GINCFE concurs in DEPTAR position regarding TOP SECRET material in paragraph 1a URAD and the effective date on which such classified material shall be made available. However, until more effective measures for protection of classified material are established by the Japanese Government it is felt that release of SECRET or TOP SECRET material should be on a case-by-case basis controlled by G2, FEC, with report of each release made to G2, DEPTAR. Reasons for including TOP SECRET material and early release obvious when samples listed below are considered:

Specific examples TOP SECRET and SECRET material to be released:

- a. Plans involving defense of Japan requiring cooperation of NPRJ and other Japanese Government agencies.
- b. Details regarding planned expansion of NPRJ.
- c. Necessary coordination with police for pickup of subversives and espionage agents.
- d. Details of Coastal Security Force.
- e. Exposure of plan for phased withdrawal of US from Japan to encourage Japanese defense preparations.
- f. Discussion of administrative agreement now in progress.

Japanese Government is currently planning introduction of legislation in next session of Diet that should provide more adequate protection for US classified material released to Japanese Government agencies. Present system prohibits release of material considered sensitive by any employee during or subsequent to his employment and provides penalty not to exceed one year in prison and 30,000 yen fine. NPRJ has a regulation comparable to AR 380-5, but lacks means to effectively punish violations. All agencies provide adequate physical security.

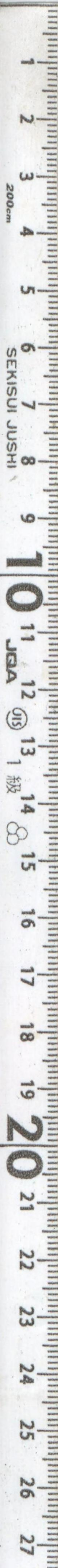

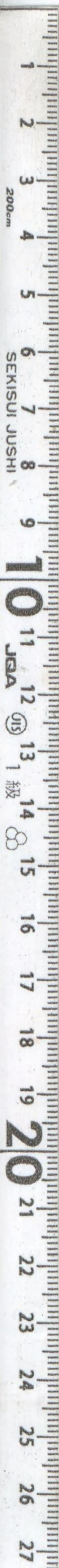

SUBJECT: Disclosure of Classified Information to Japanese Government Agencies

1. BASIC: C/N from G-2 to G-3 and DS, 15 Dec 1951.
2. REFERENCE: DA msg 89351, 112250Z Dec 51.
3. In the ref, DA (G-2) states that a proposed policy regarding the disclosure of classified information to the Japanese Govt is under study by the State-Def Mil Info Control Committee. This proposed policy plans to release the following types of info to the Japanese Govt:
 - a. Secret info essential to, direct concern to and involving the Japanese Govt.
 - b. Confidential info which pertains to equipment already furnished or programmed to be furnished.
 - c. Mil info classified Restricted.
4. State, Navy and Air concur in the above and believe that this policy should not become operative until ratification of the peace treaty with release of info in the interim to be handled on a case by case basis by the DA. The DA believes that the above policy should include TOP SECRET and should become effective immediately. The DA accordingly requests CINCFE comments regarding the foregoing to include:
 - a. Concurrence or non-concurrence with DA position and why.
 - b. Examples of TS info that should be released and types that should be released prior to ratification of the peace treaty.
 - c. Status Japanese internal security to include their ability to protect classified US info which may be released.
5. By basic, G-2 refers the proposed reply to the ref msg to G-3 and DS for comment and/or concurrence. G-2 points out that a decision on this matter is long overdue since everyday dealings with the Japanese Govt require that additional classified material and plans be discussed. The proposed radio would concur in the DA position with release of TS and Secret on a case by case basis controlled by G-2 and reported to the DA.
 - a. Examples of TS and Secret material to be released include:
 - (1) Defense plans requiring Japanese Govt and NPRJ cooperation.

- (2) Expansion of NPRJ.
- (3) Coastal Security Force.
- (4) Administrative Agreement.
- (5) Plan for withdrawal from Japan.

b. It is pointed out that the Japanese Govt is planning legislation that should provide more adequate protection of US classified info than the present system. NPRJ has a regulation comparable to US Army regulations but lacks the means to effectively punish violators. All agencies provide adequate physical security.

6. In the proposed msg (par 1 line 7), reference is made to Note 1. This is not understood as there is no Note 1 to which this reference may refer. This reference should either be clarified or deleted. The action officer could not be contacted for clarification and Col Bratton (G-2) had no knowledge to what this reference pertained. Although not of G-3 interest, this matter should be pointed out to G-2 and G-3 should concur in the proposed msg.

7. ACTION: G-3 checknote to DS and G-2 concurring in the msg as amended.

8. ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS: This completes action on G-3 TS "A" 1564 and Plans Div Case No 21-51-53.

