SMALLER WORLD COCOA BEAN CROP FORECAST FOR 1978/79

Summary

World cocoa bean production for the 1978/79 (October-September) season is forecast at 1.40 million metric tons, about 5 percent below the 1977/78 harvest of 1.48 million tons. Based on past performance, the chances are two out of three that the actual final outturn will not vary more than 5.5 percent from this first estimate of world production.

The smaller harvest this season reflects less favorable growing conditions in the principal producing areas of West Africa and Brazil. African production is forecast at 861,500 tons, 5.5 percent below the 1977/78 outturn of 911,600 tons, and the South American harvest is estimated at 377,900 tons, nearly 7 percent lower than the 405,900 tons of a year ago. A slight increase is forecast for North America to 97,400 tons from 95,500 tons in 1977/78, and production in Asia and Oceania is also expected to be moderately higher at 67,900 tons, compared with the 1977/78 crop of 63,800 tons.

World cocoa bean grindings in 1979 are expected to approximate the low 1978 and 1977 levels of about 1.36 million and 1.37 million tons, respectively. Thus, if production forecasts are realized, a slight world stock buildup in 1979 is possible, following a 105,000-ton stock increase in 1978. Although current high price levels have largely discounted the lower production prospects for 1978/79, prices are likely to turn downward in the coming months, as supplies from the new crops reach the terminal markets.

New York cocoa bean prices (the average of the nearest three active futures trading months on the New York Cocoa Exchange) in September averaged \$3.72 per kilogram (\$1.69 per pound), up from \$3.32

per kilogram (\$1.51 per pound) in August and \$3.14 per kilogram (\$1.43 per pound) in July. Prices during October averaged \$3.75 per kilogram (\$1.70 per pound).

Preliminary data indicate that 1977 producer export earnings from cocoa beans and products approximated \$4 billion, compared with 1976 revenues of \$2.1 billion and \$1.94 billion in 1975. Exports earnings will again be at high levels in 1978.

The International Cocoa Agreement (ICA), which will expire on September 30, 1979, will likely be renegotiated under the auspices of UNCTAD in Geneva, in January 1979. The United States is not a member of the current ICA, but will participate in the negotiation of a new agreement.

Major Producers

Africa

Ghana. Weather conditions for development of the 1978/79 Ghanaian main crop have not been favorable, and it is expected that the harvest will be virtually completed by the end of December, about a month earlier than usual. Thus, total recorded purchases by the Ghana Cocoa Marketing Board for the 1978/79 season are forcast to reach only 255,000 tons, but could be higher if the movement of contraband cocoa to the neighboring countries of the Ivory Coast and Togo is curtailed.

Purchases during the 1977/78 season amounted to only 271,000 tons, and were the lowest since the 1958/59 outturn of 259,600 tons. It has been estimated that 20,000 to 45,000 tons of cocoa beans were smuggled out of the country during the 1977/78 season, mostly to the Ivory Coast. Other factors contributing to the small harvest were poor growing conditions and the lack of good cultural practices, such as spraying for capsids, pruning, and weeding.

The decline in Ghana's production in recent years has also been the result of increased emphasis placed on food production by cocoa farmers because of low cocoa producer prices, as well as the rural-to-urban migration of farmers and workers. In addition, any increase in output from current renovation programs and new plantings is being offset by the decline in productivity of older trees.

In efforts to stem the decline in production, the Government has doubled the producer price to 80 cedis per 30 kilograms (equivalent to about 44.1 U.S. cents per pound at current exchange rates) from 40 cedis paid to growers during the 1977/78 season. However, because of the recent devaluation of the cedi and because of the current high rate of inflation (estimated to have been close to 150 percent in 1977), it is doubtful that the new grower price will be sufficient to reduce smuggling and to foster increased production to any large degree. The 1977/78 grower price was equivalent to 52.6 U.S. cents per pound prior to devaluation.

The Government has recently initiated a mass spraying program in the Brong-Ahafo and Ashanti regions in efforts to reduce capsid and other insect damage to the cocoa trees. This action has come too late to help the current main crop harvest, but will likely prove beneficial for next year's crop.

