



Wiki Loves Monuments 2023 in Serbia

Community-organized photography contest to document monuments, cultural heritage sites, and other subjects of interests in Serbia.

Some examples of activities:

- Local events connected to campaigns
- Edit-a-thons
- Workshops for new or experienced contributors
- Informal meetups for supporting general community engagement
- Formal meetings to support strategic or other long-term planning
- Collaborative work with an institution (such as a library, museum, or school)



Some examples of expenses:

- Temporary working space, services, prizes, outreach, and other common costs for meetups, edit-a-thons, contests, photowalks, and campaigns.
- Project-related travel for organizers and event participants
- Some equipment/technology needs with a plan for maintenance and sharing with your community
- Small-scale, one-time software development projects
- More complete criteria <u>available on Meta-wiki</u>.



Compensation for well-defined roles that do not replace volunteer activities in your Wikimedia community, such as:

- project management
- graphic design
- software development time (for small-scale projects)
- training
- childcare services
- translation / interpretation services
- speaker fees/honoraria
- Wikimedian-in-Residence roles



We're open to funding needs beyond these specific examples.


Importantly, expenses should be mission-aligned:

"...to collect and develop educational content under a free license or in the public domain, and to disseminate it effectively and globally."

What are our funding programs?









Wikimedia Community Fund

The Community Fund is a unified program with flexible support and funding for Wikimedians working on knowledge equity aligned with the Movement's Strategic direction.



Wikimedia Alliances Fund

The Alliances Fund, for mission-aligned organizations in underrepresented communities who want to collaborate and amplify our work.



Wikimedia Research Fund

The Research Fund provides support to individuals, groups, and organizations with research interests on or about Wikimedia projects.



Movement Strategy Implementation Grants

Movement Strategy Implementation Grants support projects that take the current state of a Movement Strategy Initiative and push it one step forward.

Rapid Fund

Short-term, low-cost projects by individuals, groups, or organizations contributing to Wikimedia projects.

This program is comparable to the previous Rapid Grants program.

45 days processing time; average funding amount: 500 - 5,000 USD

Conference & Event Fund

Funding and planning support to groups, individuals or organizations to organize local, regional, and thematic conferences that bring together Wikimedians for experience sharing, skill building, and networking. This program is comparable to the previous Conference & Events Grant program.

2 months processing time; average funding amount: 10,000 - 90,000 USD

General Support Fund

Flexible general operating support for individuals, groups, or affiliates that have developed larger projects or programs or a strategic plan that requires sustained investment over time to be able to achieve its goals. Multi-year grant funding is available if appropriate to the goals and objectives of the applicant. This program is comparable to the previous Simple Annual Plan Grant, Annual Plan Grant, and Project Grant programs.

2 months processing time; average funding amount: $10,000-300,000~\mathrm{USD}$

How does the process work?

Activity	Length of time
Submission Deadline	Every two months (on the 1st of that month)
Pre-screening eligibility check	7 days
 Eligibility and compliance check Feedback from Program Officer Applicants can respond to feedback 	28 days
Decisions announced	2-4 days
Grant processing, agreement, and payment	14 days
Reporting due	30 days after project end date



Five ways to get started

Some eligibility criteria

- All requests between 500 USD and up to 5,000 USD
- Proposals and reports can be submitted in any language.
- Grants can be up to 12 months in length
- Individuals can have up to one (1) open project funded through Rapid Funds
- Applicants need to demonstrate adequate and relevant experience on the target Wikimedia project(s) mentioned in their proposal.
- Full eligibility criteria on Meta-wiki



What / who isn't eligible?

- People
 - Staff and contractors at the Wikimedia Foundation.
 - Certain leaders in affiliates that receive General Support Funds (e.g. presidents, executive directors, bank account signatories, paid staff, etc.)
 - Some exceptions may be made for volunteer board members in certain circumstances related to their role in the organization.
 - Individuals can't receive funding on behalf of separate organizations.



What / who isn't eligible?

- Topics / Expenses
 - Travel scholarships for conference participation
 - Software development that depends on continuous funding
 - Research and open access fees for publication (see Research Fund)
 - Equipment purchases where there is no plan to make it available to a broader community

- You can find Wikimedia Foundation Grantee Portal (Fluxx) tutorials and other resources here. If you need any support or have any questions, please email your <u>Program Officer</u>.
- Please check the <u>Rapid Fund eligibility criteria</u> and <u>documents needed by grantee type</u> before filling out this application. Any ineligible requests can be declined during the eligibility check.
- This application can be filled in any language. All required questions are marked as 'required'. There is no character limit on the open questions.
- If you want, you can prepare the proposal offline by copying this form and later moving
 your responses to <u>Fluxx</u>. When you upload into the Fluxx Grantee Portal, make sure you
 constantly save your responses, as they do not save automatically.
- 5. Once submitted to Fluxx, your proposal will automatically be published on Meta-Wiki (Meta) within two days. You can find the <u>list of all applications here</u>. There is a community endorsement section on Meta, where community members can state why they support the proposal and why it should be funded. Community endorsement is not a prerequisite for funding.



Review the application

What do we ask about for a proposal?

- Applicant information
- Planned activities
 - Purpose → Why do you want to do this?
 - Programs or activities that will help achieve that purpose
 - The communities you want to support
 - Information about yourself and your team
- Learning and metrics
 - What you want to learn from your activities
 - Information or data you will collect to support your learning connected to the purpose of your proposal
- Budget

Fluxx is an external platform we use to process and approve proposals. Applicants submit proposals here first, then a duplicate is created on Meta-wiki.
