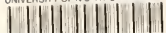

confused undergrad. His go-go, never-stop pace seemed impossible to realize as an actuality, but I can now testify that Donald Jicha possesses a divine power.

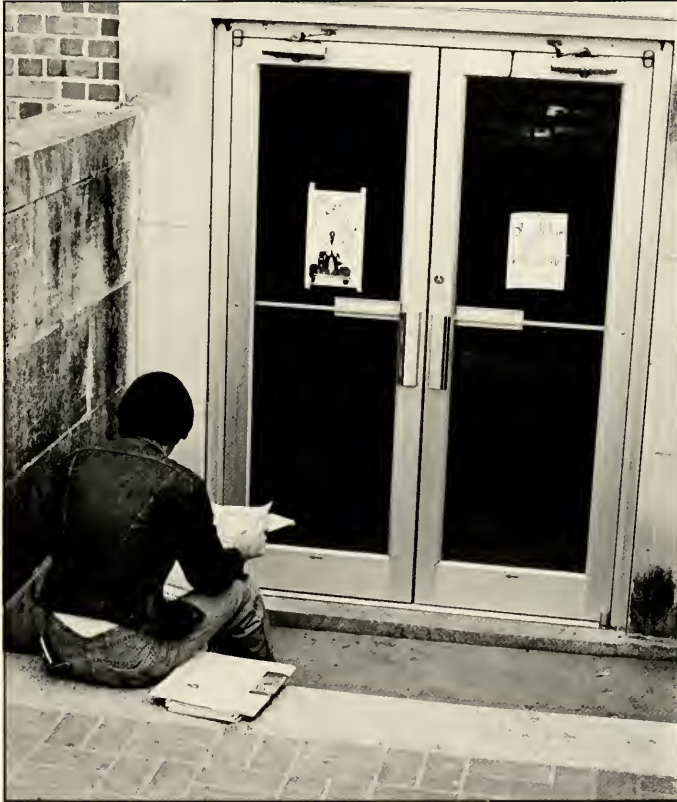
Anyway, back to the early morning. Time for a little breakfast to bring us away from those sleepless nights and Friday morning hangovers. What did you have for breakfast?

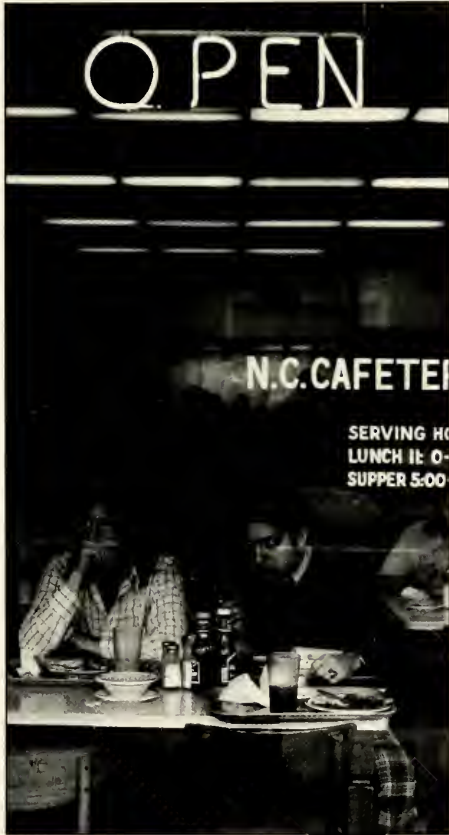
- going to the Alpha Kappa Alpha and Alpha Phi Alpha stomp show in the Great Hall