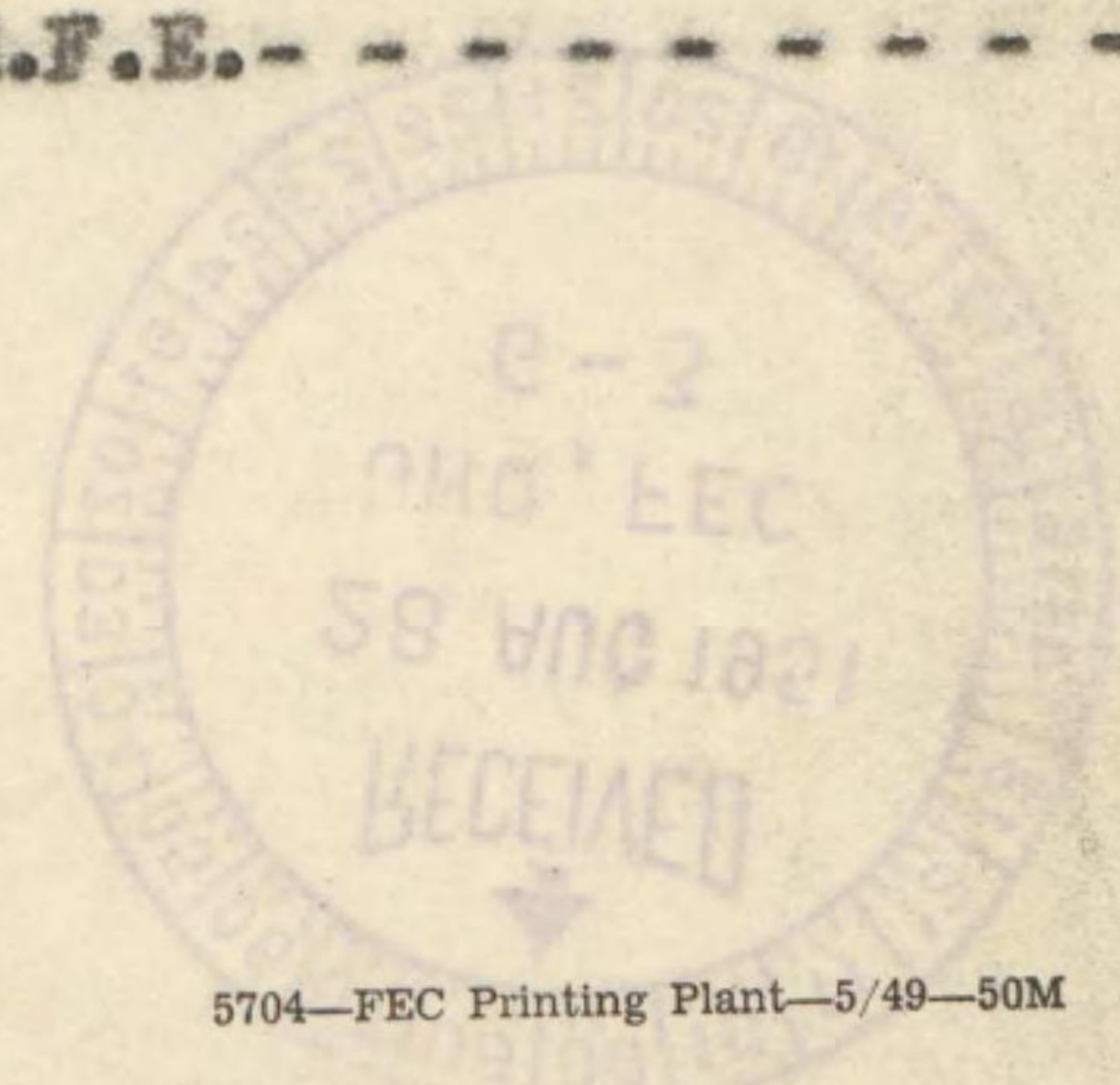

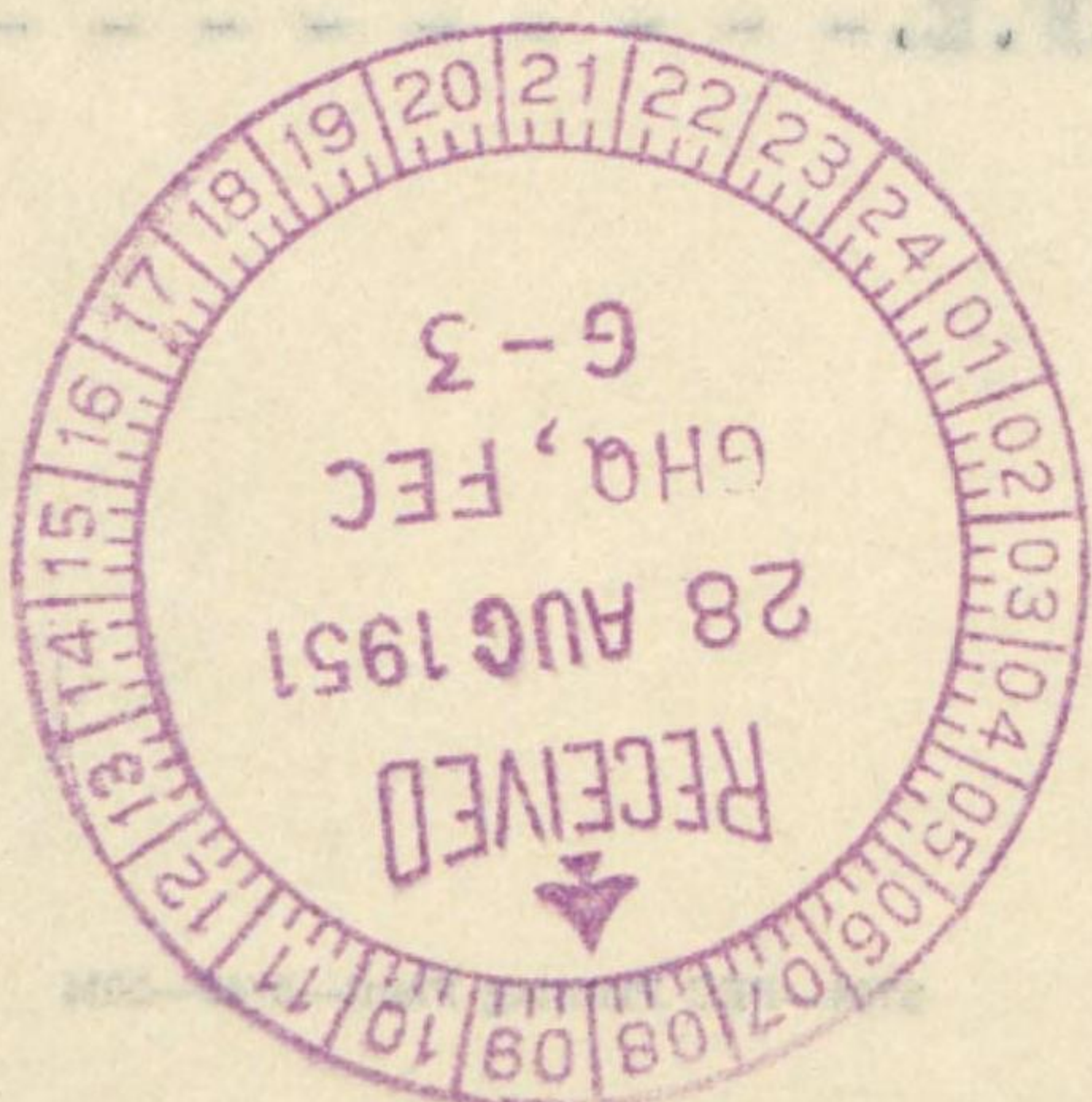

SUBJECT: Possible Compromise of Classified Information

1. BASIC ACTION: G-2 C/N No. 1 to G-3, subject as above, dated 27 Aug 51.

2. DISCUSSION: a. Basic is report of loss of a TS memo for record prepared by SGS. The M/R gave certain CinC decisions relative to the G-3 presentation of Eighth Army's operation plan TALONS. Its loss may subject the name TALONS to compromise but it is not believed that the plan itself is compromised.

b. Memo from Col Jark, approved by Gen Wright, recommended that name TALONS be changed and suggested SGS memo could be downgraded to SECRET, (TAB A attached).

c. Para 10b, AR 380-5 states that "The commanding officer of the individual having custodial responsibility will make or cause to be made a complete and thorough investigation of the circumstances as prescribed in AR 420-5. Such investigation will fix the responsibility for the loss or possible compromise upon an individual, if possible, rather than upon the title of the position held by the responsible individual or upon an office". It is considered that G-2 had custodial responsibility for the lost document at the time it was lost.

d. Since the lost document originated in the Office of the SGS, it is considered that G-2 should notify SGS of the loss.

e. G-2 reports that a thorough search has been and is continuing to be made for the missing paper.

f. The subject SGS memo was downgraded to Secret by the SGS on 29 Aug 51.

3. RECOMMENDED ACTION: a. Notify Eighth Army of the possible compromise of the name TALONS, and direct them to select a new name and notify this headquarters.

b. C/N 2 to G-2 informing them of the message to Eighth Army and of the G-3 position indicated in paras 2 c and d, above.

