BE IT KNOWN, that on this 2tin day of the month of January, 1917, before ERNEST TOURO FLOHANCE, a Notary Public duty commissioned and qualified within and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinatter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared Gallier J. Capdevielle and Benjamin W. Kernan, of New Orleans, La., herein appearing in their respective capacities as Secretary and Chairman respectively, of a slockholders' meeting of the Pelican Land & Development Company, Incorporated, a corporation domicised in this City, organized by Act passed before Sol. Weiss, Notary Public, on the 2th day of June, 1916, and under and by virtue of a resolution passed at the stockholders' meeting hereinafter mentioned, a certified copy of the minutes of which meeting is hereto annexed and made part hereof; who declared that a special meeting of the stockholders of said corporation, held on the 13th day of January, 1917, which had been duly convened for that special purpose according to law, the following amendments to the charter of said corporation were adopted by a unanimous vote of the holders of all stock of said company, present or represented at said meeting, to wit:

That Article 1 of said Charter was amended so as to read as follows ARTICLE I.

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of the corporation hereby formed is declared to be the Corporation Securifies Company, Inc., under which name it shall have and enjoy corporation succession for the period of ninety-nine years, and shall have and exercise for the purpose of the bustness to be carried on by it all the powers conferred by law upon corporations, including the power to purchase, lease, sell, mortgare, pledge real and personal property in the prosecution of its business; to contract sue and be sued; to make by-laws for its government, and generally to exercise all the powers necessary or convenient in carrying on its business.
