Nothing'll stop the Army Air Corps!

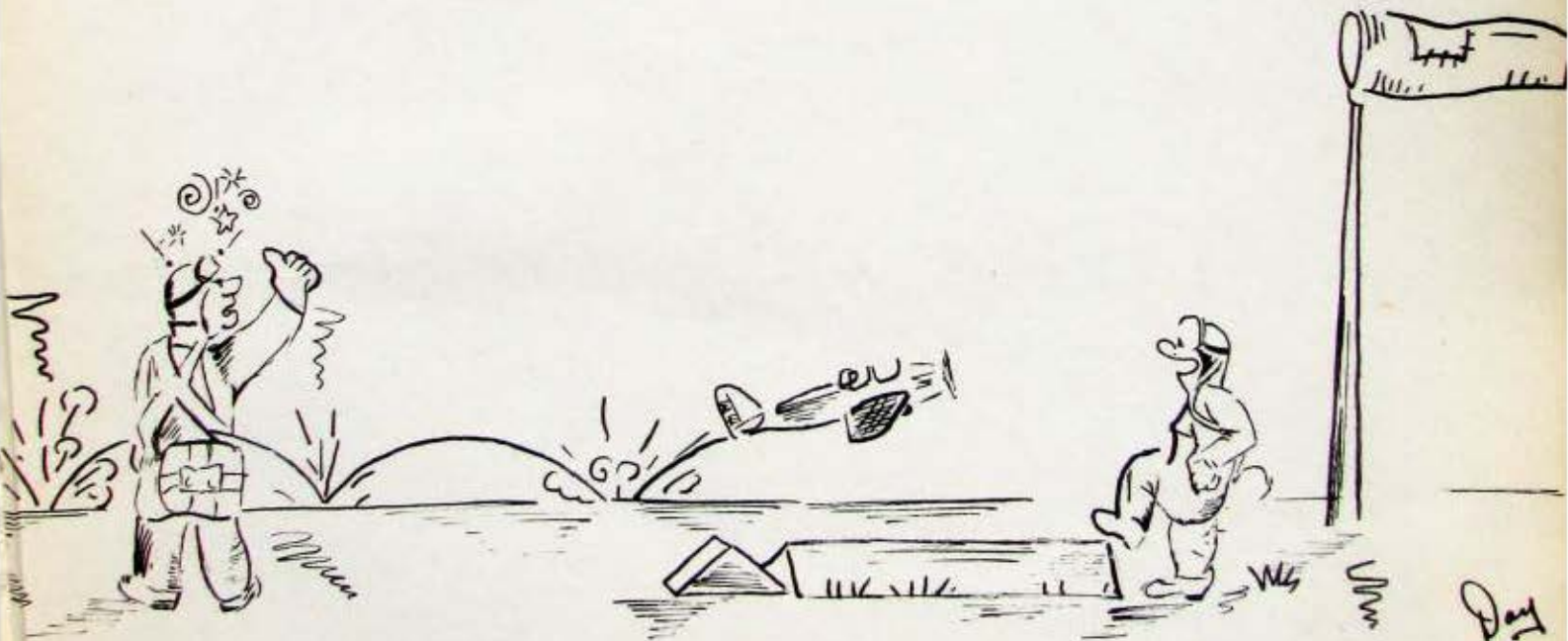

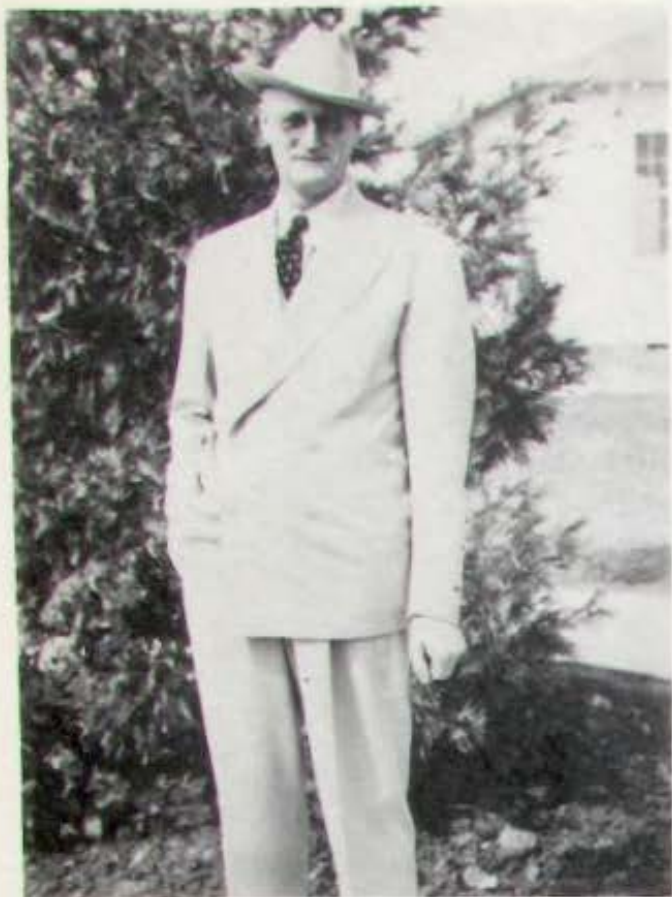

Class History . . . 43-C

Early in July of 1942 an aggregation of enlisted men from all branches of service gathered at San Antonio Aviation Cadet Center to embark on the greatest adventure of their lives. This was the first such large group of enlisted men to be enrolled as Aviation Cadets at SAACC.

Though their spirits were somewhat dampened by the over-crowded conditions there which made it necessary for them to live in tents and go back to the old G. I. mess kits and otherwise submit to various unpleasant conditions such as they had all experienced before, the picture of what the future held for them was deeply etched in the heart of every Cadet in Class 43-C.

Some of us had the "honor" to be the first Cadet "table waiters" in the history of San Antonio Aviation Cadet Center. Others dug ditches and pitched tents. It was like being a recruit all over again.

Then came Preflight School in all its glory — hours on the parade ground in that hot Texas sun — walking around in a brace — those first four inches of a mess hall stool — the heartless tone of a tactical officer's "racking back" — those gay Sundays in San Antonio. It wasn't easy, but it sure made you feel like a soldier.

Then, one stormy, wet day in September, Class 43-C rolled into Coleman Flying School in a caravan of chartered buses.

It was a gay trip and featured much laughing and singing. Our nerves tingled and our hearts beat faster as we drew nearer the place where we were at last going to actually learn to fly.

Suddenly a Cadet in the front seat of a bus said, "There's Coleman." A Cadet in the middle of the bus repeated, "Here's Coleman." A Cadet in the rear of the bus immediately followed with, "That was Coleman." We were later to find that for what Coleman lacked in size the citizens more than made up in true friendliness and hospitality.

No time was wasted in getting our schedule started and we soon found ourselves buried in rhumb lines and vectors, pleasantly illustrated by Mr. Eckhardt's famous cartoons.

Ah, the thrill of that first ride in a PT; the first spin or stall; the first solo and the first crow-hop landing; those never-to-be-forgotten unmentionables that came streaming through the "gosports" when you took off with the flaps down!! They all add up to a full and interesting day at Primary.

Then that fateful day of censored date when the headquarters building slowly rose high into the air and distributed itself in small particles throughout the surrounding country-side. It's a safe bet that nearly all of the usually light-hearted Cadets offered silent prayers for those injured or choked back a few tears for those who suffered.

Back to the routine the next day and through the several weeks that followed came 20, 40, and 60-hour checks with all their pleasure and disappointment.

Now our course is set and our goal has become more definite. Since we have experienced the thrill of flying it is no longer a dream, but a beautiful realization of an old ambition.

