These factories are the only ones engaged in the manufacture of this specific type of agricultural machinery in this prefectural area as well as a considerable portion of the neighboring prefectures. Any cessation of manufacturing of this type machinery would impose a tremendous burden on the entire area. The removal of raw materials from these factories would cause that cessation.

3. It is the recommendation of this headquarters that all possible consideration be given to this petition, with the object in view of ultimate exemption of these materials from the Procurement Demand category.
