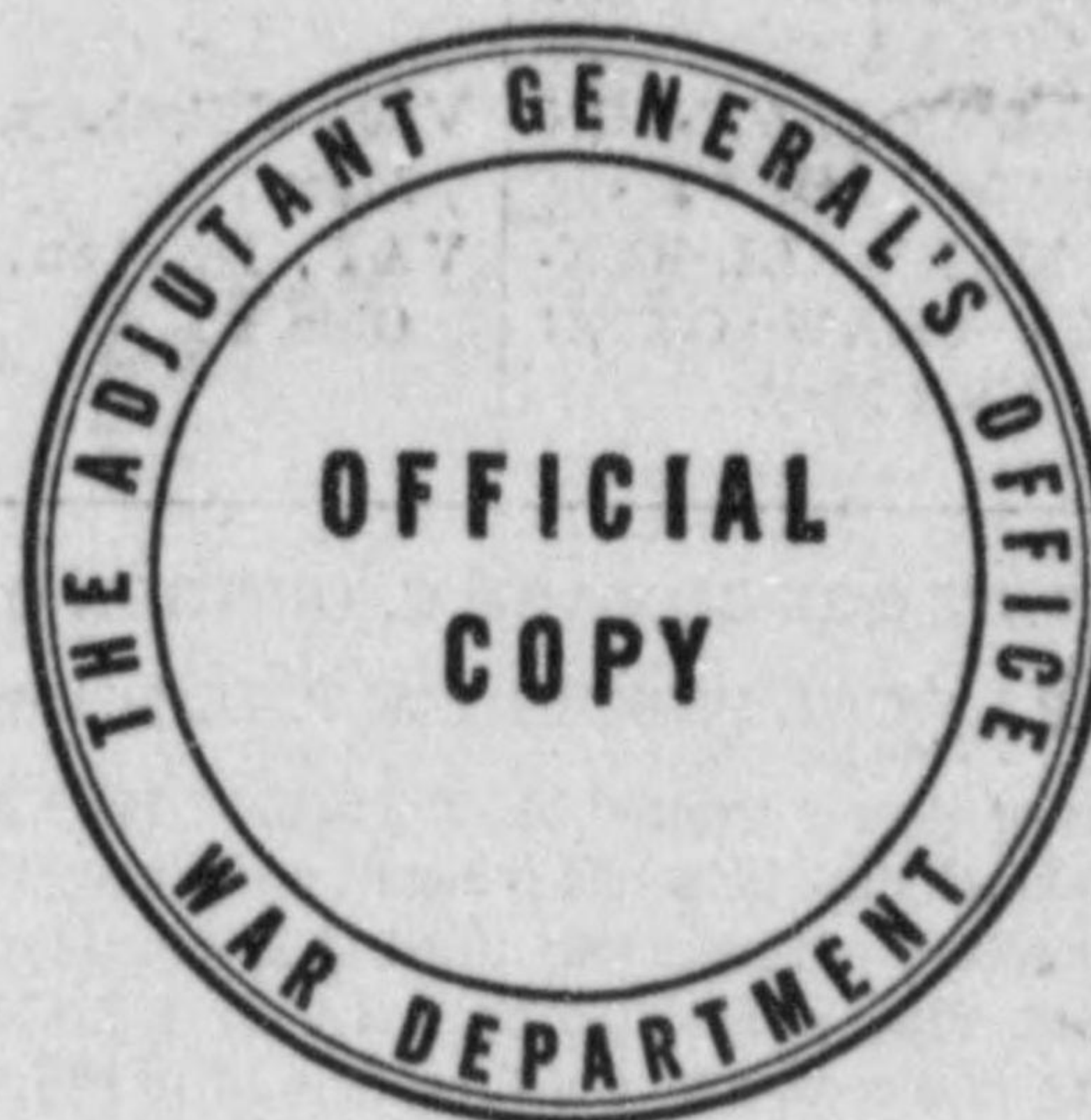


SUBJECT: Extended Active Duty for National Guard, Reserve, WAC and Warrant Officers.

1. Attached hereto is a statement of policy concerning extended active duty for National Guard, Reserve, WAC and Warrant Officers who are on a terminal leave status or who have been relieved from active duty.

2. National Guard, Reserve, WAC or Warrant Officers who desire extended active duty with one of the War Department Groups will initiate the action in writing to The Adjutant General, who will forward the application to the Personnel and Administrative Branch, Office, Chief of Staff. The requested assignment will then be referred by this office to the agency concerned for recommendation and return to the Personnel and Administrative Branch.

3. No quota under which officers can be recalled to active duty has been established for the War Department Groups; accordingly, each request for extended active duty will be considered on an individual basis by this office in conjunction with the Personnel and Administration Division. (G-1).