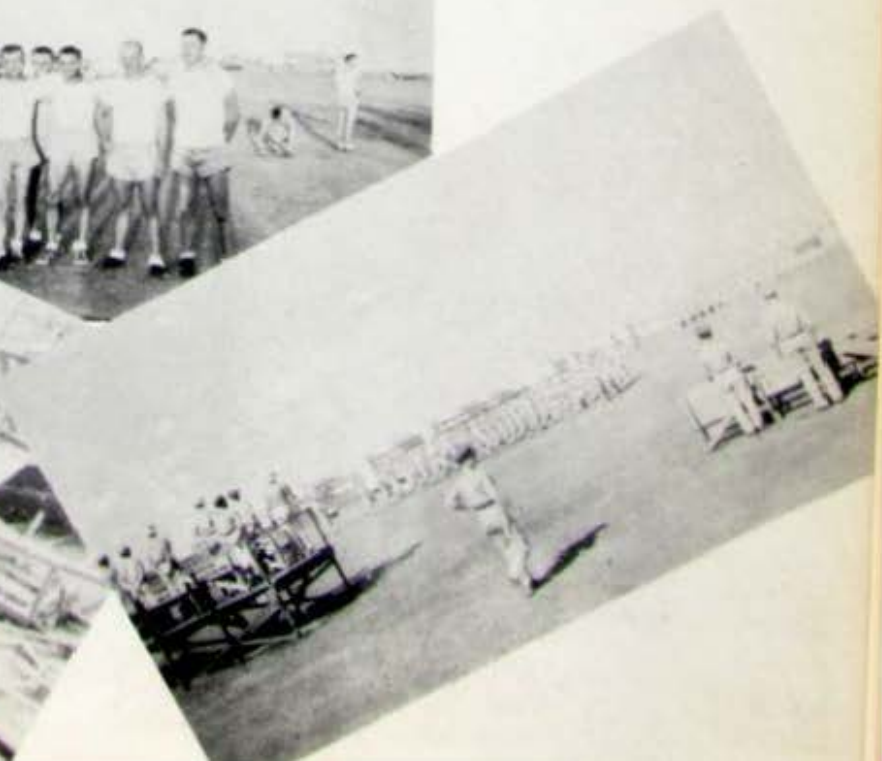
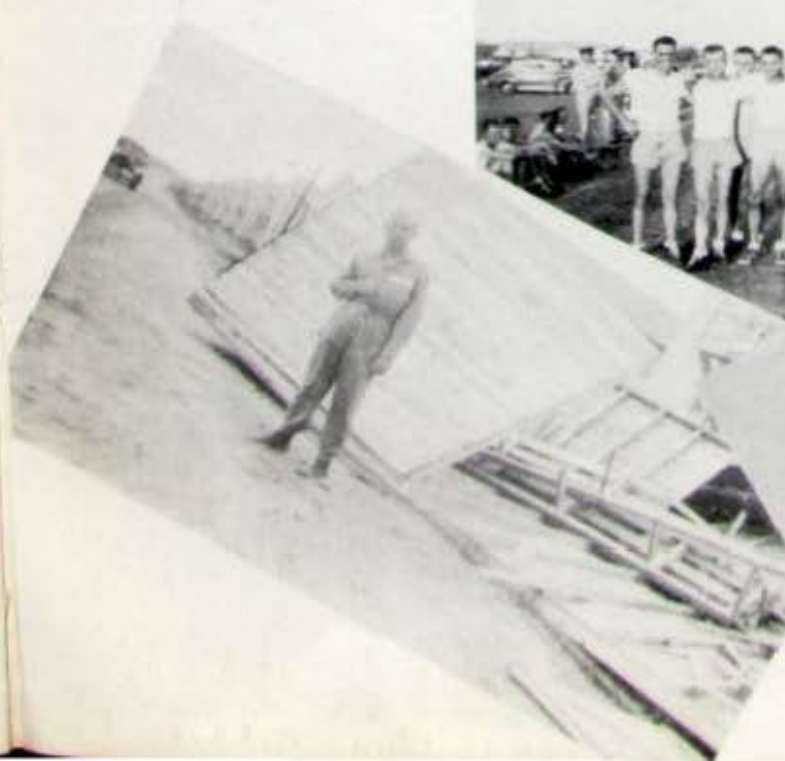