Foreign exchange earnings from the sale of the 1977/78 crop were estimated to have been in excess of \$800 million. Earnings from 1978/79 sales are forecast to fall between \$700 million and \$800 million.

Ivory Coast. Ivoirian purchases are forecast to reach 275,000 tons, down slightly from last year's record harvest of 282,000 tons. Weather conditions, although drier than normal, have been better than in Ghana, and the trees are in relatively good condition. Increased productivity of the young trees and new plantings coming into bearing, will offset to a large degree effects of less favorable growing conditions this season. However, purchases could be lower, if there is tighter border control over contraband cocoa from Ghana.

The producer price will remain unchanged from last season's level of 250 CFA per kilogram (about 49.1 U.S. cents per pound). Prices paid to farmers during the 1976/77 season were equivalent to about 33.3 U.S. cents per pound. Grinding capacity in the Ivory Coast increased to 100,000 tons annually with the addition of the PROCASI factory in 1977. However, during the 1977/78 season all factories were supplied with only 67,000 tons because of emphasis on cocoa bean exports rather than products.

The Ivory Coast continues to make plantings and open new areas to cocoa cultivation. Given favorable weather, production could reach 300,000 tons by 1979/80.

Cocoa bean exports in 1977 totaled 158,491 tons, down from 191,409 tons a year earlier. Cocoa butter shipments amounted to 11,211 tons, compared with 1976 exports of 12,113 tons; cocoa powder exports were 1,651 tons, off slightly from the year-ago level of 1,765 tons. However, exports of cocoa and chocolate mass more than doubled to 15,156 tons from 7,400 tons in 1976. Because of the record 1977/78 crop, exports of cocoa beans and products should be significantly higher in 1978.

Nigeria. Nigerian production for 1978/79 is forecast at 175,000 tons, 14 percent below the 1977/78 harvest of 203,000 tons. As in Ghana, early harvest completion is anticipated.

Producer prices will likely remain unchanged from last season's level of 1,030 Naira per ton (about 71 U.S. cents per pound). Although this is the highest price paid among the major West African producing countries, inflation in Nigeria continues at a high rate and farm workers still are migrating to the cities for more remunerative wages.

Further compounding Nigeria's cocoa industry problems has been shipping difficulties caused by port congestion, which has resulted in persistent delays in shipments and frequent declarations of "force majeure." Because to this situation, several U.S. chocolate manufacturers have either discontinued buying, or have reduced purchases, of Nigerian cocoa.

Cameroon. Production is forecast to approximate the 1977/78 harvest of 105,000 tons. Producer prices for Grades 1 and 2 cocoa beans have been increased to 260 CFA per kilogram (51.1 U.S. cents per pound) from 220 CFA per kilogram (43.2 U.S. cents per pound) paid last season.

Exports of cocoa cake in 1977 totaled 11,173 tons, cocoa butter 6,909 tons, and chocolate 2,906 tons. Provisional data show 1977 cocoa bean exports at 56,843 tons, with the Netherlands taking 48,926 tons, West Germany 2,404 tons, France 2,843 tons, and Italy 1,561 tons.

South America

Brazil. Production is forecast at 250,000 tons, 11 percent below the record 1977/78 outturn of 281,000 tons. Less favorable growing conditions have reduced the (October-April) 1978/79 Bahia main crop prospects to 1.5 million bags (90,000 tons), compared with the 1977/78 main crop of 1.887 million bags (113,220 tons). The 1979 (May-September) Bahia temporao crop is provisionally forecast at around 2.3 million bags (138,000 tons), compared with the bumper 1978 temporao harvest of 2.5 million bags (150,000 tons). Production in other Brazilian cocoa areas usually amounts to 300,000 bags (18,000 tons).

The Cocoa Growers' Central Cooperative (COPER-CACAU) of Bahia is planning to build a 500,000-bag (30,000 tons) annual capacity cocoa processing factory at Ilheus. This new facility is scheduled to open by 1982 and will produce cocoa butter, cake, and liquor. The French group CACAO BARRY will provide partial financing and technical assistance. Total Brazilian grinding capacity will be increased to around 3 million bags (180,000 tons) when this new plant comes into operation.