- ate rattlesnake for lunch - John Kuester opened the door for me at Pizzaville



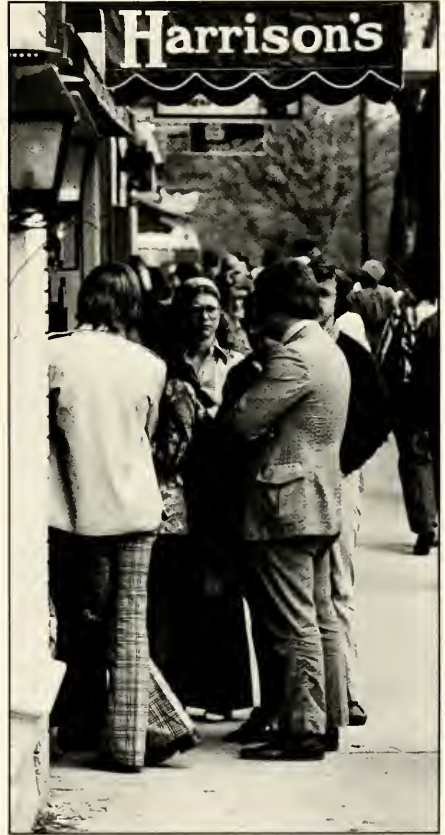

Franklin Street

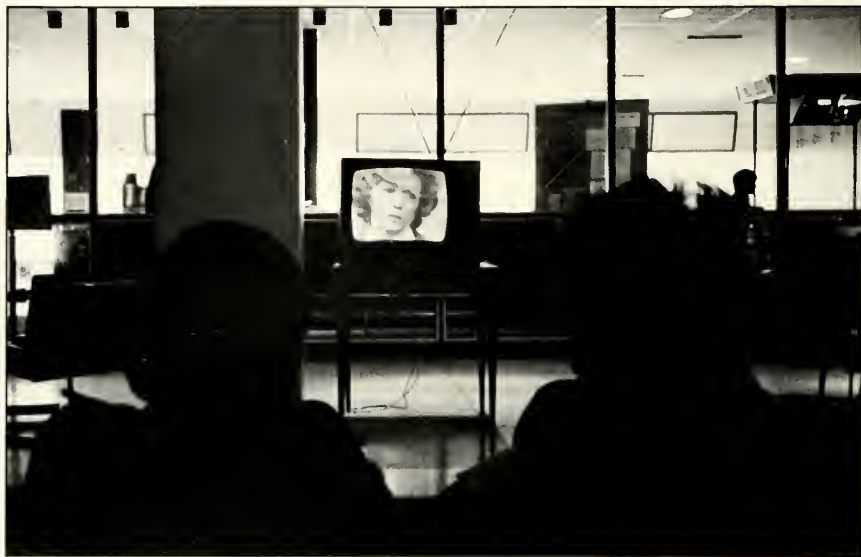

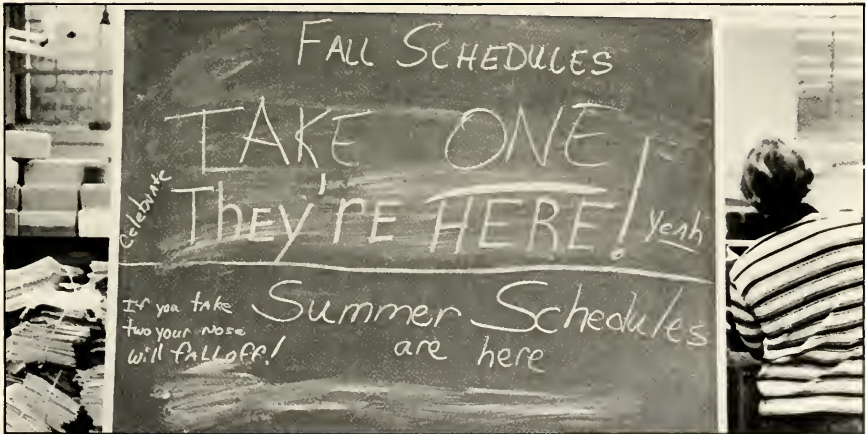

Late in the afternoon, down at the UNC Administration Building, the UNC Board of Governors adjourned, having approved the first long-range plan for academic programs and policies in the brief history of the consolidated University of North Carolina system. The five-year plan for 1976-1981 authorizes the planning of 64 new degree programs, including five at the Chapel Hill campus. It also sets re-enrollment limits for each campus and recommends a system-wide growth rate of approximately three per cent annually. UNC President William Friday lauded the plan's provisions for annual review, which insure that no school will be locked into its present

By now, Norman Cousins is well into his speech closing the Carolina Symposium. A case of laryngitis didn't keep him from speaking to a sparse crowd of about 350 people, mostly non-students. Speaking pessimistically, Cousins re-emphasized many of the fears expressed by earlier speakers in the symposium. "We live in a single governmental community and unless it is converted into a single world community, it will become a single battlefield," he said. He stressed a need for national involvement in international affairs and warned against the trappings of isolation. "We can expect only disaster," he said, "unless a broader base is established for world security; and this can come only if men work for mankind's benefit rather than purely in national interest."

