

OBJECTIVES FOR THE EVENT				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Virtual affiliate and community-led events for various languages, regions and themes</li> <li>Prepare and adapt materials locally</li> <li>Prepare participants at individual, organizational and regional levels to engage with prioritization and implementation discussions</li> <li>Ensure participants are familiar with the process and have the relevant information</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Low barrier for entry: participants should not need an in-depth knowledge of strategy</li> <li>Events that are interesting and relevant to everyday matters</li> <li>Participants can focus on their (or community's) needs and interests</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To make decisions, collaborate, take ownership for implementation, and celebrate</li> <li>Events must accommodate different time zones and input in multiple languages</li> <li>Forum for global prioritization, decision-making, and defining roles and responsibilities for implementation</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For sharing updates and decisions back with communities</li> <li>Combined with on-wiki updates</li> <li>To coordinate locally and regionally roles and responsibilities for the next steps and for taking implementation work forward</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Movement-wide collaborations bringing communities, affiliates and the Wikimedia Foundation together to implement the prioritized actions and changes from the Movement Strategy recommendations</li> <li>Some will be local / regional experiments, and some will be globally coordinated initiatives</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We need to define what actions and changes from the recommendations are relevant for different local, regional and thematic contexts</li> <li>For that, we need to prioritize and state: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>What will make an important difference in the movement?</li> <li>What has a high impact?</li> <li>What responds to our needs as different groups?</li> <li>Where would we be willing to invest energy and resources for the first 18 months of implementation?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Analysis of the incoming data to generate clusters from the proposed WHY/NEED/IMPACT statements</li> <li>Transition Support Team will aggregate the information and keep it open on-wiki and elsewhere for input from communities</li> <li>This will lead to clear patterns of priorities to use for the global conversations</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Previous step identified what we want to work on, now we need to decide when we want to work on it over the next 18 months and who does what</li> <li>Decisions around which parts of implementation start first, which start later, and which are independent, interdependent, and dependent</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Now we know what we are working on and when, the next question is who will work on it</li> <li>This is about setting up coordination teams for collaborating and experimenting, who will be involved in a supporting role and who will be leading/coordinating some aspects</li> <li>Teams can begin meetings and plan their specific implementation projects</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Movement Strategy taking life in different corners of our movement</li> <li>A lot of learning and growth</li> </ul>
