Deputy Prime Minister Joji Hayashi, currently stumping the Tokai District, asserted in Gifu yesterday that 63 of the 132 seats to be contested in the coming Upper House election would be filled by Liberal Party candidates.

TWO LOCAL CONSTITUENCY CANDIDATES FILE -- ONE WITHDRAWS

The National Election Administration Commission reported today the filing of candidacies by 2 additional candidates for the 76 local constituency seats to be contested in the coming Upper House election. One was recorded as a People's Democrat, the other as an Independent.

With the withdrawal today of HAMADA Mitsui, Independent candidate for the single vacancy in Kochi Prefecture, total local constituency candidates by party (with incumbents indicated in parentheses) are:

PRESS REPORTS LIBERALS DROP 11 CANDIDATES

Though unconfirmed by the National Election Administration Commission as of 1700 hours today, Jiji Press has reported the withdrawal by Liberal Party headquarters of 8 of its National constituency candidates and 3 of its candidates from local constituencies in an attempt to reduce the number of Liberal candidates in the coming election.

MAINICHI CONDUCTS VOTER-PREFERENCE POLL

According to Mainichi, a political preference poll was conducted by that paper recently. Questionnaires were mailed to 19 voters randomly selected from each of 95 voters' lists in 14 prefectures, asking which party would be supported by the voter in the coming House of Councillors' election. NATIONAL CONSTITUENCY CANDIDACIES INCREASED BY 6

The candidacies of 6 additional candidates for national constituency seats were filed with the National Election Administration Commission as of 1700 hours today. Among these new candidates, 4 were independents, 1 a Ryokufukai, and 1 a minor party member. Among the 4 independent candidates was OGAWA Hisayoshi, who had resigned as a candidate on the People's Democratic Party ticket from Toyama Prefecture on 13 May. Although KAWAHARADA Iwao, Liberal Party candidate, withdrew from the national constituency race this morning, his candidacy was re-announced late today.

SOCIAL DEMOCRATS CONFIDENT OF VICTORY

After reaffirming the party's decision to advocate an overall peace treaty as opposed to the Liberal Party's "separate peace" plan, the Central Executive Committee of the Social Democratic Party expressed confidence yesterday in the party's chances for victory in the coming House of Councillors' election, Yomiuri reports. This optimism was based on reports from Central Committee members which contended that the party had been placed in a favorable position because of the following factors: 1) the entering of too many candidates by the Liberal Party; 2) the slowness of the People's Democratic Party in starting its campaign; and 3) loss of popularity by the Communist Party.

The Central Committee, in addition, approved the party's three campaign slogans related to the peace issue. They are: "Overall peace for Japan, Permanent Neutrality for Japan, and Opposition to making Japan a military base for foreign Nations."

ASAHI LISTS PARTY PROSPECTS

With the close of registration of candidacies tonight at 2400 hours for national constituency candidates, political observers believe that the electoral campaign for the House of Councillors will be intensified.

In the twenty days remaining until election day on 4 June, the Liberal Party will step up its drive to win an absolute majority in the Upper House of the Diet to the same measure that it presently enjoys in the Lower House.

According to a roundup of campaign activities in Asahi (15 May), so far the Liberals have made the most headway in the local electoral constituencies, while in the national constituency they have bogged down under the twin weights of too many candidates and vigorous attacks from the opposition parties.

The Social Democrats are leading the opposition fight in the national constituency, while the People's Democrats (the reorganized Democratic Party merged with the former People's Cooperative Party and the New Political Council) are harassing the Liberals in the local constituencies by splitting the conservative votes.

According to the Asahi roundup, the Communists are apparently gaining in the national constituency but are losing ground locally.

All opposition parties are concentrating their criticism on the Government's economic policies and peace issues.

People's Democratic Party Tokutaro KITAMURA.

The policies which Liberals promised the people
to carry out in the Lower House election campaigns of
January last year, have hardly been realized. During this

session of the Diet, the Liberals tried to pass the Local Tax Law Revision Bill trusting to numbers, but the Bill was rejected at the House of Councillors. This is the raison d'etre of the Upper House.

The absolute majority of one party should be rejected in the House of Councillors from its character. The people should vote for candidates for their personalities rather than for their party affiliations and the members also should always abide by a free and unbiased policy.

The 260 members of the Liberal Party which were elected by the people in the general election of January, last year, are not the representatives of the people toward the Occupation Policies but appear to have turned to the torturers to the people.