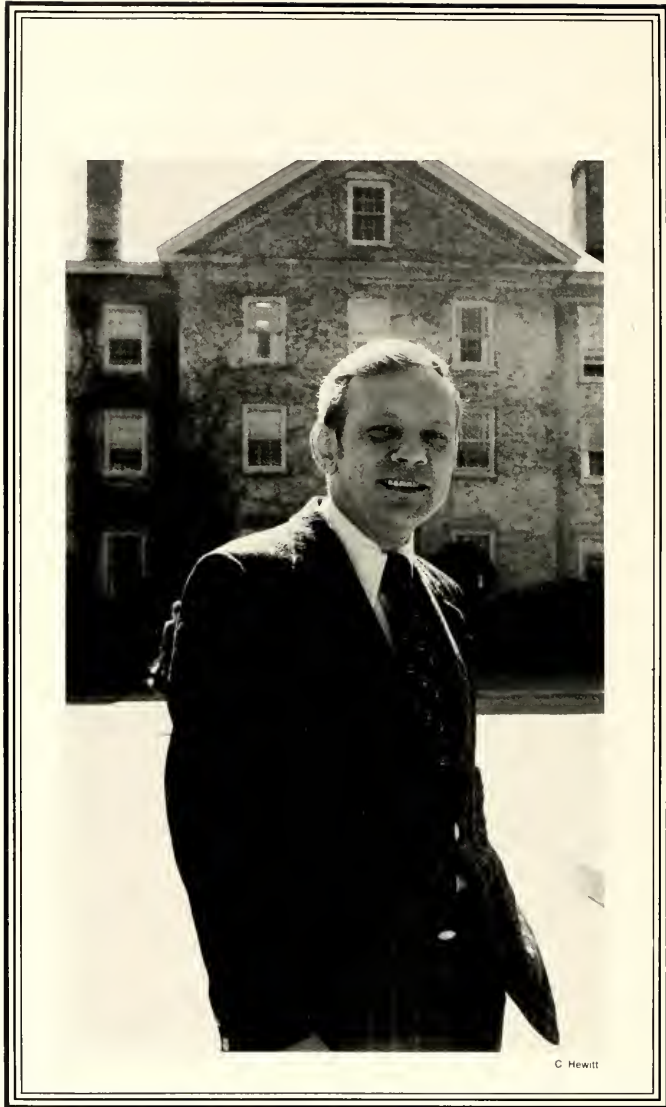

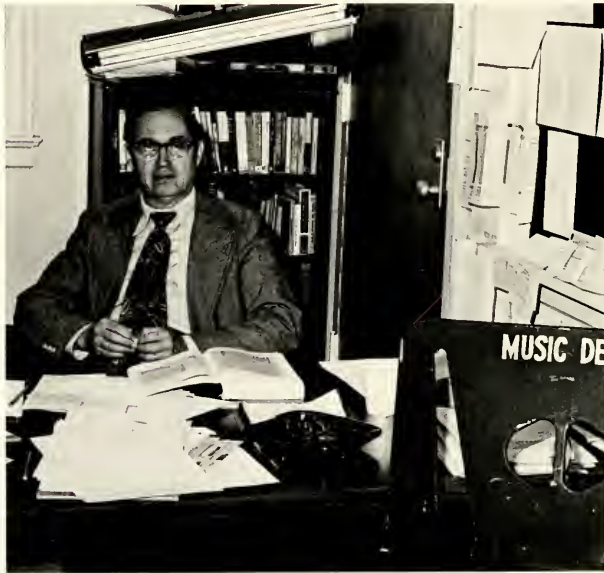

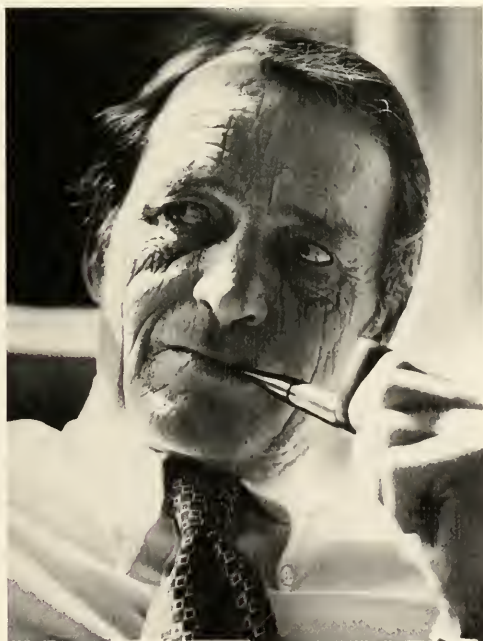

A friend of ours from Chapel Hill tells an interesting story of the over 200 years of American development — years ago, this continent was a huge chunk of cheddar cheese, fresh and unspoiled, soon, however, wind of this great cheese of opportunity drifted across the seas, and before long, adventuresome rats were on the eastern shore, sinking their teeth into the great cheese and nibbling away to their hearts content. After becoming firmly entrenched on the eastern shore, they soon found that they had nibbled their way across the Great Continent. This process went on for many years until one rat sank its teeth into what he

presumed was another piece of fresh cheese, but what was in reality a bit of ratty waste. You can imagine his confusion — the cheese of opportunity had been gobbled up and in its place remained the waste of what once had been such a savory cheese.

What had gone wrong?

None of the rats had thought to look into the future beyond the next tasty morsel, or past their immediate gratification. The rats had despoiled their cheese so that their future could only be lived amid the fallen pieces. With the short-sightedness of the rats in mind, we look at the prospects for American society.

In the next 25 years, all of us will be required to deal with more change than we have ever had to handle. These changes will require a new future-consciousness in politics, new methods of planning and new ways of re-democratizing America.

We are approaching a political future shock. To prepare for it we must develop a system of anticipatory democracy. This development will be achieved only after a lifetime of radical revolutionary upheaval, not only concerning changes in our economic and social structure, but also in our deepest assumptions about democracy itself. We must practice this anticipatory democracy, which involves developing a new guidance system for society in which we anticipate the future before it happens.

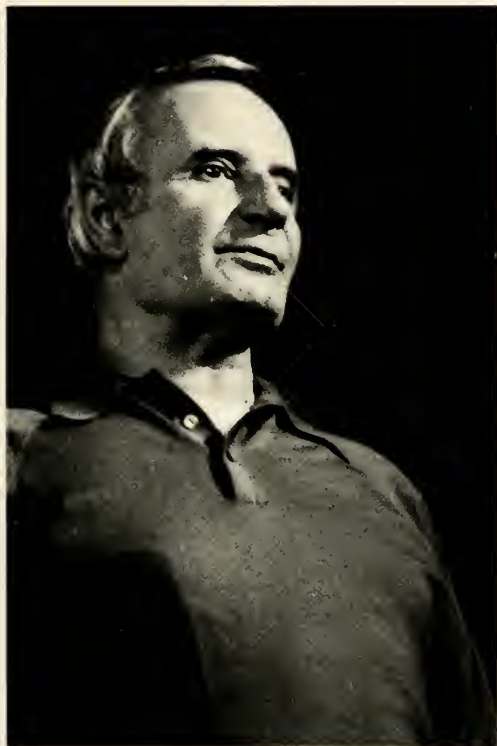

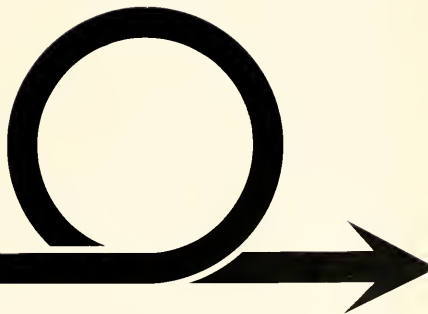

There are at least three factors that contribute to the present situation of closing some present residents out of housing. The policy of requiring freshmen to live on campus is one of the primary reasons. The second primary reason is so a student may live in a room where there is a reasonable amount of room for persons and support items. The third factor, six of these seem to be more residents interested in returning to the residence halls.

It is incumbent upon the Housing Department to make every effort to assist in the smooth operation of the University. This cannot be achieved when procedures that only students in mass classes for several days are in effect. We should not put students in a position where they must choose whether to attend class or to stand in line. We should be supportive of the educational program, not interfere with it.

The Housing department met with PHA officers and staff to discuss alternative methods of room sign-up. After discussion, the PHA body strongly urged the Housing Department to return to the waiting in line method. We accepted that recommendation.

At the day of standing in line, we learned that students who waited nine days in a 24-hour wait, were that long there. We determined what one would be able to do in a 24-hour wait. If that is another problem, we will deal with the exact situation.

third problem was that some students bulldozed their way into the front or middle of the line. The fourth problem was that some students called

personally saying they had to be this place or that for urgent personal business. Errors were made.

Then and there the staff of the department set out to work on a sign-up procedure for 1976-77 that would hopefully eliminate some of the problems. I personally met with 22 different persons or groups to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the random selection method and the stand-in line method.

We were not aware that Title IX would have an impact on our sign-up procedures. The room sign-up plan needed to be combined with the Title IX decision. We had excellent cooperation from the Title IX Committee. While the Title IX Committee was working, the Housing Department was examining and studying input relative to the actual sign-up method.

Even after meetings with various groups and individuals the decision to utilize the random method needed the approval and support of the dean of students. Even though it is not perfect, it is superior to any other plan we have been able to learn about. The residence director and the central office staff and I will gladly talk with any student who would like to discuss improvement in the sign-up procedure.

Football

Following the Carolina football tradition, Coach Bill Dooley's pre-season predictions cast images of a victorious season and glory for the good ol' blue and white. The clichés came forth by the dozens, and those of us gullible enough hoped for a championship once again. But it was not to be.

Loss piled upon loss, and fan sentiment dropped proportionately. But Dooley was not to be put down — the spirit that never sags, the heart that won't give up, the will that can't quit even against the worst of odds.

We started off okay. A Southern Conference team as small as William and Mary didn't seem to have much to offer in the way of competition. And they didn't. James "Boom Boom" Betterson jumped off with a 95-yard touchdown on the opening kick-off and led the way to a 33-7 win.

Our play was sloppy; their play was just worse. After the game and 95 yards of penalties against the Tar Heels, Dooley instituted what forever more will be remembered as the *Dooleyism*.

"We did all right, except we managed to kill ourselves with all those penalties. Offensively, it looked like Flag Day," Dooley said.

Two weeks later, Maryland unfeelingly wiped the smugness off of our faces, 34-7. Quarterback Billy Paschall completed only ten of 24 attempts and was intercepted twice.

Dooley responded with, *"I've been in football long enough to accept a defeat."*

Off to Columbus and #1 Ohio State the next weekend. Few of us dared to make the trip into Buckeye Country, from simple intimidation if nothing else. Those of us who did, though, couldn't have been more surprised to reach the third quarter only trailing 12-7.

Unfortunately, Archie (Heisman) Griffin and Company decided to wait out fate's little game and smothered us in the end, 32-7.

The appropriate *Dooleyism*: *"Wasn't that the first time anyone crossed the goal line on them this year?"*

Wahoo-wa. U. Va. promised to give us a good game, and they didn't lie. A seesaw battle ensued, but a game-saving goal line tackle by defensive back Ronnie Johnson caused a U. Va. fumble and allowed the Heels to come out on top, 31-28.

"I couldn't be prouder of a team than I am right now," Dooley said.



So, once again all bright-eyed, the Heels came back to Chapel Hill to face the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame. (This is one we'd rather not talk about.) To make a long story short, we lost a 14-point fourth quarter lead and left the field having lost 21-14 to the disbelief of everyone.

"It was about as hard a loss as you can take. We had it won and just let it get away."

Next came the State game. (And, boy, this is really the one we don't want to discuss . . . So we won't.) Fortunately, a *Dooleyism* summed up the 21-20 loss perfectly.

"I know I'm going to sound like a poor loser, but I have to comment on our two-point conversion. Our pass receiver was grabbed by the defender and pulled to the ground. That's a tough way to lose."

Never in the history of UNC football had East Carolina beaten the Tar Heels, but rules (and precedents), as they say, are made to be broken. The Tar Heels lost 38-17, although ACC Player of the Year Mike Voight gained a whopping 209 yards in the game.

"I accept full responsibility for our performance. Our team didn't play well and that's no one's fault but mine. I expected us to be a little flat, but I still thought we would win. That was the worst performance by a Carolina football team since I've been here," Dooley declared.

And then came Homecoming. All the alumni. All the majesty. All the old hurrahs and celebration. And Wake Forest. And Delmar.

Well, Delmar won the Homecoming Queen contest, but the Tar Heels were not so fortunate. Wake Forest, 1-10 just one year before, scored their first touchdown on Carolina in five years . . . and their second . . . and their third. Final score: Wake 21, Carolina 9.

Choruses of "Goodbye, Dooley" were sung by the crowd.

"You have less confidence when you lose and right now I'd say our team is definitely losing confidence."

Clemson came to Chapel Hill and flaunted a huge flag of that stupid tiger paw in Kenan Stadium. What nerve, we said. We'll make catnip outta them!

Voight gained 228 yards and the Tar Heels scored 35 points, but Clemson scored 38 points.

The profound *Dooleyism*: *"It was another tough loss."*

Okay, so the die-hards headed down to New Orleans (that's in Louisiana, son) and a match with not-so-highly touted Tulane.

Again, the Tar Heels had a 14-3 lead in the fourth quarter (remember Notre Dame, anyone?), but the Green Wave managed to fight back and take the lead, 15-14.



Well, goddammit, we did it for a change. Seven seconds left on the clock and Tom Biddle had his chance to be the hero, and damned if he didn't do it. His field goal as time ran out put Carolina ahead, 17-15, and a potentially long ride home was made a lot shorter, or at least easier to take.

Reflecting on the win, Dooley said, "We were due for one of those to come our way. . . I consider Tulane one of the best defensive teams in college football."

Tulane?

And then the ol' yearly finale. Last game of the season and our neighbors from Dook. A win over the Blue Devils would have made the whole season a lot easier to swallow, but it seemed that it just wasn't in the stars for us to get that win. Or for them to either.

A last minute fumble killed our chance for the win and it ended up being one of those that nobody likes: Duke 17, UNC 17. We kept the victory bell, but we lost our string of 204 tieless games (two shy of the NCAA record).

Afterwards, Dooley said simply, "It's an empty feeling for me."

