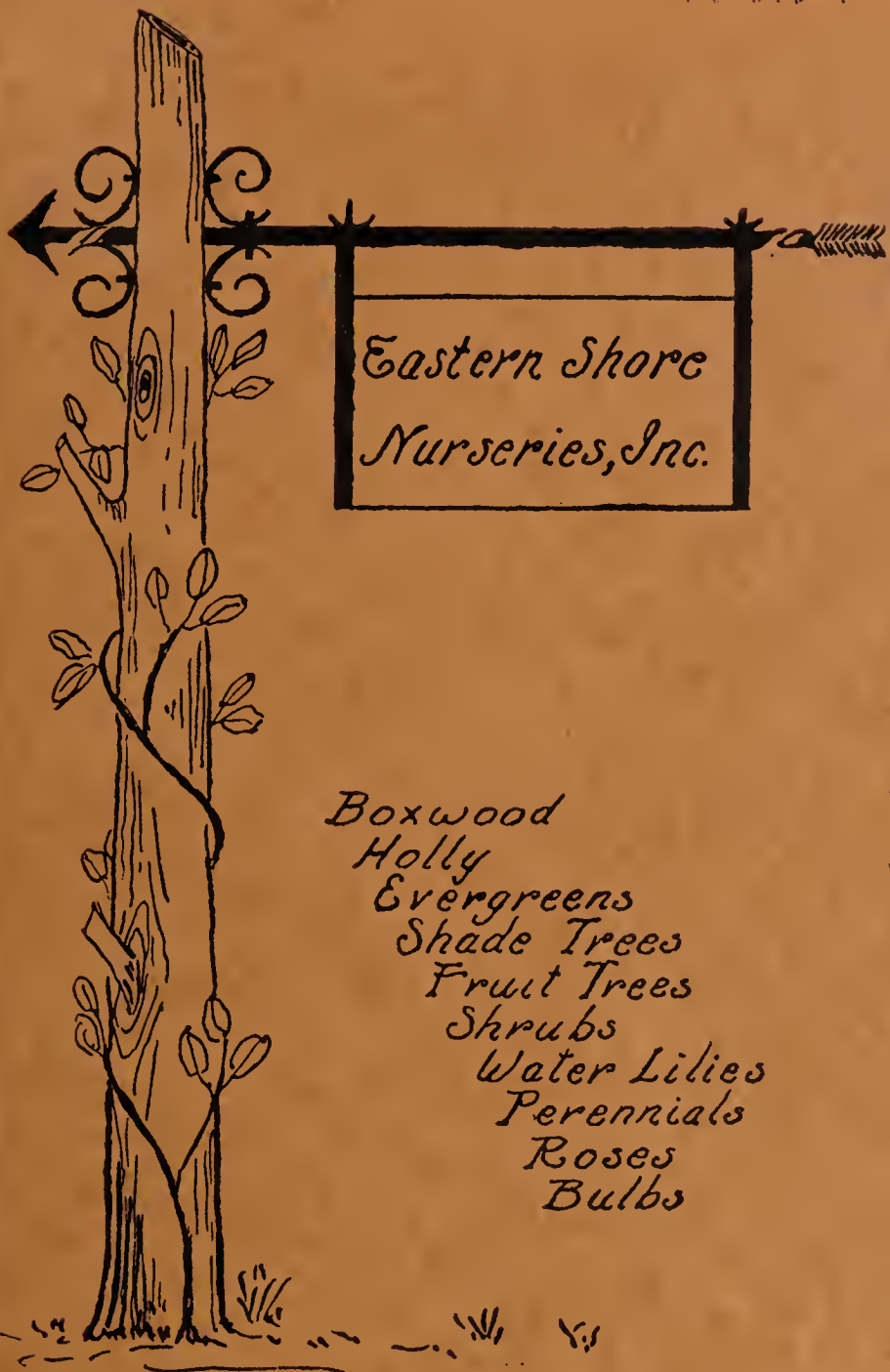

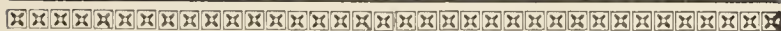
Note our quantity rates on roses, fruit trees, hedges and other items.

