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## Britain Has Lost Second World War

THE title of this leader might at first sight seem absurd, because the European part of this war has already ended in victory for Britain and her allies, while the war in the East is still on. Nevertheless, it can be proved to demonstration that Britain is now inevitably bound to fail to achieve all the primary objectives for which she started the present Armageddon in 1939.

As the world knows, Britain embarked on this ghastly adventure, ostensibly for the preservation of Poland's integrity against German aggression, but in reality, for keeping up the old balance of power in Europe in her own selfish interests. Now that Germany has been defeated, can one say that Britain has attained any of these two war aims of hers? A substantial part of what was Polish territory before the war has been torn from the eastern side of Poland and incorporated with the Soviet Union.

Has Britain succeeded as the result of the war in Europe, at least in maintaining the balance of power which has been the main concern of her foreign ministers for the last three hundred years? Emphatically, no. Never in Europe, except during the short period of Napoleon Bonaparte's power, did one country dominate nearly the whole European continent as Russia does today. In attempting to prevent Germany from ushering in a new order in Europe, Britain has only managed to leave the field clear for Soviet Communism which is in no way a less formidable enemy to British Imperialism than German Nazism ever threatened to be.

Indeed Russia has become relatively so powerful because of this war, that she is now demanding from Turkey that the Straits of Dardanelles be closed to warships of all foreign Powers, exclusively reserving free passage for those of Turkey and the Soviet Union. That is also the explanation of her desire, openly expressed recently, to take a hand in the international discussions over the Levant question.

In China, too, Russia has of late begun to give open help to the Chinese communists who are opposed to Chiang Kai Shek's dictatorship. This is causing such grave anxiety to Chungking that the Chungking Prime Minister Mr. T. V. Soong has gone to Moscow to arrive at some sort of settlement.

If, as we have shown above, this war has already brought about the loss of Britain's prestige in Europe, and is steadily lowering her standing and influence in the Middle East and China, while her stranglehold on India is also becoming shaky, are we not justified in saying that Britain has already lost this war? The post-war world will find Britain relatively far less powerful than she was before the war. This is an incontrovertible fact which we who are fighting British Imperialism will do well to keep in our minds always.

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## Nippon Nation Ready To Smash Enemy Invasion

Tokyo, June 29 (Domei)—

Your correspondent's conviction in sure Nippon victory has been strengthened to the utmost by his recent visits to various special attack bases throughout the country. The fact that Nippon's Special Attack Corps' planes, employing body-crashing tactics and human torpedoes or "Jinraj" rockets and "Kamishio" undersea craft, form the most efficient modern arms has been well demonstrated in the Okinawa operations. They represent effective combinations of the Nippon nation's sublime patriotism and manifest neither fanatic action nor anachronistic suicide.

Military observers are of the opinion that Nippon's special attack weapons have completed the experimental stage in the Okinawa campaign and full-fledged results will be obtained when United States forces attempt to carry out a landing on the Nippon mainland.

The furious fighting spirit which overflowed at our special attack training bases has fully convinced me Nippon is going to win sure victory. I even hoped for an early landing by enemy forces on our mainland just to sense the thrill when we strike a deadly blow on them and in expectation of worldwide amazement when our special attack weapons display their full activity.

The number of young men at present undergoing special attack training is enormous. This number undoubtedly corresponds to the number of special weapons to be employed. As a matter of fact, this number would be almost equal to the total number of tanks and guns which appeared in the European war theatre. Enemy air raids on Nippon, though intensified, are unable to destroy the productive capacity of our war plants which are still capable of producing a huge volume of special weapons.

The blazing fighting spirit displayed by our youths at these bases is almost astounding. Their firm determination to sacrifice their lives for the sake of their motherland was revealed in every expression. All these young men are between the ages of 18 and 20 and are ready to die in accomplishing their task as members of our Special Attack Corps in the coming battle against the enemy.

## WAVELL'S OFFER MUST BE REJECTED LOCK, STOCK & BARREL, DECLARES NETAJI

Friends At Home Urged To Continue  
Agitation To Force Total Rejection

"All those who feel strongly as I do that, in the interests of India and for the early achievement of India's independence, Lord Wavell's offer should be rejected lock, stock and barrel, must continue their agitation until we are completely out of danger."