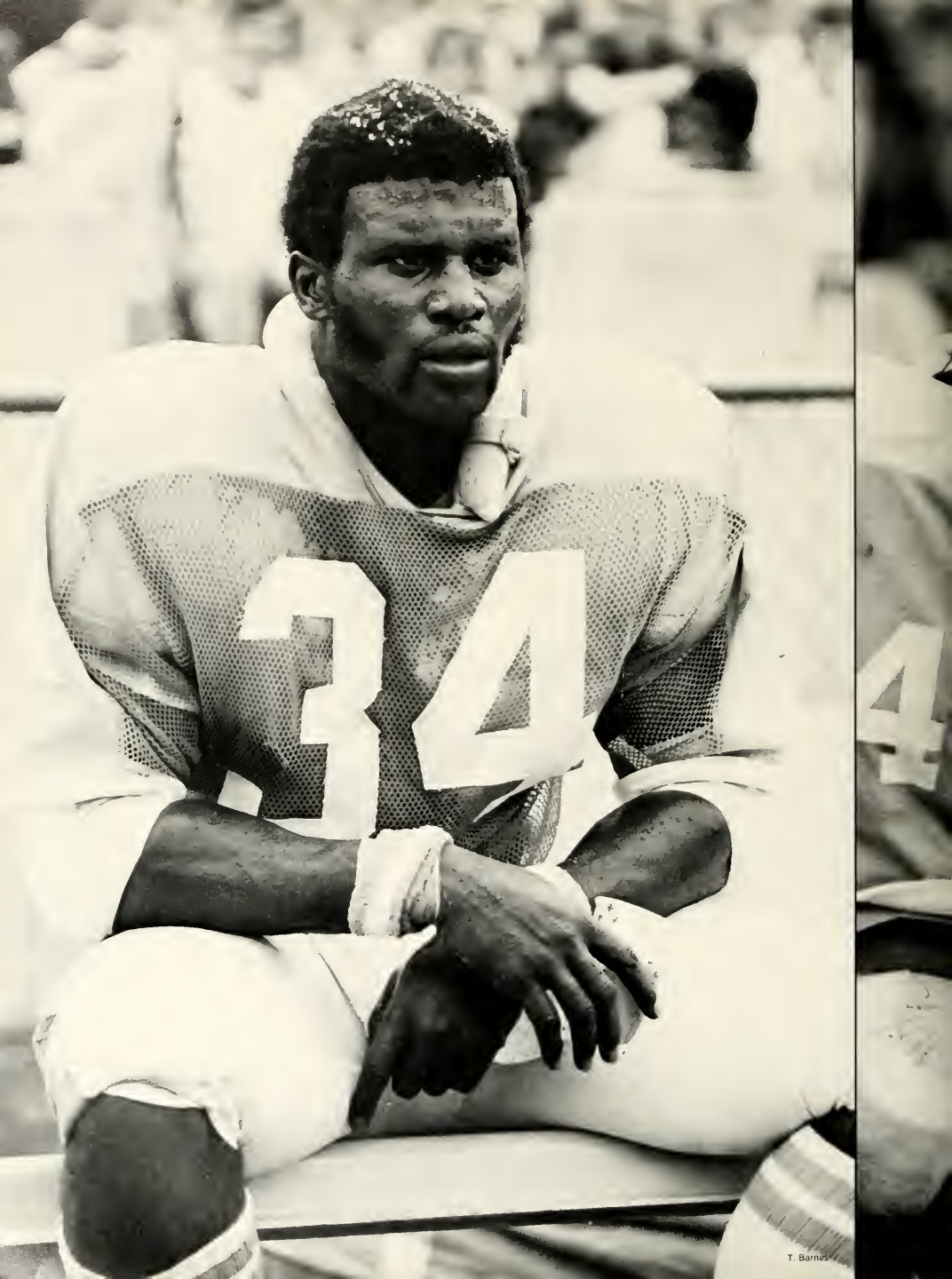
Thus ended the saga of Carolina football '75. Three wins, seven losses, one tie and a lot of excuses.

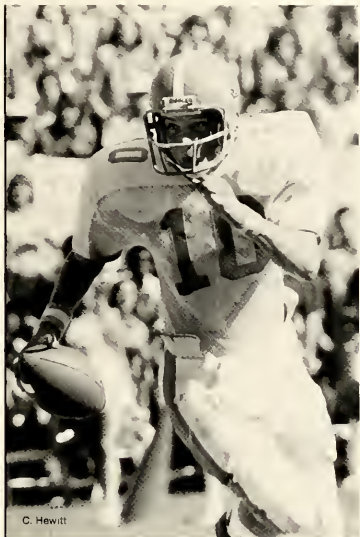

Nothing compares.

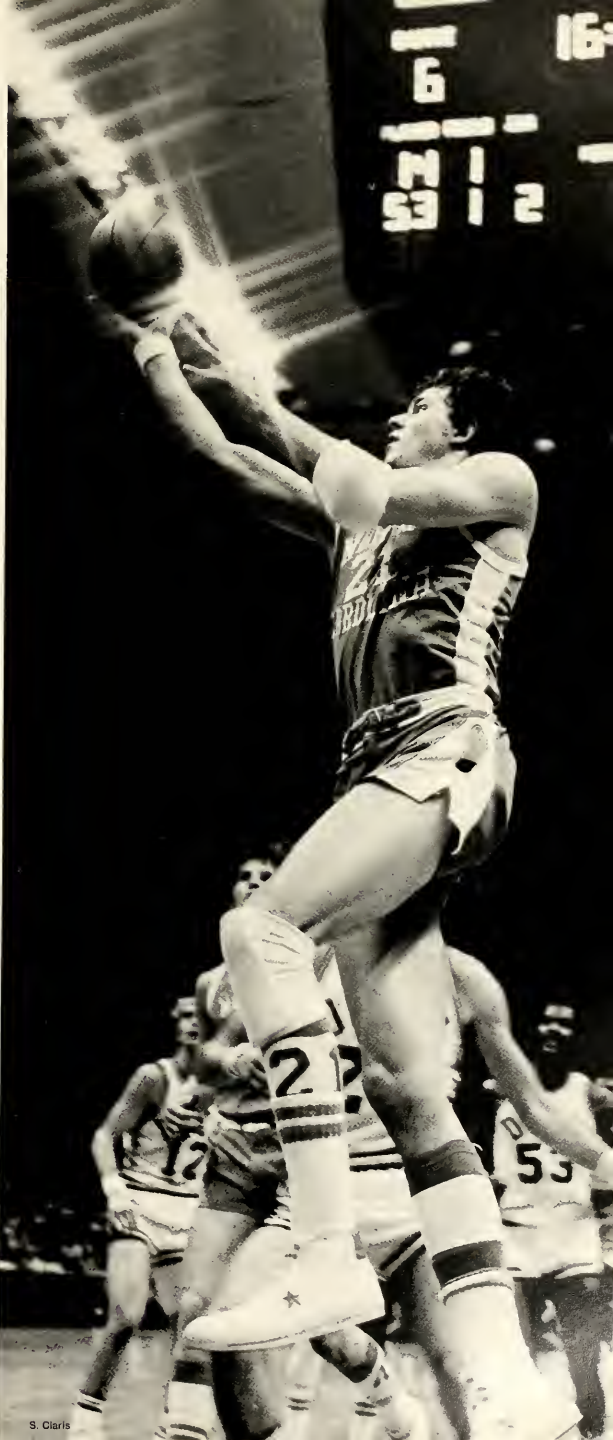
I had heard people scream in my time; but I had never heard people scream in Chapel Hill, and believe me, that's a different variety altogether.

