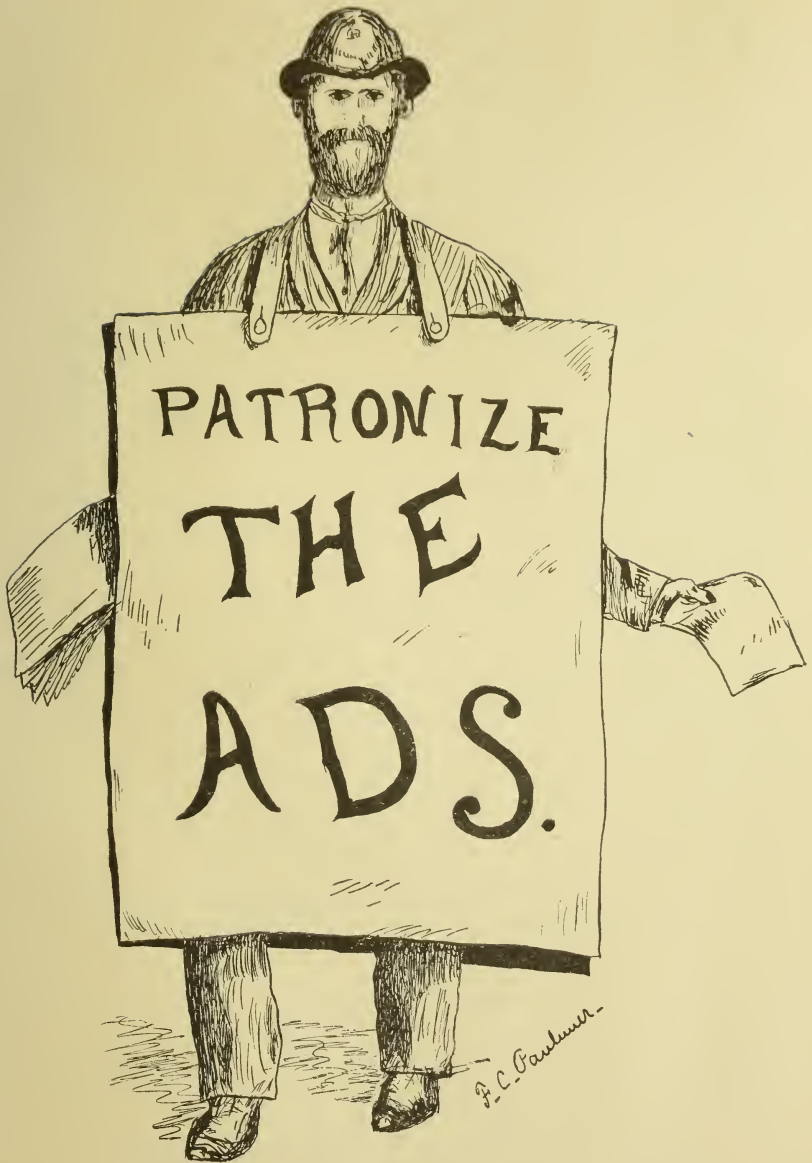