War Department letter, (AGMP-M 210.31 (14 Mar 46)A) 16 March 1946, subject, "Extended active duty for National Guard and Reserve Officers," is amended by making reference in the last sentence of paragraph 2 to WD circulars 61 and 75, 1946, instead of WD Circular 194, 1945, and by adding the following paragraph:

6. The foregoing provisions pertaining to the recall to active duty of National Guard and Reserve Officers who are on terminal leave or who have been relieved from active duty are applicable to WAC Officers, nurses, dietitians, physical therapists, and warrant officers (male and female), except so much of paragraph 2 as states an AUS officer will not be recalled to active duty unless an appointment is accepted in the Officers' Reserve Corps under the provisions of WD circulars 61 and 75, 1946.

SUBJECT: Extended active duty for National Guard and Reserve Officers

TO: Deputy Chief of Staff
Commanding Generals:
Army Ground Forces
Army Air Forces
Army Service Forces

1. The War Department desires that the interim Army contain a capable volunteer officer corps balanced with respect to the distribution of military occupational specialties, grade, and arm, or service. To this end, it is the policy of the War Department that within the procedure outlined below, competent National Guard and Reserve officers should be granted extended active duty to fill officer shortages below authorized requirements within quotas established by the War Department.

2. This policy is to remain in effect until the Army attains a permanent postwar status. It is applicable to National Guard and Reserve officers who are on terminal leave or who have been relieved from active duty. An Army of the United States officer who does not hold an appointment in the National Guard of the United States or the Officers' Reserve Corps will not be recalled to active duty unless he first applies for, is offered, and accepts an appointment in the Officers' Reserve Corps under the provisions of WD Circulars 61 and 75, 1946.

3. The matter of deciding whether or not a National Guard or Reserve officer will be granted extended active duty under this policy is the responsibility of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Commanding General, Army Air Forces, Commanding General, Army Ground Forces, or Commanding General, Army Service Forces, who may delegate the authority to the chiefs of technical services. In arriving at this determination, the commander should consider the needs of his command, his responsibility for providing replacements for overseas theaters, and requests he receives for personnel to be assigned to the several War Department activities. These commanders are hereby authorized to approve or disapprove requests for recall to extended active duty for National Guard and Reserve officers within the following minimum restrictions: The officer must--

- a. Agree to serve in a category I or II volunteer status under the provisions of section IV, WD Circular 366, 1945.
- b. Meet physical standards for general service.

c. Accept a temporary Army of the United States appointment in the grade offered by the War Department which will not be higher than the grade in which the officer served immediately prior to processing for relief from active duty. This is necessary in the interest of fairness to officers who remained on active duty and have not received the promotion made available to many officers who entered on a terminal leave status and have reverted to inactive duty.

d. Have an efficiency index of 40 or better for all active military service performed subsequent to 16 September 1940, as specified in paragraph 9, WD Circular 10, 1946.

e. Be professionally qualified to perform effectively a military occupational specialty without further training other than on-the-job, refresher, and orientation.

f. Have full understanding of the above conditions and must be further advised that he is subject to--

(1) Oversea assignment.

(2) Any general downward grade readjustment procedure in the same manner as all other officers on active duty except that he will not be reduced to a grade lower than the permanent grade he held on 7 December 1941. In view of the fact the officer is to be granted extended active duty in a temporary AUS status, his permanent National Guard of the United States or Officers' Reserve Corps appointment will not be disturbed.

4. The officer desiring extended active duty must apply for such duty in writing to The Adjutant General.

5. Upon receipt of an application, The Adjutant General will forward the matter to the commanding general of the major command having primary interest in the officer's arm or service, except that applications from officers whose last duty assignment was with an Army Air Forces element will be referred to the Army Air Forces. The application will then be referred in accordance with the officer's indicated preference. The commander granting extended active duty will forward the officer's approved application to The Adjutant General together with necessary assignment instructions and grade to be offered. The Adjutant General will be responsible for taking necessary action to--

a. Terminate and make any appointments.

b. Issue the necessary assignment instructions and amend relief from active duty orders (if the officer is on terminal leave), or order

the officer to active duty (if the officer has reverted to an inactive status) and specify his date of rank. The officer's extended active duty will be in a temporary Army of the United States status.


1. This office has been requested by the War Department Manpower Board to submit estimates of personnel requirements for the third quarter of the calendar year 1946.

MEMORANDUM TO WAR DEPARTMENT GROUPS:

SUBJECT: Grade Readjustment of Commissioned Officers

1. The following message received from the Office of the Adjutant General is quoted for your information and compliance:

a. The purpose of this message is to announce the policy and procedures to be followed in effecting grade readjustment of commissioned officers exclusive of general officers and to announce the discontinuance of officer promotions from the grade of Lieutenant Colonel to Colonel. Since the commencement of demobilization officer requirements by grade, particularly in field grade, have diminished more rapidly than the officer availability by grade from sources consisting of Regular Army officers, civilian component volunteer officers, and civilian component non-volunteer officers with less than 2 years service. The result is that a general downward officer grade readjustment is necessary commencing with Colonels and periodically extending through Captains. It is not contemplated that any First Lieutenants will be demoted to Second Lieutenants nor will Medical Corps, Dental Corps, Veterinary Corps, and Chaplain Corps Captains be demoted to First Lieutenants even though surpluses may develop in these grades. Officers being processed for separation or on terminal leave are not subject to demotion.

