

June Buds for 1890.

We again desire to call the attention of the trade to the special advantages offered by June Budding in the introduction of new varieties.

The samples of June Budded peach exhibited by us at the Chicago Conventiom were taken from the rows grown for one of our customers, and showed only the average of sizes as obtained by us, under this system. Where orders are received in time and trees or buds reach us in the proper season, we can make nearly all Peach on Peach run 3 feet and up, and a good percentage 5 to 6 feet, and all shapely and well branched. Where stock for mailing is desired, we can get nearly all to run from 12 to 20 inches, but to obtain such control over sizes we must have orders in time and buds as we want them.

Think of the advantages in time gained in getting new and rare varieties on the market. We plant the seed this winter, bud in June, and in the fall have trees 5 to 6 feet, 4 to 5 feet, 3 to 4 feet, or smaller, just as you desire, and all smooth, thrifty, nice, clean stock, and when budded early enough they ripen up buds in time to dormant bud for the following season, enabling the introducer to put his varieties on the market in any quantity desired the second year. Our climate and soil are exactly suited to this class of work, and our experience in this line enables us to offer a graded list running to six feet, which we believe has never been done by any other parties in June Buds.

It is always best where possible to send on a few trees in fall or early in spring to be set out here from which to cut buds, as we can then be more certain of getting them just when we can put them on, and at the same time have them in first class shape, securing a better stand and better growth; but this is not absolutely necessary if our directions for shipping buds are carefully followed. The main point in getting them to any desired size is to have the buds fresh and in time.
