1. Inclosures contained herewith compile applications for use of former military installations (buildings) and applications for sublease of OD-5 machinery for use by Kyoraku Sangyo Co. Ltd in manufacture by that company of bolts and nuts, railroad material, ships engines, electric gun metal utensils, and small wooden boats.

All applications contained herewith have been forwarded through necessary Japanese channels to this office and contain permission by these agencies, for use of machinery and buildings, pending approval by Military Government per paragraphs 17 d (For Machinery) 17f (for buildings) of Operational Directive 28/12 for 1945 dated 8 July 1946.

2. OD-5 machinery requested by Kyoraku Sangyo Co. Ltd. is entrusted to Finance Ministry for protection and maintenance and has been inventoried and maintained as such by said agency.

It is the belief of the Financial Bureau that greater care and more efficient maintenance would exist on listed machinery if permission were granted to Kyoraku Sangyo Co. Ltd for sublease of said machinery from Finance Ministry.

3. It is the belief of this office that encouragement of this project will further the production of essential consumer commodities necessary to the population of this and other areas, further encourage small business and greatly relieve existing unemployment situations both in this and immediate surrounding communities. Approval of applications is recommended.

1. Inclosed herewith is an application of the Kyoraku Sangyo K.K. for permission to utilize buildings and 16 pieces of machinery of the Maizuru Naval Yard, which have been designated for reparations. The application is accompanied by a recommendation of the local Japanese Finance Bureau.

2. It is the intention of the subject company to commence large scale production of bolts, nuts, railway material, ship engines, and small wooden boats. In view of the imminent removal of reparations equipment and machines which is anticipated, it does not seem advisable to permit the Kyoraku Company to commence such extensive activities, based on temporary use of reparations equipment. The subject company was organized subsequent to the termination of the war. It is the opinion of this headquarters that no firm should be organized on the basis that operation is completely dependent on use of reparation equipment.

3. It is the recommendation of this headquarters that the inclosed application be not favorably considered.

1. The recommendation contained in paragraph 3 of the 2nd indorsement is approved.

2. The temporary use by Japanese industry of machinery and equipment belonging to an installation designated for reparations removal may only be permitted when:

a. The equipment is urgently needed; is absolutely essential to maintain a minimum Japanese economy, and cannot be obtained from any other source.

b. The equipment is not an integral part of any machinery where removal would render a particular machine inoperable.

c. Proper records be kept at the reparations installation indicating location and parties responsible for custody and control.

d. It is clearly understood that the equipment is subject to immediate removal for reparations at any time without prior notice.

e. Each request for the temporary use of equipment be submitted to this headquarters with the appropriate recommendation for final approval.

3. The release of lands and buildings not required for custody and control of reparations machinery and equipment will be made to the Japanese Home Ministry under the provisions of Operational Directive 28/12.


1. The enclosed petition from the Kyoto Liaison Office, for the Osaka Railroad Division, is forwarded for your consideration. It is the understanding of this office that Iino Sangyo KK has forwarded a similar petition direct to SCAP thru Japanese channels.

2. Iino Sangyo has a reconversion permit to operate certain sections of the former Maizuru Naval Base. In one of these sections, the Maizuru Naval Arsenal, plant code 22-24, they have undertaken the manufacture and repair of railroad freight and passenger cars under contract to the Osaka Division of the Transportation Ministry. During the period August 1946 to March 1947 some 110 cars were repaired, and they expect to increase that figure to 625 this year.

3. The repair work at present required on rolling stock exceeds by about 14,800 cars the capacity of the railroad repair shops. This makes it necessary to contract some of the work out to shops capable of handling that type of equipment.

4. In view of these facts it is recommended that the 262 machines needed by Iino Sangyo for the continuation of this work be released to the Japanese Government for disposition to Iino Sangyo.

Inclosure 1 to basic communication consists of a petition from the Kyoto Liaison Office, and requests exemption of 262 machine tools which are inventoried as part of the Maizuru Naval Arsenal (22-24). The machines are in use at present by the Iino Sangyo KK, and are used for the repair of railway cars. The machines are properly subject to reparations.

2. It is the opinion of this headquarters that the machines in question are of importance to the continued maintenance of Japanese railroad equipment in this area and that removal of this equipment would create additional difficulties in the effort to provide adequate service. However, it is believed, that except in exceptional circumstances, it is not advisable to release a portion of the machines stored in plants which are properly subject to reparations. It is the recommendation of this headquarters that the Iino Sangyo KK be permitted continued use of this equipment until such time as they are required for reparations removal.

1. We wish to present to your office the petition placed in our hands for our good offices by the director of Osaka Railway Division, concerning the Maizuru Rolling Stock Manufacturing Works of Iino Sangyo K.K., located at Maizuru City, Kyoto Prefecture, for the exemption from reparation list of 262 items as specified in the annexed list.
2. The said Maizuru Rolling Stock Manufacturing Works of Iino Sangyo K.K. is the government railway's contract repair worker, and during 1946 the factory performed with satisfaction the repair work of 110 freight cars.
3. Osaka Railway Division of the government railway is under necessity assigning to Maizuru Rolling Stock Mfg. works of Iino the repair works of 620 freight cars and 5 passenger cars for 1947. The total number of repair works incumbent on Osaka Division amounts to 1505 cars. The Division's own workshop is not adequate to dispose of all these,--the deficiency being due to war-damage---hence the necessity of placing order with Iino as mentioned above for repair works of 625 cars.