Thus declares Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, in his broadcast to his countrymen inside India which he delivered over the Syonan Radio yesterday, urging all "lovers and supporters of India's independence" to continue their efforts for securing the rejection of Viceroy Wavell's offer which (Netaji states) is a grave menace to the cause of India's freedom.

The following is the text of his address:

Sisters and Brothers in India! The latest news from Simla affords a silver-lining in the cloud that overshadows us today. It appears that the representatives of the Muslim League have insisted that all the seats in the Viceroy's Executive Council earmarked for Muslims should go to the Muslim League and to the Muslim League alone. It is but natural that the Congress should refuse to accept this position and to insist that at least some of the seats earmarked for Muslims should go to Nationalist Muslims who are outside the Muslim League.

I only hope and pray that the Congress will not budge from this position, out of extreme eagerness to accept the British offer. To submit to the unreasonable demand of the Muslim League on this question

would amount to suicide for the Congress. I have no doubt in my mind that should the unexpected happen, and the Congress surrender to the Muslim League on this fundamental and all-important question, there will be a revolt within the Congress. Not only will the entire Left Wing revolt against such a decision, but large numbers of Congressmen who are not Left Wingers will also join in the revolt.

I am extremely happy to learn that representatives of five nationalist Muslim Organisations have recently held a conference in New Delhi and have reiterated their declaration that the Muslim League is not the only representative organisation of the Muslims in India. The summoning of this

## Official Announcement Regarding Evacuation Of Syonan Citizens

The war situation has reached a critical stage and in the near future, in the event of stoppage of transportation facilities, the food problem in Syonan might get serious. In such an event, we cannot leave people to face starvation, so we must guard against this possibility now. The time has now arrived to speedily effect the evacuation of Syonan citizens in accordance with the plan of Nanpo Gun, says the Kosei-Ka of the Syonan Tokubetu-si in a statement issued to the Press this afternoon.

For this reason, we wish to remove people to secure places where we can supply them with food. At the same time in carrying out this plan, we can avoid heavy casualties among citizens in the event of enemy air raids or machine gunning. This scheme will also help to complete and strengthen the Military plan of defence.

We wish the people of Syonan to understand that the main object of this scheme is based on the Authorities' anxiety to protect the people and reduce the dangers of war to the minimum. With this object in mind, the Authorities will provide free transportation,

financial assistance and there will also be a Trust Company to look after the property of evacuees.

This Trust Company is under the management of well-known and experienced public men, so no evacuee need feel any concern about the care of his property. We and the Officials concerned have good connections and the representatives of communities in other States have also been in conference. At these conferences we have tried to perfect our plans in order to protect and assure occupation for evacuees. We will also provide such persons with essential foodstuffs for three months or more and give them some monetary aid.

At this time, those people who have relatives or friends either up-country, in Java or Sumatra and wish to join them, will be free to do so. We will also send people to Endau and Bahau. Those persons who are affected by the Change of Trade will be given priority in evacuation and anyone having a large family can send away a part of the members in order to secure safety.

In conclusion we are fully prepared to assist and give citizens every facility in evacuation.

## Huge Okinawa Losses Shatter U.S. Home Front

Army Spokesman Here  
Confident In Nippon's  
Ultimate Victory

"I have full confidence we can inflict upon the enemy a devastating blow should he come to our homeland and I am sure it is the duty of the people in this country to make the defence of Malaj as complete as possible and to put in all the efforts in crushing the enemy fighting spirit," declared Lt. Col. Shozo Nakajima, Chief Spokesman of the Imperial Nippon Forces in the Southern Regions at the weekly Press conference here yesterday.

The Spokesman began by saying that in the fighting in the Okinawa sector Nippon forces inflicted 80,000 personnel losses

on the enemy in the great fighting and over 600 enemy vessels were sunk in the vicinity of Okinawa. After inflicting such immense losses on the enemy the fighting had come to a close. "Organised resistance has ceased but as in the case of New Guinea and Sjaipar resistance is still being offered by our forces."