The 1975-76 season was no exception.

As usual, in December we warmed up on some of those "poor unfortunates" like the Soviet Union, Howard University and East Tennessee State ("Who the hell are they?"); but Christmas time came along and the Big Four Tournament presented the Tar Heels with a not-too-well accepted slap in the face — Wake Forest, that is.

Well, like I said, the slap wasn't too well accepted, and by and by, Wake's Demon Deacons came to Chapel Hill. Now, let me explain — there are wins and there are WINS, and after this WIN, the Heels were riding high atop a cloud in the A.C.C.

Four days later, it rained. Before a "national" television audience (and its right arm — the all-important and all-interrupting "national" advertiser — TV timeout, anyone?), with time expired and with the score tied, State's Al Green sunk a game-winning foul shot . . . along with all of our hopes, leaving 8,800 fans with dropped jaws, unbelieving stares and dampened spirits.

But someone, somewhere must have thought our due was due. One week later, before an official national TV audience, the Heels dramatically came from behind to upend the second-ranked Terps of Maryland. The satisfaction of watching an utterly frustrated Lefty Dreisell shake his fist helplessly at the antagonistic bleacher crowd after the game went unmatched in the students' continual conflict with the outspoken Maryland mentor.

Scores remained close, but it always turned out that when time finally ran out, UNC was on top. Two one-basket victories, two single-overtime scares and one four-overtime cardiac arrest against Tulane were part of a twelve-game winning streak. Confidence returned as we watched the rest



of the I'm-better-than-you-are A.C.C. schools knock each other out of contention for the regular season title.

After the Duke game, Carolina stood at 27-2 (9-1 in the A.C.C.) and reigned as regular-season champs. It seemed we were ready to take on the world.

Next stop: Largo, Maryland.

Ah, yes, the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament, and this year it was moved up to Maryland for a change of scenery. (What excuse can Lefty make now?)

A first round bye and a second round win over Clemson put us easily into the final . . . And gawd, look who we had to play.

U.Va., it seemed, had waited until the real season came along to show what they were really made of. Without pretense and without delay, the Cavaliers handed Carolina a painful second-place finish in the tournament, sending us to the NCAA Mid-West Regional against Alabama.

Well, some things are better left unsaid, and such is the case with the Tarheel-Tide game. Suffice it to say that we didn't win a national championship.

Yet, the season is not to be ignored. Carolina finished with a regular season A.C.C. championship, and Dean Smith compiled his best record as UNC's head coach, as well as A.C.C. Coach of the Year honors.

Mitch Kupchak and Phil Ford were both named first-team All-A.C.C. and second-team AP All-America. Kupchak was named Player of the Year in the A.C.C., and *The Sporting News* named Ford to its first-team All-America.

And best yet, we know there'll be more next year.

JOHN GRIMES BRANCH . . .



For years, "Doonesbury" has been unofficially recognized as the most widely read and appreciated feature of the *Daily Tar Heel*. In 1975 and 1976, however, the readership dominance of the Garry Trudeau comic strip was severely challenged by the editorial cartoons of UNC Senior John Grimes Branch.

John's cartoons, which touched upon a vast spectrum of topics covering campus, state and national issues, were the highlights of many editions of the *DTH*.

A Chapel Hill native, John drew a few stylistically simple cartoons for the *DTH* during his sophomore year. But it was not until his senior year that he began to work for the paper on a regular basis.

"John is the most talented person I had occasion to work with on the *Daily Tar Heel*," 1975-76 *DTH* editor Cole C. Campbell says. "And I think he has the most potential and the brightest future."

"I think John is an excellent cartoonist and a better artist than some more well-known or widely syndicated professionals such as Oliphant," Campbell adds.

Ask John to describe himself and he will tell you about "a frustrated art major who realized he would soon be graduating and so had better start looking for a profession."

"I enjoy cartooning more and am better at it than I am at more serious art forms," Branch says. "I've always doodled and I guess I've always wanted to be a cartoonist. It's plain, simple fun." Whenever the *DTH* was publishing, Branch could be found at least three nights a week on the lower level of the Undergraduate Library. There he would spend an average of two or three hours working on a cartoon for the next morning's paper.

In the future, Branch hopes he will be working for a major metropolitan newspaper, where the cartooning emphasis is usually on national politics. The 1976 presidential primaries gave John some experience at taking potshots at politicians.

As primary time drew near and John readied his pen and inks, incumbent Jerry Ford and former California governor Ronald Reagan were the only Republicans to announce their candidacy. Into the Democratic ring, however, hats were being tossed almost daily, from every direction and in all shapes and sizes.

By February 24, ten men and one woman had announced their intentions to carry the Democratic banner in November: Senator Birch Bayh of Indiana; Senator Lloyd M. Bentsen, of Texas; Georgia Governor James Earl Carter Jr.; Senator Fred Harris of Oklahoma; former presidential candidate Henry "Scoop" Jackson; Long Island housewife Ellen McCormack; Duke President Terry Sanford; Governor Milton Shapp of Pennsylvania; former vice presidential candidate Robert Sargent Shriver; Congressman Mo Udall of Arizona and veteran campaigner George C. Wallace. Yet, the public's favorite, Senator Hubert Humphrey, had not announced his candidacy.

Few Americans were surprised when a narrow victory by Ford in New Hampshire, the first primary, was followed by big wins by the President in Massachusetts, Florida and Illinois.

Carter, who led the Democratic field in delegate-gathering in the caucus states of Iowa and Oklahoma, nevertheless stunned many when he was endorsed by popular vote in three of the first four primaries.

