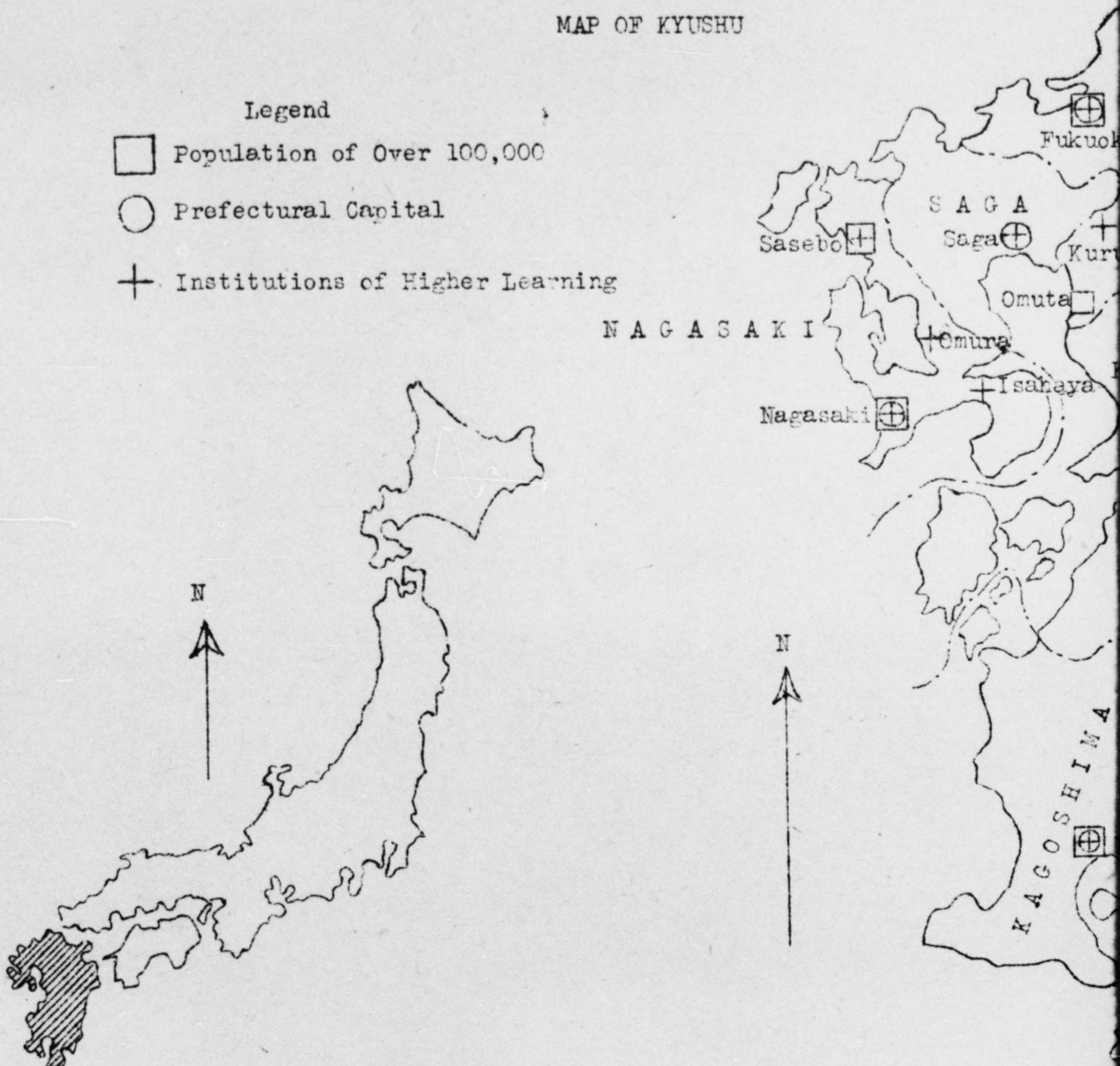

MAP OF KYUSHU

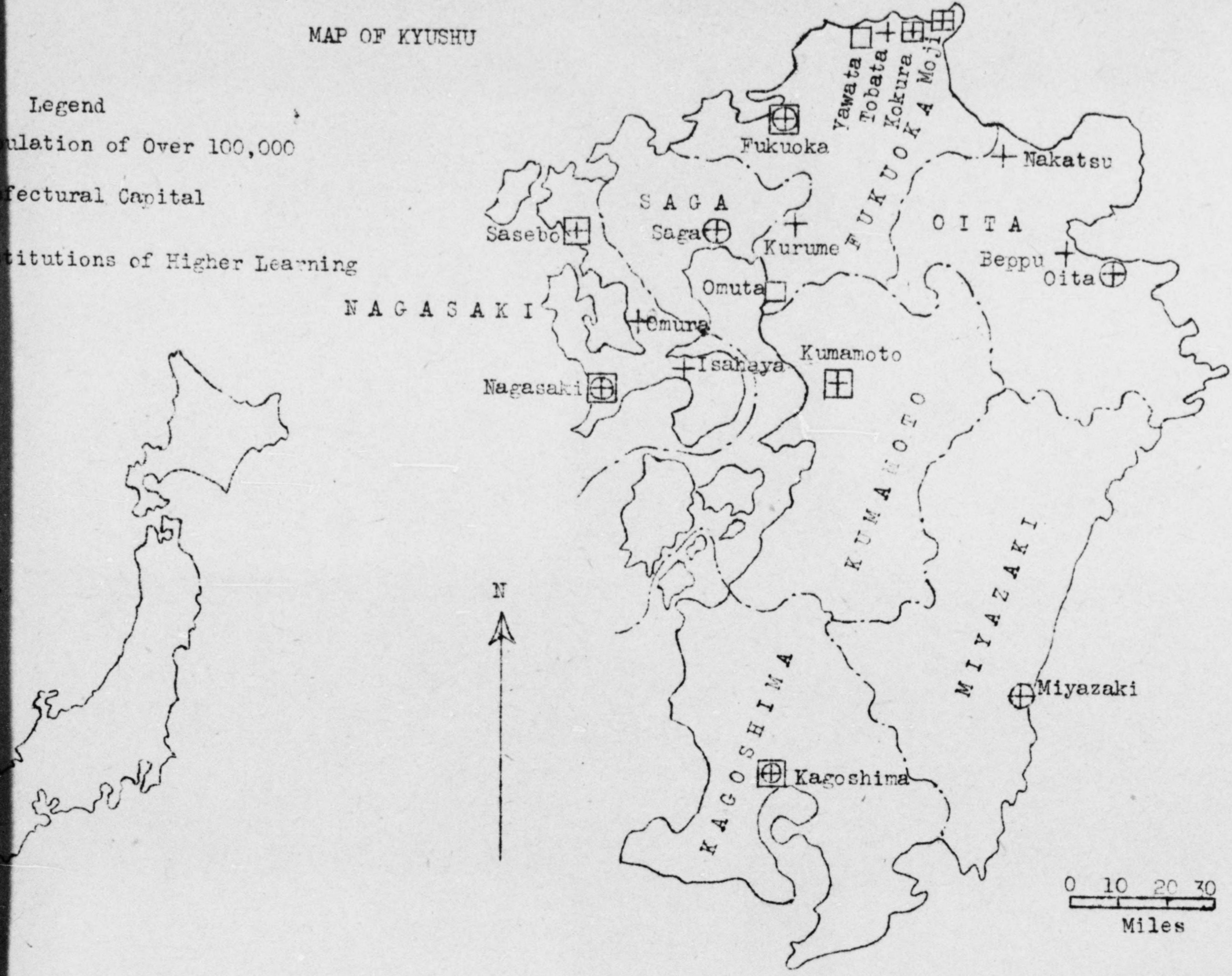

INTRODUCTION

PURPOSE

This study was made to fill a critical need in the field of Japanese education. The statistical procedures and products of record-keeping in Japan have been entirely inadequate. The Ministry of Education maintains no records of schools not under its direct control, with the result that for information concerning nearly all schools of the elementary and secondary levels, and many institutions of the higher educational level, one must depend upon the prefecture. Even at that source there are no complete records. In almost any area of education, one must collect data from the original sources. One serious gap in the records has been the lack of a list of all educational institutions in Japan. It is this major void which this study is intended to fill.