b. Officers will be selected for a one grade demotion in the order of their current temporary rank commencing with those most junior. Officers demoted will take date of rank in the lower grade as of the date of rank of their original permanent appointment or temporary AUS appointment or temporary AUS, AC appointment in that grade, which ever is earliest provided service has been continuous in that or a higher grade. An officer having been demoted one grade will not be demoted a second grade until all officers holding the temporary grade to which he was first demoted have received a one grade demotion. For example, a Colonel demoted to a Lieutenant Colonel will not be demoted to Major until all officers who were temporary Lieutenant Colonels at the time he was demoted to Lieutenant Colonel have been demoted to Majors. Reserve and National Guard Officers will not be demoted to a grade which is lower than the permanent grade which they held on 7 December 1941. Regular Army officers will not be demoted below their permanent grade. Selection for demotion of AAF officers world wide regardless of assignment will be made by the Commanding General, Army Air Forces. All other officers will be selected for demotion by the War Department.

c. Procedure. Officers will be demoted in monthly increments. At least 30 days prior to the effective date of demotion of any particular increment the War Department will notify Commanders of the names of the officers contained in that particular increment. In addition to this list of names the cable will contain a statement that the particular increment includes all officers of the temporary grade concerned with a date of rank on or after a specified date. Should the name of an officer with an appropriate date of rank be inadvertently overlooked and omitted from the increment his name will be reported in the reply described immediately below. Commanders will reply to the War Department within 12 days stating whether an officer contained in that increment should be excepted from demotion for cogent reasons and will personally justify the basis therefor.

Grade Readjustment of Commissioned Officers contd. Page 2

It is essential that this reply be received by AGWAR within 12 days. 15 days prior to the effective date of demotion of any particular increment, the War Department will dispatch cable orders listing the names of the officers whose current temporary AUS appointment is terminated without prejudice and who are tendered a temporary AUS appointment in the next lower grade subject to acceptance of the new appointment. A formal acceptance of reappointment in the lower grade will be executed in the following form:

"I accept temporary appointment effective _____ in the grade of _____ Army of the United States".

This acceptance will be forwarded to the Adjutant General, (Attention: Officers Branch) and, in addition, a cable will be initiated to the Adjutant General without delay stating that the officer has accepted the reappointment. A Regular Army officer declining to accept the new appointment in the lower grade will revert to his permanent grade except that Regular Army active list officers with 25 years or more service have the additional option of requesting retirement. The Adjutant General will be notified without delay by cable if the officer accepts either of these 2 options. If the officer has over 25 years service and request retirement he will not be demoted pending final action on his request. Regular Army active list officers with 15 to 25 years service who request retirement will not be excepted from demotion. A non-Regular Army officer declining to accept the new appointment in the lower grade will be relieved from active duty as surplus without demotion and the Adjutant General will be notified by cable without delay of the officers election of this option. Unless excepted, officers are required to direct in writing an option described above on or before the effective date contained in the cable orders.

d. Exception.

A. General. Combat wounded officers awarded the Purple Heart who are hospitalized or who have Army Retiring Board proceedings pending wherein the Board found the officer permanently incapacitated incident to service are not to be demoted until their final disposition is known. An officer in this category will not be required to accept the reappointment in lower grade but will be reported to the Adjutant General by cable. If the officer is discharged from the hospital and not ordered to appear before an Army Retiring Board, the Commander of the hospital will report the officers discharge from hospitalization to the Adjutant General by cable.

B. Individual. Individual demotion exceptions may be considered only in the most extreme cases based upon the personal comments furnished by Commanders. Final approval or disapproval of an individual exception rests with the CG, AAF for AAF officers world wide regardless of assignment and with the War Department for all others. Should an exception be approved the officers demotion will be deferred for 1 month and the officer will be included in the next monthly demotion increment. In the meantime maximum effort will be made to replace the officer. The officer will not again be excepted unless such action is again justified.

Grade Readjustment of Commissioned Officers contd. Page 3

e. It is desired that you give this policy and procedure complete expeditious distribution so as to reach all Army officers as soon as possible. In addition it is desired that upon receipt of the advance list of names contained in each monthly increment special efforts be made to inform each of the individual officers that he is subject to demotion under this policy at an early date. Implementation of this plan will require persistent alert attention by all concerned.

f. Effective immediately no additional temporary promotions to the grade of Colonel will be effected. All recommendations for promotions to Colonel AUS being processed will be returned without action except that recommendations for the promotion of combat injured officers to the grade of Colonel under the provisions of par 3 C AR 605-12 may be processed to completion.

g. Cables to TAG will be addressed attention SPXPO-P.

h. WD Circular 10/46 will be amended in separate actions to compensate for loss of rank under this policy.

