IN MEMORIAM

Dr. Anderson M. Scruggs

Maude Lay Elton

Dr. Scruggs was one of Georgia's most noted poets, and was a winner of the Georgia Writers Association's LITERARY ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS for Poetry. He was the author of three distinguished volumes of poetry, namely: Glory of Earth, Ritual for Myself, and What Shall the Heart Remember? His poetry had appeared in leading publications over the country, and he was a speaker on the subject of poetry at numerous meetings.

Maude Lay Elton had been active in the poetry field for many years. She was an excellent poet and had had many poems accepted for publication. She was the author of Chit-Chat, As a Woman Thinks, and was the editor of Blended Voices, an Anthology of Poetry by Georgia Poets. Mrs. Elton was active in the Poetry Forum of the Atlanta Writer's Club, a prominent Penwoman, and served last year as chairman of the GEORGIA POETRY DAY Observance.

We shall treasure the memory of these poets.

LITERARY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Georgia Writers Association

The highest honor within the gift of the Georgia Writers Association is its Literary Achievement Award. Given for literary excellence and for outstanding contribution to the literature of Georgia, the Award is made annually to the resident or non-resident Georgia author whose book is considered by the Award Committee to have attained the highest literary standards. Selections are made from books published in the year just closed.

Nineteen Literary Achievement Awards have been presented to Georgia authors since the organization of the Georgia Writers Association in June 1948 (at the close of the First Georgia Writers Conference):

For Year 1948	Foster Fitz-Simons	BRIGHT LEAF
For Year 1949	Elizabeth Stevenson	THE CROOKED CORRIDOR

Beautiful silver medals were presented to authors Fitz-Simons and Stevenson the first two years. Then, in view of the fact that so many books were being written by Georgians in all fields, the Association decided to make awards in three fields: Non-Fiction, Fiction and Poetry, with Special Awards to be given from time to time. Accordingly, a change was made from the silver medal to a handsome scroll carrying a reproduction of the silver medal. The following presentations of Scrolls have been made since that date:
