MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Marking of Equipment Picked Up on Recent Inventory  
and Evaluation of Former Japanese Army and Navy  
Arsenals and Laboratories

2. In addition to the items of equipment which were inventoried and marked in accordance with reference 1a (1), above, there are many additional items of equipment which were inventoried and evaluated, in connection with the recent inventory and evaluation of machinery located in Arsenals and Laboratories, Oil storage Facilities, Private Munitions Plants and Aircraft Plants, as directed by references 1a (2) and 1b, above. This equipment was, in some cases, marked with temporary numbers and, in other cases, was not marked at all during the recent inventory and evaluation; but, at the same time, each time, entered on the Japanese Evaluating Committee Reports, was entered by an inventory code number, thus leaving no direct association between items of equipment and the listing of the same items on the recent evaluation reports.

Actually, the total number of originally inventoried items is 78. Re-evaluated items is 132. A plant layout was obtained for REP files. This plan has more detail than the one which was submitted with the evaluation report.

e. Nagoya MA, Torimatsu Kojo, 01-59(a), M/A - 6 Oct

No authorized use at this large arsenal. A 520 KVA diesel generator set, 01-59(a)-5174k is classified as Class 3. This item which is similar to the one recently allocated to the Philippines at 01-56, has been reconditioned and is now in first class condition. There is a 13000 KVA capacity substation at this plant (two 6000 KVA and two 500 KVA transformers plus one 6000 KVA spare). A booklet containing many corrections to the evaluation report was obtained from the custodian. Maintenance for so large a plant was exceptionally good.

f. Hokoku Kikai Kogyo KK, Daiichi Kojo and Tsuchima Kojo, 01-17, A/C - 6 Oct

This plant was completely demolished during the war. Forty-nine (49) items have been retained at the plant's original location (Daiichi Kojo), and 107 items have been moved to Tsuchima for maintenance and security. Items at both locations have the same code number. Maintenance is very good. There is no authorized use. Plant layouts were obtained for REP files.

g. Aisan Kogyo KK, 01-10, A/C - 6 Oct

There are 111 items in authorized use at this small plant. Almost all useable equipment is in use. Maintenance of items in use and in storage is good.

h. Aichi Kogyo KK, Imamura Kojo, 01-04, A/C - 7 Oct

Twenty (20) items inventoried originally, plus twenty-seven (27) items on the re-evaluation inventory, are in authorized use. These items are all part of the utilities system of the plant for use by a textile company in the released area. Maintenance is good.

i. Aichi Kogyo KK, Enokido Kojo, 01-02, A/C - 7 Oct

Seven (7) originally inventoried items, plus two (2) re-evaluation inventory items, are in authorized use. These are all electrical equipment for power in the released area. Maintenance here is excellent.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Reparations Section

SUBJECT: Report of Inspection of Arsenals and Aircraft  
Plants, Aichi Prefecture, 5-11 Oct 48

1. A routine maintenance and authorized use check was made in Aichi Prefecture. The following is a list of the plants inspected, and information concerning them:

a. Aichi Kigyo KK, Atsuta Kojo, 01-01, A/C - 5 Oct

The plant is not in operation, but has a substation (six items) in authorized use which furnishes power for the released area. It was noticed that these items are not shown as being in authorized use on the evaluation report. These items are: 01-1-1588, 1589, 1591, 1592, 1593, and 1595. Maintenance here is very good. Many of the Class 3 items are so well maintained that from outward appearances they seem to be Class 1 machines.

b. Nagoya MA, Atsuta Kojo, 01-55(a), M/A - 5 Oct

There are no authorized use items at this plant. Inventoried items bear code numbers 01-55(a), 01-55(b), 01-55(d), and 01-97. It was noted that the 01-97 items (01-97-1 through 5) were not included on the re-evaluation report. Items of interest are assorted machine tools and a 594 KVA diesel generator set. Maintenance here is good.

c. Nagoya MA, Takakura Kojo, 01-57, M/A - 5 Oct

This arsenal has pump and press sets similar to those allocated from Plant 19-18, a large forging shop, and a 10,000 KVA capacity substation (four 2500 KVA transformers). All are in good condition and should be very desirable to the claimant nations. There is no authorized use. Maintenance is good.

d. Aichi Kigyo KK, Horita Kojo, 01-03, A/C - 5 Oct

Plant has 86 items in authorized use, 52 of which were on the original inventory. Maintenance of items in use and in storage is good. It was noted that the cover sheet for the evaluation report lists 78 machine tools.