- h. Physically qualified for general service.


2. Only the officers available for the purpose of attending the school, who have, by actual performance of duty, indicated that they have a potentiality for command or staff responsibility in joint operations will be nominated. Officers finally selected as students will be relieved from present assignments and will be assigned to the General Line School.

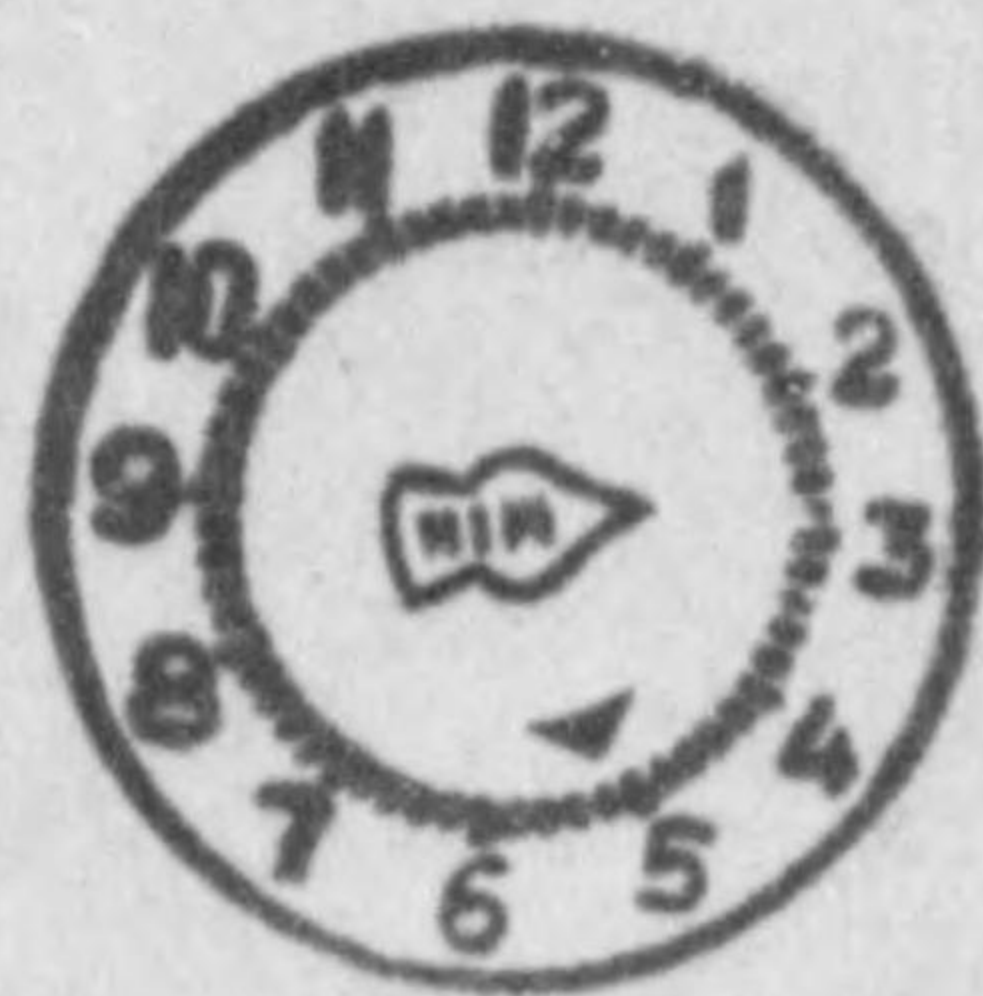



SUBJECT: Operation of War Department Motor Center.

1. The drastic reduction in the number of enlisted personnel available to the War Department Motor Center makes it necessary to limit strictly the use of official motor transportation. There has been no decrease in the number of requests for transportation since the termination of the war. On the other hand the number of enlisted personnel available as drivers has been cut to nearly one-half. This means that it is frequently impossible to provide individual transportation on request. Attention is called to the bus service to other War Department buildings leaving The Pentagon Concourse at 15-minute intervals throughout the day. It is also possible to supply employees traveling on official business with commercial bus or street car tokens for transportation to localities in Washington not covered by this Army bus service. The cooperation of all military and civilian personnel is requested in keeping the number of calls for individual transportation to a minimum.

2. The rapid turnover in personnel on duty in the War Department has made it impossible recently to keep an accurate record of those who are authorized to order official motor transportation. It is believed that there will be less confusion if the old list is discontinued and a completely new list started. It is requested that an officer from each of the War Department agencies listed below be designated to provide the War Department Headquarters Commandant with the name, rank, telephone number and room number of those who are authorized to order official motor transportation. The number of personnel so authorized is indicated opposite the name of the War Department agency. It is urgently requested that these records be kept current by notifying the War Department Headquarters Commandant of changes. The present list will be discontinued and the new list become effective on 1 April 1946. The Deputy Chief of Staff has approved the number of persons in each agency authorized to order official War Department transportation.