Ford's hopes of quickly knocking Reagan out of the Republican contest faded, however, when a victory in North Carolina put Reagan back in the running. The Reagan challenge grew even stronger when the underdog put together a string of victories in Texas, Indiana, Georgia and Alabama.

Suddenly, Ford found himself fighting to stay in the race as Reagan threatened to take Michigan, the President's home state.

Carter, meanwhile, had been slowed by a loss to Jackson in New York and a close win over Udall in Wisconsin.

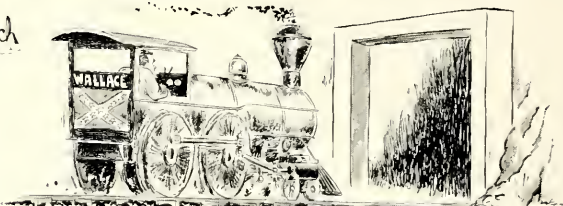
But the Carter juggernaut began to roll again when the peanut farmer from Georgia captured Pennsylvania, his first victory against major opposition in a heavily populated and industrial Northern state. Then came major wins in Texas, Indiana and his home state.

While the Democratic race was becoming a runaway, the Republican contest was in a state of confusion. With his back against the wall, Ford rallied and on the same day won Michigan and Maryland by substantial margins.

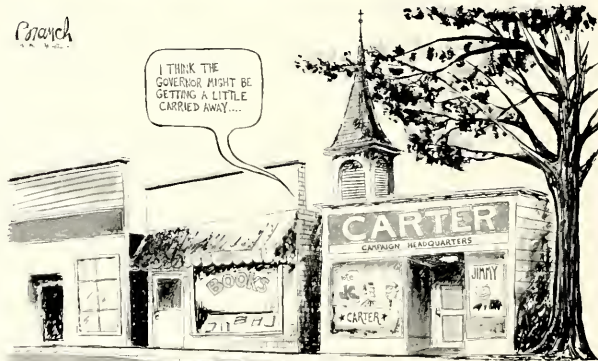

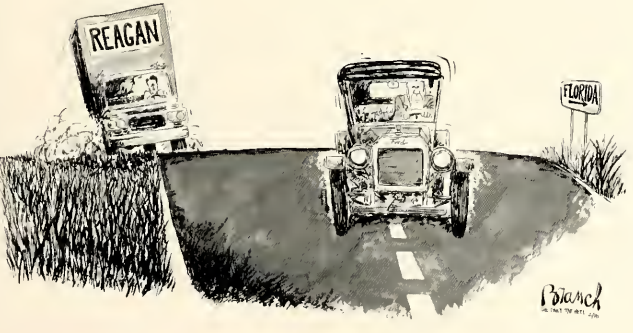

Reagan then won primaries in Arkansas, Idaho, Nevada, Montana and South Dakota; while Ford was the victor in Oregon, Tennessee, Kentucky and Rhode Island. Pressured to carry his home state as convincingly as Ford had taken Michigan, Reagan won big in California. Ford, however, countered by capturing a vast majority of the delegates in New Jersey and Ohio as the four month primary struggle drew to a finish — ending in a dead heat.

Before the conclusion of the Democratic race, however, anti-Carter forces were revived once more. Carter suffered an embarrassing defeat in Maryland at the hands of late starter Jerry Brown, governor of California. He also lost to Idaho Senator Frank Church in Nebraska and barely beat Udall in Michigan and Connecticut.

Party leaders, not yet fond of Carter, dreamed of a split convention. There, their fantasies went, they would look to the sidelines where Humphrey, previously indecisive and afraid to risk another defeat, would be waiting anxiously for their call.

In the home stretch, Carter lost to Brown five more times and to Church three times. But by campaigning everywhere, Carter added to his already overwhelming delegate total even when he lost. Although together they had found a weakness in Carter's broadbased support, the anti-Carter liberals soon realized they had no single candidate strong enough to offer in his place.

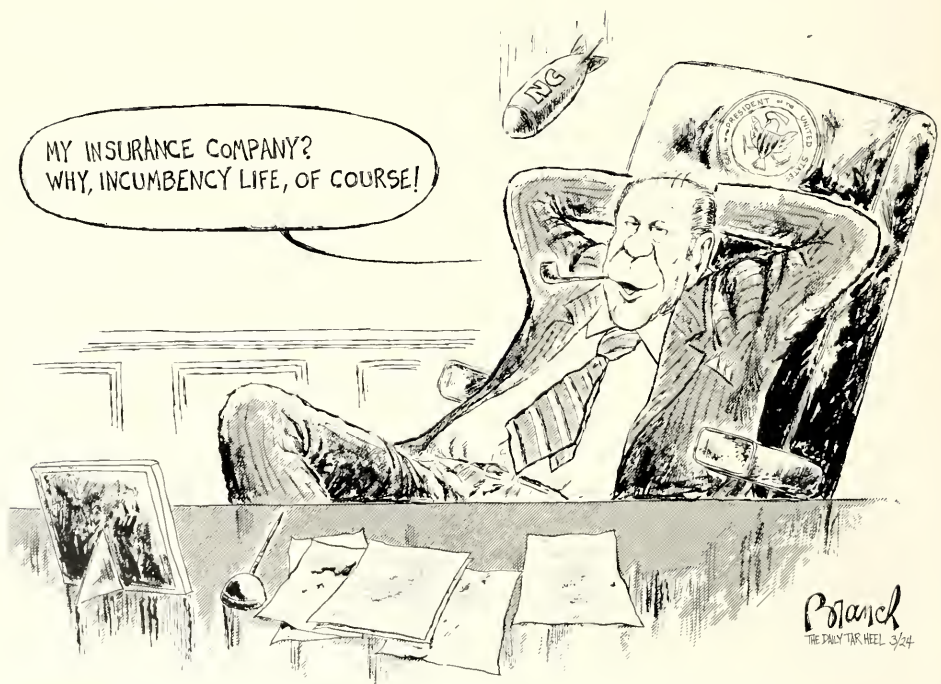
When the primaries began, most observers predicted that Ford would coast easily to the nomination at a boring Republican convention in Kansas City, while any number of Democrats were expected to battle it out for the right to oppose him at their convention in New York.