4. CLASSIFICATION: ~~M/R~~, Message to Eighth Army ~~and C/N 2 to G-2~~, Secret, to conform to new classification of ~~the~~ lost document. C/N 1 remains Top Secret, *as does G3 CN 2 & this M/R*

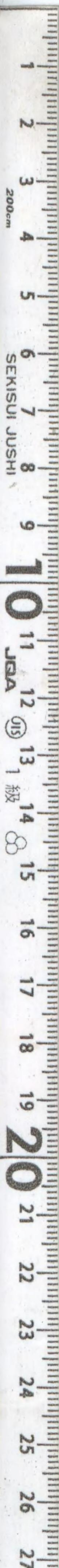

c. Personnel of the Army Establishment and its contractors whose duties necessitate access to Restricted Data held by contractors of the Atomic Energy Commission will require "Q" clearances granted by the Atomic Energy Commission. Requests for such clearances will be processed for the time being in accordance with procedures presently in effect (see reference (2)). Although Master Plans will not be required, each request for a "Q" clearance will contain a description of duties to be performed which require access to Restricted Data and the name and location of the contractor of the Atomic Energy Commission from which this data is normally to be obtained.

d. Current clearances of Army Establishment contractors and their personnel, granted under the provisions of reference (4), are acceptable for access to Restricted Data documents of similar military classification provided the bases for such clearances meet the clearance criteria prescribed in reference (3). In this connection, paragraph 10 IX A 4, reference (3), is interpreted as requiring a favorable National Agency Check as basis for clearance of contractors and their employees for access to Restricted Data classified as CONFIDENTIAL. Pending appropriate change to reference (4), new clearances granted thereunder, which will require access to Restricted Data bearing military classification, should be based on investigations meeting the criteria prescribed in references (3) and (4).

3. Handling of Restricted Data. a. The distinction between Types A and B Restricted Data will no longer be observed. All Restricted Data will be safeguarded in accordance with military classification (TOP SECRET, SECRET, or CONFIDENTIAL) borne by documents or material containing Restricted Data.

b. The Adjutant General's Section, this headquarters, will be the office of record for Restricted Data.

c. The categories TOP SECRET, SECRET, or CONFIDENTIAL, or in rare cases RESTRICTED, will be assigned to documents or material containing Restricted Data on the basis of the guidance contained in the Joint Atomic Energy Commission - Department of Defense Classification Guide for the Military Application of Atomic Energy. Provisions of reference (1) which govern handling, storage, distribution, transmission, etc., of TOP SECRET, SECRET, CONFIDENTIAL, and RESTRICTED material will be applied to Restricted Data of corresponding classification.

d. In the marking of documents and material containing Restricted Data, Type A and Type B stamps will no longer be used. Instead, the wording "RESTRICTED DATA - ATOMIC ENERGY ACT 1946" will be used generally in accordance with paragraph 49c, reference (1).


4. a. If currently in effect, "M" clearances granted under the provisions of reference (2) may be used as the basis for granting clearances for access to classified matter through TOP SECRET under reference (3) without further investigation. All such clearance certifications based on "M" clearances will be accomplished prior to 30 June 1951 by commanders authorized to grant clearances, after which date the provisions of paragraph 10, reference (3), must be complied with fully.

