1. For your information there are inclosed herewith copies of communications received from the Hyogo Ken Livestock Section pertaining to prices of meat on the Foreign Nationals' Supplementary Ration list.

2. As Japanese officials claimed they were unable to furnish meat at ¥ 70 per 100 momme the Foreign National Food Distribution Committee, with the help of these officials, made arrangement for meat deliveries directly from a local slaughterhouse. This meat is being sold on a free sale basis at prices ranging from ¥ 15 for chuck bones to ¥ 120 per 100 momme for best grade. The Committee has agreed with the Japanese not to claim the normal meat ration, or substitution of canned meat.

3. An inspection by this headquarters of the distribution operation at the main distribution center disclosed that the October-November sales were subsidized to the extent of ¥ 20,110 from the general reserve fund of the center. This fund accrues from the 8%-10% charge made on items distributed by the centers to cover costs of handling.

2. Inclosure to basic communication indicates a 74% increase in sugar cane plantation in Osaka Prefecture since last year. This shift from staple foods is understandable since yields from sugar cane have been estimated to be as high as ¥ 100,000 per tan against ¥ 50,000 for fruits, ¥ 30,000 for vegetables (before recent enforcement drive) and ¥ 3,500 for staple crops.

3. It is believed that the Emergency Production Adjustment Law will correct this tendency to a certain extent. However, it is felt that close surveillance over non-staple crop acreage should be exercised so that more drastic measures can be taken at national level if necessary.



1. It has been noted by this headquarters that the majority of criticisms of the rice quota come from farmers of small areas rather than farmers of large areas. There appears a need for a sliding scale in figuring rice quotas whereby the farmers of large areas deliver a higher quota per unit area.

2. The following is offered for study.

- a. Large farmer (10 tan) at 3 koku/tan.
 Total yield = 10 tan x 3 koku = 30 koku
 Legal retention (assumed) = 10 koku
 Quota = 20 koku
- b. Small farmer (5 tan) at 3 koku/tan
 Total yield = 5 tan x 3 koku = 15 koku
 Legal retention (same as above) = 10 koku
 Quota = 5 koku

3. It is realized that the farmer of a large area cannot produce as much per unit of area as a farmer of a smaller area because of less man hours expended but it is believed that this fact is taken into consideration by the original crop estimate. Therefore less yield per unit area is expected from the large farmer. However, if the yield estimate is slightly less than actual yield, which is believed to be the real situation, the large farmer is considerably benefited. For example, if the yield were estimated at 2.6 koku/tan rather than at 3.0 koku/tan, the cited case would be:

- a. Large farmer (10 tan) at 2.6 koku/tan
 Total yield = 10 tan x 2.6 koku = 26 koku
 Legal retention (Assumed) = 10 koku
 Quota = 16 koku

b. Small farmer (5 tan) at 2.6 koku/tan
Total yield == 5 tan x 2.6 koku == 13 koku
Legal retention (Same as above) == 10 koku
Quota == 3 koku

4. From paragraphs 2 and 3 it can be seen that the large farmer benefited 4 koku when his yield was underestimated, whereas the small farmer benefited only 2 koku under the same conditions.

5. It is recommended that a sliding scale be used whereby the farmer of a large area is obligated to deliver rice at a higher yield basis than the farmer of a smaller area.

This headquarters does not concur with recommendation contained in paragraph 5 of basic communication since it is based on the premise that (1) quotas are always set too low, and (2) that farmers will turn in only 100% of the quota, and will consume or illegally sell the remainder. It is pointed out that the reverse effect would result in those cases where quotas are actually set too high, rather than too low.

2. It is the opinion of this headquarters that the deficiencies in the present crop quota system as outlined in basic communication can be adequately corrected by proper assignment of quotas by the Food Adjustment Committees, especially at the village level, and by educating or persuading the farmers to turn in all rice produced above his legal retention allowance.