Actually, the total number of originally inventoried items is 78. Re-evaluated items is 132. A plant layout was obtained for REP files. This plan has more detail than the one which was submitted with the evaluation report.

e. Nagoya MA, Torimatsu Kojo, 01-59(a), M/A - 6 Oct

No authorized use at this large arsenal. A 520 KVA diesel generator set, 01-59(a)-5174k is classified as Class 3. This item which is similar to the one recently allocated to the Philippines at 01-56, has been reconditioned and is now in first class condition. There is a 13000 KVA capacity substation at this plant (two 6000 KVA and two 500 KVA transformers plus one 6000 KVA spare). A booklet containing many corrections to the evaluation report was obtained from the custodian. Maintenance for so large a plant was exceptionally good.

f. Hokoku Kikai Kogyo KK, Daiichi Kojo and Tsuchima Kojo, 01-17, A/C - 6 Oct

This plant was completely demolished during the war. Forty-nine (49) items have been retained at the plant's original location (Daiichi Kojo), and 107 items have been moved to Tsuchima for maintenance and security. Items at both locations have the same code number. Maintenance is very good. There is no authorized use. Plant layouts were obtained for REP files.

g. Aisan Kogyo KK, 01-10, A/C - 6 Oct

There are 111 items in authorized use at this small plant. Almost all useable equipment is in use. Maintenance of items in use and in storage is good.

h. Aichi Kigyo KK, Imamura Kojo, 01-04, A/C - 7 Oct

Twenty (20) items inventoried originally, plus twenty-seven (27) items on the re-evaluation inventory, are in authorized use. These items are all part of the utilities system of the plant for use by a textile company in the released area. Maintenance is good.

i. Aichi Kigyo KK, Enokido Kojo, 01-02, A/C - 7 Oct

Seven (7) originally inventoried items, plus two (2) re-evaluation inventory items, are in authorized use. These are all electrical equipment for power in the released area. Maintenance here is excellent.



j. Nisshin Sangyo KK, 01-21, A/C - 8 Oct

Maintenance at this plant is excellent. There are ten (10) items in authorized use (transformers and switch gear). Items are being used to furnish power for a textile plant in the released area.

k. Asahina Tekkojo KK, Okoshi Kojo, 01-11, A/C 8 Oct

Thirty-eight (38) originally inventoried items, plus thirteen (13) re-evaluation inventory items are in authorized use at this small plant. Code Number 01-25(e) is located at this plant, but is not a part of it. It is being maintained by a separate custodial staff. Maintenance is good.

l. Mitsubishi Jukogyo KK, #12, Kojo, 01-30, A/C 8 Oct

One hundred and six (106) items, Code Number 01-25(d), have been moved to this plant after the evaluation report was submitted, and are being stored in Building #8. Items bearing code numbers 01-25(c) and 01-25(h) are also stored here. These have been picked up on the evaluation report. Maintenance here is good. Twelve (12) items (utilities) are in authorized use for a food processing factory in the released area. A plant layout was obtained for REP files.

## m. The following plants were also inspected:

- (1) Mitsubishi Jukogyo KK, Koa Boseki KK, Kochino Kojo, 01-25(f), A/C - 8 Oct.
- (2) Kawasaki Sangyo KK, Okoshi Sangyojo, 01-23(a), A/C - 8 Oct.
- (3) Mitsubishi Jukogyo KK, Daiko Kojo #4, 01-25(e), A/C - 8 Oct.
- (4) Mitsubishi Jukogyo KK, Daiko Kojo #4, Ozone Kojo, 01-25(b), A/C - 9 Oct.
- (5) Kawanishi Kikai Seisakusho KK, 01-22, A/C - 9 Oct.
- (6) Mitsubishi Jukogyo KK, Daiko Kojo #4, 01-25(a), A/C - 9 Oct.
- (7) Chakyo Kikai Seisakusho KK, Komaki Kojo, 01-14, A/C - 11 Oct.

2. The appearance of the reparations equipment inspected indicates the superior supervision has been exercised by Lieut. Robert L. McLaughlin, the officer who has been in charge of reparations for the Aichi MG Team, Economics Section. (Lieut. McLaughlin was recently reassigned to the Labor Section). A systematic program was initiated by Lieut. McLaughlin which includes strict periodic inspections whereby plants are graded on a point system; an effective publicity campaign at the plants which includes posting catchphrase slogans with appropriate cartoons; and the presentation of "superior achievement" certificates, signed by the Commanding Officer, Aichi MG Team, to plants having the best maintenance. Lieut. McLaughlin should be commended for the splendid job he has done.

3. The undersigned reported to the Commanding Officer, Aichi MG Team, MG personnel were very hospitable and provided adequate logistic support.



1. Instructions for marking, reinventory and re-evaluation by the Japanese Government of equipment in arsenals, laboratories, aircraft and privately-owned munitions plants will be transmitted thru channels in the near future.

2. Inclosed herewith for your information are extracts of lists (Exhibit "A") of aircraft and privately-owned munitions plants which will be given priority in the above operation. Corrections have been made by this headquarters only of code numbers and names of the plants on this list. Addresses have not been corrected. All dispersal areas of the plants listed, remaining under custody in compliance with current directives, will be included in this operation.
