On Need For Staple Government— The North-East Volcano.

Mr. P. J. Moloney, T.D., South Tipperary, interviewed with reference to the peace pact, said no side should claim this as a victory for itself, and the people should recognise that fact. Both sides displayed great generosity and the highest patriotism, realising as they did the imperative necessities of the situation from the point of view of security and staple government and putting an end to the desperate situation in North-East Ulster.

"I wish to state," he said, "as one who opposed the Treaty that the Pro-Treaty Party met us in a truly liberal spirit. One of the immediate effects of agreement will be that a sense of security will be restored to all sections of the people—the raider, the robber, and the malefactor will not longer have a free hand to carry out their deeds of lawlessness. The people should forget all past bitterness. Wrangling, and bickering should cease, and all should get to work to build up the nation in the confident belief that the security we promised them will operate."