SCOPE

The results of this study were originally set up as two projects, a "Roster of Japanese Educational Institutions" in 46 prefectural reports, and "Statistical Tables for Japanese Educational Institutions" in 46 prefectural reports, with a summarizing report for the whole of Japan. A little trial use of the first finished reports indicated, however, that the two series would be more effective if combined. For that reason, the two reports for each prefecture have been consolidated into one report.

There are two summaries in six tables. Summary data arranged as follows: level by control. Part I summarizes data by control jurisdiction.

There are two summary statistical sections. Part One presents in six tables summary numerical and percent distribution data arranged as follows: level by types, control by level, and level by control. Part Two consists of six tables which summarize data by control jurisdiction according to level and type.

The "Roster of Japanese Educational Institutions" constitutes Part Three of this report. It is primarily a list of all institutions which are a part of the regular Japanese educational system, with significant data for each. The project is, in reality, an act of pioneering. In the course of its development, scattered and, in large degree, hitherto unclassified facts have been assembled and made available in an easily referable form. For the first time in the history of Japanese education, there is a composite list of all of the more than 40,000 educational institutions in Japan, a list which records for each its name, date of foundation, address,¹ enrollment by sex and by totals,² and the teaching force by sex, by full-time

The roster is arranged according to prefecture, control jurisdiction, and school level. There are totals for every sub-heading, and subheading and grand totals for every main heading and for every prefecture. Grand totals have been worked out on two bases of organization, that of control jurisdiction and that of school level.

The two dates chosen as focal points in the collection of data, 30 April 1946 and 30 November 1946, were selected at the request of Education Division, Civil Information and Education Section, for purposes of comparison regarding developments in the educational program.

Since this series of reports is based upon data collected before changes in the organization of the educational system were effected, the categories used are those into which schools fell before the 6-3-3-4 system was inaugurated in Japan,⁴ and the terms employed are translations of the Japanese nomenclature. The terminology used to indicate the broad levels of education are those currently used in the United States: elementary, including kindergarten, primary, and grammar grades; secondary, including high schools and preparatory schools; and higher, including schools of junior college, college, and university level.

Within each of these broad levels, however, terminology is not so simple or so clear. The various types of schools in Japan are numerous, over-lapping, and confusing to the uninitiated.

There are three control jurisdictions in the educational system: (1) national, which is the Ministry of Education control, (2) "prefectural control," or that exercised by the central national level, such as (ken), metropolis (to), city (shi), (mura); and (3) "private control." The Ministry of Education has control in educational matters at all levels and jurisdictions except those under the use of standardized texts and curricula of many sorts for every purpose, it has control over even those schools supported by private contributions. An unusual fact concerning education is that control does not include appointing power for prefectural schools and the maintenance of schools is approved by the government, and for all practical effect exercised over school matters is in the hands of the private.

There are three control jurisdictions in the Japanese edu-
cational system: (1) national, which includes both "Government"
or Ministry of Education control, and that of other ministries
which conduct specialized educational institutions; (2) "public
control," or that exercised by any level of government below
the central national level, such as that by the prefecture
(ken), metropolis (to), city (shi), town (machi), or village
(ura); and (3) "private control." Schools of the three educa-
tional levels fall within these three control jurisdictions.

The Ministry of Education has exercised extensive powers
in educational matters at all levels and over schools under all
jurisdictions except those under other ministries. Through the
use of standardized texts and curricula, and through directives
of many sorts for every purpose, it has exerted tremendous con-
trol over even those schools supposedly under other jurisdic-
tions. An unusual fact concerning this aspect of Japanese edu-
cation is that control does not include financial support or
appointing power for prefectural and local schools. Money for
the maintenance of schools is appropriated by the national Gov-
ernment, and for all practical effects much of the control ex-
ercised over school matters is in the hands of the Ministries

of Finance and of Home Affairs, who obtain their power through control of the national budget and of Civil Service appointment respectively. Within the limitations imposed by the powers of these two ministries, the Ministry of Education has enjoyed a high degree of centralized control. Its direct control, however, is applied only to a limited group of institutions.

