Extract from letter to Managers.

It appearing to us that the unprecedented stagnation of promotion in our Service arising from the loss by numerous mercantile failures and other unforeseen causes, of the hard earned accumulations of many of our Senior Members, calls for some measure of relief; moreover that one of the main objects of our subscribing to the Fund has been only partially attained by the very limited number of Civilians who have retired since the institution of the Fund, leaving 36 Annuities unaccepted up to the present year 1833, inclusive, the following Regulations are therefore proposed to be substituted for Regulations III. VIII. and XI. for the period of 4 years, viz. for 1834-5-6-7.

In lieu of Regulation III.