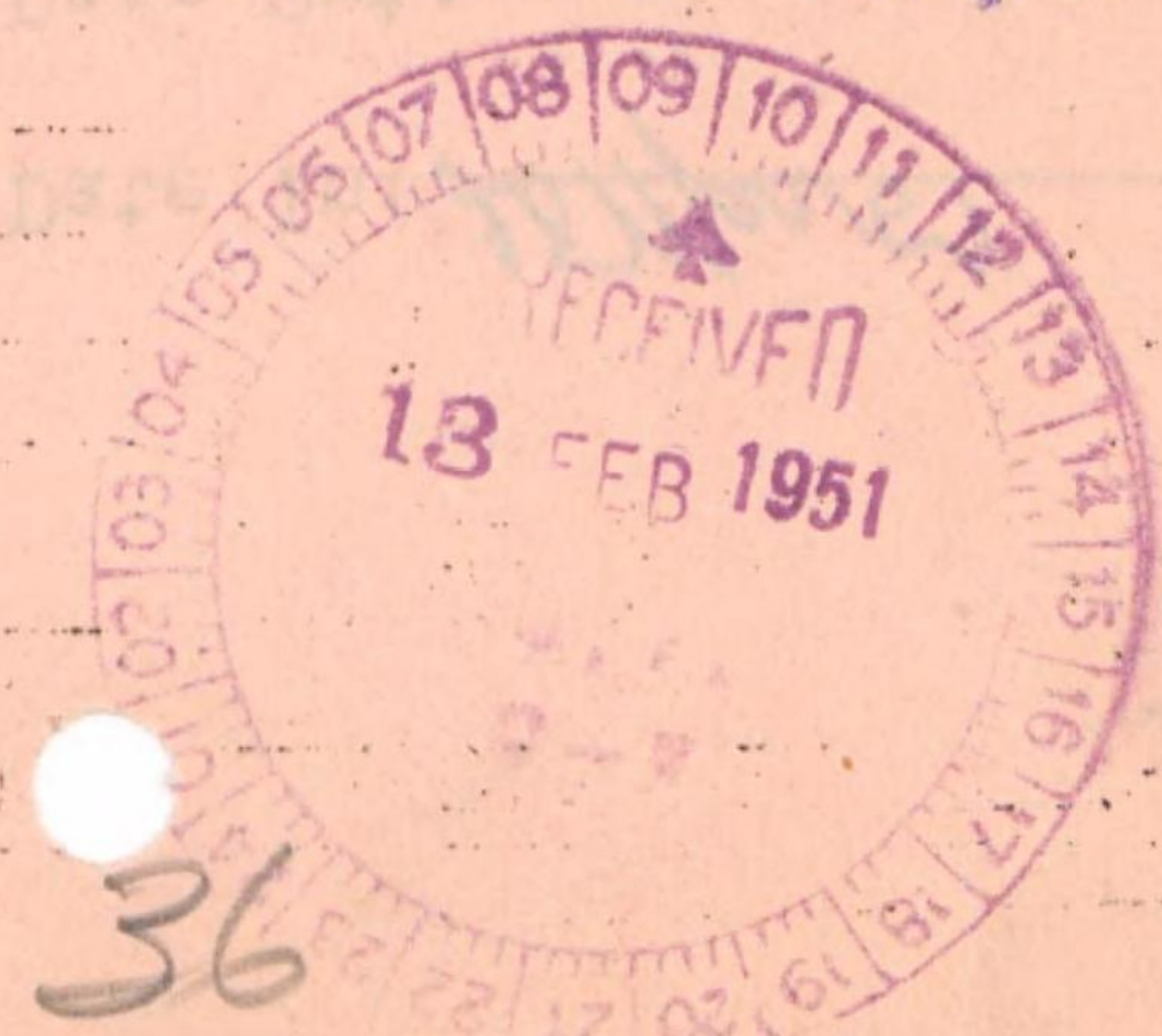

1 1. Despite the fact that (less than ten years since Pearl Harbor) the specter of an Asia marshalled under a hostile power again threatens the basic security of the United States, the weight of Washington planning still leans toward the opinion that the fate of the world depends upon the control of Western Europe.

2. In view of this situation, it is considered that GHQ must take the lead in formulating a long range concept designed to promote and secure the interests of the United States in Asia as an essential factor in the basic security of the United States itself. Under normal conditions the scope of this subject might be considered to be beyond the purview of SCAP or CINCPAC. Under the existing circumstances, however, and in consideration of the prestige of the C-in-C and the cumulative knowledge and experience represented by GHQ SCAP and FEC, it would appear that if a framework of United States grand strategy in the Orient is to be built - it must be built in this headquarters.

3. As a basic concept it is considered that such a strategy must reach beyond the military exigencies of the moment and should establish political, economic and military objectives the attainment of which will not in itself sow the seeds of still another war. Within this broad premise the following factors must be correlated:

a. The United States probably will not provide the mass of ground forces required to oppose the Communist Armies of Asia. As an alternative, the United States presumably will favor the employment of non-Communist Asiatics. The feasible implementation of such a policy will in a large measure be dependent upon the reestablishment of the war potential of Japan.

b. Such a utilization of Japan, however, must be based on a realistic appraisal of the price that the Japanese people, both now and in the future, will rightfully demand for their assistance. It must be assumed that this demand will not only include the reestablishment of Japanese sovereignty but strong participation in guiding the future destiny of Asia.

c. The sanctioning of such Japanese demands should be tempered by a dispassionate realization that the friendship of both China and Russia are also essential to the long range security of the United States. Our security interests will also require us to continue to assist other peoples in the Far East in achieving their own security as that security is measured in terms of political freedom and economic improvement.

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(Cont'd) d. The establishment of political and economic objectives encompassing the foregoing considerations should, therefore, be predicated on a United States position of partnership with rather than dominance of Japan, but it must be a partnership which will carefully nurture the favorable position of the U.S. vis-a-vis Japan which has resulted from our benevolent occupation.

e. The selection of our military objectives must be closely related to the long range political and economic objectives as well as to the more immediate requirements which must be met when/or if the Korean incident expands to include military operations on both the off-shore islands and other sectors of the Asiatic continent. It would appear that these military objectives should be of such a decisive character as to require Russia, if she chooses to initiate a world war, to fight in both Europe and Asia with her own forces. The attainment of such objectives will obviously require us to prepare for more than defensive operations.

4. The foregoing concept is not all-inclusive but is intended to point toward the scope of a strategic plan which should be conceived and approved before there can be a logical development and implementation of plans to support such obvious future requirements as will pertain to the JNPR, the ROK Army, utilization of Chinese Nationalists forces, security of the Philippines, security of SE Asia, etc, etc.