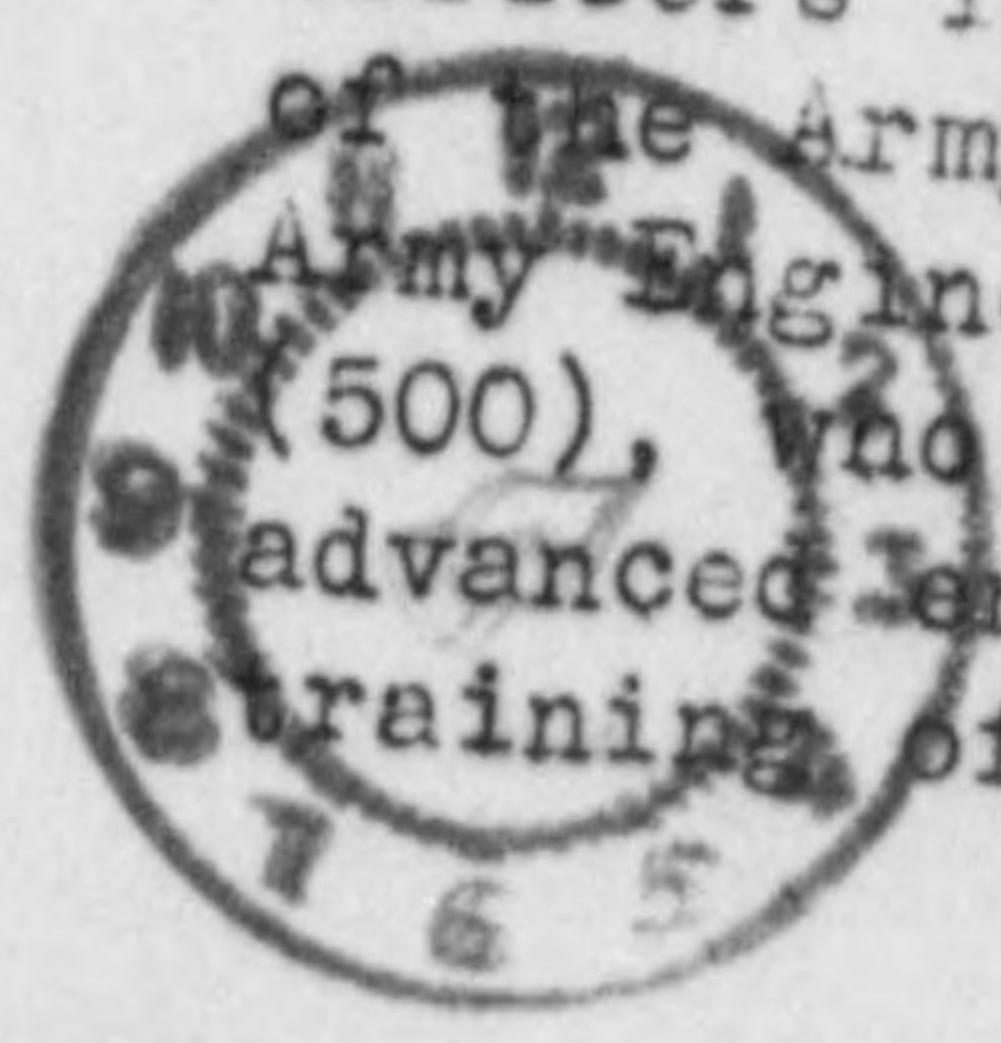



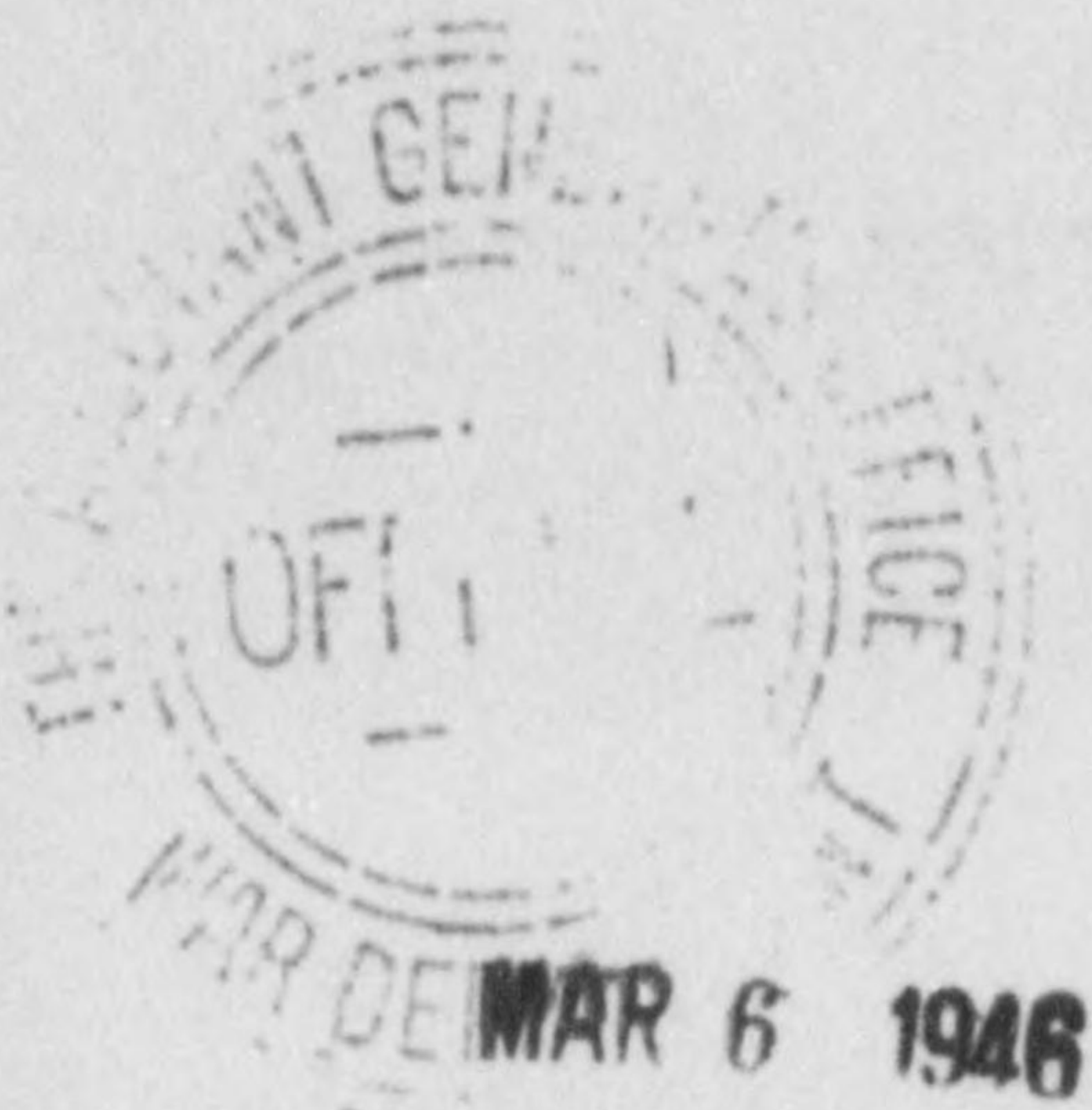

Only those officers available for the purpose of attending the school, who have, by actual performance of duty, indicated that they have a potentiality for command or staff responsibility in joint operations will be nominated. Officers finally selected as students will be relieved from present assignments and assigned to the Naval War College.

