JAPAN-ECONOMICS-PRICE CONTROL

Article states that as a result of readjustment, ceiling prices for fresh vegetables and fruit have been raised 60%, for fish 80%. Additional details. Asahi Shimbun 30 Aug 44 1-7.

INCREASED PRICES OF VEGETABLES IN JAPAN

Under the directive for the special management of the prices of fresh foods, as issued by the Ministry of Agriculture and Commerce to be enforced from 30 (August 1944), the list of fresh food items is made under the price control policy.

I. Vegetables listed for increase of prices under price control.

- A. The prices of all vegetables under price control will be increased 10 sen for each kan (a kan equals 8.27 lbs. average) at retail and 7 sen at wholesale in the designated areas of Nagasaki, Yokosuka (横須賀), Nagoya (名古屋), Kyoto (京都), Osaka and its neighborhood cities, Kobe and its neighborhood cities, Kure (呉), Hiroshima, Shimonoseki (下関), districts of northern Kyushu (九州), and Sasebo (佐世保).
- B. There will be a five sen increase in wholesale and retail prices for a kan of vegetables in all other areas.
- C. When a retailer is to deliver vegetables to families, an additional charge shall be made for deliveries.

Cucumbers, peas, tomatoes, ginger, dried onions, green onions, scallions, Welsh onions, kidney-beans, squash, taros, cabbage, Chinese cabbage, spinach, and all other vegetables are listed for an increase of prices from 40 to 40.0% at the second step of the control. Western and Japanese varieties of squash, white radishes, and carrots are classified in one category for price regulation.

- II. The designated prices of vegetables for wholesales and retail according to the classification of periods are as follows (wholesale price is for kan, and retail price is for momme (1 momme equals 58 Tr. grains):

the demonstration of Italians at the University of Innsbruck; at the age of 24, he was asked to assume the direction of the newspaper, Il Nuovo Trentino; at the age of 30, he was sent as deputy to the Vienna Parliament where he distinguished himself for his courageous defense of those being persecuted by the Austrian government; in 1919, he was acclaimed as president of the first congress of the Popular Party at Bologna; after the annexation of Trentino, he was sent as deputy to the Italian Parliament; shortly afterwards, he was elected president of the popular parliamentary group; when Sturzo was compelled to abandon his post, De Gasperi, one of the Anti-Fascist leaders assumed his position as head of the party; in 1926, he was arrested and sentenced to four years imprisonment; after this, he worked in the Vatican library for many years in obscurity and silence; during this period, he wrote many praiseworthy works under a pseudonym; in 1942, he resumed active anti-Fascist work in interests of the party; when the first Democratic government was formed last June, he held the position of minister without portfolio and at the same time became head of the Partito Democratico Cristiano. Rodino, Giulio. Vice-president of the Council in the new Bonomi Cabinet, was born at Naples in 1872. From 1913 to 1925 he was a member of Parliament and minister of War in the Nitti Giolitti and Bonomi cabinets. RLI 10 D 44 2-1.

Ruini, Meuccio. Minister of Public Works in the new Bonomi cabinet, was born at Reggio Emilia in 1877. After graduating from the University of Bologna, he became active in political and literary circles. He entered into the administration of Public Works while continuing his journalistic career as collaborator on the Critica Sociale under the pseudonym of Chantecler. As a militant radical-socialist, he took an active part in the Partito Socialista Radicale. In 1907, he received an appointment as labor director for the South. At the same time, he entered the communal administration of Rome and founded the Istituto per le Case Popolari (People's Insurance). Later he acted as deputy and State Councillor. In 1913, over stiff opposition, he was elected deputy from Castelnuovo Montis and was thus one of the 69 radical deputies to the Chamber which two years later declared war on Austria. Ruini enlisted and received the silver medal for valor shown in battle. In the postwar period, he was one of the most prominent political figures in Italy. Minister of Labor in 1918, minister of the Colonies in 1920, he soon emerged as a foremost opposer of Fascism. Upon the advent of Mussolini, he resumed his journalistic career writing economic articles for Mondo. Together with Giovanni Amendola, he founded the Unione Nazionale, center of the Democratic Labor movement. He was then dismissed from his position as State Councillor and in the next twenty years, he passed the time in studying, publishing finally two books Corvetto and La Signora Stail. When the Fascist regime was first threatened with disaster, Ruini became active again and organized the first of the resistance groups. Due to his efforts, these anti-Fascist groups were molded into one powerful organization, the Comitato di Liberazione Nazionale. When, in 1942, the group, Ricostruzione, gave evidence of becoming a political movement, Ruini organized and promoted the formation the Partito Democratico del Lavoro, centered around Ivanoe Bonomi. In the first Bonomi cabinet he was a minister without portfolio but his work against Fascism and for the reconstruction of Italy is well known. Ric 12 D 44 1-7.