1. CIAS Section this HQ, is planning an extensive publicity program to effect a successful rice collection drive.
2. Subject publicity program is necessary to stimulate the people to go over the top this year in view of the prefecture's failure to make its quota in prior campaign.
3. Shiga Prefecture is a major rice cultivating prefecture in the Kansai region, and it is thought desirable that such a program warrants military Government support in view of the immediate importance of this program.
4. Planned scope of operation for implementation of subject program is the following:
 - a. A week tour of the prefecture by prefectural and Military Government representatives in "Kolly", a loudspeaker equipped car owned by Asahi Shinbun, for the purpose of encouraging farmers to meet their quotas.
 - b. With the aid of loudspeakers attached on the car, periodic announcements encouraging rice delivery alternately with familiar recordings will be made in each village.
 - c. Showing of educational films. Due to numerous outlying districts with insufficient communications (radio, newspapers, etc.) visual education will supplement greatly the few opportunities which the people have thus far been afforded of learning about democratic principles.
 - d. The tour will be a follow-up of a similar visual education program which was effected a year ago at which time popular requests called for this follow-up program.

Dried milk (Class G)	22 tons

3. Reference b, the only information received by this office on imported food for school lunches, refers only to 1 ton of Class C-D and 13 tons of Class E food.

4. CIO letter 6348(EA) referred to in reference c has not been received here. This letter is the one which indicates how distribution is to be made.

5. Due to the use of hooks in handling, 2 barrels of dried milk, one can of stew and 10 cans of pineapple were damaged. The milk was salvaged.

6. The only information available to this office on the proper distribution of this food is the translation of an order (No. 187) from the Education Ministry to the governor of Nara prefecture. Distribution is being made in compliance with this order.

7. Effect of this order is to distribute the food to urban areas where there is a variety of food for sale, rather than to remote areas where difficulty of transportation results in a lack of proteins.