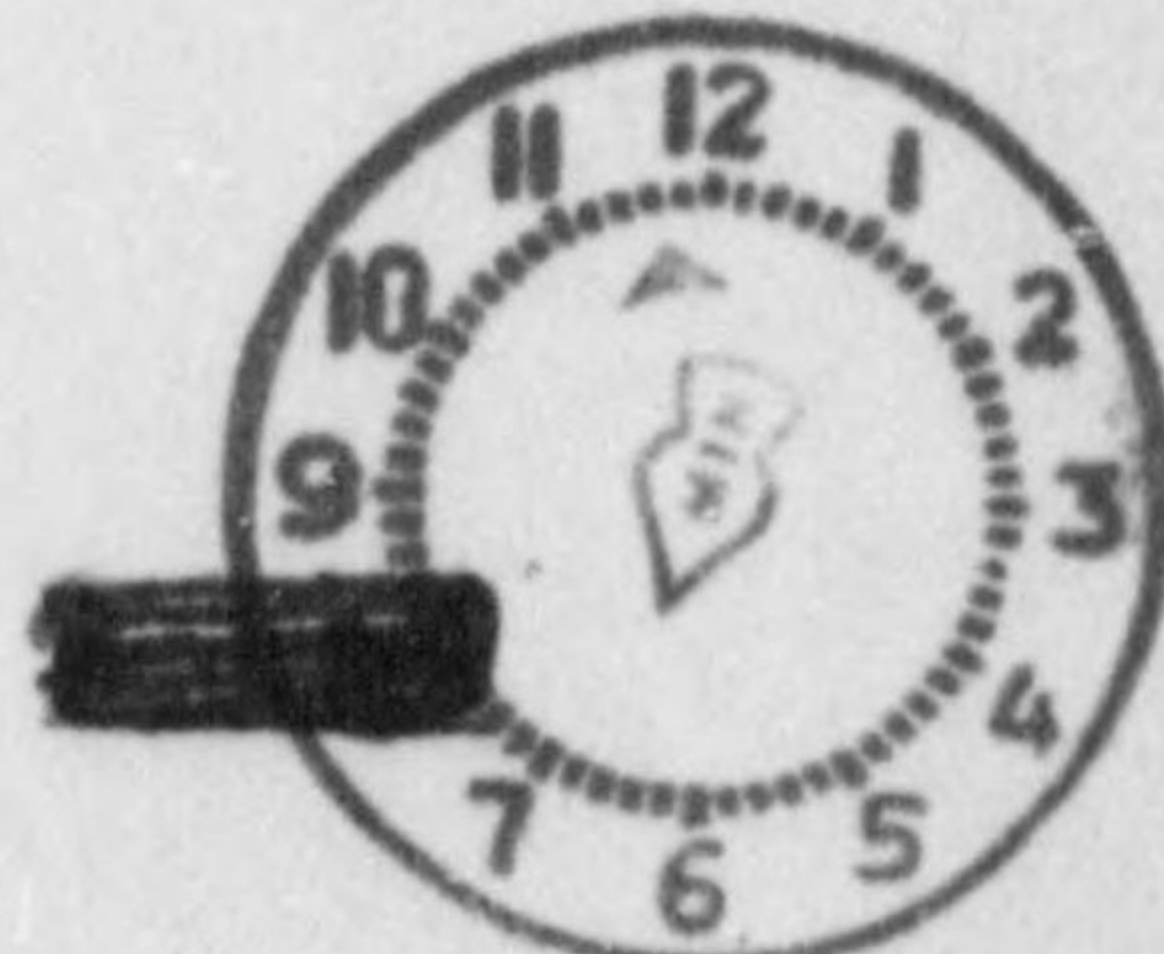

Very Satisfactory: Performance of the particular duty reported upon in an efficient manner. Personal characteristics, professional qualifications, or efficiency above that acceptable as satisfactory.

Excellent: Performance of the particular duty reported upon in a very efficient manner. Personal characteristics, professional qualifications, or efficiency above very satisfactory but below superior.

Superior: Outstanding and exceptional performance of the particular duty reported upon. Personal characteristics, professional qualifications, or efficiency above that considered excellent.

Unknown: To be used in all cases in which the reporting officer has had insufficient opportunity during the period covered by this report to observe the officer reported upon to permit a rating as to the performance of the particular duty, his personal characteristics, or professional qualifications.

MEMORANDUM TO WAR DEPARTMENT GROUPS:

SUBJECT: Separation Criteria

1. WD AGO Letter, AGPE-A-WDGAP 220.8 (22 Sept 45), dated 24 September 1945, Subject: Discharge of Surplus Enlisted Personnel in the Zone of Interior, is rescinded.
2. No enlisted men will be discharged as surplus who have less than 40 points as of 2 September 1945 or who have less than 2 years service as of 30 June 1946. Pending issuance of further instructions by the War Department, no enlisted WAC will be discharged as surplus with less than 2 years service as of 30 April 1946.
3. Paragraph 1c, Memorandum to War Department Groups, Subject: New Separation Criteria, dated 16 January 1946 is supplemented as follows. Individuals who meet the criteria prescribed below or who, by continued service, would acquire the prescribed length of service by the dates indicated may be separated under the authority of the Demobilization Directive as contained in the memorandum of 16 January at any time they are determined to be surplus to the needs of the war Department Groups.
 - a. Enlisted Men (Except Regular Army, volunteers) with 40 points as of 2 September 1945 or with 24 months service as of 30 June 1946.
 - b. Enlisted WAC (Except volunteers) with 24 months service as of 30 April 1946.
 - c. Male Officers (Except Regular Army, volunteers, and Medical Department Officers) with 65 points or with 42 months service as of 30 June 1946.
 - d. WAC Officer (Except volunteers) with 36 months length of service as of 30 April 1946.
 - e. Request for relief from active duty of officers forwarded under the above provisions must include a statement that the officer is surplus to the requirements of the agency.
4. It is again emphasized that the separation of all personnel will follow the principle of priority of release for those with highest points and longest length of service, particularly combat. It is of the utmost importance that there be no discrimination, preferential treatment or favoritism in the application of these provisions.

Effective immediately, individuals whose length of service or adjusted service rating score or age is equal to or above those indicated in the following subparagraphs will not be moved from the United States to a theater on temporary or permanent duty or returned to a theater from temporary duty in the United States except as indicated in paragraph 4 below:

a. Officers other than medical department: Individuals having more than 2 years 9 months service, or an ASR score 48 or age 49.

b. Medical Department Officers:

Medical Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40, or 2 years 6 months service.

Dental Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40 or 2 years 6 months service.

Sanitary Corps, ASR score 30, or age 35, or 2 years 6 months service.

d. WAC personnel will not be moved overseas except as provided in paragraph 4 h (3) (a) below and except for WAC officers moved overseas on temporary duty of 90 days or less. All requests for overseas shipment of WAC officers mentioned above will be submitted to the War Department for approval.

e. Length of service as used in this paragraph includes total active commissioned and enlisted honorable service, continuous or interrupted, since 16 September 1940 and continues to accrue with the passage of time. Time lost under AW 107 will not be included.

f. Adjusted service rating score as used herein is the score computed for each individual as of 2 September 1945.

