Terms of Credit.—To regular customers and well-known houses of established credit, all bills bought from this catalogue are due June 1st, without regard to date of purchase.

Bills purchased on special quotations, made by letter, are due three months from date of invoice, or subject to a discount of one and a half per cent. for cash within ten days of date of invoice.

1967 Unknown correspondents desiring credit are requested to give satisfactory reference in Philadelphia or New York.

Cash Discount.—We allow a discount of Five Per Cent. on orders accompanied by a cash remittance, and also on all bills (at catalogue prices) paid within ten days from date of invoice.

The Prices Quoted are those ruling at this date. We expect to adhere to them until the issue of our January catalogue, except where important changes compel us to advance or reduce our prices, when we shall be governed by the market. 10 lbs. and more will be supplied at the rates per 100 lbs.; ½ ib and ½ bush. at pound and bushel rates; but smaller quantities will be charged at a higher rate.

NO CHARGE for Packing or Cartage.—Bags and boxes are charged at Cost. After delivering to forwarders in good order (as shown by Bill of Lading) our responsibility ceases. Insurance will be effected only when so directed.

SEALED PACKAGES .- We make no charge for sealing pounds, pecks, or bushels, but, at the low bulk prices quoted therein, we shall charge for putting up in smaller sealed packages, when so ordered, as follows:

In Ounces.—One cent per ounce; 50 cts. per 100 ounces.

In Quarter-Pounds, Pints, and Quarts.—Two cents for each package.

In Two-Quarts and Four-Quarts.—A charge of three cents per package.

Burpee's New Extra Early AUSTRALIAN YELLOW GLOBE ONIONO

Six years ago one of our correspondents in Melbourne, Australia, reading the description of our New Australian Brown Onion in The FARM ANNUAL, sent us for trial a sample of this fine onion, which he said was equally valued in that country. From the small crop of seed grown by us in this country we sent out samples to a number of our customers for advance trial during 1900. The reports received, as well as repeated trials made at Fordhook Farms, show that it is a fit companion to the Australian Brown, first introduced by us in 1897, and already so famous as the earliest and longest-keeping onion in cultivation.

The bulbs of this New Australian Yellow Globe are globe-shaped,—see illustration from a photograph. The Skin is a light brownish yellow, similar to the Globe Danvers, but a little lighter, while the bulbs are slightly larger. From their solidity they are heavier, a bushel weighing several pounds more than a bushel of American varieties,—an important feature where bulbs are sold by Six years ago one of our correspondents in Melbourne,

ties,—an important feature where bulbs are sold by weight. An average onion measures about three inches weight. An average onion measures about three inches in diameter each way, weighing about seven ounces. The onions are thin-necked and ripen evenly in all soils; the plants do not make any second growth. The flesh is pure white, very soild, and exceptionally mild in flavor. As the plants grow quickly, the bulbs mature extra early, and this in connection with their exceptional keeping qualities makes them profitable to plant for market. The Australian Yellow Globe is truly remarkable in productiveness. Two customers, in competition for our prizes, reported a yield of two bushels of fine onions from a single small sample packet of seed, while another customer raised a bulb fifteen inches in circumference and twenty-one and a half ounces in weight.

Others stated that it produced "the finest onions they had ever grown in a single season from seed."

This has been our motto for many years. It is not a mere advertising "catch phrase," but represents the standard of the Burpee Quality in Seeds. Growing seeds of the highest grade is not only our business but our pleasure as well. So careful are we of the reputation established by conscientious work for nearly thirty years, that we prefer to report "sold out" rather than to purchase any seeds of doubtful pedigree, with which to fill orders when our own stocks are exhausted.

Quality is our aim always. We never attempt to compete merely in price. It is quite true that BURPEE's SEEDS cost more than the usual commercial grades,—but (and this is a great big BUT!) they are worth much more. Were not this the fact it would not have been possible for us to secure the largest mail-order seed trade in the world!

We are exclusively a catalogue house and never send out travelers to solicit orders, even at wholesale. Consequently there are several houses who supply a greater bulk of seeds at wholesale than do we, but we flatter ourselves that we retain the exclusive trade of many intelligent merchants throughout America who realize that, particularly in seeds, "the best is the cheapest."

Shortages for 1904. It is a most remarkable coincidence that, owing to extremely unfavorable climatic conditions, the shortages in seed crops the past season have been upon the same lines as for the previous year. Cucumber, Squashes, and many Melons have produced only one-fourth of an average yield, as have also late varieties of Sweet Corn; early varieties of Sweet Corn have averaged from forty to seventy per cent. of a normal crop. All first-early Peas, except Alaskas, are extremely short, several varieties averaging only half a crop, while many long-podded late Peas are almost equally as short. Wax Beans bid fair to rule as high in price as last year, while of several green-podded Bush Beans there are not enough in sight to meet normal requirements. Tomatoes and Sweet Peas are also short, but not to such a distressing extent.

As usual, we shall aim to protect our regular customers, and have fixed prices in this Advance List upon a moderate basis,—lower, in many instances, than we would accept for these scarce items alone. And yet, wherever possible, we will make special prices to merchants who favor us with a complete general order. In this connection it may not be amiss to allude to the fact that we continued to supply Sweet Corn at our catalogue prices (but necessarily in limited quantities) last season, when canners were freely offering more than double our wholesale prices!

We are not speculators but bona fide growers and dealers. We realize thoroughly that the only way to retain our wholesale trade is to treat merchant-customers just as we should want to be treated were the positions of buyer and seller reversed. Our adherence to this principle (together with the sterling quality of Burpee's Seeds) has resulted in an annually increasing wholesale trade,—notwithstanding the fact that for five years we have been "exclusively a mail-order house" and have not had a single traveler on the road to solicit orders.

We try to make it to your own best interests to deal with us and, having no travelers, are always prompt to respond to requests for special quotations by mail or telegram.

# Telegraphic Cipher (or Cable Code) FOR WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The telegraphic cipher word for quantities must always precede the cipher words for seed, but if the same quantity of several varieties is ordered, the cipher word meaning that quantity need be placed only before the first. For example:

Arad Navy, Purity, Benares, Calliope, Chalice, Malmo Balcony, would mean, ship at once, cheapest route, ten pounds each Navy Blue and Sadie Burpee Sweet Peas (white-seeded), twenty-five pounds each Burpee's Allhead Early Cabbage and Oxheart Carrot, and ten bushels Burpee's Stringless Green-Pod Beans.

Our customers will find this a very inexpensive way of wiring their orders, but we must caution them that care be taken in writing out the messages, as we cannot hold ourselves responsible for errors arising from incomplete messages or incorrect translation.

IMPORTANT.—This telegraphic cipher must be used ONLY on orders by telegraph or cable, and never in written orders sent by mail.

A Telegraphic Cipher (or Cable Code) is attached to each variety, by which orders can be wired at little expense,—using also our code for weights and measures as given on page 3. For example:

Darken Pelew Balcony would mean: Send immediately, by fast freight, forty bushels of Burpee's Stringless Green-Pod Beans at catalogue price.

Dargie Arad Cage would mean: Send immediately, by express, ten pounds of best select Jersey Wakefield Cabbage at catalogue price.

Darnel Amoy Lantern would mean: Send immediately, by mail, three pounds of seed of Big Boston Lettuce.

This list cancels all previous quotations. Orders are binding only when accepted. On varieties which are in extremely short supply we shall refuse orders after we have sold quantities allowed for our wholesale trade.

Those who depend on us each year for their supply of seeds are advised to place their orders early, before advances in prices become necessary.









### New Cabbage,—Burpee's "EARLY STONEHEAD."