Inejiro ASANUMA.

It is natural that the Cabinet should resign in a body or the Diet be dissolved according to the normal course of constitutionalism merely on the ground the Local Tax Bill has been rejected. We are surprised, however, that the Cabinet is devising a plan of prolongation of its ruling power as shown in its reference to the opening of the extraordinary Diet session.

That we have introduced non-confidence vote in the Cabinet toward the end of the seventh session of the Diet is due to the fact that we are demanding for the establishment of parliamentary government instead of the "government by force" of the Liberal Party relying upon numbers.

As regards the Local Tax Bill the Liberal Party intended to carry it through the Lower House single-handed.

Anyway, we will exert ourselves to the utmost to make way for the overthrow of the present Cabinet through the election ~~campaign~~ this time.

Labor-Farmer Party

Haruo OKADA.

At the juncture of confusion after the surrender the Liberal Party declared clearly that it would carry out thorough-going examinations into the scandal cases. In the meanwhile the majority of people voted for the

Liberal Party in expectation of the presence of more powerful Government representing Japan than the preceding one unworthy of their trust.

Thus the victory went to the Liberal Party. After that, nevertheless, the Liberal Party has fulfilled none of its public promises.

Its policies are all ill-balanced, growing reactionary by degrees, and thus driving the people into a corner. Taking up for an example the budget program for the 1950 fiscal year, we can find in it reactionary policies protecting the ZAIBATSU at the sacrifice of laborers farmers and medium and small enterprisers. As for the peace conference, we advocate overall peace and eternal neutrality.

People's Democratic Party Tokutaro KITAMURA.

The YOSHIDA Government is deprived of its self-autonomy in politics.

The free competition involved in the platform of the Liberal Party is influenced by the classical thought prevailed in the eighteenth century. We are not the members of the foreign Diet but those of the Japanese Diet.

The present Cabinet, however, is deprived of its self-autonomy with its right of deliberation in the Diet completely set at naught.

As for the peace treaty problem, we are absolutely opposed to our submission to a particular country.

Farmers' Co-operative Party Rokutaro MATSUMOTO.

If the government policies are successful Japan will really be self-sufficient **in** food supplies even though the population goes to ninety million.

Nevertheless, the YOSHIDA Cabinet thinks nothing of the production increase **in** foodstuffs within the country and buys rice from foreign countries at the high price of eight thousand six hundred yen per five bushels.

It cannot be overlooked that this has put farm villages in a difficult situation.

The Local Tax Bill, though abolished, represents an extortionate taxation upon farm villages because it imposes juridical person and added value taxes upon the agricultural and fishing co-operative associations as well as upon the commercial concerns.

RYOKUFU KAI Party

Aisuke OKAMOTO.

If the Liberal Party has a **majority** in the Upper House after this election it will control a majority in the Both Houses. Therefore, there will be no need for the Both House system. On the contrary, if the Opposition parties gain in strength, the deliberation on bills

is delayed in the Upper House, resulting in the poor administration of the national affairs.

In this view, we stand for strict fairness from the unique standpoint of the Upper House.

Liberal Party

Etsujiro UEHARA.

The Single House system is desirable in democratic politics, but the Both House system is inevitable according to the political ~~sense~~ prevailing Japan.

In this sense, ~~however~~, the Upper House has brought disgrace upon the Both House System in voting against the Local Tax Bill.

It is easy to carry out inflation policies at any time but it is considered that the present Government might be compared to a physician performing an operation of appendicitis.

Though the overall peace treaty means a promotion of friendly relations with U.S.S.R. we are doubtful about the intellects of the politicians advocating both overall peace treaty and strict neutrality, in view of the fact that the U.S.S.R, has continued detaining our compatriots for four years.

I. With reference to the trend of the
political parties and other organizations
toward the election for the members of the
House of Councillors to be held in June
next, it appeared that before the announcement
of the Notification, the decision of the candi-
dates delayed in all electoral districts as it
was in the extra session of the Diet. In

the nature of the election for this time, the existing political parties have laid stress on the career, personality, and territory of each candidate, and being most rigorous in selecting of their official candidates, they are confident of victory, while other organizations are expected to recommend prominent people as their candidates by making the organizations to which they belong their respective recommending mother bodies. Surrounding those 132 seats in the House of Councillors, it seems a considerable fierce battle will spread out.

