


PRISONER OF WAR, NOW PRESIDENT—From prisoner of war at the age of three, because his father was a leader in a rebellion against the tyranny of Spain, to the presidency of his people at fifty-three, is the record of General Gerardo Machado y Morales, who next May will be inaugurated as the fifth president of the Republic of Cuba. Nominated by the Liberal party, Machado appealed to the voters on a platform which included: Abolishment of the national lottery as soon as it shall no longer be needed as a source of public revenue. Establishment of free trade with the United States on certain articles imported into Cuba. Modification of the Platt amendment to the Cuban constitution whereby among other things the United States is authorized, under provisions of the Paris Treaty ending the Spanish-American War, to intervene for the preservation of Cuban independence, and the maintenance of a government adequate for the protection of life, property and individual liberty in Cuba. The election by Machado is welcomed by the Americans who have \$1,350,000,000 invested in that country and by the American manufacturers who sell \$200,000,000 worth of goods to Cuba each year.