5. The rapidly clarifying picture of Russian strategy in the Far East with its particular implications concerning Japan augurs the need for immediate clarification of our own strategy. The ramifications of the related policy requirements are beyond the competence of any one staff section to either outline or monitor. It is recommended, therefore, that the CofS designate a small group of representatives from appropriate sections of GHQ SCAP and FEC to work under the direct guidance of CofS in the immediate initiation of an outline of a strategic concept designed to best promote and secure the interests of the United States in the Far East against enemies, actual, potential, or merely presumed.

1. BASIC: C/N 1 (CAS (Anx)-C 380, to CofS thru G-3 and G-2, subj as above, o/a 23 Sep 50.

2. REFERENCES: C/Ns 2, 3 and 4, same subj, following Basic, 24, 26 Sep and 2 Oct, respectively.

3. DISCUSSION:

a. By Basic CAS submitted recommendations reference proper security classification for the various aspects of the NPR project, recommending that all activities be declassified except certain TOP SECRET and SECRET matters and listing the general categories of material which should receive these two classifications. By C/N 2, 24 Sep, G-3 concurred and forwarded basic to CofS thru G-2 and Document Regrading Board. G-2 concurred by initialing G-3 C/N. By C/N 3, Document Regrading Board obtained concurrences of G-1 and G-4, and by C/N #4, Document Regrading Board began processing the entire action back thru DCofS, SCAP, G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4 in turn to Chief, CAS, requiring each staff section to submit a list of all documents originating in that section with recommendations as to the proper security classification for each document. Basic, which was originated as a TOP SECRET document, was downgraded to SECRET by the Document Regrading Board by coordination with CAS.

b. All documents originating in G-3, including this M/R and accompanying C/Ns, have been listed in the "List of Documents on the NPR Originating in G-3 Section". (Incl to C/N 1 to Document Regrading Board, 21 Oct). TOP SECRET documents originating in G-3 in general have been concerned with two subjects: first, planning for use and deployment (including locations) of the NPR and, second, establishment of the Northern Command and the resulting responsibilities of the Northern Command for planning the use of the NPR. These two subjects come within categories listed in basic under paras 3a, (2) and (3), which indicate that GHQ planning with respect to the future role and operations of the NPR and the deployment of NPR units should continue to be classified TOP SECRET. Further review of the pertinent subject material contained in documents previously originated in G-3 within these categories indicates that the TOP SECRET classification assigned probably resulted from the high degree of secrecy maintained during the planning phase of the NPR project. No details are discussed in any G-3 originated document relating to the detailed organization of the NPR or its detailed deployment. The locations of NPR units cannot be kept secret. A continued TOP SECRET classification of the information contained in documents previously originated in

G-3 is unnecessary, will hamper planning and will cause civil emergency plans to be classified TOP SECRET. Since the emergency use of the NPR relates primarily to civil emergencies and since civil emergency plans in the past have been classified only as SECRET, it is considered that a SECRET classification is adequate. Furthermore, much information on the NPR has appeared in the Japanese press, and the fact that GHQ is providing guidance and control is obviously no secret. Other material, relating to other uses of NPR, which should continue to be classified TOP SECRET is indicated by appropriate recommendations and notes in the list submitted. Para 2a (4) of basic allows sufficient latitude for the establishment of the TOP SECRET classification, if needed, for any future documents originating in G-3 and it is, therefore, considered desirable that G-3 in forwarding basic to CAS by C/N recommend that para 3a (2) and (3) should be deleted from the TOP SECRET category and inserted under para 3 b in the SECRET category. This recommendation has been coordinated with DCofS, SCAP (Gen Fox), G-1 (Col Owens) and G-2 (Col Svensson) who are in agreement that a SECRET classification is adequate.

MEMORANDUM FOR: G-3

SUBJECT : Inclusion of SM 9610 in G-3 Booklet JCS Directives to CINCFE.

1. BASIC: D/A (P&O) memorandum dtd 24 Feb 48, distributed to major commands and D/A staff for necessary action, republishing memo of JCS (SM 9610 dtd 12 Feb 48) relative to safeguarding information on anticipated special joint planning. G-3 by handwritten note enquires if subject JCS memorandum should be included in G-3 Booklet JCS Directives.

2. REFERENCE: C/N of C/S dtd 26 Sep 47 which requires G-3 to make timely revision of subject booklet.

3. DISCUSSION:

a. Basic transmits the essential parts of JCS 1831 to CINCFE (and other theater commanders) for necessary action. Although this transmittal is in unusual form, the direction to comply with the provisions of JCS 1831 is clear.

b. Directive states that a directive requiring special detailed joint operational planning may shortly be issued and outlines a "story" to answer possible public comment and query. However, directive forbids release of "story" or other publicity reference such planning without direction (or prior approval) from JCS.

c. Other JCS directives relative to safeguarding information have been included in subject booklet, particularly Annex 24, JCS 1712 (Top Secret), Policy on Safeguarding Information Re Cover & Deception, and Annex 19, JCS 1552/78 (Restricted) Security Directive, Results of Operation "Crossroads".