"When we take into consideration the large personnel losses inflicted on the enemy forces and thus the staggering blow dealt on the American home front it is clear that the demoralising effect on the enemy fighting spirit is tremendous. The Okinawa operation from a strategic point of view was a victory for us," Lt. Col. Nakajima declared.

"The next fighting will most probably be fought in the vicinity of Nippon mainland and bearing in mind the heavy losses we had inflicted on the enemy in the Okinawa Islands we can imagine that the fighting on the mainland will result in greater losses for the enemy. In regard to fighting on the mainland we have to be very worried about communication lines and fuel consumption," continued Lt. Col. Nakajima.

"On the other hand the enemy has got to come from a distant place and would be at a disadvantage because he has to maintain long communication lines. As compared with the enemy we are in a more

## Evacuation Schemes Outlined

The following is the evacuation scheme of the authorities: Taking into consideration the present situation and future scheme of transportation facilities, the carrying out of evacuation should be speedily undertaken. Therefore, we will begin putting this Evacuation scheme into effect as from the middle of July.

First, we will begin with the Northern, Middle and Southern parts of Malaya.

Railway facilities: In order to provide for the convenience of those wishing to evacuate by train, we cannot give any assistance to unnecessary or non-urgent travellers. From the middle of July onwards, almost every day special trains will be run for evacuation. Evacuees bringing relatives or friends and wish to evacuate to States north Malacca-Bahau Colony included—at these Stations every State Government and various community representatives will receive, allot to certain places and generally look after the welfare of such persons.

Northern part of Malaya Peninsula. Stations: Ipoh, Taiping, Kampar.

Middle and Southern part of Malaya Peninsula. Stations: Kuala Lumpur, Mentakab (Pahang), Bahau, Seremban, Tampin (Malacca) Batang Malaka

As to Johore State, we are going to put into effect another plan.

For those who wish to go to Java or Sumatra, transportation will be provided by sea to Palembang and Djakarta. On railway facilities provided to transport their respective

Malacca, Bahau and nearby places. From July 1st onwards, investigation will be carried out for respective groups or communities and the Auxiliary Police will also register according to Police Divisions. Before sending out evacuees, we are preparing Record Cards as to the place the person wishes to go to, nationality, sex, age, or relatives, occupation, ability and any other special details.

These cards will be made out by Police Divisions for the places where people wish to evacuate. So for evacuees to the Malaya Peninsula, Java or Sumatra, registration will be carried out accordingly by the Auxiliary Police.

The Auxiliary Police will make out a list of names of those wishing to evacuate and after registration, each person will receive 20 katties of rice, salt and sugar, being 3 months' rations at one time in exchange for the Provision Card. In addition, through the Kucho, Government will pay to every adult and child \$100 in cash. This money will be "Evacuation Aid". If the evacuee is a person who has had to change trade, then he will also receive a "Change of Trade Bounty", and there will be no restriction as to the sum of cash evacuees can carry with them.

Two large bundles will be allowed to be carried by railway truck, but clothing, foodstuffs, cooking utensils and farming implements can be carried by the evacuees.

## Kosei-Ka Cho Advises Early And Speedy Evacuation Of Citizens

Commenting on the official statement on the evacuation of Syonan citizens, the Kosei-ka Cho says:—

Just shortly before the surrender of Singapore, the British tried to evacuate Britishers only to whom priority was given and local people were given no chance to evacuate and, also, movement of capital was strictly prohibited. Now, on the contrary, our Military Authorities in carrying out this evacuation scheme, are acting like a parent toward his children—having in mind only the safeguarding and protection of local citizens. We also permit entirely free movement of capital.

We know by doing this, there will be decrease in production power, but in spite of this fact, we wish only to secure relief and safety for the people from starvation and the hellish horrors of war. Therefore, the only underlying idea of this evacuation scheme is safety for the people—

nothing more than that. I wish every citizen to fully understand this sympathetic attitude or care of the Authorities, and do not get panic-stricken or anxious by listening to false rumours.

I wish people to act quickly and take the initiative in evacuating while there are free and speedy transportation facilities. For the time being, we wish people to remove to a place of safety where they can have sufficient food. At the same time, these evacuees can co-operate by joining the "Grow More Food" Scheme and those who understand the good intention of the Authorities and wish to give their full co-operation, should register without delay at their Kucho's office.

