

Fischer's Ruffled Cyclamens which Won Medal Awarded at German Flower Show.

FISCHER'S CYCLAMENS WIN.

(From Florists' Review, April 17, 1930.)

The illustration on this page shows a group of 120 cyclamens at a German flower show entered by Ferd. Fischer, celebrated cyclamen seed grower. These plants won a first prize, consisting of a medal and a cash award.

The exhibit is of Mr. Fischer's new introduction, Fischer's Ruffled Salmon, a distinct, deep salmon, with the edges fringed, resembling the fringed orchid. It is said to be as good a producer as other varieties, having a profusion of blooms, and a healthy grower, fixed as to type. American growers who have handled this cyclamen have found a strong demand for it. There will be a larger supply of the seeds available this season, according to the American Bulb Co., Chicago, sole distributors of Ferd. Fischer's seeds in this country.