Next, we should submit to you the report of the outline of the trend in connection with the political parties and other organizations, and the peculiar circumstances.

(A) The Liberal Party.

In the presence of the coming election which has the gravity to control the charge of political situation for a long term, the Party has determined to command a majority by hook or by crook, and,

putting up the following slogans, it is using a sure card to win the heart of the people to the best of its ability.

(1) Restoration of Independence by the earlier conclusion of peace Treaty.

(2) Loan to the Small and Medium Business and Industry from the United States Aid Counterpart Fund and the Deposit Division Fund.

(3) Operation of Tax Reduction and Promotion of Foreign Trade.

(4) Self-Supporting of Food-Stuffs.

But its unpopularity of the administration in the charge of political situation for the past one year and four months has gradually come to a head. Moreover, by the bombastic talk of Finance Minister IKEDA made some time ago against the small 池田 and medium businessmen and industrialists, and by the failure of the Local Tax-Bill, it cannot be covered up that popular feeling has been alienated from it. Particularly,

as the Party has made rural communities, mountain villages and fishing villages as well as the strata of small and medeum businessmen and industrialists as the nucleus of its territory, it is considered that the Liberal Party will find itself in a very disadvantageous position in the coming election. Taking advantage, however, of the relative weakness of the opposition parties front, it is confident of victory. In the selection of its official candidates, stress has been laid on their territory, career and personality, and in selecting them it has been most rigorous. On the other hand, efforts have been made to prevent itself from having too many competitors in the field, partecularly as to the candidates for the national constituency it has given up to rake up the vaguely scattered votes, but the selection has been made over and over again with the policy that they should stand on the fixed foundation, co-operating with the candidates for the local constituency.

Ahead of any other political parties, the official candidates have already been decided, and it was decided and announced on March 30, to have selected the first 116 official candidates and on April 11 the second 116 Official candidates, namely, those amounting to 137, and, aiming at the target of having 70 or 80 of them to be elected, it is making the arrangements to take the attitude to the undertaking of the election energetically.

(B) The Peoples Democratic Party.

Though it gives us an impression of being rather tardy in the electoral campaign on account of the preparation for the formation of the new Party, it has got the position of the first Opposition Party By the union of the Democratic Party, People's Cooperative Party and the New Political Council, and it aims to overthrow the YOSHIDA Cabinet in the coming election, putting up the following slogans.

(L) Perfect independence for peace and neutrality.

- (2) Establishment of the independence of the National Diet.
- (3) Relief of the strata of nation with moderate means.
- (4) Abolishment of bad taxes -- Additional value tax and fixed capital tax.

With the members of prefectural assemblies belonging to the Party, first in number on a national scale, as its foothold, it is expected to fight a good fight. Regarding the selection of its official candidates, their previous territory and personal popularity have specially been taken into consideration and it decided and announced to have ~~sselected~~ on April 15, the first 32 official candidates and later the second 14 official candidates, amounting to 46 of them, and aims at the target for having 40 of them to be elected.

However, as it is not long after the formation of new party. ~~agreements~~ have not

been made in connection with the territories of its powerful candidates, and, in some prefectures, we see it finding itself in difficulties in selecting its candidates. Among the principal prefectures in such difficulties there is Gumma Prefecture, where the fixed numbers are two, and where the two present councillors and two former Representatives have stood as the candidates respectively, all refusing to budge an inch. In Osaka and Toyama Prefectures those formerly belonged to the Democratic Party and those formerly belonged to the people's Cooperative party have recommended their own candidates. The Party is, therefore, appears to be anxious about the settlement of it. And yet, on a national scale the coming election is supposed, as a result of the formation of the new party, to be developed advantageously to it.

Furthermore, the Party concentrated its power on the independence of the national Diet and the criticism of the Liberal Party with no definite policy of its own, aiming at the

overthrowing of the present Cabinet as its final target, it is considered that after the electoral notification the stump-speaking of the party leaders is expected to be expanded on a national scale.

(C) The Ryokufu Kai

The Ryokufu Kai is the largest Party in the House of Councillors at present, but it makes any way a free and unbiased policy of the one-man-one-party-principle the feature of it. Accordingly, it has not any obvious policy publicly promised as other political parties have, and the policy of the Candidates is on the matters unified in accordance with their assertions and requests from their respective standpoint. The following matters have been affirmed by them most emphatically.