In addition, any problems, such as assistance or care of properties of those evacuating will be dealt with at the "Citizens Protection Department" at Evacuation Headquarters which will be at Kosei-ka, Syonan Tokubetu Si.

conference is an indication that public opinion in India is beginning to assert itself. I only hope that the organisations and individuals who are hostile to, or are suspicious of, Lord Wavell's offer will put up a combined opposition. In the first place, it appears to me eminently desirable that all nationalist Muslim Organisations in India should make their voice heard.

Perhaps the Azad Muslim League or the Jamiat-ul-Ulema could take the initiative in convening a representative conference of nationalist Muslim Organisations from all over India. From the report that is before me, I find that in the recent conference held in New Delhi, representatives of the Khudai Kitmatgars of the Frontier Province and of the Praja Party of Bengal have not participated. It is also not clear, if the Majlis-i-Ahrar took part in that conference. In the conference that I have just proposed, it may even be possible to invite representatives of the Unionist Party of the Punjab—for it is possible that the Muslim members of the Unionist Party will not accept the position that the Muslim League is the sole representative of the Muslims of India.

continue our activity, so that a situation may be created in which the Congress will feel compelled to resign from the Viceroy's Executive Council.

Mahatma Gandhi's wise and prudent action in not participating in the Simla Conference gives us some hope that the evil may yet be averted. I can understand that the Muslim League representatives have resented his absence from the Conference, and particularly his action in handing over his seat to the Congress President, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad.

What Mahatma Gandhi has done is not only constitutionally proper, but has been tactically a wise step. It would have been a very great injustice to Maulana Abul Kalam Azad personally, and to the large number of Congress Muslims who have made tremendous sacrifices in the cause of India's freedom, if the Congress President had not been allowed to lead the Congress delegation to the Simla Conference, simply because he happened to be a Muslim.

I am surprised and pained to find that in his negotiations with the Congress, Mr. Jinnah did not deal directly with the Congress President, but commandeered the services of Pandit Govind Vallabh Pant as an intermediary between himself and the Congress President.

There is no doubt by his non-participation in the Simla Conference, Mahatma Gandhi has enhanced his personal position and prestige. It has also enabled him to take an objective view of the whole situation, thereby rendering it possible for him to put his foot down at the right moment and advise the rejection of the proposed offer.

Meanwhile, the danger continues and we cannot afford to rest on our oars. I, therefore, hope and trust that all lovers and supporters of India's independence will continue their efforts for securing the rejection of the British offer which is a grave menace to the cause of India's freedom. Once this obstacle is removed from the path of India's freedom, the Indian people will be able to regain their mental balance and to prepare fresh plans for continuing the national struggle until complete independence is achieved.

advantageous position in that we would be using smaller planes with lesser oil consumption," the Chief Spokesman went on.

"Although the enemy has been carrying on exaggerated propaganda regarding the comparative fighting strength of Nippon and America by saying that his ratio was 10 to 1 and even 15 to 1 I think the correct ratio is about 5 to 1. Assuming that the ratio of fighting strength is 5 to 1 it would be clear that if the losses suffered on both sides were of the same percentage, the enemy's would be greater than ours," Lt.-Col. Nakajima explained.

"As the battle approaches the Nippon mainland and the fighting becomes fiercer, the enemy losses are bound to increase proportionately. As his losses mount up he would in time reach a dead line and this would be a divine opportunity for us to win the war. The reason why the enemy is trying to bring this war to a quick conclusion is that he is afraid of reaching a dead line," the Spokesman revealed.

Referring to Viceroy Wavell's proposal to Indians to solve the country's political problem, Lt.-Col. Nakajima said that the proposal was a deception and that it was not different from the former proposal which the Indians had rejected as it did not concede independence to them.

It is quite clear that Indians must take up arms and fight the Britishers gallantly to obtain their freedom. He was, however, convinced that the freedom of India would only materialize with the successful consummation of the War of Greater East Asia.

The spirit with which Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Head of the Provisional Government of Azad Hind, and the Azad Hind Fauj are fighting against the Britishers to obtain their cherished goal is worthy of praise, Lt.-Col. Nakajima stated.