Brazil's foreign exchange earnings derived from exports of cocoa beans and products in 1977 totaled a record \$774 million, more than double 1976 sales of \$357 million. Export earnings during the first 6 months of 1978 totaled \$267 million.

Ecuador. Production is forecast at 74,000 tons, slightly above the 1977/78 crop of 72,000 tons. Two new cocoa processing facilities are nearly ready to come on stream, one in November 1978, the other in January 1979. When these new plants are operational, Ecuador's total annual processing capacity will be approximately 124,000 tons, which is well above current production levels. The Government has restricted the exportation of cocoa beans to 25 percent of national production in order to provide more supplies for the domestic processing industry.

Preliminary data place 1977 exports of cocoa beans at 20,085 tons, valued at \$63.2 million, compared with 1976 exports of 22,236 tons, valued at \$32.5 million. The Netherlands was the leading recipient of 1977 shipments, taking 6,030 tons, followed by West Germany with 4,405 tons; the United States 3,390 tons; and the USSR with 1,250 tons.

Ecuador's exports of cocoa products in 1977, with 1976 data in parentheses, were as follows: cocoa butter 2,774 tons, \$13.5 million (2,526 tons, \$9.3 million); chocolate liquor 33,539 tons, \$148.9 million (21,775 tons, \$47 million); cocoa cake and powder 3,389 tons, \$14.5 million (2,948 tons, \$2.9 million); and chocolate products 938 tons, \$3.6 million (861 tons, \$1.5 million).

Asia and Oceania

Malaysia. Reflecting new plantings coming into bearing, 1978/79 production in Malaysia is forecast at a record 27,000 tons, and is expected to reach 30,000 tons for the 1979/80 season. Intercropping of cocoa with coconuts has proven profitable, and the Government is planning to continue to expand production.

A M\$30-million cocoa project is to be undertaken in the State of Sabah, which will involve the development of over 6,000 hectares for cocoa and is to be completed by 1985. In addition, the Sarawak State Government has announced that an additional 3,200 hectares of cocoa will be planted from virgin lands. The Malaysian Government has a target of 243,000 hectares of cocoa by the year 2000.

A M\$5-million cocoa processing plant is to be built in Lower Perak. The new facility will produce cocoa butter and cake for export. Currently Malaysian cocoa beans are sold at a 6-10 percent discount from West African origins because of high acidity content. The Government is working to correct this problem by improving fermentation methods, and reportedly some progress have been made.

Major Importers

World cocoa bean grindings in 1977 were estimated at about 1.37 million tons, 10 percent below 1976 grindings of 1.52 million tons. Grindings in 1978 are estimated to reach 1.36 million tons and are expected to remain at low levels in 1979. Continuation of relatively high prices for cocoa beans and expanded use of substitutes and extenders are largely responsible for the reduced grind levels.

Cocoa bean grindings for specified consuming countries for the first 9 months of 1977 and 1978, and 1977 annual data are as follows:

Provisional data indicate world cocoa bean imports in 1977 at 1.01 million tons, 12 percent below 1976 imports of 1.14 million tons. The smaller imports reflect reduced world cocoa bean production in 1976/77 and the effect of increased grindings in origin countries. The United States remained the world's leading cocoa bean importer in 1977 with 174,903 tons, followed by West Germany with 150,534 tons; the Netherlands with 145,230 tons; and the United Kingdom with 79,874 tons.

Cocoa bean imports by the USSR in 1977 totaled

only 73,000 tons, well under the 1976 and 1975 levels of 134,000 and 155,777 tons, respectively. Cocoa bean imports in 1977 by East European nations and the USSR together amounted to about 180,000 tons, 27 percent below 1976 imports of 246,000 tons. Imports by West European countries in 1977 amounted to 559,235 tons, only slightly below 1976 imports of 564,716 tons.

International Developments

The International Cocoa Organization on July 28 announced its decision to renegotiate the International Cocoa Agreement (which will expire on September 30, 1979) under the auspices of UNCTAD in Geneva, in January 1979. In preparation for the January meeting, a preparatory committee will meet

October 10-20, and December 4-13, in London. If there has not been sufficient progress by the end of the December meeting to allow the renegotiation, the January 1979 meeting will be postponed.