8. Request more information as to the proper distribution of this and other imported food.



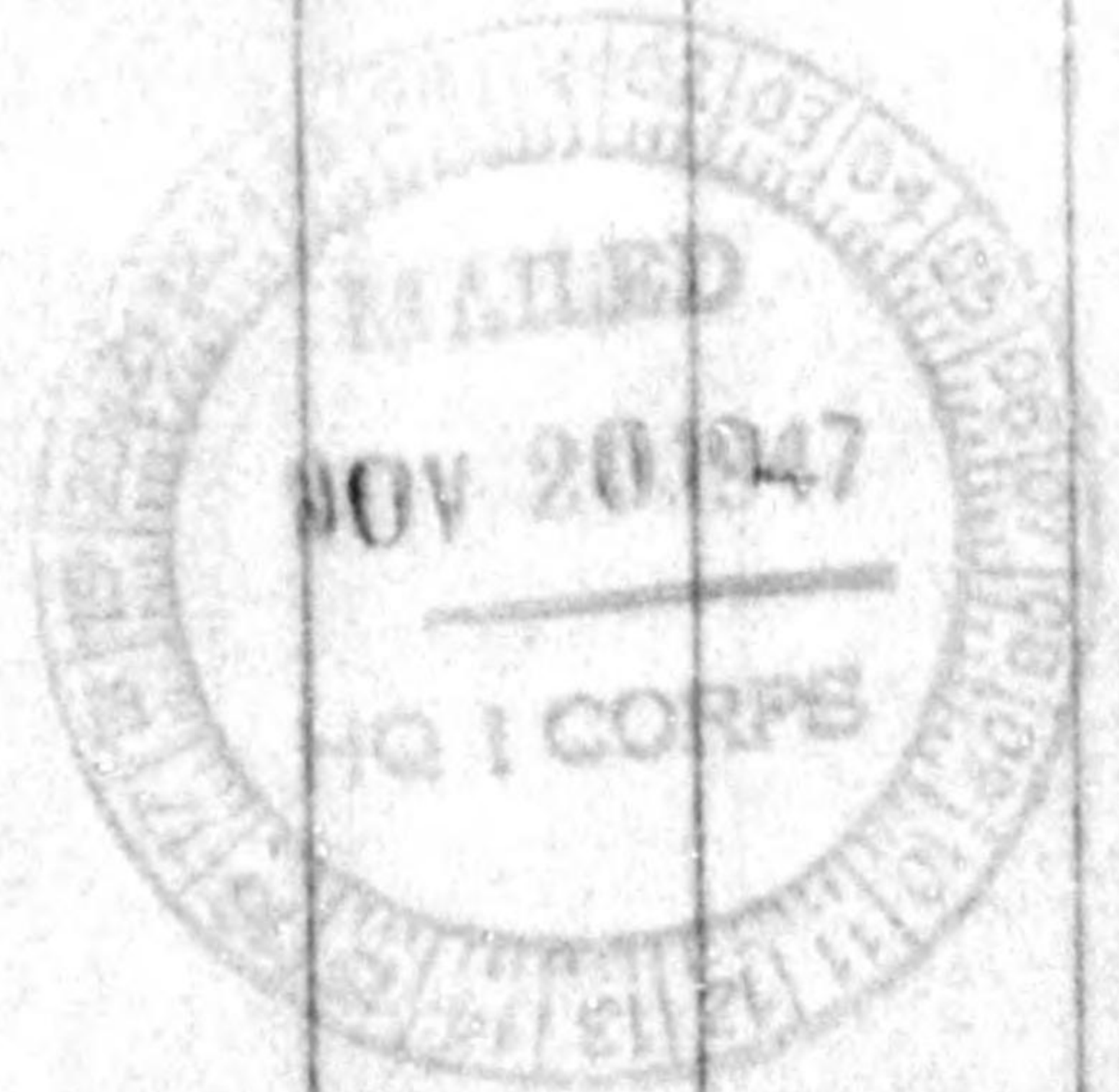

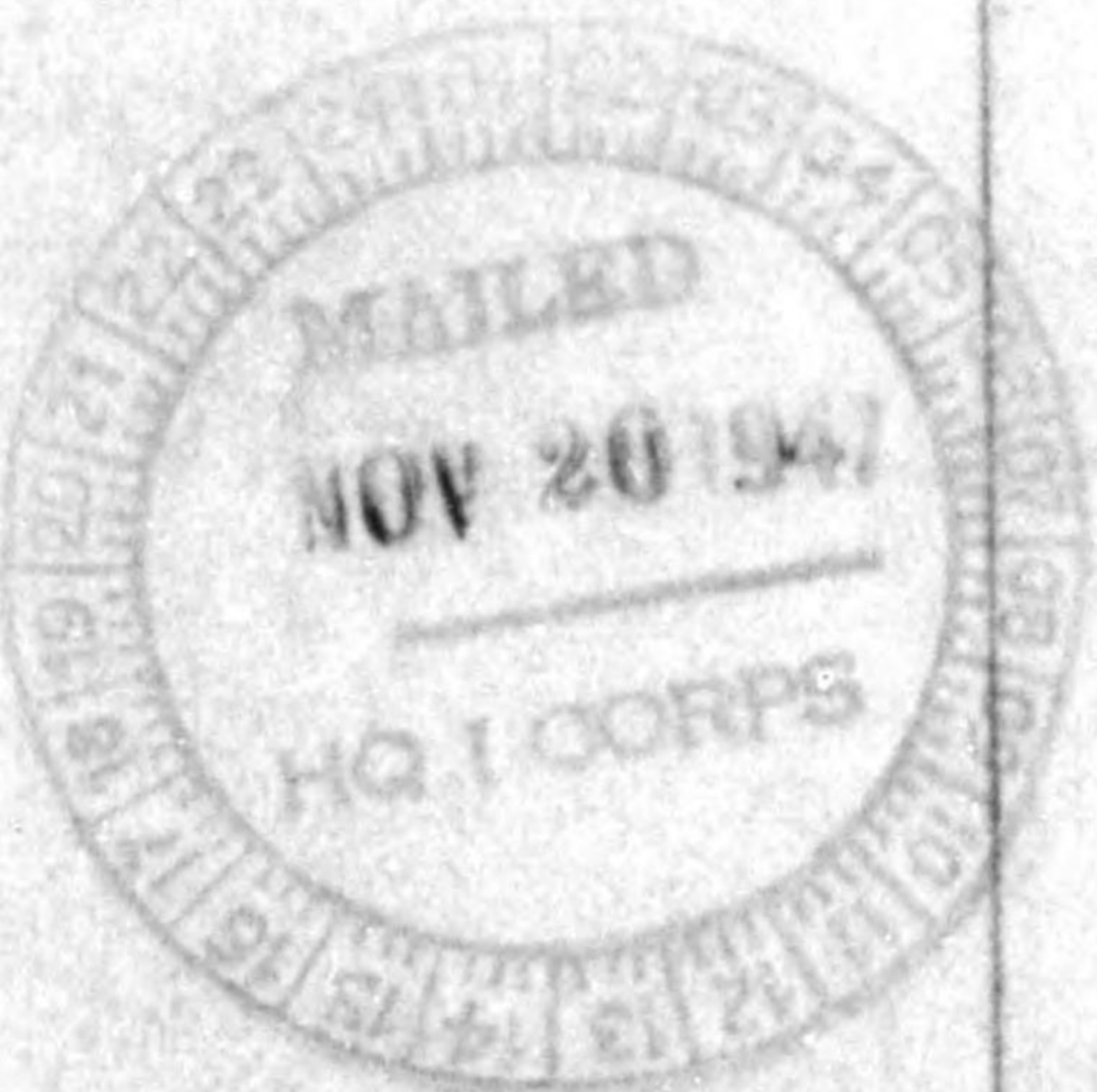

2. The food collection program is well under way in Shiga at this time, the rice collection being more than 10 per cent of quota. The prefectural government has received the allocations on paper of incentive goods but no actual items are forthcoming.

3. From experiences of last year, it is known that Shiga farmers suspect misappropriation of these incentive goods when the items are not available for distribution at the time the farmers become eligible to receive them.

1. Reference Headquarters First Corps Radiogram ICBA 572 dated 17 October 47 with regard to plan effected by the Japanese Police in this prefecture to prevent illegal transportation of rice and sweet potatoes.
2. Periodic spot checks are made at every major railroad or tram-car station in this prefecture; both outbound and inbound. Plain-clothes-men are constantly riding different trains in an effort to detect illegal transportation of above mentioned products. This plan has been in effect for several months in this prefecture.
3. Foodstuffs totaling 9,756.6 kilograms were confiscated during the latter part of August and early part of September. Foodstuffs confiscated over and above the legal amount was paid for at the legal price and turned over to Food Corporation for distribution to public as supplementary rations. Approximately 3/4 of this food was confiscated while passing thru this Ken.

1. Reference is made to requisition from this Hq dtd 3 Aug 47 attached.

a. Ice used to cool water for use in the company mess and to cool the one cold drink which is served daily with the noon meal. Approximately 75 lbs. daily.

b. Since the closest PX is some 100 miles from this Hq, the beer and coke sold to Officers and Enlisted Men of this unit are cooled in the unit bar. Approximately 75 lbs. daily.

