PECCRA is a soldier in GENE CATENA'S Regime and has to obey orders. In reference to unions, LARDIERE mentioned that JAMES PAONE and SAMUEL PEZZA do all of PECCRA'S work for him. LARDIERE said Local 863's ticket always carries PECCRA into his position in election time and thinks that if PECCRA had to run on his own, he would be defeated.

On 12/3/64, LARDIERE said he had contacted TONY PRO (ANTHONY PROVENZANO) about IBT Local 660 wanting to force the company building the freezer company at Pert Newark to give the rights for organizing this warehouse to Local 660. At this meeting TONY PRO asked LARDIERE to meet with GENE CATENA.

Informant advised that CATENA teld JOSEPH PECORA that LARDIERE had again embarrassed CATENA. CATENA explained he had teld LARDIERE to contact TONY PRO about the trouble with Local 660 and if PRO could not help him, then LARDIERE was to see THOMAS EBOLI (TOMMY RYAN). LARDIERE failed to fellow these instructions.

On 12/21/64, CATENA instructed LARDIERE to see SAMMY COHEN of Meat Cutters Local 464, East Orange, N. J., and tell him LARDIERE has heard rumers that he is talking too much and that he is accepting money from GENE CATENA's competitors. Informant advised that on 12/24/64, LARDIERE teld CATENA that he had met with COHEN and warned him as CATENA instructed.

On 1/6/65, GENE CATENA met with FRANK PALMIERI during which time a discussion was held concerning the International Garment Workers Union (IGU). PALMIERI said he had been meeting with (FNU) DE FILLIPO (Phonetic) of this union in an effort to make him live up to his former promise of giving Monarch Fashions "proferential treatment". CATENA became angered at PALMIERI for not bringing this problem up to LARDIERE as LARDIERE knows how to deal with DE FILLIPO and keep him in line.