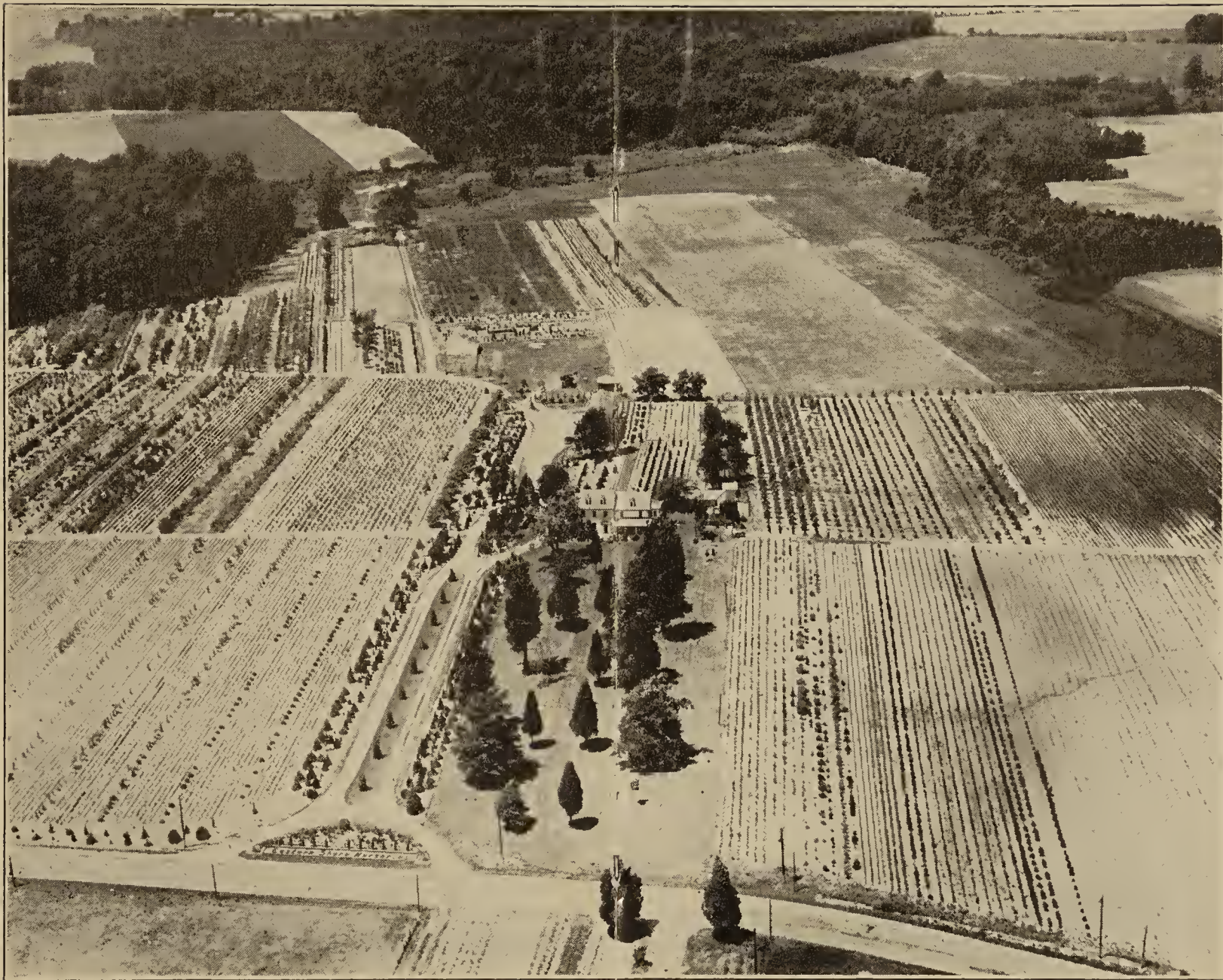