c. By five dependent families to cool drinks. Rations are purchased by these families from the I Corps Commissary on a weekly basis whereby more ice is consumed than if food could be purchased daily. House type electric refrigerators have been issued to only two of the five families, however, these will not hold a week's supply of food. Approximately 75 lbs. each daily.

d. This unit is issued some 400 rations in bulk every week, and these rations must be stored and the perishables must be refrigerated. Most of the food will keep, however, it takes approximately 50 lbs a day for the fruit and fresh vegetables, these items are kept on ice.

e. The PX train requires some 600 lbs. of ice bi-monthly.

f. During the month of Sept, Lt Col Hunter, CO of the 8th Army Laboratory Train of the 406 Medical General Laboratory, required 2000 lbs. of ice to preserve his findings until he was able to get them back to his Hq.

g. On 7 Oct 47, this team was issued eight (8) coolers, water which require ice since they are not electric. 25 lbs. each daily.

h. Detachment at Takefu must preserve food, cool drink for noon meal, cool water, cool beer and cokes. Approximately 125 lbs. daily.

1. Mie Prefecture is now preparing its 1948 Rice Collection Program. Difficulty is anticipated in completing the large quota required, and this Unit is making every effort to assure collection of the full quota. Large amounts of staple foods are being carried from Mie Prefecture to Osaka by blackmarketeers, some of whom come from Osaka for that express purpose. Mie Prefectural Police are cooperating by maintaining check points at principal stations throughout Mie Prefecture. However, since blackmarketeers operate in large numbers and exercise considerable ingenuity in avoiding detection, it is impossible for this Prefecture alone to stop the outgoing flood of staple foods.

2. It is requested that Osaka Police be instructed to make seizures of excessive amounts of subject food at Tsuruhashi and Uehonmachi Stations. It is further requested that Military Police maintain surveillance to insure that the Japanese Police carry out their assignment.