d. The directives contained in paragraphs 4 and 5 of SM 9610 apply primarily to the Zone of Interior, where queries on certain task force preparations might originate and be referred to military agencies for comment. In GHQ, FEC, release of information is centralized, so that knowledge of subject directives by the General Staff, and JSPOG should be sufficient to insure compliance.

e. There recently has been an increased emphasis on security within GHQ, FEC. Subject memorandum is routed for circulation through A C/S G-1, 2, 3, 4 and JSPOG. No further circulation should be necessary

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to insure compliance with directives contained therein. Further circulation of SM 9610 through insertion in G-3 booklet might in itself lead to rumors, conjectures or leaks concerning a highly classified subject and thus defeat the objective sought by JCS, i.e., prevention of breaches of security concerning joint planning.

- 4. RECOMMEND: No further action by G-3.
- 5. COMPLETION: This completes G-3 action on basic.

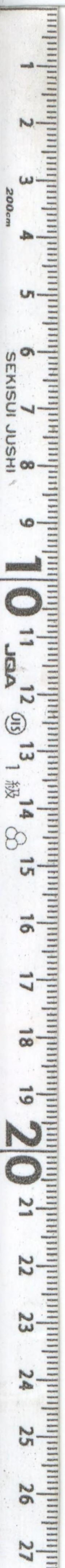

Agency may conceivably be involved in cover and deception training or
operations, now or in the future. Insofar as major commands are concerned,
such cover and deception would be tactical in character unless otherwise
directed by this Headquarters. Cover and deception operations by G-2 and the
Chief Signal Officer would be strategic in character. Activities by the Army
Security Agency are directed by the War Dept.

c. The General Headquarters Document Downgrading Board also has
an interest in the information contained in the security policy re classifica-
tion.

