

THE PROJECT USES WIKIFUNDI, THE OFFLINE EDITING ENVIRONMENT THAT MIMICS THE EXPERIENCE OF EDITING WIKIPEDIA, TO NAVIGATE CONTEXT-SPECIFIC CHALLENGES.

ONLY 20% OF AFRICA IS ONLINE

Reasons range from:

- lack of access to internet
- lack of electricity
- non-affordable equipment or access
 AND
- literacy levels
- 80% of online content is in 10 languages (spoken only by 3 bn as 1st language)
