

DIRECTIONS.—The Dahlia delights in good, rieh, loamy soil, at least eighteen inehes deep; let it be well dug and enriched. Turn the plants out of the pots about the 10th of June, and they will soon make a rapid growth, and commence flowering in July. Stake the plants, and tie up the branches as they proceed in growth. Take up the roots in the fall, after the frost has killed the tops, and, after drying a few days, put them away in a dry eellar.