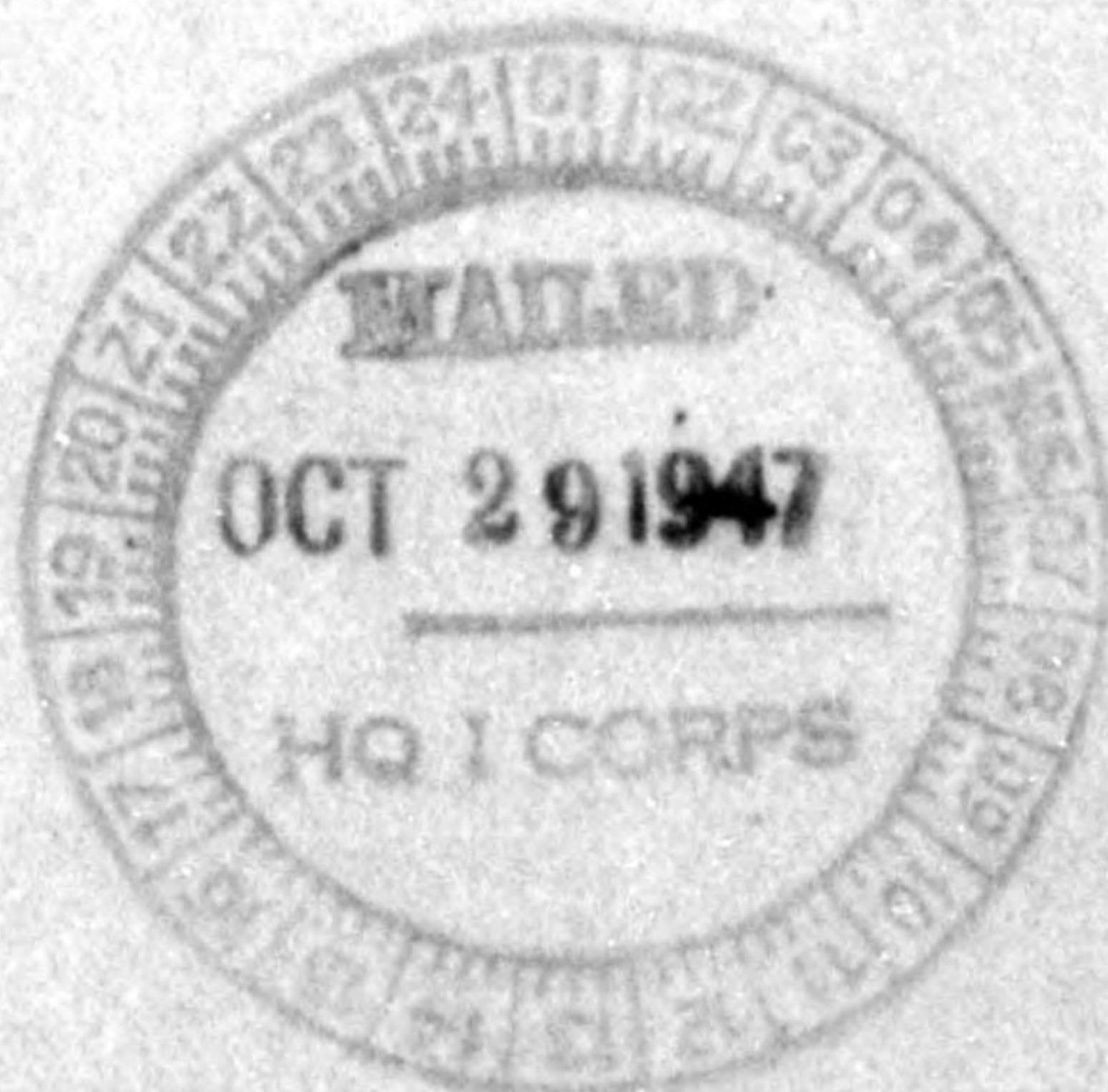

1. Pursuant to request in basic letter, Headquarters Mie Military Government Team, this headquarters directed the economic police of Osaka Prefecture to exercise surveillance over the Tsuruhashi and Uehommachi stations for the purpose of detecting and seizing excessive amounts of staple foods. Said economic police worked under the supervision of Military Police.

2. On 4 November, excessive quantities of rice, barley, sweet potatoes, flour and soy beans were seized in a total amount of 1,216.7 kilograms. On 5 November, 2,464 kilograms of aforementioned staple foods were seized.

3. Surveillance is being continued.