3. Individuals except those who volunteer to serve overseas longer than the maximum tour prescribed in WD Circular 383, 1945 will not be moved to Overseas Commands on permanent duty or returned to theaters from temporary duty, leave or furlough in the United States who under the provisions of the above circular, had they been returned to the Overseas Command, would by ~~1 March 1946~~ ^{with no time} become eligible for return to the United States.

4. Exceptions to paragraph 2 above are as follows:

a. Regular Army officers.

b. Officers whose MOS is on the War Department's list of Scarce Categories of Officer Specialists in Section VII of WD Circular 321, 20 October 1945, as amended, or superseded. (See Section IV WD Cir 368, 1945)

c. Officers who are qualified as language specialists provided they are not eligible for separation and have less than 39 months of service.

d. Officers who were commissioned thru OGS and have less than 3 months active commissioned service.

(2) (Enlisted men) (Changes No. 2 to RR 1-1)

h. Special exceptions not otherwise provided above:

(1) Temporary Duty:

(An individual who is eligible for separation or who will become eligible for separation, prior to his scheduled date of return will not be ordered overseas under this provision.)

Officers returned from a theater to the United States to accomplish a specific mission and report back in person to the theater commander.

(3) Transfer to Accept Civilian Employment:

Any officer or enlisted personnel who desires to be transferred to a theater in a military status for relief from active duty or discharge to accept civilian employment, provided that documentary evidence is presented to establish the fact that the individual has a civilian job with the United States Government in the theater to which he has requested transfer.

5. The certificate or volunteer statement signed by the individual to qualify for exception from the provision of paragraphs 2 and 3 will be included on or attached to and transmitted with the individuals WDAGO Form No. 66-1 or service record.

6. Movement orders for personnel excepted from the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this letter will include a citation to the paragraph or subparagraph under which the exception is made in the following statement:

"Personnel included herein are excepted from screening procedures under paragraph or subparagraph () of letter AG 370.01 (17 Jan 46)OB-S-A-M, 23 January 1946, subject: Screening of Personnel for Overseas Movement."

7. Personnel removed from overseas shipments under the provisions of this directive will be reassigned by the Major Force concerned, or discharged in accordance with current War Department discharge criteria.

8. The EDCMR of personnel in the United States on temporary duty, leave or furlough from a theater and relieved from overseas assignment will be made in accordance with Paragraph 12, Supplement No. 5 to PRI, 4 September 1945.





1. Letter, AG 370.01 (31 Oct 45)OB-S-A-M, 7 November 1945, subject: Screening of Personnel for Overseas Movement, is superseded by this letter, except as provided in paragraph 8, below.

2. Effective immediately, individuals whose length of service or adjusted service rating score or age is equal to or above those indicated in the following subparagraphs will not be moved from the United States to a theater on temporary or permanent duty or returned to a theater from temporary duty in the United States except as indicated in paragraph 3, below:

a. Officers other than medical department: Individuals having more than 2 years 9 months service, or an ASR score 48 or age 49.

b. Medical department officers:
Medical Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40, or 2 years 6 months
service.
Dental Corps, ASR score 45, or age 40, or 2 years 6 months
service.
Sanitary Corps, ASR score 30, or age 35, or 2 years 6 months
service.
Veterinary Corps, ASR score 30, or age 35, or 2 years 6 months
service.

Medical Administrative Corps, ASR score 30, or age 35, or 2 years 6 months service.

c. Enlisted men: Individuals having more than 21 months of service, or an ASR score 36, or age 37, or age 34 for individuals with more than one year of service.

d. WAC personnel will not be moved overseas except as provided in paragraph 3 g (3) (a) below and except for WAC officers moved overseas prior to 1 February 1946 on temporary duty of 90 days or less.

e. Length of service as used herein includes total active commissioned and enlisted service since 16 September 1940 and continues to accrue with the passage of time.

f. Adjusted service rating score as used herein is the score computed for each individual as of 2 September 1945.

3. Exeptions to paragraph 2, above, are as follows:

a. Regular Army Personnel.

b. Officers whose MOS is on the War Department's list of scarce categories of officer specialists in Section VII of WD Circular 321, 20 October 1945.

c. Officers who are qualified as language specialists providing they are not eligible for separation and have less than 39 months of service.

d. Enlisted men who are qualified as language specialists providing they are not eligible for separation and have less than 27 months of service.

e. Medical, Dental and Veterinary Corps officers who were commissioned through ASTP and have less than 30 months of active commissioned service.

f. Volunteers (except WAC personnel) who sign one of the following certificates:

(1) (Officers) (Sect IV, WD Cir 366, 7 Dec 45)

(a) "I elect to continue on extended active duty for an unlimited length of time."