In 1946 the Ministry of Education exercised complete or "direct" control over only certain schools, mainly on the higher education level. These included the seven Teikoku daigaku (Imperial universities), which enjoyed generally accepted prestige as superior institutions for advanced learning, and the daigaku (ordinary universities), which were not granted such high favors either in personnel or equipment, and consequently were not accorded comparable esteem. These two types of universities were analogous roughly to both senior colleges and universities in the United States. Other types of schools under the complete control of the Mombusho were semon gakko (colleges), which usually did not grant degrees, and, in many ways, corresponded to junior colleges, and koto gakko (higher schools), which were even more unclassifiable, being a kind of cross between preparatory schools and junior colleges. Also under Ministry of Education jurisdiction were koto shihan gakko (higher normal schools), or a level similar to that of semon gakko, but with more specialized purposes, being established expressly for the purpose of training teachers, and shihan gakko (normal schools), at first considered of secondary level, but in 1935 placed on the higher education level. The course of study for shihan gakko was three years in length, whereas that for the higher normal schools was four years. Some special schools, such as mo gakko (schools for the blind), roa gakko (schools for the deaf and deaf mutes), and roa gakko (schools for the blind and mute), were under Ministry of Education jurisdiction.

Public control covered all institutions conducted and regulated by governmental units lower than the national level,

Included the seven Teikoku daigaku (Imperial universities) which enjoyed generally accepted prestige for advanced learning, and the daigaku (universities) which were not granted such high favor and consequently were not accepted. These two types of universities were senior colleges and universities in the types of schools under the complete control of the Ministry of Education. They are seinen gakko (colleges), which were established in 1935, and, in many ways, corresponded to gakuin (higher schools), which were being a kind of cross between preparatory colleges. Also under Ministry of Education jurisdiction were koto shihan gakko (higher normal schools) similar to that of seinen gakko, but with being established expressly for the secondary level, and shihan gakko (normal schools), which were established at the secondary level, but in 1935 placed on the higher level. The course of study for shihan gakko was of shorter length, whereas that for the higher level was longer. Some special schools, such as roa gakko (schools for the blind), roa gakko (schools for the blind and deaf), and shihan gakko (schools for the blind and deaf) were under Ministry of Education jurisdiction.

All institutions conducted and reported to the Ministry of Education are those at levels lower than the national level,

i.e.; prefectural, municipal, town, or village governments. In Japan in 1946, public control covered a much wider range of school levels than did the Ministry of Education control. On the higher education level were universities, colleges, higher schools, normal schools, and a few special schools, all of the types under the "direct control" of the Ministry of Education, with the exception of Imperial universities. In addition, publicly controlled institutions included also schools of the secondary and elementary levels. Jitsugyo gakko (vocational schools) were numerous and varied. Chuo gakko (middle schools) were schools of high school level established for boys. Koto jo gakko (girls' high schools) were established for girls as substitutes for middle schools. Seinen gakko (youth schools) were institutions established to take care of the further education of students who had finished elementary training but who were unable to attend regular schools of the secondary level. Often they were night schools. Sho gakko (elementary schools, after 1941 called kokumin gakko, or national schools) and yochien (kindergartens) require no special explanation.

Private control meant substantially what the term means in the States, control exercised by an individual or group of individuals independently of government on any level, with support coming from nongovernmental sources. One chief difference, however, between both public and private schools in Japan and public and private schools in the States, was that in Japan the central Governmental agency for education (the Ministry of Education) exerted much more power over the management of schools than does the Federal Government in the United States, a power which was described as "indirect control." The scope of jurisdiction for privately controlled institutions was identical with that of public jurisdiction, including institutions on all levels and of all types except Teikoku daigaku (Imperial Universities). The chart on pages iv to vi indicates by level the type of schools under each of the three control jurisdictions in 1946.