But after 30 primaries, Ford was no closer than Reagan to the nomination, and both were forced to take part in an undignified scramble for votes among the few hundred still-uncommitted delegates.

And the Democrats, brought peacefully, if joylessly, together by a man who had purposely bypassed the old party structure, had only Carter's selection of a running mate on tap to provide excitement at their now-perfunctory gathering.

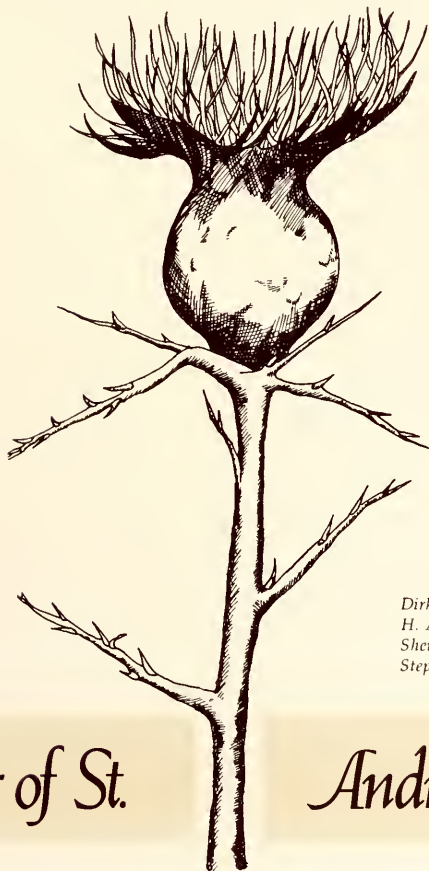
Society of Janus was founded in 1956 for the purpose of honoring individuals who have worked to improve residence hall conditions and life; its membership is selected from the entire University community.

Willie P. Mangum Medal

The Willie Person Mangum Medal in Oratory, the oldest and one of the most prestigious awards given at the University, was first awarded in 1878 by the daughters of Willie P. Mangum, Class of 1815. Mangum, a U.S. senator from North Carolina for over 30 years, served as President of the Senate during the Tyler administration.

The medal is given annually by the Mangum family to the member of the graduating class giving the best oration, in the opinion of a selected group of judges, on a serious topic. Past winners include: Gov. Charles B. Aycock; Albert Coates, founder of the N.C. Institute of Government; U.S. Congressman L.H. Fountain and Dr. Frank Porter Graham.

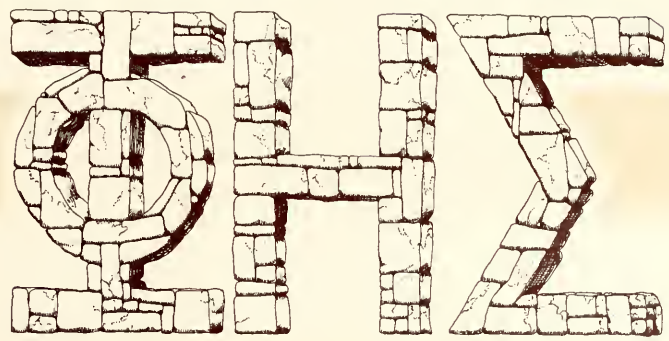

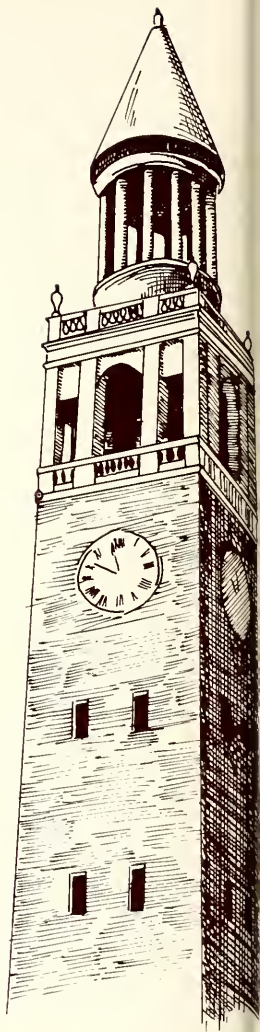

James M. Johnston Undergraduate Scholars

In 1975-1976 the James M. Johnston Awards were made for the sixth year to academically outstanding students who entered the University. Johnston Scholarships are the most prestigious which are awarded by the University among all of its scholarship programs. Competition for them is keen. This program is made possible through the generosity of The James M. Johnston Trust for Charitable and Educational Purposes, which is administered by its Trustees. The late James M. Johnston was a native of Orange County and attended the University, to which he had a loyalty throughout his life. He was an outstanding and very active member of the banking and business community of Washington, D.C.

The James M. Johnston Trustees have stipulated that academically superior young men and women be extended scholarship awards to recognize their scholarly merit and to assist them financially in achieving their educational goals. In addition to the approximately 230 Johnston Undergraduate Scholars on the Chapel Hill campus, there are about 80 Johnston Scholars at North Carolina State University and UNC-Greensboro studying in the special curricula offered there. The Johnston Awards Program is administered through the Student Aid Office at Chapel Hill under the direction of the Johnston Trustees and the University Committee on Scholarships, Awards and Student Aid. Johnston Undergraduate Awards are made to the most academically talented students who qualify for University scholarships.

Through the years, special friends of the University have established several scholarship funds to recognize the scholarly merit and to meet the financial needs of outstanding undergraduate students. The University Committee on Scholarships, Awards and Student Aid has designated several of the most valuable of these awards as being limited to those students whose academic achievements exhibit very high standards of excellence. Generally, Distinguished Scholarships are awarded to entering freshmen and continued throughout the undergraduate years. Stipends vary according to the resources of the particular scholarship, the intentions of the donor and the needs of the recipient. The Distinguished Scholarships are among the most valuable awards offered by the University. In every instance they are awarded on the basis of the outstanding scholarly achievements of the students who receive them.
