Remittances may be made by postoffice order, express order, draft or registered letter. All claims for mistakes or errors must be made within five

days after plants are received.

All orders must be accompanied by the cash or satisfactory references, unless from parties of known responsibility to me. You may be perfectly responsible, but I must know it before sending plants.

voice unless otherwise agreed before shipment of goods.
