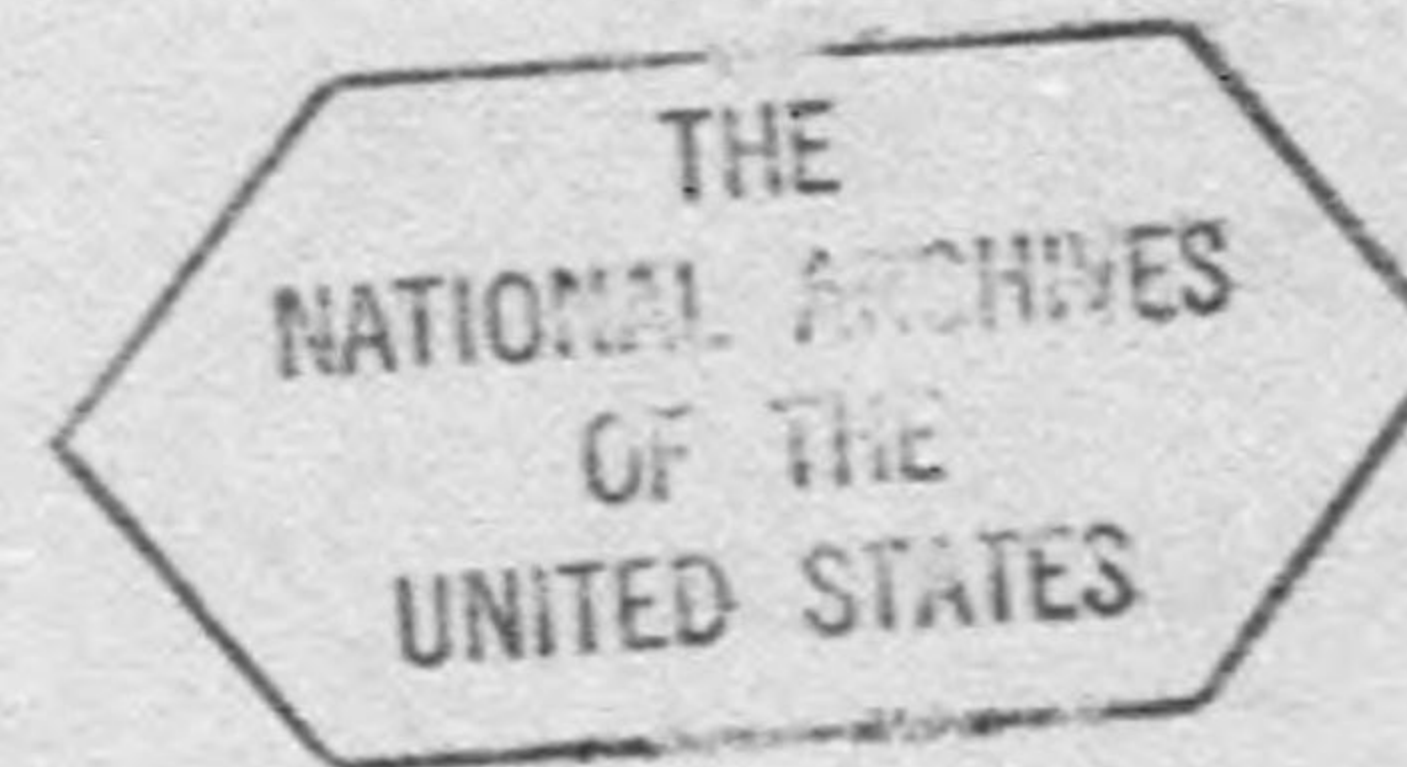

Arenals in Kanto Region.

1. Reference is made to inclosed memorandum, Headquarters, Kanto Civil Affairs Region APO 500, KEDI 387.6, subject: "Report on Reduction of Custodial Personnel at Reparations Arenals in Kanto Region," dated 6 Nov. 1950, 14 Nov. 1950 and 1 Dec 1950.

2. At 1st Naval Fuel Depot, Ofuna (19-26), Fukaya Factory, 2nd Military Arsenal (34-35) and 1st Naval Air Depot (14-01), it is difficult to reduce at once custodial personnel as instructed under existing conditions and guards are required as follows:

Name of Arsenal	Code No.	Number of required guards	Reasons
1st Naval Fuel Depot	19 - 26	15	Reparations machines are scattered over a wide range.
Fukaya Factory, 2nd Military Arsenal	34 - 35	14	Guard-posts are 3 and no more reparations machines are concentrated.
1st Naval Air Depot	14 - 01	18	In addition to the arsenal, Ami-machi, Inashiki-gun, there are 4 oil tanks in the district under their charge. They must go rounds and guard these installations at the same time.

We request that your authorization be given to the subject as above.

at Reparations Arsenals in Kanto Region

1. Reference is made to inclosed memorandum, Kanto Liaison and Coordination Office, file KLO No 1,729, subject same as above, dated 27 October 1950.

2. The reports on the reduction of custodial personnel which are attached to the reference are acceptable with the following exceptions:-

a. 38-27 and 38-13, Utsunomiya Air Arsenal and Naval Technical Research Laboratory. The number of guards to be paid from reparations funds should be reduced to three since the Fuji Industrial Co. Ltd, Utsunomiya Plant (38-10), where they are located has a sufficient number of guards for the whole installation.

b. 34-35, 2d Tokyo Military Arsenal, Fukaya Plant. The number of guard posts should be reduced to three and the number of guards to be paid from reparation funds to 14.

c. 34-38, Tachikawa Military Air Arsenal, Tokorozawa Plant. The number of guards to be paid from reparation funds should be reduced to three and one guard should be paid from operating plant funds.

d. 10-24, 1st Naval Technical Arsenal, Maebashi Branch. The number of guards should be reduced to only one for daytime duty only since the Fuji Industrial Co Ltd, Isesaki Plant (10-06), where they are located, has a sufficient number of guards for the whole installation.

e. 19-26, 1st Naval Fuel Depot, Ofuna. The number of guard posts should be reduced to five and the number of guards to be paid from reparation funds to 20.

f. 39-51, 1st Tokyo Military Arsenal, Jujo Plant. The guard post located in the released area (Bldg No 52) should either be eliminated or complimented with guards paid from other than reparations funds. The permanent guard post on Bldg No 1160 should be moved to a more westerly sector within the installation and the number of guards to be paid from reparations funds be reduced to 20.

1. Reference is made to memorandum, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 6 November 1950.
2. Paragraph 2 b is corrected to read as follows: "b. 34-35, 2d Tokyo Military Arsenal, Fukaya Plant. The number of guard posts should be reduced to three and the number of guards to be paid from reparations funds to 10".
3. Following are additions to paragraph 2 of the reference:
  - a. "g. 19-29, 2d Naval Explosive Arsenal. The number of guards to be paid from reparations funds should be reduced to six, and six should be paid from the operating funds of the occupying companies."
  - b. "h. 39-70, 72, 73 and 76, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th Military Technical Laboratory. The number of guards to be paid from reparation funds should be reduced to 12 and six should be paid from the operating funds of the occupying companies".
  - c. "i. 39-54, 2d Tokyo Military Arsenal, Itabashi Plant. The number of guards to be paid from reparations funds should be reduced to six, and six should be paid from the operating funds of the occupying companies and institutions."
  - d. "j. 19-26, 1st Naval Fuel Depot, Ofuna. The number of guards to be paid for from reparations funds should be reduced to five, and 23 should be paid for from operating funds of the occupying companies and institutions."

reduced to 19.