(1) Tax reduction and overcoming of monetary stringency and depression.

(2) Stabilization of the economy of rural community.

(3) Promotion of small and medium business and industry.

It appears that they have anyhow made these their slogans. They are planning, it seems, to secure the superiority in the House of Councillors as before by stressing that, adjusting the going of the House of Representatives too far and giving life to the good sense and the expert knowledge, it is the message of the House of Councillors to have a free and unbiased policy. From the foregoing view point, its official candidates are selected on the standard of their personality, and on April 6 the first 47 official candidates, amounting to 57 of them, were decided and announced. But, boarding together, the Ryukufu Kai has no horizontal liaison, and all the candidates are unaccustomed to elections and they have confirmed territory, and from these points, it is regarded to be difficult to maintain the status quo in the House at large.

(4) Concerning various organizations .

(1) The Farmers' Cooperative party (Hokkaido).

Taking advantage of the organization of Hokkai Nomin Domei (Alliance of the Farmers of Hokkaido) which is the most powerful organization of farmers, it has arranged to recommend one candidate for national constituency and two candidates for local constituency, and the selection of those candidates seem to have been over, and it is expected that it will develop an active Campaign.

(2) The Kyukoku Seinen Renmei (League of Youths Save-the-Nation) (Kagawa Prefecture).

As the League itself it does not appear to recommend any candidates, but a large number of the following leaflets have been distributed within the prefecture, and, at the same time, extending over the early part of May from the end of April street speeches have been made in various parts. It is not obvious at present that the candidates of which party it will support.

"Down with the political bosses before complaining of the heavy tax !!

Keep the election in Kagawa Prefecture from being stained by the "narikin" (overnight millionaire) after the war !! "

(3) The Hankyo Minshu Domei (Anti-Communist Democratic League) (Kanagawa),

Chief Committee Yoshio OGAWA (Candidate of People's Democratic Party for local constituency) of the League seems to have been recommended by it. Making up his mind to stand as a candidate, OGAWA is going on with his electoral preparation.

(4) The Shin Nippon Jiyu To (New Japan Liberal Party) (Tokyo),

Takayuki MIYATO (candidate for national constituency) of the President of the Party who have been making a peculiar movement early seems to have decided to stand as a candidate with the Party as his territory.

(E) Those who are rumoured to stand as the candidates supported by other peculiar organizations.

(1) Ryuko KODAKA (Independent) who is expected to stand as a candidate for national constituency supported by all performance circles of Hokkaido is the boss of Aizu Ikka, stall-keepers. Among 160,000 or 170,000 stall-keepers throughout Japan, one-third of them, not to speak of those in Hokkaido, are expected to support him by voting for him.

(2) Supported by the Zenkoku Izoku Kai (Association of Nation Remaining Families of the War Dead), Hikiagesha Renmei (League of the Repatriates) and Mibojin Renmei (Widows' League), Gen-ichiro NAKAGAWA (Liberal Party) has expressed himself to stand as a candidate for national constituency.

(3) Supported by the Kyoto Seinen To (Youths' Party), Zen-ichi OHURA (for local constituency of Kyoto) Pressman of the Bunka Nichinichi Shimbun (Cultural Daily Newspaper) seems to have determined to stand as a candidate and is going on its preparation.

(4) Connected with the religious organization.

Religious organization has the nation-wide supporters in its nature, and as the mother body for recommendation it a powerful organization. Those who are expected to stand as candidates with this organic body for the background are as follows.

UPPER HOUSE CAMPAIGN GATHERS MOMENTUM

With 546 candidacies filed to date to contest the 132 seats available in the House of Councillors, top-ranking officials of both Government and Opposition parties have launched intensive campaign programs.

At an executive meeting in Tokyo today, the Liberal Party announced plans for a nation-wide speech campaign to begin tomorrow in conjunction with Prime Minister Yoshida's scheduled stamping tour of the Tohoku district. Construction Minister Masuda, Postal Services Minister Ozawa, and Labor Minister Suzuki have already departed on similar tours.

The newly-formed People's Democratic Party Supreme Committee Chairman, Gizo Tomabechi, has completed his campaigning in the Tohoku and Hokkaido districts after severely criticizing policies of the Yoshida Cabinet.

Election pledges and slogans of most parties are reported to be centered around an early peace treaty and local tax law revision.
