4. Objections to Colonization as prop-
- ounded & answered by Dr Hewitt at New Haven, at the meeting of the State Coloniz. Socy May 1834. (over)

(1) Its origin was with slaveholders - not so but with himself, Mills &c

(2) It is a violation of the natural rights of the Africans, which are born in this country to remove them to a land wh^{ch} is not theirs - not so because they go with th^{er} own consent.

(3) It is cruel & barbarous to exile them from th^{er} native land - not so, bec. it is for their interests to go

(4) There is a better way (viz immediate Emancipation) of promoting the good of African & Col.ⁿ stands in its way - not so, for th^e Col. Socy is but a handful of men, & every Colonizationist is an abolitionist, & (3) (Dr Fiske) slaveholders who were so from principle, in 1816-17 &c opposed it.

Arguments in favor of Colonization
urged at the same meeting by Hewitt & others.

(1) The old Colonization Society of N.H.
 Moses was the President. (Hewitt)

(2) This scheme a great help to the
 Missionary Enterprise (Webster) ^{the pilgrims by} leaving England
 & colonizing
 this country confer a great blessing on America, & we were now
 spreading the light of liberty over Eng^d; so it will be in this case (Dacon)

(3) The only scheme that can put a stop
 to the slave trade. (Webster)

(4) The morals of the Colonists are better
 than ^{they} could be expected consid^{ing} the previous condit^{ion}.

(5) The Anti-Slavery Excite^d the result
 of the inf^{er} of Coloniz^{er} principles = sparks thrown
 off by the centrifugal force of the great wheel.

(6) The Col. Soc. in attacking the abolitionists
 acts on the defensive (Fiske)

(7) Abolitionists were the Ultra men -
 on the same question.

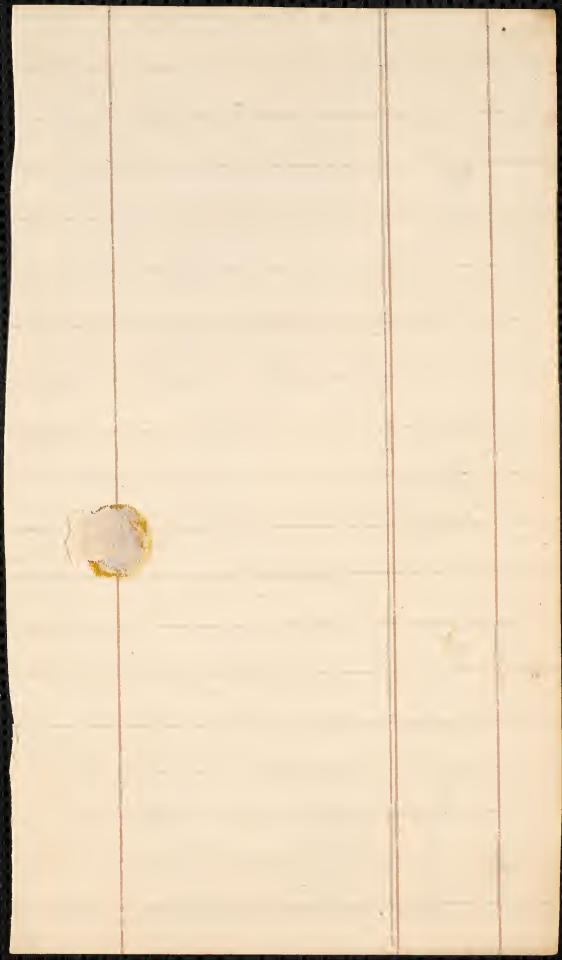

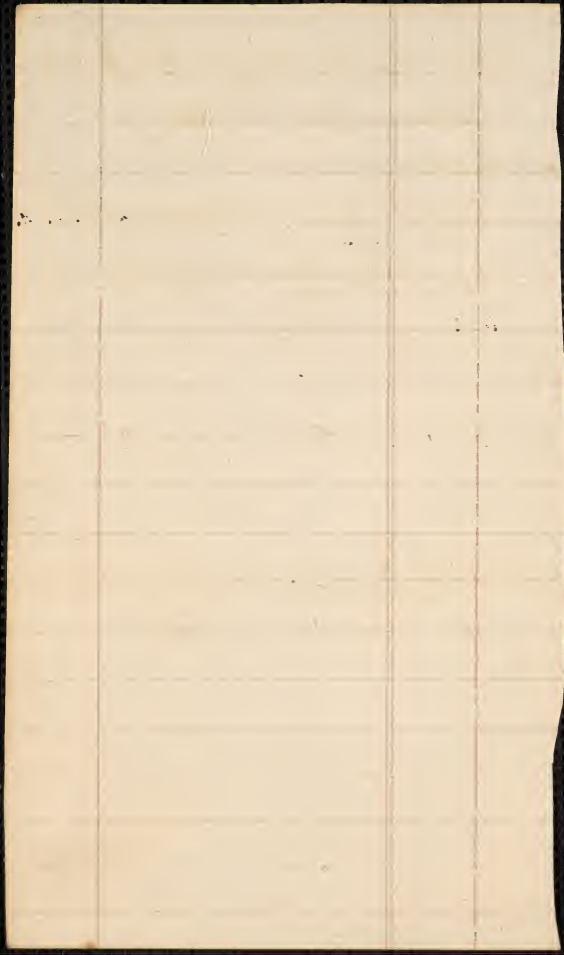