3. In view of the above, the following actions are recommended:

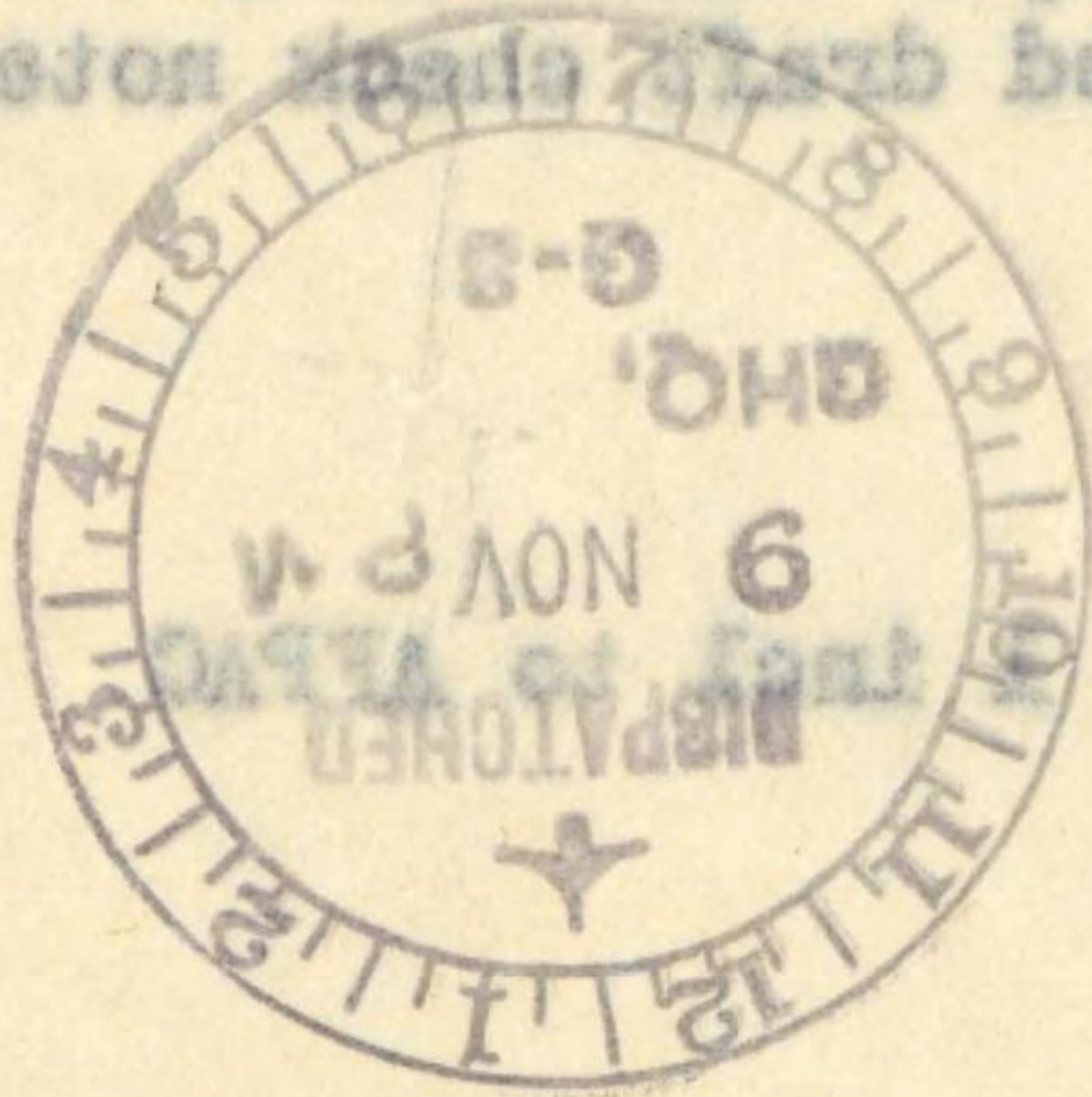

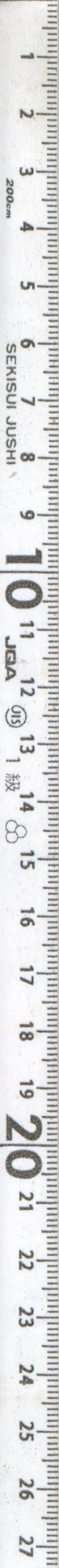

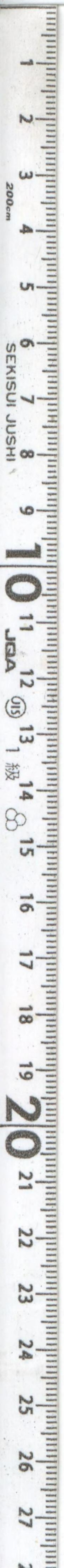

SUBJECT: Policy of Safeguarding Information Concerning Cover and Deception.

TO : See Distribution

1. On 11 October 1946 the Joint Chiefs of Staff approved JCS 1712, which is a revised security policy for safeguarding information concerning cover and deception.

2. The following information extracted therefrom is forwarded for information and guidance.

a. The classification of aspects of cover and deception is as follows:

(1) TOP SECRET: Information on all aspects of U.S. strategic cover and deception originated by the U.S. (or Allies) or contained in documents or similar material received from other nations will be classified "TOP SECRET."

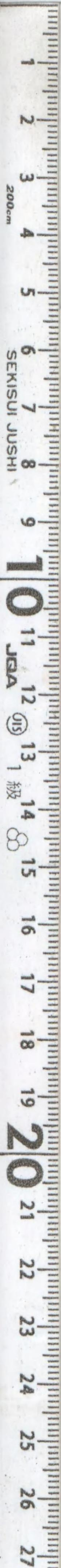
(2) CONFIDENTIAL: Information on tactical cover and deception will be classified "CONFIDENTIAL" when such information includes comprehensive or integrated documents or techniques of communication deception, radar deception, sonic deception and visual deception.

(3) RESTRICTED: Information on elemental factors of methods used in tactical cover and deception will be classified "RESTRICTED."

b. The handling of "TOP SECRET" cover and deception information will be as specified in "TOP SECRET" control procedure and each cover and deception plan will be assigned a code name by the commander of the Headquarters for which the plan is written.

c. Recorded information will be reclassified in accordance with this security policy. Borderline cases will be assigned the higher classification.

3. It is desired that addressees submit to the Headquarters under appropriate classification for prior approval any programs for cover and deception operations or training projected for implementation by agencies under their control.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Action concerns JCS 1712 which was approved by JCS on Oct 11, 1946 and contains a security policy for safeguarding information concerning cover and deception. This paper passed to G-3 to brief for C/S.

2. The cover and deception plans written during the war by this Headquarters were distributed in part or in whole to Theater Major Commands. In view of this fact and of the nature of the information contained in the security policy reclassification and dissemination, it is believed necessary to review these features of the policy for the information and guidance of the Major Commands.

3. It is also conceivable that G-2, the Chief Signal Officer and the Army Security Agency may be involved in cover and deception training or operations, now or in the future. This cover and deception operation would be strategic in character. Therefore, it is believed advisable to pass JCS 1712 to G-2, the CSO and the President GHQ Document Downgrading Board for information and guidance.

4. In view of the classification aspects of this paper, it is believed that the GHQ, Document Downgrading Board should receive an information copy of the proposed letter.

5. ACTION RECOMMENDED -

a. Pass JCS 1712 and brief thereof to C/S.

b. Distribution of JCS 1712 by Secretary General Staff to G-2, and the CSO in turn for information and guidance.

c. Dispatch of proposed letter by AG to AFPAC Major Commands for information and guidance.

d. Pass information copy of proposed letter ^{by AG} to the President GHQ Document Downgrading Board.
