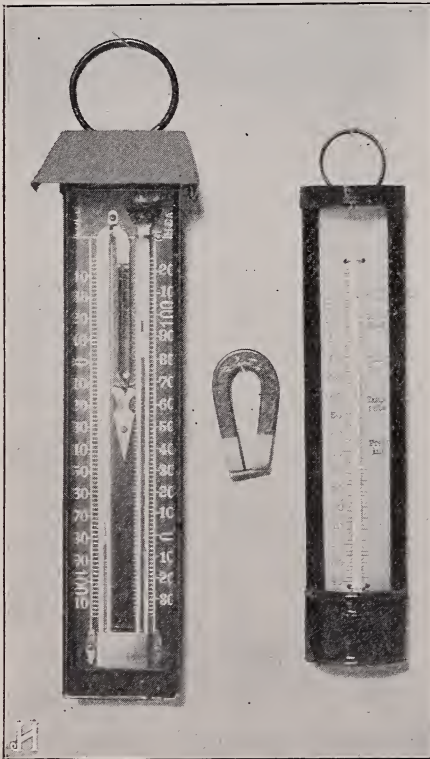

It is never necessary to use the words "send" or "express" in a telegram, as that is understood. The words "one," "two," "three," etc., can be used to represent hundreds, and "quarter" to mean twenty-five, or quarter of a hundred.

When possible, give leaving time AT CHICAGO of train on which flowers are wanted, giving the even hour *without* the fraction—for instance, if train leaves at 5:10 or 5:45, use simply "five."

In using our code, word your telegrams so they can be construed but one way. For instance, DO NOT write it this way: Eight hundred carnations, etc., as we would not know whether you wanted 800 carnations or only 100 sent on 8 o'clock train.

Our store is not open after 7 P. M. week days, or 12 M. Sundays and Holidays. July and August at 5:30 P. M.

Make allowance therefore for delay in transmission of telegrams, and whenever there is any doubt whatever as to telegram reaching us before our closing time, use the Code word "Corporal" in case it will do to send the flowers on the morning train.

The Long Distance Telephone Service have reduced their rates, and when possible we suggest telephoning your orders. We can tell you just what we have and what it will cost you, whereas, by telegram it requires quite a little time, and if it is necessary for us to answer you the double telegram at an expense of not less than 52 cents is equal to the cost of phone service from points in a radius of about 150 miles day rate and 250 miles night rate. (6 P. M.)

This is very important, and if observed will prove mutually beneficial.

Admission—This order is a substitute for my regular order.
Dancing—If cannot fill exactly as specified, you may substitute according to your best judgment.
Ancestor—This order is an addition to my regular order.
Durable—These flowers are for funeral purposes, and colored flowers must not be substituted for white.
Affection—Fill if possible, even at extra expense.
Fabricate—Flowers ordered are to be re-shipped to a distance, therefore buds must be cut specially close.
Fortunate—Select extra stock and charge accordingly.
Devotion—For cheap work, and can use second class flowers, if at reduced price.
Flattery—If price has advanced since last quotation, do not send goods, but telegraph.
Forgery—This order countermands all previous orders.
Formation—Add these items to the order which you already have, but in case first order is already shipped cancel this addition.
