OFFICIAL

1. CONFERENCE ROOM:

Arrangements have been made with personnel of the Tokyo Army Education Center (AEP School) for a conference room to be used by personnel of this headquarters. Requests to utilize the aforementioned room should be made to the Deputy Chief, this headquarters, at least 24 hours in advance.

2. PROMOTIONS OF CIVILIAN PERSONNEL:

Following extract from CP Memorandum Number 27-50, Civilian Personnel Section, General Headquarters, Far East Command, cs, is reproduced for your information and compliance:

"2. Section 1302 of the Supplemental Appropriation Act, 1951, signed 27 September 1950, requires certain changes in personnel practices in the Federal Civil Service, with those provisions of the Act relating to inter-agency transfers, reinstatements, and promotions being effective retroactive to 2 September 1950.

"a. Inter-Agency Transfers. All transfers made by Federal Agencies must be made on a temporary basis. Accordingly, transfers of status employees will be made as emergency indefinite appointments. The employee will be continued under the retirement system but will have a temporary appointment in the new agency.

"b. Reinstatements. Beginning 2 September 1950, reinstatements of persons having civil service status must be made on a temporary basis by means of an emergency indefinite appointment.

"c. Promotions. All promotions beginning 2 September 1950 must be made on a temporary basis, the word "temporary" to be inserted after the word "promotion" on the Standard Form 50 reporting the action.

"3. Inasmuch as all positions in overseas areas are excepted from Civil Service appointment requirements the provisions of this Act do not pertain, with exception of the promotion limitation, so long as employees continue to occupy excepted position. However, all employees, including those who possess personal civil service status, upon return to the United States, who desire to continue Federal service, will fall within the purview of cited Act.

"4. All promotions effected by this Headquarters effective after 1 September 1950 must be considered temporary even though those effected prior to date of this memorandum are not so documented on the notification of personnel action.

"5. It is requested that the contents of this memorandum be brought to the attention of all employees."

3. FLAT CAR:

A flat car has been assigned this headquarters for use in conjunction with the "SPARROW". All requests for the "SPARROW" should indicate whether or not the flat car is desired.

4. MESS DEDUCTION CARDS:

a. Following extract from CP Memorandum Number 29-50, Civilian Personnel Section, General Headquarters, Far East Command, cs, is reproduced for information and compliance.

"3. Under authority contained in references, a, b and c, subsistence deductions from the pay of civilian employees will be discontinued at close of business 30 November 1950. Effective 1 December 50, civilian employees authorized to subsist in government messes may be furnished meals on a cash basis by purchase, at assigned billet, of Type II meal coupon books (30 coupons) at the regular rate of \$12.00 (40 cents per meal). The Type II coupon book is valid until all coupons are used. Refunds will not be made for unused coupons; however, they may be disposed of by sale or gift to other authorized persons when necessity arises. No refunds or credit will be extended for lost books.

"4. Mess deduction cards in the possession of employees will become void on 1 December 50 and may be destroyed."

b. Mess deduction cards not previously destroyed will be turned in to the Civilian Personnel Clerk, this headquarters.

2. Following letter, Civil Affairs Section, GHQ, SCAP, 524.23 (20 Nov 1950) CAS-A, subject; "Shipment of Baggage" dated 20 November 1950 is reproduced for your information and compliance.

"1. All civilians employees returning to the ZI on termination or leave should be instructed to ship their hold luggage and/or household goods to Tokyo Central RTO. (Household effects will be accepted for shipment only upon termination.) Upon arrival of the individual in Tokyo and at the time of termination or leave processing, a check should be made with Civilian Personnel Section, FEC, as to proper disposition of baggage. Household goods and hold baggage will be properly crated and inspected before shipment to Tokyo. It will be necessary only to attach copies of travel orders received in Tokyo for further shipment to the ZI.

2. It is requested that under no circumstances baggage be shipped to Yokohama."

2. MESS DEDUCTION

The following extract from Daily Bulletin No. 169, GHQ, SCAP and FEC, cs, is reproduced for information and compliance:

"CINCPAC message ZX 29762, 22 November 1949, which authorized civilian employees not occupying dependent-type quarters to elect 12 or 21 meals per week and be subject to payroll deductions to that extent has been amended to allow civilians to eat all of their meals in approved commercial eating establishments. Civilians who relinquish their rights as organized mess members will no longer be subject to payroll deductions for subsistence. Civilian employees electing zero subsistence will not be permitted to eat in government messes other than as a bona fide guest of a mess member."

DAC's who desire zero subsistence will contact Miss Klockslem, Personnel Division, CAS, GHQ, SCAP, at least three weeks prior to date discontinuance is desired.


3. SELF-IMPOSED CENSORSHIP

The following paragraph is extracted from Daily Bulletin No. 171, GHQ, SCAP and FEC, ex, for information and compliance:

"Self-imposed censorship is urgently required of all members of the occupation in the present situation. The discussion of military matters in public, over the telephone, or even in small private conversations is potentially dangerous. The repetition of usually baseless rumors may be equally harmful. Even experts sometimes disagree whether certain information might be of value to the enemy. Protect our troops and help to insure victory by censoring yourself. Don't say it! Don't repeat it! Stop rumors!"



It will be necessary for personnel arriving at hotels to have in their possession a copy of the letter of authorization."
